Army Colonel, Major, police officer killed in Anantnag encounter



ANANTNAG, SEP 13: In a major encounter, two army officers and a police officer were killed at Hallora area of $Gadool\,hamlet\,in\,South\,Kashmir's\,Anant$ nag district on Wednesday.

An official told news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), that acting on a specific input about the presence of terrorists in Haloora area of Gadool hamlet of Anantnag, joint teams of army and police launched a cordon and search operation in the area in the afternoon.

"When the joint teams zeroed in on the suspected spot, the hiding terrorists opened a heavy volume of fire resulting in the fatal injuries to two army officers and the police officer," they said.

Two army officers and the police officer of the DySP rank succumbed to injuries who were identified as Colonel Manpreet Singh, who was the commanding officer of 19 RR, Major Aashish Dhon-



chak and DySP Humayun Bhat, the son of former DIG Kashnir Ghulam Muhammad Bhat, originally from Tral, presently living at Humhama, Budgam.

General officer Commanding of Srinagar based 15 Corps Lt General Rajiv Ghai, DGP Dilbagh Singh, ADGP Kashmir Vijay Kumar and other officers reached the encounter

Amid heat wave, prolonged dry spell reduces water level in Jhelum, other tributaries

SRINAGAR, SEP 13: With prolonged dry spell and record-breaking heat wave in Jammu & Kashmir, the water flow at River Jhelum and other tributaries have reduced, causing worry among the people, especially farmers.

However, the government has admitted that at some of the places, things have got affected, but stated that it is a temporary impact and cannot sustain for a long time.

In Charge Chief Engineer, Jal Shakti department, Sanjeev Malhotra told the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO) that the prolonged dry spell has reduced the waterflow in the river Jhelum, Doodh Ganga and other tributaries.

"It is obvious that the water can be supplied only when it is available. But at this juncture the absence of rainfall has reduced the water flow in rivers as well as the tributaries, thus simultaneously TURN ON.....PAGE 02 **HT News Network**





spot and the entire forest area of Gadool has been cordoned off in a bid to track down the terrorists. "Search operation is going on and helicopters have also been press into service," they said, adding that given dark, high beam lights have been installed and all the layers of cordon have been tightened to ensure terror-

Today's encounter at Anantnag is the biggest since August 5 this year in South Kashmir when three soldiers of army's 34 RR were killed in Halan Manzgam forest area of Kulgam district. Pertinently, on March 30, 2020, five security personnel-including a Colonel, a Major and a sub-inspector were killed in an 18-hour long encounter at north Kashmir's Handwara. Sources said today's encounter is the biggest since 2020 where the army and police have lost its senior officers. The Anantnag encounter comes at a time when forces are having the upper hand and the number of local militants is all time low as stated by the Director General of Police (DGP) Dilbagh Singh.

LG, DG, ADGP, others participate in wreath laying in Sgr: A wreath laying ceremony was held in Srinagar where Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, DGP Dilbagh Singh, ADGP Kashmir Vijay Kumar, SSP Srinagar Rakesh Bhalwal besides a number of police, army and CRPF officials participated and paid rich tributes to slain DySP Humayun Bhat. The officers laid wreaths on the coffin draped with tri-colour. Emotional scenes were witnessed when slain DySP's father, the former DIG Ghulam Hassain Bhat, also paid floral tributes to his slain son and offered him the last salute.

Pall of Gloom in Budgam's Humhama: Almost every eye was moist with tears when the body of slain DySP Humayun Bhat reached his home at Friends Enclave Humhama in Budgam district on Wednesday evening. Women were seen wailing and shrieks filled the air as the coffin came out of the ambulance. DGP DilbaghSingh, ADGP Kashmir Vijay Kumar, DG CIDR Swain, SSP Srinagar Rakesh Bhalwal, SSP Budgam besides other officers of the police participated in the funeral of slain DySP. Hundreds of locals also participated in the last rites of DySP Humayun.

Overthe last 14 years, he has been posted at Government Middle School Poshnadi Anantnag and has immensely helped in increasing the enrolment of economically downtrodden. He has engaged children in extracurricular activities and also set up an 'honesty box' in the school premises.

With his undeterred efforts, he has played a vital role in bringing the school to national limelight. His School also received the PM School for Rising India (PM SHRI) award this year.

"My motive has always been to work for the deprived, poor and downtrodden children so that they become successful," Sheikh told UNI.

He said there were only 45 children including seven irl students when he joined the school in 2009 who were studying in a two room school structure.

"There are now 110 students and among them 60 percent are girls. After joining school, I adopted unique ways to attract students. This encouraged their parents and they provided land to the school. On that land we built a school of ten rooms with the government funds and later the school was upgraded from Primary to Middle standard," he said.

Besides academics, he ensures that the children are not behind in extracurricular activities. The girl students of school, he said, have been going for a 15 days snow skiing course to Gulmarg for the past five years and parents are allowing them on his reputation.

Sheikh said that Deputy Commissioner Anantnag provided him Rs 3 Lakh after seeing the activities in the school for purchasing a TV set for learning. Besides a projector, a mike, a computer and stationary, school bags and other items were also managed out of these funds

And there were of course a lot of challenges for him during this journey.

"Initially the locals didn't have faith but slowly they began to send their children to school,", he said.

The award winning teacher has also set up a cosmetic stall in the school for the children to use during the winter months.

"I have also developed an "honesty box" in the school for the children. If they find any amount which incidentally may have been dropped by any person, the

children will put that into the box," he said. "If one has sincerity, honesty, dedication then anything is possible to achieve", Sheikh believes and added "there is still more to do for these poor and

downtrodden children. He said when he came to know that he had been selected for the national award he was on a picnic trip

to Achabal garden in the district with his school children. "It was completely surprising for me and for the children of myschool, "he said and added "the children cried and hugged me for the honour". (UNI)

HC Again....

granted a short-term bail of one month by a sessions court, moved the high court, seeking bail on medical grounds.

"The bail application moved by the petitioner for grant of short bail for a period of two months on medical ground is found to be devoid of any merit and substance and is liable to be rejected," Justice M A Chowdhary said after hearing defence lawyer Sunil Sethi and senior CBI counsel Monika Kohli.

"Bail application along with pending interim application(s) is thus dismissed," the judge said in his

eight-page order. Singh has moved about half-a-dozen bail applications since his arrest on October 18, 2022 by the CBI for allegedly using touts to get his son the question paper of the police sub-inspectors recruitment examination conducted by the Jammu and Kashmir Services Selection Board (JKSSB) in March that year.

He was among 24 people charge-sheeted by the agency in the case on November 12 last year and was termed as the main accused and kingpin.

Kohli said that the petitioner is the kingpin of the recruitment scam. He not only played with the careers and aspirations of aspirants but also brought a bad name to the selection body - JKSSB - and to the Jammu and Kashmir government, Kholi, who is an additional advocate general, said.

The petitioner during the period of one month for which a short bail had been granted by the sessions court, except managing certificates or prescriptions for his different ailments, did not receive any treatment,

This is "evident from the prescriptions which had been made a part of the petition, and hospitalisation of the petitioner on the very date when he surrendered after expiry of short bail on July 15, there being no complicacy in the period of one month of his being on

The petitioner has been moving repeated applications for grant of bail just to defeat the process of law, she said.

Kohli said as in case of bail being granted, he being the kingpin and the main conspirator of the paper leakage scam shall make all efforts to tamper with the prosecution evidence which is yet to be produced before the court for determination.

Justice Chowdhary said the apprehension of tampering with the prosecution evidence cannot be ruled out in view of the mindset of the petitioner and in case of grant of bail, he may attempt to tamper with the prosecution evidence so as to screen himself from the charge. "The treatment to the petitioner with regard to his various ailments can be provided to him in custody and in case he requires any specialised consultation or any surgery that can also be got conducted, which being in custody," he said.

Notably, J&K parts continue to witness prolonged dry spell while the hot and dry weather conditions continue for a long. Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu & Kashmir and other areas in the valley witnessed record-breaking maximum temperature in the month of September.

and its quality confirming to BIS 10500 Standards, regularly on a long term and sustainable basis. In UT of J&K, 3244 water supply schemes (including standalone schemes for Schools, Angawadi Centres, Health Institutions & Gram Panchayats) have been planned at an estimated cost of about Rs. 13000 crore to provide new and upgrade existing tap water connections of 18.67 lakh rural households for a sustainable, reliable and potable supply of drinking water to improve the

living conditions of about 1.10 crore rural population. Divulging further information, the ACS said that these water supply schemes comprise of about 6600 components like source development in the shape of Bore-wells, tube-wells & dug-wells besides Rapid Sand Filtration Plants, Over Head Tanks, Slow Sand Filtration Plants, Ground Service Reservoirs and pipe laying works aimed to augment the existing water supply system and to provide the new tap water connections in uncovered areas.

He informed that as on date about 97% of the critical work components have been awarded, all of them through transparent e-tendering system involving about 1700 contractors. This is in contrast to 14% in June, 2022. Similarly, the start of works has also picked up from 6% in June, 2023 to 73% as on date thereby indicating that the implementation of the mission is in full swing all across the UT. There is absolutely no compliant regarding any of the allotments, he said.

He said that as the infrastructure is being built to meet the requirements for next 30 years and a huge quantum of work is involved including laying of a vast pipe distribution network, hence the requirement of pipe material is equally large for which timely availability was to be ensured to avoid the delay in implementation of the mission without compromising on the fairness, accountability and transparency of the procurement process as envisaged in the GFR 2017 and Manual for Procurement of Goods 2017.

Talking about the financial powers, Kabra said that in strict compliance to the GFR 2017, Manual for Procurement of Goods 2017 and S.0 15 dated 09-01-2020 delegating the financial powers for award/sanction of contracts, UT of MK has been able to purchase 60% of the total pipe requirement as on date through complete

e-tendering and scrutiny through a UT level purchase committee headed by Development Commissioner Works and with members across the departments like Finance, l&C, MED etc. which was less than 5 % in June, 2022.

"About 24 OEMs have been involved in supply of pipes through competitive tendering. While doing so, on the advice of the National Jal Jeevan Mission and in view of the difficulties being faced in timely supply of GI pipes, cost effective and technically feasible HDPE pipes are also being used, especially in Jammu province which has not only resulted in increase in supply rate but a saving of about Rs. 430.00 crore is expected in the overall estimated cost of the projects," he

Under Water Quality Monitoring & Surveillance, he added, a component under Jal Jeevan Mission which aims to ensure that quality of water being supplied is as per the standards of BIS 10500 to improve the health conditions in rural areas especially children & women.

"98 water testing laboratories have been set up/ strengthened across the UT, and 11 of them have been accredited by NABL, for testing of water samples the reports of which are made available on the WQMIS portal which is in the public domain," the ACS said.

In order to involve the communities in the surveillance of the water quality, the ACS informed that they field testing Kits (FTKs) have been made available to Pani Samiti Members. As on date 7200 FTKs have been distribute and 32000 women have been trained for use of these FTKs.

Also, he said to involve the communities in planning, monitoring & implementing the Jal Jeevan Mission in villages, Pani Samitis have been constituted in all the villages of the UT who are involved in monitoring of the works at village level and on the completion of these schemes. About 23000 meetings of Pani Samitis/ special Gram Sabhas/ Jan Sabhas have been held in connection with the planning and monitoring of JJM works besides Har Ghar Jal Certification of the villages where 100% FHTCs have been provided. As on 31st August, 3088.00 Crore has been expended since the start of the Mission, out of which Rs. 2600.00 Crore have been spent during last 12 months.

The ACS informed that during the Current financial year, the UT has spent Rs. 1447.06 Crore and has been able to lift two tranches of funds amounting Rs. 1433.56 Crores from Gol.

He said that from last few weeks, some incorrect and malafide information has been propagated in respect of the implementation of the Jal Jeevan Mission in the UT of J&K and in this backdrop, it is imperative to make few points clear to the general public and to all the stakeholders:

1. A scam of 13000 crore has been alleged when on the other hand it has been stated that only 800 Crore have been spent till August, 2023. But the public is being misled in both these aspects as neither any scam has taken place nor the figures given in respect of the expenditure are correct as the total expenditure in JJM as on 31st August is Rs.3088.30 Crores and every allot ment/ contract has been awarded strictly following the process laid down in the GFR. Such allegations are complete nonsense and made by people who have no understanding.

2. All the works have been awarded through a transparent and competitive e-tendering system after accord of Administrative Approvals, Technical Sanctions (wherever required before tendering). The works have been allotted strictly as per the Financial Powers delegated vide S.0 15 of 2020 dated: 09-01-2020 and on the approvals of SBD and rates from the UT level Committee headed by the Development Commissioner Works, the senior most engineer in the UT, and with the consent of the District Jal Jeevan Missions (DJJMs) headed by the respective District Development Commissioners it may be noted that no contract has been awarded without e-tendering.

3. The PHE used to allot all works departmentally, against the law laid down by the Constitution and the instructions, GFR, etc. During 2019, e-tendering was made mandatory. Initial attempt was made to allot these works on composite tender basis. Since there was very poor response due to limited capabilities in the UT, a revision was made in consultation with experts/in accordance with guidelines. The results are there for everyone to see in terms of progress on ground. This fact has been acknowledged in the letter dated: 20th July 2022 when the person was heading the department.

4. All the figures with regard to progress in implementation of the jai Jeevan Mission is being reported by the field Divisions on the IMIS and which is being captured and displayed on the said portal/dashboard on a real-time basis. All these details viz; physical progress, financial progress, water quality monitoring reports etc. are available on the respective portals which are in public domain. The releases and expenditure by the UT, scheme wise, is available in public domain on Jan-bhagidari, as the same is made through BEAMS. The progress is being monitored through IMIS only and no physical communication is being made in this regard. Any household tap connection provided is reported on IMIS portal with Aadhar based identification. The Pani Samitis monitor the progress in addition to the engineering officials, third party monitoring agencies and DPMUs.

5. The schemes ongoing under different other heads are also being completed and an expenditure of about Rs. 210 Crore has been made under erst while NRDWP, NABARD and JKIDFC Schemes.All these schemes shall be completed within the mission period. Due diligence has improved execution of schemes under JKIDFC funding and a much less quantum is likely to be shifted from that estimated in June, 2022 - 459 schemes costing about Rs. 783.72 crores.

6. All the advisories received from the Anti-Corruption Bureau J&K have been circulated to the filed officers including Deputy Commissioners for strict adherence and for corrective actions. if needed to be taken. None pointed out any malpractices or allotment of tenders without following due process.

He said that initial fire hit Kent. her handler and another soldier covering the move, adding, "the party continued to close in undeterred to prevent the terrorists from escaping. In the ensuing heavy fire-fight, displaying exceptional courage, own troops successfully neutralised one terrorist."

"In the operations so far, Army Dog Kent was fatal, while three other soldiers and an SPO were injured. Casualty evacuation of soldiers was done, however, since the terrorist fire was going on, body of Kent could not be retrieved," they added and said that later, one of the three soldiers succumbed to his injuries and other two and a police SPO were evacuated to the Military Hospital.

"Fire fighting continued throughout the night to ensure terrorists do not get away," he said, adding that on Wednesday the second terrorist was spotted and a firefight commenced, during which another soldier was injured. Finally, at around 1130 hours, the second terrorist was

neutralised. Due to the thick undergrowth further move was done deliberately. In the operations two likely foreign terrorists along with two Ak series rifles and packs with administrative and logistic

stores were recovered, he said. "The success of the operation is an apt testimony of the coordination and cooperation existing between the various agencies involved. The importance of Guidance and Counselling in adolescents' life

Guidance is a broader term which includes counselling as one of its services. It means help or advice to deal with the complex problems linked with your work, education, personal relationship and making into easier ones. Guidance is regarded as a conceptualized programme of activities that offers a gateway out to the existing problems in the present era of complex scientific and technological developments. The aim of guidance and counselling is to assist behaviour change, enhance coping skills, promote decision making, improve the relationship and to facilitate users' potential.

Guidance and counselling help to recognize and understand about one's talents and abilities, help to develop an optimistic outlook for removal of undesirable traits, it aids to develop resourcefulness and self-direction in adapting to changes in society. Guidance and counselling earn recognition through their services rendered in enhancing human happiness by being healthier, more productive, attain valuable lesson and also eliminate later stage problems. The major aim of guidance and counselling services is to encourage students' academic, social, emotional and personal development. These are thus, an integral component of education as well. Guidance and counselling have become very imperative for young children and schools have a massive role in fetching out the best in children, as at today's time young minds need guidance to polish their personality and also help to attend to the physical, social, psychological, educational and vocational needs of the school students who go a long way to remove impediments of learning.

Adolescence is generally considered as a turbulent period and is often portrayed as a negative phase of life-a phase of storm and stress to be survived or endured. This stage is best defined as a critical period in relation to puberty and also considered as a revolution of a person's life which starts with biological transformation and finished in adjusting with those challenges in the society. Adolescence means 'to emerge' to attain 'identity' and this way of attaining identity has to go long facing up with challenges as well as changes. During this period a variety of physiological, cognitive, emotional and social changes take place. Adolescence emerges from later childhood and merges into adulthood with sexual maturity, increased hormone levels, desire for more independence, the capacity to think abstractly, escalating interest in peers, distancing from parents due to relationship with peers or outside and the inauguration of a romantic relationship are characteristics

of adolescence. These characteristics are like shifting from a child like to be adult-like. The tendency to make innovative discoveries is more frequent in adolescence as compare to childhood because in childhood scope of activity is restricted as a child has fear of guardians or afraid of going far whereas in adolescence they discover superior freedom. Additionally, there is a diverse number of conflicts that adolescents are faced with, such as making decisions about future adult role, identity formation and separating themselves from caregivers.

Adolescents require explicit attention. Today, millions of children are addicted to drugs, engaged in various crimes, school dropout, delinquency, attempt suicide, suffer from anxieties and depressions. In spite of rising in literacy rates, the trend of opting the wrong decision or confusing is continuously increasing in children because of the lack of guidance services. At this stage of life, adolescents are packed with multifarious challenges and if these challenges are not resolved, they may go on to become a social misfit in later life. An adolescent on his own may also make use of trial-and-error approach and master the developmental tasks vital for the switch to ideal adulthood but in the practice, they used to waste their precious time that they might spend in learning and knowing further constructive activities and also it would deteriorate their self-confidence and motivation to acquire up tasks that have proved to be hard in doing it. They are not mature enough to critically evaluate baffling situation arising due to these changes around them. Many of these problems not only require remedial treatment but also prominently help from guidance and counselling profession to take preventive efforts. Thus, adolescence becomes challenging as well as a puzzling chapter of lifespan development for those who are facing and also for the parents and adults who are raising and nurturing their children. So to survive this period and get the direction of fulfilling their potential, adolescents require guidance and honest support.

Adolescents confront problems which they cannot readily cope with the absence of assistance from their parents, teachers or professionals such as school counsellors. The academic achievement may be one of the determinants of adolescent mental health and as a result, can be associated with the adolescents' need for guidance and counselling. A school counsellor's role also becomes sensitive when the ultimate aim is students academic achievement.

COUNSELING

Teenagers have an important role in society. Today's young people are the hope, future citizens and leaders of tomorrow; therefore it is necessary to develop aptitude, behaviour and action according to democratic ideals. In India adolescence has a good hold on the population. They will be controlling and running the world someday. Clearly, we need to better understand these challenges and find appropriate solutions. The principle of guidance and counselling in schools is to make progress in academic achievement, increase acquisitions and application of conflict resolution, promote affirmative study attitudes and behaviour and reduce school dropouts of the children. Even at institutions, adolescents have the stress of academic performance, selecting fields of specialization and career as well. Teachers as well as parents choose academic achievement as sole criteria to judge students' performance. However, it can be a very hard period during which a great deal of understanding, patience and support is required. Modernization has given many positive effects as it is providing so many opportunities, but at the same time, it has remitted into multiple stressors in adolescents' life. This stress leads to massive mental health problems. It is, therefore, very pertinent that students' guidance and counselling needs must be known, so that, steps can be taken to make available required support services in this regard to them at an adequate level.

The CoF interacted at length with the Forest Officers and Forest frontline staff, on various Deliverables, schemes and Government programs in forestry sector including Green J&K Drive, Green India Mission, Har Gaon Hariyali, Non Timber Forest Products policy implementation, Forests for recreation, fodder, livelihood, development of eco-tourism etc.

The CoF said "Green India mission is one of the missions that come under the umbrella of the National Action Plan on Climate Change (NAPCC). Every country has an obligation to arrest the downward spiral of climate change. Hence, India as a responsible growing global power took up the responsibility of reducing the deleterious effects of climate change by launching different missions under NAPCC. Accordingly Green India Mis-



sion was launched in Shopian in the year 2021 to protect, restore and enhance forest cover".

He said our focus in Shopian is to increase the quality of degraded moderately dense forests and to ecologically restore open forests which have suffered degradation here due to different reasons. He added that Grasslands and wetlands revival are other

focus areas under this mission. The CoF informed that during the year 2022-23, 39350 numbers of plants were planted in the already fenced up areas with financial implication of Rs 6.786 lacs.

He said in tune with Government

initiatives on generation of livelihoods, the Forest Department in the last two years is also focusing on an increase in forest-based livelihood incomes for hundreds of households in and around the forest areas. He said the Green India Mission implementation mechanism in Shopian is quite robust and largely democratic in nature. The Gram Sabha and various committees are the key institutions for planning and implementation at the village level and works are being done through Village Forest Committees here.

"India Will Become Global Aviation Hub, Like Dubai, In 5 Years": J Scindia

New Delhi: Aviation has really started on its growth curve in India now and the Delhi airport will become the world's second-largest airport by the end of the year, Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia has

In an exclusive interview with NDTV on Wednesday, Mr Scindia said civil aviation infrastructure in the country has expanded at a "scorching" pace under Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "Delhi airport has a throughput capability of 70 million, which will go up to 109 million come December. That means that Delhi is going to become one of the largest airports in the world. We are going to be second, if at all, only to Atlanta. So that's the scale

that you are looking at." Throughput capacity, in this case, refers to the number of passengers that an airport can handle in a year.

The minister said the Jewar airport will be inaugurated in the next 12



months and its capacity will grow to 60 million by 2030. So, between Jewar and Delhi, there will be a throughput capacity of 160 million.

Airfare Pinch On last-minute airfares going up massively in some sectors a couple of months ago, and the argument for government involvement in regulating fares, Mr Scindia said, "Civil aviation is a deregulated sector. What happened in June was an anomaly... That was a time of high prices and you had an airline with almost 30 aircraft being grounded. So,

capacity got sucked out of

the system."

"You had a double whammy and therefore you had some cities - including Srinagar, Pune and Goa-which were primarily connected by GoFirst that had an abnormal rise in fares. We had a meeting with the airlines on June 5 and I said that this is not tenable and this is not right. We had a free and frank discussion, and soon after that you saw the normalisation of fares," he added.

Asked about when India can become an international aviation hub like Singapore, Dubai or Doha, Mr Scindia pointed out that,

since 2014, the number of airports has gone up from 74 to 149 - with the new Utkela airport in Odisha being inaugurated three days ago - the fleet size has risen from 400 to 700 and the number of passengers has increased from 6 crore to nearly 14.5 crore. He said that, by 2030, the

number of airports is projected to go up to 220 - an increase of nearly 50% - the number of planes will more than double to 1,500 and the passenger count will nearly triple and touch 42.5 crore. The minister said that must happen on the international side because, until now, Indian carriers have been "very concentrated" $on \, growing \, capacity \, on \, the \,$

Pointing to the large orders for aircraft placed by Air India and IndiGo, he said,"India, for too long, has had its hub either on the eastern border or the western border. We are currently working with Delhi International Airport Limited(DIAL)to look at setting up a hub in Delhi to start with. In the next decade.

Supreme Court Cracks Down On 'Media Trials', Wants Guidelines In 3 Months

New Delhi: The Supreme Court has taken strong exception to 'media trials' - referring to "biased reporting (that) gives rise to public suspicion the person has committed an offence" - and directed the Union Home Ministry to prepare guidelines for police to follow during press briefings in relation to criminal cases. The ministry has three months prepare a detailed manual.

The top police officers of each state and the National Human Rights Commission have been directed to submit suggestions to the home ministry within a month and the next hearing will be in January, a bench led by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud said, underlining the need to sensitise police personnel.

"Administration of justice is affected by 'media trials'. Need to decide at which stage (of investigation) details should be disclosed. This is a very important issue because it involves interests of victim and accused. It also involves the interest of the public at large... media report on

On behalf of the government, Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati today assured the court the government will frame and release guidelines regarding media briefings by the police. "The government will inform the court about it..." she said. An annoyed Supreme Court emphasised the fact "media trials" violate the privacy of a victim or complainant, and that this is concerning if they are a minor. "Victim's privacy cannot be affected. We also have to take care of the rights of the accused."

"How should police be trained for media briefings? What steps has the Government of India taken (regarding)our 2014 instruction?" the court asked. Senior lawyer, Gopal Shankaranarayan, an amicus curiae, referred to salacious media reports surrounding the Aarushi case and agreed, "We cannot stop media

Bharatpur, Sep 13 (UNI) At least 11 people were killed and 15 injured early on Wednesday when a trailer rammed into a parked bus in the Lakhanpur police station area of Bharatpur district in Rajasthan, a police source said. According to the police control room, the accident took place on the Jaipur-Agra highway at around 4.30 am near Hantra in Bharatpur district, about 160 km east of Jaipur, the capital city of Rajasthan.

'A trailer rammed into it from behind, killing 11 people and injuring 15 others," a senior police official said.11 people died on the spot in the accident. The deceased were identified as five men and six women, police officials added. Police said the ill-fated bus carrying pilgrims was travelling from Bhavnagar in Gujarat to Mathura in Uttar Pradesh when the accident occurred. The injured have been admitted to RBM Hospital in Bharatpur, police said.

After receiving information, the District Superintendent of Police, Mridul Kachhawa, arrived at the spot and inquired about the accident.

Cabinet Approves Phase-III Of eCourts Project, Allocates Rs 7,210 Crore

New Delhi: The Union Cabinet on Wednesday approved the third phase of eCourts Project as a central sector scheme with a financial outlay of 7,210 crore to be implemented over four years.

Briefing media after a Cabinet meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Information and Broadcasting Minister Anurag Thakur said the eCourts Mission Mode Project is the prime mover for improving access to justice using technology in line with the PM's vision of "Sabka Sath, Sabka Vikas and Sabka Vishwas". As part of the National eGovernance Plan, the eCourts Project is under implementation since 2007 for ICT enablement of the Indian Judiciary. The Phase II of the project has concluded in 2023. The third phase is aimed at ushering in a regime of maximum ease of justice by moving towards digital, online and paperless courts through digitisation of the entire court records including legacy records and by bringing in universalisation of e-filing/e-payments through saturation of all court complexes with e-Sewa Kendras, he added.

It will put in place intelligent smart sys-



tems enabling data-based decision-making for judges and registries while scheduling or prioritising cases. The main objective of the Phase-III is to create a unified technology platform for the judiciary which will provide a seamless and paperless interface between the courts, the litigants and other stakeholders. Phase III of the e-Courts Project, beginning 2023, in India is rooted in the philosophy of "access and inclusion", the minister said. Citizens who do not have access to technology can access the judicial services from eSewa Kendras, thus bridging the digital divide, the government said.

Special Session's Agenda Unknown, Centre Calls All Party Meet Day Before

The government will hold an all-party meeting Monday evening - hours before the start of a five-day special session of Parliament that was called for by Union Minister Pralhad Joshi earlier this month.

Mr Joshi posted on X (formerly Twitter), writing: "Ahead of the Parliament session from the 18th of this month, an all-party floor leaders meeting has been convened on the 17th at 4.30 PM. The invitation for the same has been sent to concerned leaders through email. Letter to follow." The post also included a Kannada translation of the statement. Mr Joshi is a Lok Sabha MP from Karnataka's Dharwad constituency.Monday's all-party meeting may discuss the agenda for next week's session, a lack of clarity over which has led to furious speculation, including buzz the government will move a resolution to change the country's official name from India to Bharat. The all-party meeting call has been played down by CPI leader D Raja, who told news agency ANI, "This is a routine meeting... but before calling the special session the government should have consulted leaders of the opposition."

"Nobody knows what is the agenda for



the special session. What are the issues that will be discussed?" Last week formal invitations to G20 leaders from President Droupadi Murmu's office described her as the "President of Bharat", triggering an outcry from the opposition. The government pointed to the relevant line in the Constitution, which says "India, that is, Bharat, shall be a Union of States..." There is also talk the special session has been called to formally move the Parliament from the old building to the new; sources had said this may take place on September 19.The government's special session announcement has been widely criticised by opposition leaders. Several hit out for choosing a date that clashes with "India's most important festival" - Ganesh Chaturthi will be celebrated on Tuesday.

"Congress Will Try To Raise Himachal Crisis In Special Session": Priyanka Gandhi

Shimla: Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Wednesday said Mandi MP Pratibha Singh would raise in the special session of Parliament the demand for declaring the recent calamity in Himachal Pradesh a 'national disaster'.

However, Priyanka Gandhi said she was not sure if Ms Singh, who is also the Himachal Congress chief, would be allowed to raise the demand during the session. The special session of Parliament will be held from September 18 to 22.

"We do not know what the session is about and whether she (Pratibha Singh) would be allowed to raise the issue or not but even if this does not happen, we should make a strong representation to the Centre on it and the Congress would fully support it," the Congress general secretary told reporters during her visit to the Shiva temple site in Summer Hill. Twenty people were killed in the landslide at the Shiva tem-



ple on August 14.

Priyanka Gandhi also met the families affected by the landslide. Three landslides had claimed 27 lives in Shimla city with the Fagli and Krishnanagar killing five and two people respec-

The Congress leader also visited the Krishnanagar landslide site and met the displaced families. She said there are several issues like restoration of national highways which can be fixed only by the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) and declaring the destruction following heavy rains a national disaster would facilitate restoration works in the state.

"No one would like to do politics at this hour and everyone should come forward for help," she said and asked the Centre to rise above "party politics" and help Himachal Pradesh without taking into consideration whether there is a Congress or BJP government in the state.

Slamming the government's move to lower import duty on American apples, she said the Centre is not fully aware of the extent of the damage in the state and the move would encourage imports and hit the local apple growers who have already suffered due

"The situation in Himachal Pradesh is very painful and the state has suffered huge losses. The Union government seems to be unable to understand the gravity of the situation in the state," she said, adding that big business houses were offering lower prices for the purchase of apple produce in Himachal.

In a statement issued on Wednesday, BJP state chief Rajiv Bindal said that Congress leaders are telling lies and asked where is the notification regarding a cut in import duty.

He said that the people of Himachal are still waiting for the guarantees announced by the Congress on the eve of 2022 assembly polls to be fulfilled. The women are asking for 1,500 per month while youngsters are waiting for

five lakh jobs. Priyanka Gandhi, who is on a two-day visit to the rain-affected areas of Kullu, Mandi, Shimla and Solan districts, had visited Mandi and Kullu on Tuesday.

Scientific coal mining to begin in Meghalaya soon: CM

Shillong, Sep 13 (UNI) Chief Minister Conrad Sangma said scientific coal mining will soon begin in Meghalaya, with the Centre having approved the leases of four miners.

'The final stage of the mining plan that was to be submitted is being vetted, and in a matter of weeks or a month or so, we will see this happening on the ground. The process is now at a very advanced stage," he said.

In April 2014, the National Green Tribunal imposed a blanket ban on coal mining and transportation in the state, following which the mining industry suffered negative growth, thereby affecting the GSDP as a whole.

Apart from the impact on the economy, the ban severely crippled the lives of thousands of people dependent on the mining sector, both directly and indirectly.

Sangma, who also holds the Mining and Geology portfolio, informed that there are a few pressure groups that have asked the government to review and reduce the required area of the mining plan from 100 hectares to a considerable size.'We were fighting in the Supreme Court against the NGT ban and then discussing it with the Government of India. All this matters because for us, we wanted the process to start, and that is what is important to us, and when the discussions took place, there were different factors that were put in such as area, technology, etc," he said."While the negotiations were going on, the issue of the area came up. The Government of India was very particular that the number should not go down, and so we felt it was in the greater interest of at least setting the ball rolling and starting the whole thing for mining. Let us not stick to the issue of 100 hectares for now. Let it start, and once things start, in the next stage we can come and discuss the reduction of the area, as the Government of India was not comfortable at that time.

Supporting actor Hardik delivers a hit with his fire and intensity

NEW DELHI, SEP 13: It was one of those games where the scorecard may not entirely reveal the impact Hardik Pandya had with the ball on the overall result. His figures read 5-0-14-1, which while being very impressive were not quite the blockbuster of the kind you saw from 20-year-old left-arm spinner Dunith Wellalage (5-40) or Kuldeep Yadav

Yet, they left an indelible mark on India's spirited defence of 214 on a surface where the ball was gripping, turning square, keeping a tad low at times, and, in general, playing up and down enough to have batters between the devil and the deep blue sea. One moment they were thinking patience was the order of the day, and that you needed to tread with caution like KL Rahul and Ishan Kishan did in a superb exhibition of batting against spin during their 63-run stand that led India's revival after three quick


Next, when they were seeing spinners come on and challenge both edges of the bat, as Wellalage did by simply sticking to a wicket-to-wicket line and varying his flight and angles, you couldn't help but think it's best to try to play your shots before a ball has your name on it. How batters from both sides tackled this dilemma made for compelling viewing. And it's amid this that Hardik truly stood out with his fire and intensity, a compliment that has largely been reserved for his batting, and captaincy to a large extent, in the past.

It's no secret India have longed for Hardik to bowl in this manner for a while and have done everything possible, even hav-

ing him wrapped in cotton wool, precisely for this kind of impact. For starters, this certainly allows India dynamism in the selection, as you saw on Tuesday with them fielding a third specialist spinner in Axar Patel to support Kuldeep and Ravindra Jadeja. Sure, the conditions did help spin but even if they don't to the extent they did here, India are in a position to think flexibility and batting depth and have Hardik play the role of a third seamer, and not a bits-and-parts bowler who can merely hold an end up.

Hardik's intensity really helped India, especially when for a while it looked as if they were just running out of gas when Dhananjaya de Silva and Wellalage threatened a jailbreak. It's no rocket science, but on raging turners of the kind, invariably the ones that don't turn are more dangerous more often than not. But such pitches can over-excite spinners to some extent, and it seemed to be the case for a while with Jadeja and Axar.
