

Srinagar, Jun 10: Stating that no power curtailment schedule has been announced in the Valley, the Kashmir Power Distribution Corporation Limited (KPDCL) on Saturday said that the electricity is being supplied as per the availability. Talking to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Chief Engineer, KPDCL, Javed Yousuf Dar said that there has been no circular with regard to the power curtailment in Kashmir. "The KPDCL has not announced any power curtailment," he said when asked about the reports regarding two-hour power curtailment in morning and evening.

However, he said that the KP-DCL has been managing the electricity supply to the people accord-



ing to the availability.

"The electricity is being made available by JKPCL and we have been maintaining the electricity as per the availability and thus we have to go for the power curtail-

On June 05, KNO reported that Jammu and Kashmir has recorded a 25 per cent sudden cut in the power supply, a move that has triggered a "temporary power deficit in the UT.

Officials' privy to the development had said that the J&K's power supply has been cut by 25 per cent without "any clear reasons."

Kashmir region, as per official sources will face the brunt of the power shortage given the soaring temperatures in Jammu, where the power department is resorting to minimum possible cuts.

Srinagar, June 10 (UNI) Jammu and Kashmir Waqf Board on Saturday issued orders to ban entry of Footwear into the praying areas of Mosques and Shrines, officials said.

Chairperson of the Jammu and Kashmir Waqf Board Syed Darakhshan Andrabi has issued orders to ban entry of footwear into prayer areas of Waqf controlled Mosques and shrines.

"The devotees and worshippers are often seen praying in the vicinity of the footwear they carry along, that not only creates unhygienic conditions, but also breaches the sacrosanctity of these religious places", the order reads.

It has also directed the Engineering Wing and the other staff accordingly to put in place necessary arrangements for safe custody of footwear outside the praying areas by installation of Shoe racks under CCTV Surveillance.

NC dismayed over massive power outages across Kashmir

Says unannounced load shedding has added to people's woes

Srinagar, June 10 (GNS): The Jammu and Kashmir National Conference Saturday lamented the divisional administration of Kashmir on massive load shedding across the valley, saying the unprecedented scenario has broken all previous records of power outages.

In a joint statement Zone Presidents Ali Muhammad Dar, Dr. Bashir Ahmed Veeri, and Javed Dar said, "The ruling dispensations both at the center and the local administration in J&K are sleeping over the pressing need to find an early solution to the worst ever power crises in Kashmir."

"Such a crisis has never been witnessed in the last three decades. On one hand, the Govt has whimsically and highhandedly increased power tariffs and renewed old agreements. Tariff is also extracted forcefully notwithstanding the financial conditions of consumers while electricity continues to play hide and seek with the consumers," they added.

After the major power outages this summer, People are unable to cope up with the situation as they continue to face cuts of five to six hours now, they said adding, "In some areas, the power cut has been for over 24 hours. Despite tall claims of improvement in the power scenario, nothing has changed on ground. This summer, the power consumers of Kashmir valley had faced a double whammy an increase in tariffs and 31-hour to 56hour weekly power curtailments. Now when the people had expected relief, the KPDCL again resorted to the curtailment more particularly with the onset of June."

DCDRC Baramulla solves 08 years old Case of Complainant Rs. 30k fine/other Penalties imposed on Opposite Parties

BARAMULLA, JUNE 10: In a significant development, District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission (DCDRC) Baramulla has solved 08 years old case filed before the erstwhile District Consumer Forum Baramulla under Section 12 of the Consumer Protection Act 1987 by complainant Irshad Ahmad Sheikh against the Sopore Electronics and Samsung Service Care Centre Baramulla by imposing a fine of Rs 30,000 and other penalties.

It is worth mentioning here that

soon after the establishment of DCDRC Baramulla, the long pending cases of people are initiated and the proceedings on different litigations/cases are carried out for early redressal.

With regard to the case, DCDRC Baramulla has issued an order stating that a complaint has been filed before the erstwhile District Consumer Forum Baramulla way back in the year 2015 under Section 12 of the Consumer Protection Act 1987 which $could\,not\,be\,adjudicated\,till\,the\,estab$ lishment of the DCDRC Baramulla.

The facts to the present Complaint are that Irshad Ahmed Sheikh (hereinafter referred to as the Complainant in the instant Complaint) has averred that he purchased a mobile phone model Samsung galaxy 7262 from Sopore Electronics main Chowk Sopore on 07/07/2014, against the payment of Rs. 5900 but after few days the said mobile could not func-

The Complainant has contended that he approached the Samsung service centre Baramulla on 20/07/2014, for repairs of the defective mobile phone, although the service centre formatted the memory card but the mobile phone could not function. Thereafter he approached the said service centre again on 25/07/2014,

but neither the mobile phone was site parties for replacement of the repaired nor it was replaced by the Opposite Party.

The Complainant has further contended that since at the time of purchasing the mobile phone he was a student of Kashmir University and has purchased mobile to help him in studies but his hopes to improve performance in the academics were shattered as he could not afford to buy a new mobile phone, which constrained him to approach to Consumer Court for redressal of his grievances.

Alleging to be a case of deficiency of services, the Complainant prayed for appropriate direction to the Oppomobile phone and the compensation of an Amount of Rupees One Lac, for loss of time, strain and stress caused to the Complainant.

"Notices were issued to the Opposite Parties but none appeared despite services and they were accordingly preceded Ex Parte."

The Complainant submitted the defective Mobile Phone before the Court and adduced himself as Witness in person besides he adduced another person as Witness Haroon Rashid. 'The Witness stated before the Court that the Complainant purchased a Mobile phone from Sopore Electronics, Main Chowk Sopore, which became non-functional within two days. He approached the Samsung Service Centre Baramulla for repairs of the said defective phone.

Though the Service Centre rectified the defective Mobile phone but the Mobile phone could not function again which constrained the complainant to approach the Consumer Court for redressal of his grievance, said the Witness person.

After going through the case file and the documents placed on record, the Commission is of the considered view that the sole grouse of the Complaint is that the mobile in question

Russia to deploy tactical N-weapons in Belarus

MOSCOW: Russia will start deploying tactical nuclear weapons in Belarus after special storage facilities are made ready on July 7 and 8, President Vladimir Putin said on Friday, Moscow's first move of such warheads outside Russia since the fall of the Soviet Union.

Putin announced in March he had agreed to deploy such weapons in Belarus, pointing to US deployment of tactical nuclear weapons in a host of European countries over many decades.

"Everything is going according to plan," Putin told Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko, discussing the planned nuclear deployment over a meal at the Russian leader's summer retreat in the Black Sea resort of Sochi.

"Preparation of the relevant facilities ends on July 7-8, and we will immediately begin activities related to the deployment of appropriate types of weapons on your territory," Putin said, according to a Kremlin transcript of his remarks.

Lukashenko said: "Thank you, Vladimir Vladimirovich."

More than 15 months into the biggest land war in Europe since World War II, Putin says the United States and its Western allies are pumping arms into Ukraine as part of an expanding proxy war aimed at bringing Russia to its knees.



Putin, 70, casts the war as a battle for Russia's own survival in the face of what he says is an ever-expanding Nato. He has warned the West that Moscow will not backdown.UkrainianPresidentVolodymyr Zelenskiy says Ukraine will not rest until every Russian soldier is ejected from his country, and wants it to join Nato as soon

as possible. Putin's nuclear move is being watched closely by both the United States and its Nato allies in Europe and by China, which has repeatedly cautioned against the use of nuclear weapons in the conflict.

The United States has criticised Putin's nuclear deployment, but has said it has no intention of altering its position on strategic nuclear weapons and also that it has not seen any signs Russia was preparing to use a nuclear weapon.

The war in Ukraine has triggered what both Moscow and Washington say is the deepest crisis in relations since the depths of the Cold War, with major nuclear arms denouncing the other in public.

Putin's nuclear remarks have raised particular concern.

Last September, he warned the West he was not bluffing when he said Russia would use "all available means to protect Russia and our people".

It is still unclear where the Russian nuclear warheads _ which will remain under Moscow's control — will be kept in Belarus.

Range of 500km

Putin, who is the ultimate decisionmaker on any nuclear launch, said Iskander mobile short-range ballistic missiles, which can deliver nuclear warheads, had already been handed over to Belarus. Russian sources say the Iskander has a range of

Belarus said Su-25 aircraft had been adapted to carry the warheads. The Sukhoi-25 jet has a range of up to 1,000km.

If the weapons were launched from Belarus's main air base outside Minsk, those delivery vehicles could potentially reach almost all of eastern Europe — including a host of Nato members — as well as cities such as Berlin and Stockholm.

After the Soviet Union collapsed in 1991, the United States went to enormous efforts to return the Soviet nuclear weapons stationed in Belarus, Ukraine and Kazakhstan to Russia – which inherited the nuclear arsenal of the Soviet Union.

Two airplanes collide at **Tokyo's Haneda airport**

Tokyo, June 10 (UNI) Two passenger jets appeared to have collided near a taxiway in Tokyo's Haneda Airport on Saturday, according to Japan's transport ministry.

Around 11:00 a.m. local time, a Thai Airways flight departing for Bangkok and an aircraft with EVA Air came into contact on Runway A of Haneda Airport, local media outlets reported, citing sources with the airport.

Currently, the two planes are parked on the runway, footage from Tokyo Broadcasting System Television showed.

According to national broadcaster NHK, part of the wing of the Thai Airways plane looks to be broken, and what appears to be fragments can be seen near the run-

The airport has shut down the runway near the site of the accident, with no injuries reported so far.

Some domestic and international flights have been delayed at the airport.

About 10k people evacuated in Philippines due to threat of Volcano eruption

Manila, June 10 (UNI) Authorities in the province of Albay on the Philippine island of Luzon began evacuating 10,000 people on Friday due to the threat of an eruption of the Mayon volcano, Philippine media reported.

The authorities launched the evacuation of 2,400 families, or 10,000 people, living in the four-kilometer zone of "permanent danger" of the Mayon volcano, the GMA broadcaster reported, citing officials.

On Thursday, the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology raised the volcanic eruption threat to Level 3, the report noted, adding that in the case of Level 4, the provincial authorities will evacuate another 16,000 people from the 8-kilometer zone.

Mayon volcano last erupted in 2018.

Explosion Kills at Least 27 People in Somalia

Canada reports 10 new wildfires

Ottawa, June 9 (UNI) There were ten new wildfires burning in Canada on Friday, bringing the total number of wildfires in the country so far this year to 2,405, the Canadian Interagency Forest Fire Centre said.

There were 422 active wildfires on Friday, down from 431 on Thursday. The number of out-of-control wildfires fell to 219 on Friday from Thursday's 234, the centre said in a daily update on its website.

On Friday, there were 89 wildfires being held and 114 under control. Wildfires have so far devoured about 45,000 square kilometres of land in Canada, making 2023 one of the worst years for wildfires on record, according to the center.

In Alberta, unsettled weather brought new starts. Hot and dry windy weather was across the north, and extreme fire weather is expected.

In Ontario, two larger fires in the far north were receiving some limited suppression action and ignition. More lightning fires from existing and new lightning are expected, the centre said.

UN peacekeeper killed in attack in northern Mali

Bamako, June 10 (UNI) A peacekeeper from the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali (Minusma) was killed in an attack that also left seven others seriously injured in northern Mali, the UN mission said in a statement on Friday.

"I strongly condemn this cowardly act against our patrol. This tragic loss is a stark reminder of the risks our peacekeepers face as they work tirelessly to bring stability and peace to the people of Mali," El-Ghassim Wane, head of Minusma was quoted as saying.

"The security and protection of peacekeepers remains a priority," he said, adding that every effort will be made to "reinforce their protection in the face of Mali's evolving security challenges.'

According to Wane, since MINUSMA's deployment in 2013, 190 peacekeepers have lost their lives and hundreds more have been wounded, some of whom disabled for life, as a result of "hostile acts" perpetrated against them. Minusma's mandate runs until June 30, 2023. Its main missions include to support the implementation of the Peace and Reconciliation Agreement in Mali and to accompany the political transition." Sweden Ready To Host NATO Troops Before It's A Full Member

Stockholm: Sweden, whose NATO membership bid is currently blocked, is ready to welcome temporary NATO bases on its soil even before it is a full member, Prime Minister Ulf Kristersson said Friday.

"The government has decided that the military can undertake preparations with NATO and NATO member states to enable future joint operations," Sweden's conservative Prime Minister Ulf Kristersson wrote in an article co-signed by Defence Minister Pal Jonson in daily Dagens Nyheter.

These preparations could include temporary stationing of foreign materiel and personnel on Swedish soil," they wrote. The decision sends a clear signal to Russia and strengthens Sweden's defence."

The presence of NATO troops would serve as a deterrent against any possible Russian actions from across the Baltic Sea. Sweden has been a NATO "invitee" since June 2022, but its bid, which must be rati-

fied by all 31 member states, has been blocked by Turkey and Hungary. Only full members are covered by NATO's Article 5 collective defence clause under

which an attack on one member is consid-

ered an attack on all. Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has not provided any indication, since his re-election in late May, about whether he



plans to approve Sweden's NATO bid. Western nations, and the United States in particular, have been pushing Ankara to give its green light, insisting that Sweden has met the terms of a deal agreed with

Ankara last year. That accord includes a committment to crack down on opposition Kurdish movements, such as the Kurdistan Workers' Party PKK, blacklisted by Ankara which considers them "terrorist" groups.

But Turkey has also demanded that Stockholm extradite dozens of activists living

in Sweden that it also labels as "terrorists". The Swedish government has insisted

that it cannot make such decisions since its judiciary is independent. In addition to bidding to join NATO, Sweden has also hiked its military spending following Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

US unveils \$2bn arms package for Kyiv

WASHINGTON: The United States on Friday announced a \$2.1-billion military aid package for Ukraine, just as Kyiv appeared to be opening its long-awaited counteroffensive aimed at driving Russia from the country.

The package included missiles for Patriot air defence systems, artillery rounds, drones and laserguided rocket system

The new arms, illustrate ment to both Ukraine's critical near-term capabilities as well as the enduring capacity of Ukraine's Armed Forces to defend its territory and deter Russian aggression over the long term," the Pentagon said in a statement.

It took to \$40.4 billion the value of military supplies the United States has provided Ukraine since early 2021, most of it since Russia invaded the country on February 24, 2022.

It came at a crucial point in the war. Ukraine has been stockpiling weaponry and



tion for a likely gruelling land campaign to try to force Russian troops to retreat from the large sections of south-eastern and southern Ukraine which they occupy.

Meanwhile, the White House said on Friday that Russia appeared to be deepening its defence cooperation with Iran and had received hundreds of oneway attack drones that it is using to strike Ukraine.

Citing newly declassified information, the White House said the drones, or **Uncrewed Aerial Vehicles** (UAVs), were built in Iran, shipped across the Caspian Sea and then used by Russian forces against Ukraine.

Pak Court Refuses To Send With Parents Hindu Girl Forcibly Converted To Islam

Karachi: A 14-year-old Hindu girl, who was allegedly kidnapped, forcibly converted to Islam and married off to a Muslim man in Pakistan's Sindh province, has appeared before a district court which refused to send her with her parents despite her insistence that she wanted to go with them.

Sohana Sharma Kumari was allegedly kidnapped at gunpoint from her home in the Benazirabad district of the southern Sindh province on June 2 in front of her mother by her tutor and his accomplices.

Her father Dilip Kumar filed a complaint with the police, saying she was kidnapped. Later, the girl appeared in a video stating



clearly under duress that she had converted to Islam and married a Muslim man. Her parents however insist-

ed that she was underage. The girl was recovered by police from a house in the district, five days after being kidnapped, after a lot of hue and cry on social

Sohana was brought to the district court in Larkana on Friday where she in her statement told the judge she was abducted and forcibly converted to Islam and wanted to go with her

However, the judge adjourned the hearing until June 12 stating that she appeared to be under pressure while giving her statement and sent her to a shelter home for women.

Her mother, Jamna Sharma, told the media at the court that her daughter was taking tuition at home and a few days back the teacher had told her he needed a 100,000 loan. "When my daughter told

me about this I told the teacher he shouldn't be discussing such matters with Sohana and he went away. But he returned after a day with some people and forcibly took her away at gunpoint. I pleaded with him to take the money and jewellery but leave my daughter but they didn't listen," Jamna said.

Her father told the media that all the documents produced by the accused to prove that she had converted to Islam and married a Muslim man of her own free will were fake.

Colombian President confirms 4 children found alive 40 days after plane crash

New Delhi: The "minor" who was among the seven women wrestlers accusing the Wrestling Federation of India President and BJP MP Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh of sexual harassment, changed her statement under pressure, Olympian Sakshee Malikkh told NDTV in an exclusive interview. "There's huge pressure on us to compromise," she said, accusing Mr Sharan of getting his men to call and threaten the complainants. Elite grapplers Bajrang Punia and Sakshee Malikkh, among the country's top wrestlers leading the protests against Brij Bhushan Singh, claimed the minor's father is under depression because of the pressure put on him to withdraw the comdemanding the arrest and custodial interrogation of the accused since day one as he has enough power and influence to derail the investigation and intimidate the
