SRINAGAR, JAN 9: Panchayats and Block Development Councils (BDCs) have ceased to exist in Jammu and Kashmir from today. All the Panchayats and BDCs have completed their term and now at least for six months these Panchayats and BDCs will be non-existent in the erstwhile state.

As per the official data, there were all but 28,000 representatives of Panchayats and BDCs.

Elections to 77 Municipalities including 40 in the Kashmir division, 37 in the Jammu region and 4291 Panchayats were supposed to be held in October-November last year but were delayed due to the grant of reservation to Other Backward Classes.

agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Chief Engineer, Jal Shakti Department Kashmir, Sanjeev Malhotra said that the dry spell has already started impacting the water resources here. "In absence of the timely snowfall and rainfall, the water level in all the surface water sources here have reduced," he said.

He added that the department has been ensuring adequate water supply to the people by resorting to the curtailments, but certainly it is going to impact in the long run. "The snowfall in Chillai-Kalan is pivotal to have adequate water, but as this period is going on presently on a dry note, it will have a long term effect as well," he said.

Furthermore, he stated that the snowfall during the peak time of Chilla-Kalan is important as the snowfall after this period will not have sustainability like today's period.

"Our surface water sources are not getting recharged in absence of the snowfall and rainfall, so the precipitation at this juncture is must to get our sources recharged well in advance for the future months," he said.

Moreover, the weatherman here has predicted a dry spell till January 16, but added that a few feeble Western Disturbances would affect Jammu & Kashmir after January 16.

"Dry weather would likely continue till 16th Jan with cloudy on 12th evening," Director Meteorological department (MeT), Dr Mukhtar Ahmad told KNO, adding that a few feeble WDs are approaching after 16th Jan.

snowfall till mid-January.

Tourist Guide Mushtaq Ahmed Naik said that the lack of snowfall has hit locals badly. "Educated youth who had procured snow bikes and were earning a living are sitting idle. Hoteliers, shopkeepers, sledge workers are all disappointed," he said adding that things may bounce back if there is snowfall.

One of the hoteliers in Gulmarg said that due to below-average snowfall, tourists are having second thoughts about their plans to visit the hill stations of Kashmir. "It's very unfortunate and we hope things will improve and there is a heavy snowfall," he said adding that there will be grave social and economic implications if it doesn't snow.

A local Skier confirmed that some international skiers who were scheduled to visit Gulmarg for ski have canceled their bookings.

The lack of snow is likely to hit the water table as well in Kashmir Valley.

Kashmir's Last.....

in his nine-by-eight shop tucked between two four-storey residential buildings. He occasionally looks away at the minaret of the Sufi saint Syed Simnania's shrine which overlooks his dingy shop. He hums some chants, returns his gaze to this wooden block, and starts boring small holes in it.

Kharadi is again making a traditional Kashmiri musical instrument called Surnai. When finished, this surnai will adorn a shelf in the shop already stacked with years-old Surnais.

'I still make it for my own happiness and satisfaction, even though the instrument is not in demand today and nobody has asked for it in many years,' Kharadi told the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

According to musicologists, the Surnai was brought to Kashmir from Iran through Central Asia. The playing of Surnai was regarded as extremely auspicious in Kashmiri culture, and the Bhands here prominently featured it in their plays.

"The players used to visit the farms during harvest time and perform for the farmers' amusement while also taking the crop for themselves in exchange for the performance, 'Bashir said, adding that Surnai is played with the mouth; musical notes are produced by blowing into it and pressing fingers against the stops.

Surnai is made up of three components: the nai, a wooden pipe with nine holes, the barg, a locally sourced wheatgrass reed, and a copper disc into which the barg is fixed.

To ensure accuracy, Kharadi asked Abdul Jamal, a local Surnai player and Kangri maker, to play it for him. "Even a minute change can spoil its musical tones," he said.

Kharadi is a member of a line of artisans of Kulgam, thought to be the only professionals in Kashmir to have ever produced this traditional instrument.

Mohammad Abdullah Kharadi, Bashir's father, was tasked by a businessman from Kishtwar to make a Surnai. Once he got going on making it, he was successful on his first try. The demand for Surnai increased over time

ment the act have encountered challenges, the Department of Handicrafts and Handloom Kashmir is actively working to address the issue of machine-made copperware being sold as handmade. The department is promoting genuine handmade copperware and has introduced hologram-based labeling to authenticate products. 291 Copperware labels were issued in the first three quarters of 2022-23. Additionally, a priority is placed on bringing handmade copperware under the protection of the Geographical Indication

Furthermore, the department has recently included copperware, along with 20 other crafts, in the category of 'Notified Crafts' to support local artisans. This inclusion facilitated the registration of copperware artisans, granting them access to various government support programs.

Describing the measure as a significant undertaking, Director of Handicrafts and Handloom Kashmir, emphasized that the department's overarching goal is to champion genuine handmade copperware. He assured that the identification of deceptive artisans and manufacturers of copperware by the Quality Control Division will be given top priority.

This directive serves as a modification to the Prohibition of Manufacture of Specified Copper Utensils (by Machine) Act, 2006, (Act No. XIII of 2006) and mandates the department to take action against unlawfully operating units and conduct the confiscation of machine-made copper items.

The public is urged to purchase copper items labeled with QR codes, as this supports authentic artisans.

Kashmir residents Hilal Yaqoob Deva alias "Sethi Soab" and Musiab Fayaz Baba alias "Shoaib Zarar" of Shopian before the NIA special court here.

They were charged under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code and Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, a spokesperson of the federal agency said.

Malik, who is known by various other names like Saifullah, Noomi, Numan, Langda, Ali Sajid, Usman Habib and Shani, has been found to have been involved in various terrorist attacks in Poonch and Rajouri districts of Jammu region, the official said.

The supplementary charge sheet follows investigations in the case registered suo-motu by the NIA on June 21 last year.

The case relates to a conspiracy hatched "physically as well as in cyberspace" by various proscribed terrorist organisations to spread fear and terror and disrupt peace in J-K by carrying out attacks using sticky bombs, Improvised Explosive Devices and small arms.

"Investigations so far have revealed that the charge-sheeted trio had entered into a criminal conspiracy to carry out terrorist attacks on security forces and others in Jammu and Kashmir with the intention to wage war against the Government of India. Malik

fish. However, the fisheries department contends that production has steadily increased over the past four years and is anticipated to rise further in the upcoming season.

Speaking to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) Dr Imtiaz Ahmed Khan, Chief Proctor at Kashmir University and renowned Ichthyologist said the effect of the dry spell on fish in Kashmir is evident.

When the water level decreases, it forces the fish out of their comfort zone, he said, adding, "In winter, fish usually stay in lower water zones where the temperature is higher compared to the upper layers of water. The decrease in water depth affects the temperature stratification zone, disrupting the fish's comfort," he said.

Dr Khan said that in running water, oxygen exchange occurs, and nutrition comes from the catchment area, benefiting both stagnant and flowing water. "However, during dry weather, water from the catchment area doesn't reach, affecting the fish. In the breeding season, if you kill a single fish, you are responsible for killing hundreds of fish," he said.

Natural fish breeding in Kashmir usually happens in February and March. Dr Imtiaz said eating fish during this season

setting the tone for smooth implementation of new targets set in the 3rd Conference

The Chief Secretary impressed upon all the Administrative heads to look into the progress of implementation of all the focal points given in the first two conferences by the Prime Minister to States/UTs. He asked each of them to apprise him about the status of each of them. He called for devising an effective strategy to achieve all the targets in a set timeline besides submitting Action Taken Reports (ATRs) to his office in next few days.

Regarding the 3rd Conference which was held at New Delhi between 27th to 29th December previous year and was attended by Dulloo himself, he directed for taking all the pre-emptive measures to transform them into the reality in a time bound manner.

The Chief Secretary called these targets very ambitious and highly transformative that is going to change the style of governance for betterment of the common people. He made out that frequent reviews of these goals should be taken by each Administrative Secretary besides he himself desired to take periodical review of these targets each month.

While elucidating the Chief Secretary highlighted several areas on which the Prime Minister laid emphasis upon. He enumerated that the areas like provision of quality drinking water by resorting to testing by the consumers themselves. Further the focus on micro irrigation, millet promotion, natural farming, creation of farmer database in agriculture sector was also underscored in the Conference, the CS revealed.

Dulloo also shared that in Health sector the Fir India Movement, Har Ghar Yoga, enhancing Health & Wellness Centre capacities were laid emphasis upon. It was given out by the CS that it is also among the deliverables of the conference to frame export plan for each district, promotion of e-commerce and implementation of PM Vishwakarma Scheme in industrial sector.

Moreover it was said that equal focus should be laid on the development of clean energy including solarization, energy storage, e-vehicle promotion in transport sector. Enhancing the number and strengthening of SHGs in rural livelihoods mission, creation of multipurpose PACS in cooperative sector, enhancing Disaster Management capacities, iconography of historical monuments were few other points the Chief Secretary pointed out among the major takeaways from this recent Conference.

The three day Conference also held special sessions on Cyber Security: Emerging Challenges; Perspectives on AI. Stories from the Ground: Aspirational Block & District Programme; Role of States: Rationalisation of Schemes & Autonomous entities and Enhancing Capital Expenditure; AI in Governance: Challenges & Opportunities besides a discussion on best practices evolved in central ministries and other States and UTs across the country.

He added that the maximum over many stations of Kashmir region today was 7-8 degree Celsius above normal while the dense fog over plains of Jammu would likely continue during the next three days.

Pertinently, the parts of Kashmir continued to witness sub-zero temperature amidst the ongoing 40-day harshest winter period, Chillai-Kalan, which commenced on December 21. 2023 and will end on January 31.

Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir recorded a low of minus 2.4 degree Celsius.

Qazigund, the gateway of Kashmir also recorded a low of minus 2.6 degree Celsius while Gulmarg, a famous ski-resort, has recorded a low of minus 4.6 degree Celsius.

Pahalgam, a famous tourist place, recorded a minimum temperature of minus 4.4 degree Celsius. In Kupwara, the mercury settled at minus 4.5degree Celsius while in Kokernag, a minimum temperature of minus 1.2 degree Celsius was recorded.

no or below-average snow received this winter at tourist spots including Gulmarg, Pahalgam, and Sonamarg.

Till mid-January, no snowfall is expected in Valley.

Several tour operators from Kashmir confirmed that tourists have started calling off their trips to hill stations of Kashmir. "Majority of the tourists who have been calling off their trips are newly married couples and skiers," Ajaz Ahmed one of the tour operators said.

Shahzad Rasool – the proprietor of Hotel 'Village Walk' in Sonamarg told the news agency Kashmir News Trust that his hotel is empty. "Not only my hotel, all hotels in Sonamarg are empty. It is just because of the lack of snowfall. Thajvas Glacier which ignited the hearts of tourists witnessed only 4-inch snowfall this season. Last year, Sonmarg witnessed over 7 feet of snowfall till mid-January," he said adding that some tourists visit the destination during the day but don't prefer night-stay.

Several photographs of tourist destinations including Gulmarg and Sonamarg have gone viral on social media showing snowless patches of these destinations.

The Weather Office has attributed low snowfall to the absence of Western Disturbances. An official said that there will be almost no major

to the point where he gave up traditional carpentry and concentrated solely on this instrument. His reputation as a skilled Surnai maker spread throughout Kashmir among its players, particularly the folk theatre performers. Nearly 50 years into his practice, he received orders from all over Kashmir.

"Before starting to make a Surnai, I used to offer a ritual at the local shrine of Hazrat Mir Syed Simnani (RA) as I believe this instrument is very pious," Kharadi said.

Abdullah passed away in 2012, but before that, he had given his son the legacy of this craft. Bashir had already started crafting Surnai at the age of 17.

Kharadi noted the declining interest in traditional musical instruments, saying the last order for a Surnai was placed about eight years ago. He has not sold a single Swarnai since then.

"The quantity of Surnai my father and I produced varied greatly. Previously, districts in Kashmir and neighbouring states would request such instruments, but as modern music has taken centre stage, this art form is on its deathbed." he lamented.

Abdullah's Surnai was sold at Rs 400, whereas the same Surnai today would cost Rs 3,500, Bashir said, adding that it normally takes him a day or two to make it.

"There has also been no initiative from the government to save this rare craft," he lamented.

To make ends meet, Kharadi makes wooden household items like big spoons, bowls, meat pounders, beaters, pestles and other items which he then supplies to retailers in Srinagar. "Surnai making is just a hobby now; our main business is to make other items," he said.

Kharadi said he is proud of his craftsmanship but laments that no one in his family has taken over this art. "I am the last one in my family to know this craft. Nobody after me will ever carve any instrument. I cannot ask my son to learn this as I know it won't fetch him enough money to survive," he said.

Under the NIA scanner are outfits such as TRF, United Liberation Front Jammu and Kashmir, Mujahideen Gazwat-ul-Hind, Jammu & Kashmir Freedom Fighters, Kashmir Tigers, PAAF and others.

These outfits are affiliated with Laskhare-Taiba (LeT), Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM), Hizb-ul-Mujahideen (HM), Al-Badr and Al-Qaeda, the spokesperson said.

Meanwhile, a Fisheries Department official told KNO that the fish production in J&K has witnessed a substantial surge in the last four years and is expected to increase further in the coming season.

"The fish production in Kashmir has increased by 5840 tons, generating 366.12 lakhs of revenue during this period," the official said.

He added, "The production of trout has increased from 598 tons in 2019 to 1990 tons during the financial year 2022-23. To enhance fish productivity, the department imports fish seed from foreign countries." 1144 Trout Rearing Units have been set up in the private sector, and 56% (611 units) were established in the last four years to generate employment opportunities for the youth."

DODA, JANUARY 9: Deputy Commissioner Harvinder Singh today led a comprehensive review of the education sector, covering all 10 education zones in the district.

The Chief Education Officer presented detailed information on government-sponsored schemes, infrastructure, schools in aspirational blocks, zone-wise pupilteacher ratios, and the status of various initiatives like Samagra Shiksha. The meeting included updates on girls' hostels, KGBV

schools, ICT labs, Pradhan Mantri Schools for Rising India, board examinations, and digital initiatives

It was informed that the district has 10 education zones, including 2 aspirational blocks, with a total of 537 operational schools.

The DC called for expediting the ongoing construction of 5 girls' hostels, emphasizing the completion of works in Doda and Bhella. The DC directed education officials to coordinate efforts to ensure efficient utilization of government funds meant for amplification of school infrastructure. He laid

stressed on rationalization of teaching staff, minimization of dropout rate, ensuring punctuality, and strengthening infrastructure of KGBV.

Reviewing the performance of schools in board exams, the DC was informed that the district recorded a pass percentage of 98.31 in 8th exams, 79.80 in 10th exams, and 67.69 in 12th exams. He directed for remedial measures in schools with low results, expediting of ongoing works.

Seeking best amenities for students, he asked for providing water supply connections to KGBV girls' hostels, streamlining the working of Anganwadi centers, making provision of library in schools and improvement of enrollment. The DC also urged for utilizing aspirational block and panchayat funds for upgrading facilities in schools and providing the best teaching staff to underperforming schools. Mir Tariq Rasool

Prof. Rehman Rahi is a poet of multiple- shades, and multiple thoughts with varied expressions. For many, he is a westernized poet and for few, he was anti-tradition who 'revolutionized' the poetic thought of an agonized nation during the hard times. Many say he was playing with words and for some, he used to play with thoughts but for all he was a poet, a critic and an academician caught in destitute times and only some realize that his inner man was fixe in the brouhaha used to goes off against every conscious voice in the background of destitute times, still, he proved himself as a compos mentis and expressed his thought and emotions artistically using almost all poetic devices to beautify his art of poetry. Like his precursor Dina Nath Nadim, Rahi is a product of a progressive movement, he accepted the revolutionary influence of Marxist literary thought evident from his poetic collection Nawroz-e-saba but his power of imagination, evolving thought process, the art of assimilation, aesthetics, ironies, ambiguities, symbolism, and imagery painted his poems with shades of modernism, existentialism, and surrealism which evolved as a unique artistic format. He didn't beautify his art with one shade only, Rahi is not a poet of a single style, and one can catch different shades, styles, and dictions from Rahi's art. If one associates him with westernized poetic art by citing his resembling poetic themes with western poets, If the theme of his poems like "Sooun Gaam" resembles Eliot's "The Love Song of Prufrock",.If Rahi's Nawroz-e-saba portrays progressive literary thought, then one can also feel the shades of Abhinavgupta's "Anubhava-nived ana-stotra," when He expresses his experiences in a poem like in Thoni Russ Sadaa. There are stances of bhairava mudrâ like in the poem Sona Lank. Sometimes Rahi abides by the descriptive technique as used in Abhinava's sâmbhavî mudrâ.

Rahi has not laid off from his tradition, besides using all new styles to beautify his art. His art, if resembles the western modern diction, is rooted in the tradition of Mehjoor and Dina Nath Nadim. The shades of Abdul Ahad Azad too are visible. As a well-read and conscious poet, he has tried to fit and find a place for his art beyond the boundaries of his nation, so to appropriate his poetry Rahi has aesthetically decorated his poetry with trends of the time like Modernism, Nationalism, Progressivism, or existentialism. The proper hermeneutics of Rahi's poetry can reveal new philosophies and philosophical elements within the verses he has crafted. His poetry has scope for phenomenological



and ontological appraisal.

Rahi was a proponent of change and evolution. He always yearns for uniqueness and in this longing, he loses his circle and strives for the reality he dreamed of during his literary life. He says probably in the introduction Nawroz-e-saba that new thought gives budding to new ideas, new reality awakens new dreams and new dreams give new directions to the new reality. So to achieve new dreams, Rahi moved a step forward from his tradition. He didn't keep himself fixed. Even in his literary journey, He at times didn't feel it important to fence himself in the elements of prosody-Ourooz o Ahang-though considered as poetic essentials. He has always tried to craft the lexis differently to achieve different structures and meaning in resonance with the spectacle and melody. Referring to Aristotelian mimesis, Paul Ricoeur one of the world's major philosophical thinkers says that spectacle, melody, and lexis together play an instrumental role. Rahi has appropriated all the Ricoeurian elements beautifully in both his Nazms and Ghazals thus crafting striking pieces of literature.

Poet always talks, sometimes with nature or with himself or with the words, pain or beauty. Poetic dialogue is continuous without voice. Sometimes a poet talks about people's suffering or pain, and sometimes about the nation's agony or triumph. Like other poets, Rahi continued his conversation with Zabarwan Ball or Sonlank discussing the 'Being. Rahi was never silent as many say that he is a poet of "poet of silence" perhaps for being indifferent or maintaining silence over people's agony. He gave voice to people's agony in his poetic collection "on the Pier of Bridge-Kadla Thatis Peth". One should read Rahi's acceptance speech written in the year 2000 in response to a Fellowship conferred to him by Sahitya Akademi. The speech is enough to prove that Rahi was never a poet of silence vis-à-vis people's agony. Rahi arrived into this world when the global knowledge system was thriv-

ing with varied political, philosophical, and social slogans, realism, romanticism, modernism, Marxism, and other -isms were spreading but Rahi's homeland was struggling in an abysmal crisis that continued till his last breath and Rahi always find himself in destitute times. He was a conscious poet aware of the surrounding hard times so to live with his art and reach the audience during the destitute times he opted for poetic language. People always look at poets or leaders during hard times and seek the poet's role. Friedrich Hölderlin a famous German poet and philosopher, himself posed the same question in an elegy Brod and Wein or "Bread and Wine" what are poets for in a destitute time or time of need? The elegy was written in 1801. Martin Heidegger poses the same question: what are poets for? And comes up with the answer too. Heidegger says that a poet should reach the Abgrund (abyss) and sing Dasein (existence) in the destitute times. Rahi seems to be aware of his times of destitution when he feels that fugitive gods have departed. He calls his inner poet to sing the Heideggerian Dasein in his poem Shaiy'r (poet) with an artistic expression. Rahi not only provides an answer to Holdrein and Heidegger but reaches out to other poets of destitute times like Baudelaire who speaks of the condition of a poet in the modern destitute age, Stephane Mallarme, WB Yeats, and Rainer Maria Rilke. Rahi says that a poet is: A dewdrop walks to soothe burning petals, A cascade flows to cut the mountains, A breeze runs to create waves in oceans, A gaze of love to blossom a lotus, A bulbul who dreams spring in winters.....

Rahi feeling the agony of the times aesthetically reaches the audience sometimes, he satisfies himself by saying that Shaiyrus asaan chi zakhman zev anyen : Eng; Poet makes wounds to speak(Nowroz-e-saba), many times he found solace and solution at the symbolic peak of Zabarwan.He says kiya soonchyeth meyt zev dyech taals, zar chu zabarvun baalus peyth(Kadla Thetus Peyth).

Tailpiece: Prof. Rehman Rahi is a multifaceted poet, critic, and writer who left a treasure of poetry and critical writings. He is not a poet of modernism and progressivism but a poet thinker and poet of philosophies who needs to be explored along with his contemporaries like Prof Rashid Nazki and Amin Kamil in conformity with the modern parameters of knowledge and scholasticism. His writing demands deep research and interpretation. We need to come out of the mere rhetoric to establish concrete poetic and literary thought based on the treasure of writings our poets have left behind.

Maldives President Urges China To Send **More Tourists Amid Row With India**

Beijing, China: Maldivian President Mohamed Muizzu on Tuesday appealed to China to "intensify" efforts to send more tourists to his country, amid a spate of cancellation of reservations by Indian tourists after a diplomatic row erupted over the derogatory remarks by his ministers against Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

On the second day of his five-day state visit to China, Muizzu in his address to the Maldives Business Forum in Fujian Province on Tuesday termed China as the island nation's "closest" ally.

"China remains one of our closest allies and development partners," he said. He praised the Belt and

Road Initiative (BRI) projects launched by Chinese President Xi Jinping in 2014, saying that they "delivered the most significant infrastructure projects witnessed in Maldivian history", according to his



He urged China to bolster the flow of its tourists to the Maldives. "China was our (Mal-

dives') number one market video of him on a pristine pre-Covid, and it is my request that we intensify efforts for China to regain this position," according to a readout posted on his official website.

The highest number of visitors to the Maldives were from India, with 209,198 arrivals, followed by Russia in second place with 209,146 arrivals, and China in third place with 187,118 arrivals.

In 2022, India remained the top Maldives tourism market, with 240,000 arrivals. Russia followed closely in second place with 198,000 tourists, and Britain ranked third with over 177,000 arrivals. Before COVID, China held the top spot with over 2.80 lakh tourists but is currently struggling to revive its domestic and foreign tourism due to a nearly fouryear lockdown policy and the continued slowdown of its economy.

As a result, Chinese tourists who travelled abroad for holidays in millions before COVID are now restricting themselves given the economic slowdown.

Is it better to eat several small meals or fewer larger ones?

t is widely accepted in modern culture that people should divide their daily diet into three large meals breakfast, lunch, and dinner — for optimal health. This belief primarily stems from culture and early epidemiological studiesTrusted Source.

In recent years, however, experts have begun to change their perspective, suggesting that eating smaller, more frequent meals may be best for preventing chronic disease and weight loss. As a result, more people are changing their eating patterns in favor of eating several small meals throughout the day.

Those who advocate for eating small, frequent meals suggest that this eating pattern can:

- improve satiety, or feeling full after a meal
- increase metabolism and body composition
- prevent dips in energy
- stabilize blood sugar
- prevent overeating.
- While a few studies support these recommendations, others show no significant benefit. In fact, some research suggests it may be more beneficial to stick with three larger meals.

Early epidemiological studiesTrusted Source suggest that increased meal frequency can improve blood lipid (fats) levels and reduce the risk of heart disease. As a result, many experts advise against eating fewer, larger meals a day.

Over the years, some studies have supported these findings, suggesting that people who report eating small, frequent meals have better cholesterol levels than



those who consume fewer than three meals per day. In particular, one 2019 cross-sectional studyTrusted Source that compared eating fewer than three meals per day or more than four meals per day found that consuming more than four meals increases HDL (high-density lipoprotein) cholesterol and lowers fasting triglycerides more effectively. Higher levels of HDL are associated with a reduced risk of heart disease.

This study observed no differences in total cholesterol or LDL (low-density lipoprotein) cholesterol. It is important to note, however, that this is an observational study, meaning it can only prove association, not causation.

Additionally, one review published in the American Heart Association's journal CirculationTrusted Source concluded that greater eating frequency is associated with a reduced risk for diabetes and cardiovascular disease, according to epidemiological studies.

Meal frequency and weight loss

There is a commonly held notion that more frequent meals can help influence weight loss. However, the research on this remains mixed.

For example, one studyTrusted Source compared eating three meals per day or six smaller, more frequent meals on body fat and perceived hunger. Both groups received adequate calories to maintain their current body weight using the same macronutrient distribution: 30% of energy from fat, 55% carbohydrate, and 15% protein.

At the end of the study, researchers observed no difference in energy expenditure and body fat loss between the two groups. Interestingly, those who consumed six smaller meals throughout the day had increased hunger levels and desire to eat compared to those who ate three larger meals per day.

Although calorie intake was controlled in both groups, researchers hypothesized that those who consumed frequent meals would be more likely to consume more daily calories than those who ate less frequently.

Results of another large observational studyTrusted Source suggest that healthy adults may prevent long-term weight gain by:

- eating less frequently
- eating breakfast and lunch 5 to 6 hours apart
- avoiding snacking
- consuming the largest meal in the morning
- fasting for 18-19 hours overnight.

, due to inconsistencies and limitations in the current body of evidence, there is insufficient evidence to determine the relationship between meal frequency and body composition and the risk of overweight and obesity.

Does eating frequent meals boost metabolism?

Small, frequent meals are often touted as a cure-all for obesity. Many believe that eating every 2 to 3 hours can help boost metabolism.

Digestion of food does require energy. This is known as the thermic effect of food (TEF)Trusted Source. However, it does not appear that meal frequency plays a role in boosting metabolismTrusted Source.

In fact, some studies suggest fewer, larger meals may increase TEF more than eating frequent meals.

"[From our research], we have found that passion- or strong interest-may be a [key motivational factor for achievement and well-being] as it sets the direction of the arrow," Hermundur Sigmundsson, Ph.D., pro-



fessor of psychology at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology, the lead author, told Medical News Today."Therefore, we say: Find your passion and develop it! Grit, or perseverance, is the size and strength of the arrow. Find your interest area and focus on the process. [Be ready to] take challenges! Challenges are key for development!" he added.

Observational studies indicate that an active lifestyle is helpful for maintaining cognitive and neurological health across age groups — especially in higher order processes such as switching between tasks, working memory, and cognitive inhibition.

For example, older adults who underwent 1 hour of aerobic training 3 times per week for 6 months had increased gray and white matter volume compared to controls.

The new paper points to studies that suggest that maintaining social ties enhances cognitive reserve through cognitive strategies, greater neural growth, and synaptic density, which protect against pathological processes.Imaging studies have demonstrated that larger social networks are linked to a larger orbitofrontal cortex – involved in decision-making – and amygdala volume.

These studies also demonstrate that less socially active people have a greater number of white matter lesions.In addition, randomized control trials have shown that social relations may enhance cognitive reserve, and interventions have shown that increased social interaction in communities is linked to better cognitive function and larger brain volume.Other studies, however, indicate no link between social relations and cognitive function later in life. The researchers thus suggest that more robust evidence from randomized controlled trials is needed to demonstrate causality.

"Der Kaiser', who is credited with pioneering the libero role, inspired West Germany to UEFA Euro 1972 and 1974 FIFA World Cup glory," FIFA said. Infantino said: "A legend of German and world football, Franz Beckenbauer has achievements and triumphs which are etched in history and

yet, for all his popularity, 'Der Kaiser' always remained modest and down to earth."

"He will always be remembered by football supporters across the world, especially by fans of the German national team and FC Bayern Munich, with whom he enjoyed so much success," he added.

Infantino described Beckenbauer as "a really great person, a friend of football, a champion and a true legend", adding "dear Franz will never be forgotten. My thoughts are with his family, his friends and the German Football Association, to whom I offer my deepest condolences."
