HC Refuses To Quash Case Against College Professor Over WhatsApp Status On Abrogation Of Art 370

MUMBAI, APR 14: Any critical or dissenting views in sensitive matters that stir up emotions of different groups of people must be expressed only after proper analysis of the situation and backed with reasoning, the Bombay High Court has said while refusing to quash an FIR against a professor for putting a WhatsApp status on Article 370.

A division bench of Justices S B Shukre and MM Sathaye in its order of April 10 said it prima facie finds that the professor has in a very casual manner posted the status



message about the abrogation of Article 370, which ended the special status of Jammu and Kashmir.

were also held at all mosques and shrines in Srinagar including Masjid Jamiat-e-Ahlehadith, Gawkadal; Asar-e-Sharif, Janab Sahib Soura; Asare-Sharif Shehri Kalashpora; Ziarat-e-Makhdoom Sahib, Khanqah-e-Mualla, and different Imambaras.

In South Kashmir, people in large numbers offered Jumat-ul-Vida congregational prayers at Jamia Masjid Hanfia, Jamia Masjid Ahlihadith, Bait-ul-Muqaram and Rehat-Ded Masjid in Islamabad (Anantnag) town. Congregational prayers were also offered in Ziarate-Sharief Khiram Kabamarg; Kund, Aishmugam and Bijbehara areas of the district.

In Kulgam, the biggest prayer gathering was seen in Jamia Masjid. Large congregational prayer gathering was also witnessed in Khankah Tral, Jamia Masjid Shopian and Jamia Masjid Pulwama.

Thousands of Muslims also offered Jumat-ul-Vida prayers in all other districts of the UT.

Meanwhile, Devotees said that it is for the 3rd time in the living memory of people that they are being barred from offering Juma-tul-vida prayers at Jamia Masjid.

They added that for the whole year Muslims of the Valley keep waiting to offer prayers in Jamia Masjid on this most important last Friday of the holiest month of Ramadan to earn reward and seek forgiveness of their almighty. And even that right has been snatched from us by "authorities".

Sumaira Nazir usually offered Jumat-ul-Vida prayers at Srinagar's Jamia Masjid. "On this day I used to go early in the morning so that I could offer my salah inside the masjid. When sometimes the Jummah prayers were not allowed in the masjid, then I visited Bazar masjid. But this year despite normalcy i am not able to offer prayers in Jamia masjid due to reasons better known to authorities only," she said.

Similarly, Srinagar resident Mushtaq Ahmad said, "We were hopeful that this Jumat-ul-Vida, we will be able to offer congregational prayers in Jamia but nothing such happened."

Authorities disallowed Jumat-ul-Vida (last Friday of Ramazan) congregational prayers at Kashmir's historical Jamia mosque, the managing body of the grand mosque in Srinagar said.

Anjuman Auqaf, the managing body of Jamia Masjid Srinagar said District Magistrate and police officials visited the mosque at 9.30 am and asked the management to lock the gates of the mosque as the administration has decided that Jumat-ul-Vida prayers will not be allowed at the Masiid.

The Anjuman resented the move and said it caused great distress to lakhs of Muslims, who traditionally come from all parts of the valley to offer prayers on the last Friday of Ramazan in Jamia Masjid.

The Anjuman said once again the authorities showed their "dictatorial attitude" and "blatant interference in religious matters and hurting the religious sentiments of the people."

The disallowing of the Jumat-ul-Vida prayers at Jamia mosque triggered widespread condemnation from locals and political parties.

"I had come from Anantnag to offer Friday prayers, but was shocked to see the gate of the mosque locked on the pious day. This is a violation of religious freedom," said a devotee outside the Jamia mosque. Many locals said there was no reason for the

government to disallow prayers. "There has been no law and order problem in old Srinagar for a long time and it is surprising to see that we were not allowed to offer Friday prayers,"

said a resident of Nowhatta. National Conference president Farooq Abdullah and Vice President Omar Abdullah claimed that by not allowing the Friday prayers at Jamia mosque, the government was betraying its own claims of normalcy.

"If the situation is good, then why the prayers were not allowed at Jamia Masiid?" Faroog Abdullah said while interacting with reporters in Srinagar.

"We are constantly treated to claims of normalcy in J&K and yet the administration betrays its own claims when it resorts to locking up one of our holiest mosques thus denying people the chance to offer prayers on the last Friday of Ramzan," Omar tweet-

Apni Party leader and Srinagar Mayor, Junaid Mattoo condemned the action of disallowing prayers at Jamia Masjid.

"Law and order concerns and management shouldn't be allowed to evolve into vetos and policy/ administrative embargos curtailing fundamental religious rights," he tweeted.

J&K People's Conference Vice President Basharat Bukhari castigated the administration for not allowing Friday prayers in Jamia Masjid today.

Kashmiri separatist group All Parties Hurriyat Conference said the repeated closure of the historic and central Jamia Masjid srinagar by the authorities belies the claims that "all is well now " in "Naya

Kashmir ' "Not allowing Jumat-ul-Vida prayers at the historic Jama masjid, on such an important religious day when lakhs of namazis from all over the valley traditionally pray at the Masjid for its great religious significance, is condemnable," a statement by the APHC said.

"It is a direct violation of people's fundamental right to practice their religion," the statement ended. "Such measures are a reminder that things on the

ground in Kashmir are not what is being propagated to outside world by strictly controlled narrative and huge number of forces on the ground," the

It said the weather will remain generally cloudy with intermittent Light to moderate rain with light snow over higher reaches and thunderstorm, lightning at widespread places of Kashmir Division and many places of Jammu Division on April 18-19.

On April 20 and 21 the weather will remain generally cloudy with intermittent Light rain, thunderstorm and Lightning at few places there after the weather is likely to remain partly cloudy but dry from April 22 to April 27.

An independent weather observer Faizan Ariftold UNI that Jammu and Kashmir is likely to experience the impact of two consecutive Western Disturbances in the upcoming week. He said the first WD is expected to arrive on April 16 and will be followed by another WD around April 18.

He said the second WD can decrease the day temperature over 10 degrees Celsius from the normal. Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir, recorded a low of 9.0 degree Celsius against 7.2

degree Celsius on the previous night and it was 1.4 above normal during this period of the season. The maximum temperature was 7.1 degree Celsius above normal of 20.1 degree Celsius in Srinagar on

Qazigund, on Srinagar-Jammu national highway settled on 6.0 degree Celsius for the second consecutive day and it was 0.5 degree Celsius below

normal for the gateway town of Kashmir. Pahalgam, recorded a low of 3.6 degree Celsius against 3.2 degree Celsius on the previous night and it was 0.8 degree Celsius above normal for the famous

(Modi-ji, there is something I need to tell you.)" Little Seerat then pans the phone camera towards an uncovered concrete surface, right in front of two closed doors which she identifies as the "principal's office and the staff room".

"Dekho humara farsh kitna ganda ho chuka hain. Humein yahan niche bithate hain (Look how dirty

the floor is. They make us sit here).' The chubby-cheeked girl then takes PM, Modi, on a virtual tour of the school building, saying, "Chalo mein aap ko bari si building dikhati hoon aapne school ki (let me show you the big building where our school is)".

As she walks a further few steps and bends the lens to the right, an unfinished building comes into view. "Yeh dekho, pichle 5 saalon se, dekho kitni gandi building hain yahan pe. Chalo mein aap ko andar se dikhati hoon (Look how unclean the building has been for the last 5 years. Let me take you on a tour of the inside of the building)".

After directing the lens to where the students sit for their classes, she once again points to the floor

and the visible layer of dirt on it.

"Please, aap se na request karti hoon, aap na achha sa school bana do. Humein niche baithna parta hain aur hamari uniform gandi ho jati hain aur phir humein Mamma marti hain. Humare pas bench bhi nahin hain (I request you to build us a nice school. We have to sit on the floor because of which our uniforms get dirty. My mother often scolds me for this. We don't even have benches to sit on)."

She then takes an unplastered flight of stairs to the first floor and pans her lens towards the corridor, which has a similar unclean appearance as the ground floor.

"Please Modi-ji, mein aap se request karti hoon ki achha sa bana de yeh school. Meri bhi baat sun lo (Please Modi-ji, I am requesting you to make my school better. Please grant my wish)".

She then skips down the stairs and proceeds to the outer compound with her lens firmly directed towards the unclean surface.

The little one pans her lens out towards the "toilet", which barely has the appearance of one.

"Dekho, humara kitna ganda toilet aur tut gaya hain (Look how filthy and broken our toilet is)." She then points to an open area where she says a

new school building is coming up. Giving a further first-hand view of the glaring lack of amenities at the school, she shows how the students don't even have functional toilets and have to relieve themselves in the open.

She then directs her lens towards a pit where the students go to relieve themselves.

"Humein iss naali mein jana parta hain (We need to head to this pit to relieve ourselves.)

The munchkin closes her video with a fervent appeal to PM Modi. "Modi-ji, aap poore desh ki sunte ho. Meri bhi sun lo aur achha sa humara veh school banwa do. Bilkul sundar sa school bana do taaki humein niche na baithna padhe. Taaki Mamma na mare. Taaki achhe se padhai karein. Humara school please achhe se banwa do (Modi-ji, you listen to all the countrymen. Please listen to me too and build us a good school. The school should be such that we don't have to sit on the floor. So that my mother doesn't scold or cane me. So that we could all study well. Please have a nice school constructed for us)," she signs off saying.

HC Refuses.....

The court dismissed the petition filed by 26-year-old Javed Ahmed Hajam seeking to quash the first information report (FIR) registered against him by Hatkanangale police station in Maharashtra's Kolhapur district under section 153 A of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) for promoting enmity.

Hajam, originally from Baramulla district of Jammu and Kashmir, was a professor at a colege in Kolhapur.

The allegation against Hajam is that between August 13 and 15, 2022 he had put a status on his WhatsApp 'August 5 Black Day Jammu & Kashmir' with a message below saying 'Article 370 was abrogated, we are not happy' and '14th August Happy Independence Day Pakistan'.

Hajam, in his plea in the high court, said he had not circulated any messages that would promote enmity or bring disharmony or feeling of hatred between religions. He claimed that he had merely put his view on his WhatsApp

The bench, however, opined that the first status message on Article 370 constituted an offence under section 153A of the IPC, but the second status message on Pakistan's Indepen-

dence Day did not. "The first message which has been posted on WhatsApp by the petitioner (Hajam) is without giving any reason and without making any critical analysis of the step taken by the central government towards abrogation of Article 370 of the Constitution," the court said in its order

"In our view, this message has the tendency to play with emotions of different groups of people in India as there are strong feelings of contrasting nature about the status of Jammu and Kashmir in India and therefore, one has to tread cautiously in such a field," the high court

If any criticism is to be made, it must be upon evaluation of all pros and cons of the situation and backed by reason, the court added.

"No doubt, in a democratic country like India where there is a fundamental right in the nature of freedom of speech and expression under Article 19, every word of criticism and every view of dissent is important for maintaining democracy in a good state of health," HC said.

"But we may add that at least in sensitive matters any critical words or dissenting view must be expressed after proper analysis of the whole situation and must provide the reasons for which the critique or dissent is made," it

This is more so when the emotions and sentiments behind a particular thing or aspect being criticised run high with different shades and hues among different groups of people, the bench said.

"In such a case, the criticism, disagreement, difference of opinion, dissent, whatever one may choose to call, must be expressed upon an in-depth analysis and accompanied by reasons so that the appeal that such critique makes is not to the emotions of groups of people but to the reason; the logic; the rationale

of the groups of people," the order said. It added that when appeal is to the reason then there is least possibility of stirring up emotions, but when the appeal is to the emotions then the reason is the casualty.

"When reason falls victim to the emotions, there results ill-will, hatred, public disturbance and negativity all around," the high court said.

The court, however, noted that the second status wishing Pakistan a Happy Independence was not covered by section 153A of the IPC as "no reasonable person with a strong mind would see anything wrong in celebrating Independence Day of other countries without denouncing the celebration of Independence

Day of one's own country". The bench refused to quash the FIR and dismissed Hajam's petition. (Agencies)

Spray fungicide.....

rains, because rain causes leaf surfaces to be wet, a requirement for most foliar diseases, and rain may splash spores from leaf to leaf and from plant to plant.

Therefore, if one is able to coat plants with fungicides prior to a rain, the plant is better protected from disease, they said.

"Periods of wet weather are when a plant is most vulnerable to foliar disease. Fungicides, properly applied, may help to prevent or slow the initiation of disease and the spread of disease which commonly occurs during or shortly after a rain," They added.

Dr Tariq Rasool, a senior scientist at SKUAST (Sher-i-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology) said that as rains are predicted from Sunday, growers must spray fungicide before rains to avoid scab.

Orchards where over 50 to 60 percent petals have fallen must be sprayed with any SKUAST recommended fungicide to avoid any disease in future, he said.

Those Orchardists who have sprayed in around last week of March and apple flowers are in full, they too can go far fungicides as per the last ;ast research it has been found safe to spray fungicide in bloom and there won't be any effect on the fruit, he said.

Diseases like scab won't see that it is in the flowering stage and it won't attack but it can attack anytime and those who have spraved before 15-20 days must spray fungicide before it rains, he said.

He advised farmers that they must use mist spray not full speed spray so that it won't damage the petals and fruits and mist spray must be used always and the practice of bathing the whole tree must be avoided.

"Best time for spray is morning and this is the critical stage of the scab so people must avoid mixing more pesticides and insecticides and focus on fungicide only this time," he said.

He said that even if it rains, a few hours after spraying fungicide, it will still provide protection to the fruit and keep diseases at bay.



One of the greatest aspects of the education is technical education. Though it is very important to have general moral education also, technical education plays an equally important role in the developmental process of a nation. Higher education generally falls, into two categories, either training in the fine arts, the humanities, cultural patterns and behaviour that aims to develop a man's overall personality. On the other hand, technical education aims primarily at equipping a man for work in the practical sense of getting him fit for a job.

Liberal education, in origin, has its roots in our society is older than technical education and obviously, it is more popular than technical education in our country. But the need of the hour is to build up a strong base in technical education too, that would help our country to stand at power with other powerful countries of the world. It was only with the advancement of industrialization that the people came to realize the importance of technical education. The Industrial Revolution brought about a great change in the outlook of men regarding education. After the industrial revolution, technical education was seen as a scope for the future and a lot of emphases was put on the topic at various education levels and an even separate council was also set up to ensure proper technical literacy. The increasing use of machinery was the major reason that compelled us to feel the necessity of technical education as a major need. All the developed, as well as developing countries of the world, have started to impart specialized training to their youths in order to maintain their supremacy in the field of the industrial revolution.

Technical education is something related very closely to the economic stability of a country too, good technical skills can effect some new technological innovations as well as also helpful in getting good jobs at national as well as international level. It, therefore, becomes very important for our technical education to undertake periodic review of the curriculum and subject content of the technical programmes to ensure that they are up to date and are effectively fulfilling the technological requirements of the country at par with international standards.

Development of Technical Education in India

Education scenario in our country has not been fair enough, before the advent of industrialization, education in India was the privilege of the upper class, and there were no major opportunities for others to gain some quality education. With the popularisation of Technical education in India, it has given a new dignity as well as status to the labour class and lower class in the country. The old myth that mental work is superior to physical work has been replaced by the new concept of education and physical work has gained a lot of respect as well as its due benefits and is looked upon as field of careers these days. Technical education makes a man capable of diving deep into the realities of life and presents before him a true picture of life.

India is gaining pace in the terms of technical education since the attainment of freedom the progress made in the field of technical education in the country is not bad, but in view of the tremendous need and the present circumstances, the pace of progress is not quite satisfactory and need some more reforms.

The beginning of formal Technical Education in India started way back to the mid of 19th Century. The major policy initiatives in the pre-independence period included appointment of the Indian Universities Commission in 1902,

issue of the Indian Education policy resolution in 1904 and the Governor General's policy statement. A major step was the formation of Indian Society for Technical Education (ISTE) that was founded in the year 1967 with a mission to advance for the cause of education in general and all its function which pertain to engineering and allied branches of engineering and technology, architecture and town planning, pharmacy, management, process of teaching and learning, research, extension services and public relations in particular. The main goal was to serve as a common agency for stimulating and guiding its members to formulate the general goals and responsibilities of technical education for the service of mankind and the advancement of general welfare.

Another major initiative in the terms of technical education was taken in the year 1987, with the development of AICTE that was the giving of statutory status by an Act of Parliament. AICTE is the All India Council for Technical Education, which was first established in 1945 and later given statutory status by the parliament in the year 1945.

To ensure proper technical education in the country, at par with international standards an advisory board was established. The All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) is the statutory body and a national-level council for technical education, under Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development. It can be seen way back in the year 1945 that an advisory board was established and later on in 1987 it was given statutory status by an Act of Parliament. All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) is responsible for proper planning and coordinated development of the technical education and management education system in India which is aimed to constantly improve the level of technical education in the country. The AICTE accredits postgraduate and graduate programs under specific categories at Indian institutions as per its charter, and is controlling body that approves all the technical institutes as well as colleges in

AICTE is not working alone in the field of technical education and is assisted by 10 Statutory Boards of Studies, namely, UG Studies in Eng. & Tech., PG and Research in Eng. and Tech., Management Studies, Vocational Education, Technical Education, Pharmaceutical Education, Architecture, Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Information Technology, Town and Country Planning. The AICTE has its headquarters in 7th Floor, Chanderlok Building, Janpath, New Delhi, which has the offices of the chairman, vice-chairman and the member secretary, plus it has regional offices at Kolkata, Chennai, Kanpur, Mumbai, Chandigarh, Guwahati, Bhopal, Bangalore,

Hyderabad and Gurgaon. There is a need for a governmental body that oversees all the aspect of the technical education in the country and makes sure everything is carried out in the field of technical education, as per the standards. This need was fulfilled by the AICTE, that is the statutory authority for planning, formulation and maintenance of norms and standards, quality assurance through school accreditation, funding in priority areas, monitoring and evaluation, maintaining parity of certification and awards and ensuring coordinated and integrated development and management of technical education in the country as part of the AICTE Act No. 52 of 1987.

Technical Education and Liberal Education

There is no doubt that at present there are very few good technical institutions in the country that are catering to the needs of the technically trained individual according to the international levels. Most of our young men have some preconceptions against all types of manual labour and mostly prefer a job in some office to doing work with their hands. Today everyone wants a white-collar job; as a result,

the manual labour is degrading. Unemployment, on the other hand, is also a major concern and hence stares at the youth of the country in the face. The jobs of clerks in offices too are limited. All educated young minds cannot be absorbed in this vocation. Hence need today is to have a high knowledge level in order to have a good

Technical education these days is only likely to succeed when a large part of the nation has become sufficiently literate. Technical education is not only limited to doing an engineering course or some high fees for designing course. It is an excellent thing to train an electrician's son in the latest development of his trade, but it is really absurd to expect him to become a first-class electrical engineer unless he has gone through a primary course with proper education. It is, therefore, not wise to put liberal and technical educations in water-tight compartments and there is a vast difference. The proper policy would be to stress liberal education in the early stage and then commence with the main course of technical education basing on the student's choice of scientific research on aptitude and inclination.

Challenges in the Field of Technical Education

Globalization has resulted in many new challenges in the field of the technical education system not only in our country but also around the world. With the growing modernization, the demand for trained technical workers is also increasing day by day. Also with the demand is rising the hunt for the quality. This scenario has also led to a lot of challenges in the field of technical education in our country. Till recently technologies were mostly imported to our country and the training needed for these technologies were generally carried abroad. Globalization has opened the economy to global players in the industry and service sectors as a result of which, new products and services are being introduced continuously with improved quality and customer focus. The most important factor in the success of this new brand of industries and service units is only by meeting them with a group of highly motivated and meticulously trained forces in the field of technical education. The knowledge and technical skills of this workforce have to be regularly updated. The engineer coming out of our institution should be capable of meeting the challenges of the modern industry and the question is what are we really capable of this?

There is no doubt that India is rich in mineral resources but it is also a fact that most of them have not yet been explored. The government is committed to utilizing this wealth, but the problem is that we do not have sufficient level to explore these resources by ourselves, with the present level of our technical literacy. More and more technical institutions are, therefore, being opened with a vision to raise the level of technical education in the country. A large number of technical hands are pouring out of our universities every year. It is a happy sign of the times but unfortunately, our industries are still mediocre and the number of jobs is less. It would be harsh to say that we are lacking far behind, but the fact is that we are a developing nation still struggling to reach out some unexplored resources. Our quest to achieve is the main driving force towards the success, and we need to capitalize the fact.

Conclusion

No nation could generate the progress unless it promotes technical aspects in its fields. The technical education produces technicians for all type of industries and it is true that the progress of a country much depends upon its Industrialization without which a handsome economy would not be possible, so need today is to formulate a technical education system that not only caters to the needs of the present, but also prepare us for the future.

Puffin' and pantin' on the Roald Dahl beach

Roald Dahl has been dead for over 30 years. Never was he more in trouble than now. Dahl was a Royal Air force pilot. In 1940, his plane crashed in Libya and he was severely injured in the spine and head. Months later, he recovered. When the war was over, he took up writing seriously, and we discovered he was a genius. It is possible that the brush with death—the broken spine and the cracked skull-touched off new nerves; pain and trauma are potentially regenerative.

A fortnight ago, Puffin, the children's publishing wing of Penguin, brought out a revised edition of Dahl's short stories for kids, not only with the help of virtuous editors but also with the active aid of censors. They hired Sensitivity Readers to go over Dahl's texts, as reported by The Guardian, which, like many other newspapers, has carried a series of articles condemning the Puffin effort to make a good man

An aside. The Guardian has been a leader of the liberal banners of the universe to make the planet a better place. Indian media, often brave when the government in power is soft, has followed suit. Well, they seem to have completely forgotten that they did everything in their power to "appear good" and "progressive" at every opportunity and that they contributed to the cancel culture whose latest victim is Dahl.

To generalise on Dahl's plane crash and pains. True writing is not possible without experience, which is why an imitative software like ChatGPT must fail. The prescriptive society we are at pains to evolve revolts against the idea of experience, and, therefore, against art. You must fall to rise. "To live, to err, to fall, to triumph, to recreate life out of life!' Joyce said. Well, if Joyce resurfaced in our midst, he is not likely to be published for reasons of misogyny, racism, and obscenity. Great writing is not against Man. It is against all that is imperfect in the human condition. By critiquing the present, the written word sets a higher standard for the

In varying degrees, the cancel culture has affected the standing of writers like Nabokov, Heming-



way, Enid Blyton, Peter Handke, and J K Rowling. In keeping with the re-emergence of the visual culturea kind of return to the primitive civilisation—as opposed to the written culture, it is the word that is taking the brunt of the reformist zeal of the virtuous, not the abstract arts like painting or music. Naturally, there are more writers paying the price than other artists.

Dahl's short stories are like miniature explosions. In one of his early stories, Madame Rosette, for example, a couple of young RAF pilots based in Cairo during the war get hilariously drunk and plan to save ("It is the chivalry of the army", a sentence repeatedly uttered by one of the cheerfully inebriated characters) a bunch of women from the hands of Madame Rosette who runs a brothel. She is described in

all the banned words of today: "short, fat,...greasy"; "a large mudcolored face"; "a small fish mouth..."; "a trace of black mustache". All these play to a type so that the "chivalry of the army" comes through.

Without the misogyny—which to my mind is as congenital a condition as might be obesity or queerness—the saving of the girls will never be romantic and comic enough. The story was written in the early 1940s. It is good to ask: why should Penguin (which brought out the short stories of Dahl and profited) not edit these offending descriptions, so the parents of Puffin readers, too, are reformed?

The Sensitivity Readers that Puffin hiredearned their keep by removing/ adding words and sentences and changing the tone and mood of the stories, so kids do not grow up toxic. No matter that the same kids watch porn on the internet and are addicted to violent games.

That Puffin's convent idea of literature brings into question the legacies and intellectual property rights of authors is part of the problem. The equally important part is the puffery at the heart of the lib-

eral enterprise. For instance, in the story Matilda, a sentence that previously read "crazy with frustration" now says "wild with frustration". In Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, the description of the boy, Augustus Gloop, has changed from "enormously fat" to just "enormous". The Cloud Men characters in James and the Giant Peach are now Cloud People.

In what way is this different from the Victorian idea of good behavior that would encourage women to refer to a man's legs as "understandings"? The textual changes in Dahl's work add up to a massive act of censorship. And this is carried out not by the State, not the social media mobs of the Left and the Right, but by a publishing house.

At this rate, it is safe to assume that Shakespeare's Get Thee To A Nunnery passage (Hamlet admonishing a frozen, waxen Ophelia) will be soon dropped from college texts. When institutions preach ethics, one can safely assume potent individual revolts are being preempted.

When a whole society is caught in a reformist frenzy, witch-hunting and lynching become hard to distinguish from a collective compulsive mental disorder to be seen as samar-

The latest development in the Dahl story is that Puffin will go back to restoring the prodigal writer to his original text. It will, however, offer both versions-original and rewritten-for readers to choose from. This follows the public outcry, led by the likes of Philip Pullman and Salman Rushdie. Too late. Puffin remains exposed: at heart, it is not a publisher, but a policeman.

When the government of the day comes down on free speech, at least the binary of the situation is clear. But what is one to do when publishing houses take the initiative to virtually silence an author? A fourletter word comes to mind, and it is not love, as Sensitivity Readers might like to think.

"BJP Carrying Out Fake Encounters With Eye On Polls": Akhilesh Yadav's Claim

Ahmad, his son and several others are accused in the Umesh Pal murder case in UP, the fallout of which made Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath swear in the Assembly that he would wipe out the mafia there.

Speaking to reporters after paying tribute to eminent jurist and social reformer Babasaheb Ambedkar at his birthplace Mhow on his birth anniversary, Mr Yadav said the Constitution, of which the former was the chief architect, was under threat.

"Institutions are being finished one after the other and (Bharatiya Janata Party) governments (at the Centre and UP) are working to destroy the Constitution Babasaheb gave us," Mr Yadav said.

Queried about Thursday's encounter, Mr Yadav said,

"From the very first day, (the Uttar Pradesh) BJP government is indulging in fake encounters with an eye on polls." However, on being asked about allegations that Atiq Ahmad had connections to Pakistani elements, Mr Yadav just said "what can I say about the connections he has and with whom".

He slammed the BJP government in UP for action against a mother-daughter duo in Kanpur, during which their houses were bulldozed and burnt down, leading to both losing their lives.

Mr Yadav also alleged a promising student leader was killed in Ballia by those belonging to the "caste of the (UP) chief minister". "Is it an India where you can kill a weaker person? Is it an India where we won't get our Constitutional rights,"

that had encircled them in Jhansi on Thursday. Ahmad, his son and several others are accused in the Umesh Pal murder case in UP, the fallout of which made Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath swear in the Assembly that he would wipe out the mafia

Arvind Kejriwal Summoned By CBI In Delhi Liquor Policy Case On Sunday: Sources

New Delhi: Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has been summoned by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) for questioning over alleged corruption in the capital's now-scrapped alcohol sales policy that led to the arrest of his deputy Manish Sisodia in February, sources have told NDTV. The CBI has asked Mr Kejriwal to appear for questioning on Sunday, sources said, making it the first instance in recent memory where a Chief Minister has been summoned by the central agency in an investigation. The CBI is investigating allegations that the liquor policy implemented by the Delhi government last year, which ended government control over the sale of liquor in the capital, gave undue advantages to private retailers. Alleging the involvement of the "highest levels" of Mr Kejriwal's government in the swindle, the agency has claimed crores in kickbacks were paid for favours in the policy and funnelled into his Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) election campaign in Goa last year.

"A Dangerous Plot": Congress Leader On Proposal For **New Term For Widows**

Mumbai: Former Maharashtra minister and Congress leader Yashomati Thakur on Friday said the state government's proposal to refer to widows as 'Ganga Bhagirathi' was a "dangerous plot" and conspiracy, and alleged that "Manuwadi" forces were constantly trying to restrain women and other sections of the society. Patna: Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, tasked with bringing together Opposition parties that have no love lost for the Congress to forge a grand alliance against the BJP, today said that he has spoken to all parties and "they are ready". Sources say that Nitish Kumar has agreed to speak to parties who remain equidistant from the BJP and the Congress. He has already met with Arvind Kejriwal. "I am



completely with him. It is extremely necessary that the entire opposition and the country come together and change the government at the Centre," Mr Kejriwal said after the meeting.

Gearing up for a potential election rematch against Donald Trump, the Irish-American Democrat dwelt on the success of Irish emigres in carving out a new life far from home.

The United States and Ireland were joined in "not just the hope but the conviction that better days lie ahead", he said in a speech to the Irish parliament, after his motorcade was cheered by large crowds in Dublin.

Seeming to draw a firm contrast to some US Republicans' dystopian vision for the future of America, Biden added: "We have the

power to build a better future." But, following a testy visit to Belfast prior to Dublin, Biden also issued a pointed warning that the UK "should be working closer with Ireland" to protect a 25-year-old peace deal in Northern Ireland.

Extradited Pakistani man charged with police officer's killing in UK

74-year-old man who was extradited from Pakistan appeared in court in London on Thursday, charged with murdering a UK police officer nearly 18 years ago. Piran Ditta Khan is accused of killing Sharon Beshenivsky, who was shot as she tried to foil a robbery at a travel agency in November

Beshenivsky's female colleague was also injured in the incident in Bradford, northern England. Neither officer was armed.

The rare fatal shooting of a police officer on duty in Britain triggered widespread shock and revived calls for police to routinely carry guns.

Beshenivsky, 38, had three children and two stepchildren. She had been an officer with West Yorkshire Police for only nine months before her death.

Khan, who was arrested in Pakistan in January 2020, was extradited to the UK on Tuesday, the Crown Prosecution Service said late on Wednesday.

As well as murder, he is also facing a single charge of robbery, two counts of possession of a firearm with intent to endanger life and two counts of possession

of a prohibited weapon. Charges against him were authorised in 2006, the CPS, which is responsible for prosecutions in England and Wales, said.Khan appeared before a magistrate in central London and was remanded in custody until

a further hearing on Monday. No pleas were entered. Six men have previously been jailed in connection with the shooting, including a Somali national who was sentenced to a minimum of 35 years in jail.

Qatar and Bahrain re-establish relations

Bahrain's foreign ministry released a similar statement, the country's state news agency reported.

Saudi Arabia, the UAE, Bahrain and Egypt imposed a blockade in 2017, accusing Qatar of supporting extremist organisations in the region and becoming too close to Iran. The four countries banned Qatari planes and ships from using their airspace and territo-

'Patience, reciprocity' needed in dealing with Kabul: Khar

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan once again warned the international community against abandoning Afghanistan, which is currently facing a humanitarian crisis and needs urgent assistance to survive.

Speaking at the Ministerial Meeting of the Neighbours of Afghanistan in Samarkand on Thursday, Minister of State Hina Rabbani Khar called for 'patience' and 'reciprocity', saying that the international community should continue to engage $with the interim Afghan \, government. ``We$ need to be flexible. This process should be appropriately incentivised," she suggested.

She said Pakistan firmly believed that humanitarian support should remain delinked from any political considerations.

She mentioned Kabul's decision to suspend education for women and girls and to prevent female staff members from working for national and international NGOs. Says Pakistan believes aid should be delinked from political considerations

The minister regretted that some of the policies and actions of the interim Afghan government didn't provide an incentive for engagement.

Ms Khar said people were questioning the utility of engaging with the interim Afghan government as she called these approaches "misplaced and need to be re-assessed".

"The international community currently finds itself at a standstill with Afghanistan. The cascade of unmet expec-



tations has meant that critical support needed by Afghanistan to stave off a grave humanitarian crisis, prevent an economic meltdown and combat terrorism has been withheld", she said.

"We cannot talk of the Afghan people without talking to them. Constructive engagement with the Interim Afghan Government remains imperative. As friends and neighbours, we don't have the luxury to disengage with Afghanistan", she said.

Noting that connectivity has remained a pipe dream for far too long, Ms Khar advocated for turning this 'constraint' into a conduit for regional peace and prosperity.Connectivity projects such as CASA-1000, Trans-Afghan Railways, TAPI and others, were not merely economic undertakings, they were strategic investments for a shared future, the minister noted.On the sidelines of the conference, Ms Khar met with the foreign ministers of China, Russia and Iran.

IMF chief urges world to avoid a 'second Cold War'

WASHINGTON: Countries must do more to avert the costly consequences of growing global trade fragmentation, and help averta "second Cold War," the International Monetary Fund's (IMF) managing director said on Thursday. "I am among those who know what are

the consequences of a Cold War: it is loss of talent and contribution to the world," Kristalina Georgieva said during a press conference at the official start of the World Bank and IMF's spring meetings. "I don't want to see that repeating," she

said, adding that the world should "rationally accept there will be some cost, there will be some fragmentation, but keep these costs low." Georgieva was born and raised in Bulgaria, a former Soviet satellite state.

Multilateral institutions like the World Bank and IMF have an important role to play in preventing the world from splintering into different blocs with severe eco-

nomic consequences, she said. An IMF report earlier this week predicted that growing trade fragmentation resulting from events like Brexit, the US-China trade war and the Russian invasion of Ukraine, could make the global economy as much as seven per cent smaller than it

otherwise would have been. Policymakers had a crucial role to play to "defend the interests" of their citizens, Georgieva said. "If we fail to be more rational, then people everywhere will be worse off," she said.

Progress has been made on a number of



key issues for the World Bank and IMF, the Bank's outgoing president, David Malpass, said earlier on Thursday at an event marking the official start of the spring meetings.

Member states agreed on a number of steps to boost the World Bank's financial capacity, he said, freeing it up to lend "as much as \$50 billion of new financing" over the next decade.

French president Emmanuel Macron will host a summit in June which will look to extend some of these new rules to other financial institutions and build a "new financial framework," the French finance minister Bruno Le Maire told reporters.

The Bank and IMF's leaders said progress had also been made on replenishing lending facilities for low-income countries which have been depleted by the twin impact of the Covid-19 pandemic and the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

Ireland, Saudi Arabia, the UK, Portugal and Japan have all already come forward with "substantial new pledges or contributions" towards replenishing these funds in recent days, Georgieva said.

Yemen prisoner swap starts as truce talks set for second round

A major prisoner exchange involving hundreds of captives from Yemen's civil war got underway on Friday after truce talks ended with an agreement to hold a second round.

The first plane departed Sanaa, the rebel-held capital, for government-controlled Aden hours after a Saudi delegation departed without a fresh truce but with plans to meet again.

Both initiatives come a month after Gulf heavyweights Saudi Arabia and Iran, who back opposing sides in the Yemeni conflict, agreed to re-establish ties, prompting a wider rapprochement across the



troubled region.

On Friday, 322 prisoners will fly on International Committee of the Red Cross planes between Sanaa and Aden, on the first day of an operation that will see 887 prisoners released.

"The first flight from Sanaa has left," ICRC media adviser Jessica Moussan told AFP, signalling the start of

the three-day exchange. Among the prisoners to

be released by the Houthis on Friday are Yemen's former defence minister, Major General Mahmud al-Subaihi, and the brother of the ex-president, Major General Nasser Mansur Hadi,

officials said. The biggest prisoner swap since 2020 is taking place after a delegation from Saudi Arabia, which launched a military intervention in support of the beleaguered government in 2015, held talks with Yemen's Iran-backed Houthis this week in an attempt to end hostilities.

The Saudi delegation, led by Ambassador Mohammed al-Jaber, left Sanaa late on Thursday without a finalised truce but with an agreement to meet again, according to Huthi and Yemeni government sourc-

"There is an initial agreement on a truce that should be announced later on if finalised," a Huthi official said on condition of anonymity, in the information that was confirmed by a government source.

US airman arrested over classified leaks

WASHINGTON: FBI agents on Thursday arrested a young national guardsman suspected of being behind a major leak of sensitive US government secrets — including about the Ukraine war. US Attorney General Merrick Garland announced the arrest made "in connection with an investigation into alleged unauthorised removal, retention and transmission of classified national defense information".

Addressing a news briefing, Garland named the suspect as Jack Teixeira - previously identified by US media as a 21-year-old airman, and the apparent leader of an online chat room where the document trove first emerged.

Garland confirmed that Teixeira is an employee of the United States Air Force National Guard, and said FBI agents took him into custody "without incident".

trove first emerged News helicopter footage showed the suspect, in red shorts with his hands behind his back, being placed by heavily-armed agents into an unmarked sports utility vehicle, in a forested area in North Dighton, in the northeastern state of Massachusetts. Teixeira was due to make an initial appearance at the US District Court for the District of Massachusetts.

US media began honing in on Teixeira after The Washington Post reported that hundreds of pages of documents had been posted on the social media platform Discord by a man who worked on a US military base.

Like in other cancers, in ovarian cancer also the cancer cells begin to line up along the abdominal cavity. Large masses like tumours take up a lot of space in the abdominal area, leading to changes in appetite, like feeling full very quickly or not feeling

Some people with bloating due to cancer also experience chronic nausea and vom-

Congestive Heart Failure

Congestive heart failure or CHF also results in bloating, not just in the abdomen but with swelling in the legs too. According to the American Heart Association, other symptoms of CHF include fatigue, breathlessness, and heart palpitations.

STI Increase: Syphilis Cases Spike 74% in Four Years

exually transmitted infections (STIs) like syphilis, chlamydia, and gonorrhea continued to rise in 2021, a new reportTrusted Source from U.S. Centers for Diseases Control and Preven-

tion (CDC). Over 2.5 million STIs were reported in the United States in 2021, marking a 7% increaseTrusted Source in cases between 2017 and 2021.

Cases of increases in syphilis saw the biggest spike, growing by 32% between 2020 and 2021.

The CDC says the COVID-19 pandemic, which drove many people to forego or delay prevention services like testing, contributed to the spread

Even before the pandemic hit, however, STIs were on the riseTrusted Source — a trend that has disproportionately impacted ethnic minority groups, gay and bisexual men, and

people younger than age 25. "Rates of STIs continue to increase in the U.S. with alarming numbers over the past few years. Changes in sexual behavior with a decrease in condom use, decrease in prevention and testing efforts are likely the major contributors to the increase in STIs in the U.S.," says Dr. Maria Alcaide, an infectious disease specialist with UHealth, University of Miami Health System and a professor of Medicine with the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine.

What's behind the uptick in STIs? Between 2017 and 2021Trusted Source, cases of gonorrhea have increased by about 28%, cases of syphilis have increased by nearly 74%, and cases of congenital syphilis have increased by over 203%.

The report showed that cases of chlamydia dropped by 4%, but the researchers suspect the decline is due to reduced prevention and public health efforts during the pandemic and not an actual decrease in infec-



"The COVID-19 pandemic may have contributed to the rising rates of STIs as people may have had less access to education, testing, and treatment," Dr. Alcaide says. But STIs were swiftly rising even before the pandemic hit.

DataTrusted Source suggests barriers to care, discrimination, and the stigma attached to STIs have all contributed to the rise in STIs.

Reduced condom use, a decrease in prevention and screening efforts, and opioid useTrusted Source, which is known to go hand-in-hand with STIs, are believed to have played a role, too.

Why syphilis is spreading the fastestBetween 2020 and 2021 alone, syphilis rose by 32%.

"While most of new syphilis cases occur among men who have sex with

men, we are also seeing an increasing number of cases among women, which reflects the increase in congenital syphilis," Alcaide said. Dr. Irene Stafford, a maternal-fetal

medicine physician and an associate professor of OB/GYN with McGovern Medical School at UTHealth Houston, says syphilis is often a silent infection that presents with no symptoms. "The rash and lesions of early syph-

ilis can be asymptomatic and after they clear, an infected individual is unaware they are still infected," she

People who are infected can then unknowingly spread it to others through skin-to-skin contact or mucosal contact with an infected person.

"Transmission is easier than with other STIs that are transmitted through sexual intercourse," says Alcaide. How to prevent and detect STIsMany STIs can be asymptomatic in certain individuals, however, left untreated, can lead to complicationsTrusted Source like chronic pelvic pain, pelvic inflammatory disease, infertility, pregnancy complications, an increased risk of contracting infections like HIV, and infant death.

Syphilis, for example, is more common in reproductive-aged people, including pregnant women, according to Dr. Stafford. Untreated, the infection can be

passed to the fetus and lead to health complicationsTrusted Source, like speed and liver problems and nerve issues, due to congenital syphilis.

To prevent the spread of STIs, all sexually-active people should get regularly tested once a year.

"If there is a new sexual partner, unprotected sex, recent STIs, or a partner with STIs testing should be done more frequently," says Alcaide.

STI screenings and open conversations should be a part of all routine health care visits, according to Stafford, not just when people have behavioral risk factors.






