Sinha said that efforts were being made to restore "permanent peace".

"Success has been achieved to a great extent in this direction," he asserted and hoped that the government would continue achieving success as per the "expectations and aspirations" of the people of the country.

Besides, scholarships for their children are also being sanctioned, Swain added.

He said whatever is possible we will try to provide them (SPOs) under an institutional way so that they could receive benefits and efforts in this regard would continue.

"Our all officers are highly worried about the SPO's that how to take them alongwith and whatever would be possible we will do for them", the DGP said. (UNI)

They revealed that as of now 27.61 MW electricity is being generated with an installation of rooftop solar projects on 1900 government buildings.

"These projects have been established with the help of JAKEDA and other sister concern departments," they said, adding that the load of government related institutions is about 600 MW.

"Out of approximately 4000 MW load with IPDCL, the load of the government related entities including hospitals, schools, colleges, universities, defense establishments and street lights besides 22,49,4 registered government offices are approximately 600 MW," they said.

"Nearly 15 percent energy is consumed by the government establishments, which is annually estimated to be 3000 mn units of electricity and if only 50 percent of the energy needs are met through rooftop solar projects, the J&K government will save about Rs 700 crore every year," they added.

Official sources said that the financial burden will also be reduced with electricity consumption by educational institutions like Kashmir University, National Institute of Technology and Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology that have better potential for power generation through solar energy.

"Reducing electricity consumption in government departments will provide relief from increasing electricity load,"

they said. "The outstanding dues of various government departments are worth crores, which was waived off under a scheme, but still several government departments are not submitting their monthly electricity bills," official sources

"JAKEDA promotes the widespread adoption and sustainable use of all forms of renewable energy, including hydropower, solar, wind, geothermal, biomass and hydrogen energy in the pursuit of sustainable development, energy access, energy security and low-carbon emission, economic growth and prosperity," they said. (UNI)

Situation In....

Day parade in Lucknow, General Pande said, "On the western front, the situation in Jammu and Kashmir is under control. But in the past few months, there has been an increase in terrorist activities in the southern region of Pir Panjal and Rajouri-Poonch." "There is a ceasefire on the Line of Control (LoC), but from the attempts made to infiltrate, it is clear that the terror infrastructure across the border is still intact. Attempts to infiltrate have been foiled by the Army while maintaining complete alertness," he said.

The Army chief underlined that the number of terror-related incidents has seen a significant drop in the interior areas of Jammu and Kashmir due to the continuous efforts of the security forces.

"We are working with all the stakeholders in a committed manner to uproot and end the terror network in the country," he said.

Talking about the northeast, General Pande said, "In the past few years, there have been important peace accords and peace dialogues with local insurgent groups. As a result of this, there has been a positive development in the region. The proactive policies of the government have played a major role in restoring peace." He said the situation in ethnic strife-torn Manipur has been brought under control due to the government being proactive and the efforts of the Indian Army.

The Army chief said the soldiers have shown maturity in a sensitive atmosphere, adding that "concrete efforts are on to

establish peace and harmony in the state". The Army is "fully ready and competent to deal with any situation" on the northern

borders, he added. "To develop our capability on the northern borders, we have taken a number of concrete steps. Through the provisions of emergency procurement, we have got a number of modern equipment, including arms and weapons with niche technology. Special attention has been paid to develop critical infrastructure in border areas and good progress has been made in this area," the COAS said.

Meanwhile, the 76th Army Day was also celebrated at the Sapt Shakti Command in Jaipur.

"The quarterly EPMS report shall only be submitted by the employees working in the Pay Level-6 and above while the employees working in Pay Level-5 and below are exempted from filing of self assessment report," said the official.

He said that the instructions are brought to the notice of all concerned employees as well as Reviewing and Controlling officers for compliance. (UNI)

Kashmir Valley.....

January 24 on cards. Summer like weather conditions prevail in Srinagar and other parts of the Kashmir valley and people were seen basking under the sun in parks and on the banks of iconic Dal Lake during the harshest part of

winter "Chillia Kalan".

Srinagar recorded a maximum temperature at 14.6°C on Sunday which was 8.2°C. above normal against 6.4°C, while the minimum temperature further dipped to -4.3°C on Monday against the -4.2°C recorded Sunday night.

Srinagar witnessed a record 15.0°C maximum temperature on January 13 which was 8.6°C above normal of 6.4°C since 2003 during this period of the

The other stations of the Kashmir valley also witnessed 8-9°C above normal day temperature on the previous day.

Meteorological Centre Srinagar predicted dry weather likely to continue till January 24 with feeble Western Disturbances (WDs) approaching on 16th and 20th evening.

It said under the influence of these WDs, the weather will remain generally cloudy with the possibility of light Rain/ Snow over isolated middle & higher reaches of Jammu and Kashmir.

"Overall, there is no significant weather activity till January 24", the MeT office added.

As per the indications of different models, the outlook during January 25-27, there is a possibility of light rain or snow at scattered places during the period.

Meanwhile, Qazigund on Srinagar-Jammu national highway had a low of-4.2°C against -4.0°C a day ago, while Kokernag recorded a low of -2.0°C against the -2.2°C recorded the previous night.

Pahalgam dipped to -5.6°C against -5.5°C recorded the previous night. It was still 1.5°C above normal for the tourist spot of south Kashmir.

Gulmarg plummeted to -2.8°C against the -1.2°C recorded on the previous night. It was 5.1°C above normal for the famous ski resort of north Kashmir.

Kupwara recorded a low of -4.1°C against the -4.0°C recorded the previous day. It was 1.2°C below normal for the frontier Kashmir district during this period of the season, the MeT office said.

Ladakh Witnessed.....

Minister Narendra Modi, the Central Government has accorded very high priority to the development of Ladakh and welfare of the local population including Buddhists and tribals, he said.

The delegation conveyed its heartfelt gratitude to PM Modi for rapid development of the mountainous region ever since it was accorded the UT status in October 2019.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, though for the first time a Ladakh delegation had met the then Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru way back in 1949 seeking separate UT status for the remote region, the dream fructified only seven decades later after PM Modi took over.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, PM Modi accords highest priority and attention to Ladakh, unlike the previous governments due to which the UT faced decades of neglect and abandonment. For the first time under the Modi government, Ladakh has been granted a University, Hotel Management Institute and professional Colleges, he

Referring to the action plan for "Carbon Neutral" Ladakh as announced by PM Modi, Dr Jitendra Singh said, with a Rs. 50 crore Special Development Package for Ladakh, for the first time any Central government has been so liberal in funding the various projects for the region.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, an exclusive Examination Centre has been set up at Leh for conducting the UPSC's Civil Services. "This is not only a significant Governance reform but a huge Social reform for the job aspirant youth living in remote and far-flung areas," he said.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, Ladakh will soon have South East Asia's first Night Sky Sanctuary at the Night Sky Reserve at Hanle village in Eastern Ladakh as a part of Changthang Wildlife Sanctuary. It will boost Astro-tourism in India and will be one of the world's highest-located sites for optical, infra-red, and gamma-ray telescopes, he said.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, the CSIR in the Union Ministry of Science & Technology is promoting "Leh Berry', which is an exclusive food product of the cold desert. Referring to PM Modi's visit to Ladakh in May 2018, Dr Jitendra Singh said the Prime Minister has strongly advised promoting Seabuckthorn, which is the source of "Leh Berry".

The Minister said that commercial cultivation of three medicinal plants is also being promoted at a height of above 15.000 feet. This includes "Sanjeevani Booti", locally known as "Sola", which has very high life saving and therapeutic

Dr Jitendra Singh said that the Department of Atomic Energy will set up facilities in the UT for Gamma Irradiation Technology for preservation/shelf life extension of fruits and vegetables. He was happy to note that Apricot from Ladakh is now

being exported to Dubai and other overseas destinations.

(JJM) impressed upon the concerned that after culminating the process of tendering and allotment of works the focus of the mission should be to complete the schemes well on

The meeting besides the ACS, Jal Shakti Department was attended by Principal Secretary, Finance; Secretary, Rural Development; Secretary, School Education; Mission Director, JJM; Chief Engineer, Kashmir/Jammu besides other senior officers of the department.

While speaking during this meeting the Chief Secretary highlighted the importance of identification of the sustainable water source for each scheme in order to achieve the goal of round the year 'Nal se Jal' for each household. He stressed on carrying out the much requisite feasibility studies to make the schemes successful in providing quality water to the its consumers.

He called upon the department to make provision for senior officers to monitor the progress on each scheme and see that it completes meeting all the essential guidelines set for the water supply scheme. He even advised for earmarking a proportion of works to be monitored by the concerned Chief Engineers especially those with having ground water source or requiring electromechanical works for their completion.

Dulloo also asked for enhancing the capacity of locals to carry out the testing of water supplied to them and operation of the allied schemes. He called for training as many locals as possible in the local technical institutions for keeping a pool of technically sound people in each village to look after their schemes. He impressed upon enhancing the number of 'Nal Jal Mitras' for accelerating the frequency of testing and better operation of the

He also called for making provisions for operation and maintenance of the schemes wherever necessary for the panchayats to be declared as 'Har Ghar Nal se Jal' certified. He called for increasing the IEC activities to generate awareness among the masses besides taking measures for including 'water conservation' in the school curriculum here as desired by the PM.

The ACS, Jal Shakti, Shaleen Kabra informed the meeting about the measures being taken to pace up the progress on this mission. He gave out that till date 76% of the households have been provided with tap connections comprising of 14,23,305 households across the districts of J&K. He further apprised that around 3,27,215 households have been added in the current financial year only.

Regarding the execution of works the ACS revealed that the progress is satisfactory as 6478 (98%) of works already stands allotted and 5806 (88%) works started on ground and 1571 works completed by the executing agencies.

As far as water quality monitoring is concerned it was said that around 204957 tests had been conducted in different areas of the UT in 98 labs established across it. It was also given out that 7530 Free Testing Kits (FTKs) have been distributed in villages where more than 33000 women have been trained to use these kits properly.

Moreover it was highlighted that out of 22 district labs, 10 have been accredited by NABL and rest are going to get the accreditation soon. To ensure quality it was reported that third party monitoring, roping in of NGOs as ISAs besides capacity building of Pani Samities is ensured across the panchayats of the UT. It was also revealed that all the water testing labs at tehsil/Subdivision level are being inspected by Food & Drug Controller to ascertain their readiness and fitness for the task they had been established.

The committee later gave an in principle approval to the carrying out of works on 79 schemes across the UT to include the left out 57837 households across different districts of the UT as per the guidelines of this mission besides taking other decision for smooth advancement of this national mission.

The Finance department said that

in the last month of the ongoing fiscal, payments shall be made only for the works duly executed, and the goods and services already procured.

It also directed that a rush of expenditure on procurement of goods and services should be avoided during the last month of the current financial year to ensure that codal procedures are complied with and there is no infructuous expenditure.

"Director Finance (s)/Financial Advisor (s) are advised to specially monitor this aspect in their respective departments," the order states.

It also imposed a 10 percent economy cut on the budget allocation for OE, LTC, POL, travel, advertisements, publicity, hospitality & sumptuary activities.

The government further directed that utmost economy shall be observed in organizing conferences seminars/workshops. "Holding of exhibitions/fairs/ seminars/ conferences outside I&K is strongly discouraged," the order states.

The government also imposed a complete ban on holding of meetings and conferences at private hotels. "Government buildings/halls should be utilized for holding of meetings and conferences instead," the order

The government also imposed a 10% economy cut on the budget allocation for conduct of camps, conferences and seminars.

"Purchase of new vehicles is strictly discouraged. Exceptional cases for meeting critical operational requirements shall be permitted with 20% reduction against condemnation as a replacement measure and with the concurrence of the Finance Department. The already condemned vehicles must be auctioned and auction proceeds deposited as miscellaneous revenue before submitting such a proposal," the government said.

The government also said that travel expenditure should be regulated so as to ensure that each department remains within the revised allocated budget. "International travel shall not be allowed unless specific permission is granted by the Finance Department," the government said.

It also imposed a 10% economy cut on the travel expenses budget allocation for 2023-24.

The government also said that there shall be a complete ban on holding of official dinners and lunches, except those hosted by the chief secretary and Lieutenant Governor or with specific approval of

the Lieutenant Governor. It also said that no new posts shall be created and filling of regular posts may be undertaken only through JKSSB/JKPSC routes and with concurrence of the Finance Department.

"Posts that have remained vacant for more than two year should be identified for surrender. Such posts should not be revived except under rare and unavoidable circumstances and after seeking clearance from the Finance Department," reads the order.

Ram 'Bhaian'.....

Kohli Buys Into India's Plan To **Bat With Wild Intensity**

The No. 3 Batter Tried To Hit Half Of The 16 Balls He Faced Against Afghanistan To The Boundary

NEW DELHI: The ball pings off the middle of the bat. Poof. It's a rasping slog-sweep from outside off. Both the outfielders are on the leg side - deep midwicket and wide long-on - in the powerplay, but neither has a chance to cut it off. The slog - and it's variety - is among the most productive shots for big-hitters in T20 cricket. But Virat Kohli, even at his destructive best, isn't much of a slogger and relies more on timing at a strike rate of 257.14. the ball. Playing his first T20I in more than a year though, he was prepared to slog at a spinner in the powerplay.

It wasn't just any spinner. Mujeeb Ur Rahman can turn the ball both ways and can even get the new ball to swing. He is in demand in T20 - and T10 leagues around the world.

Kohli has had his share of troubles against spin in T20 cricket and has been averse to taking risks against this variety of bowling in the past. But on Sunday, he tore up the old template and bristled with high intent. He hit 29 off 16 balls, with five fours. He tried to hit half of those 16 balls to the boundary, according to ESPNcricinfo's logs. He took Mujeeb alone for 18 off seven balls

In a middling chase of 173 against an Afghanistan attack that was without its leader Rashid Khan, Kohli could have opted to ease his way in. But he didn't. Instead, he batted with purpose and looked entirely in sync with the way modern-day T20 cricket is played. Of course, the flat Indore pitch and the

change in batting approach was clear. A plan is taking shape with the T20 World Cup, in the USA and the West Indies, less than six months away.

Kohli even slogged Naveen-ul-Haq wide of long-on. He also dashed out of the crease to Fazalhaq Farooqi. He kept throwing his hands, hips, and shoulder at the ball despite the odd play-andmiss. He admonished himself when he missed. He also admonished himself when he failed to perfectly recreate that six off Haris Rauf from the 2022 T20 World Cup in Melbourne. Just for the record, this ball that caused Kohli such grievance had almost sailed over the rope for six.

Once again, there was precious

fast outfield helped Kohli, but the little reason to be going so hard. This was a choice made by a high-class batter willing to adapt to the world around him. When Kohli tried to pump another boundary down the ground off Naveen, he ended up slicing it to midoff. He then sat back in the dug-out and watched Yashasvi Jaiswal and Shivam Dube operate with similar high intent. Jaiswal struck at two runs a ball and Dube just under it as India made a

mockery of the chase. India captain Rohit Sharma has also veered away from a safety-first T20 batting approach. After being run-out for a duck in the first T20I in Mohali, he could have taken his time to settle down in the second, but he chose to go hard from the get-go. He backed away

and swung for the hills first ball, but Farooqi bowled full enough to trim the

Perhaps having capable hitters like Axar Patel and Washington Sundar at Nos.7 and 8 is giving India's the top-order batters more freedom to attack. In the 2022 T20 World Cup semi-final, India had R Ashwin and Axar at Nos. 7 and 8. Ashwin has improved as a T20 batter, but he is more of a four-hitter than a six-hitter. When Hardik Pandya returns, he will lend even better balance.

India will play just one more T20I, in Bengaluru on Wednesday, before the World Cup in June, but Rohit has already seen enough. He was very pleased with how his batters are refusing to take a backward step.

Mathews blames 'agendas' of former selectors for white-ball wilderness

COLOMBO: Expect to see more of Angelo Mathews in Sri Lanka's T20 side this year. Expect to see him bowl more frequently. And because this is late-career Mathews, coming back into the white-ball frame after years of being picked only for Tests, expect him also to be driven by grievance to some extent.

Following his first T20I outing in almost three years, Mathews seemed to take aim at the previous set of selectors - headed by Pramodya Wickramasinghe-for working to their own "agendas". He also said the freshly-installed selection panel, headed by Upul Tharanga, had him in their T20 World Cup plans.

In any case, in his first international T20 outing since March 2021, Mathews played a critical role in a last-ball win, top-scoring with 46 off 38 balls. This is after he had taken the new ball and bowled two overs for 13 runs. He thinks he shouldn't have spent so long in the white-ball wilderness.

"In the last two Lanka Premier

League (LPL) seasons I batted and bowled well. but unfortunately I wasn't selected for the T20 World Cups, and I wasn't given reasons for that," he said after the game, having picked up the Player-ofthe-Match trophy. "If you take decisions that are driven by agendas, these kinds of things can happen - we haven't even qualified for the Champions Trophy.


"But one thing I believe is that if you train and play wholeheartedly, you can create an environment for yourself where you can perform. I kept my efforts up over the last couple of years. I think I can play for a little while longer."

Mathews' bowling has been a sticking point over the years. He had been an important member of the attack in arguably Sri Lanka's best white-ball sides (between 2007 and 2014), where he frequently bowled in the powerplay in T20s. But a growing catalogue of injuries over the years had either prevented him from bowling, or put him in a frame of mind to play only as a specialist batter, depend-

ing on who tells the story. More recently, though, he has become a regular contributor of quiet overs again - a role he said he relishes. "The communication with me and the new selectors is quite clear. They asked me whatmyplanswerefor thefutureand[toldme] their plans as well. We hadavery good discussion. They said that I'm in their plans for the T20 World Cup, and if I could bowlafewovers. Isaid: 'Absolutely - if I can help the team in any way'. "I've been

bowling in the LPL as well, and you saw bowling in the [domestic] one-dayers as well recently. If I can bowl a few overs that helps the balance of the team and the captain can decide whether he wants to play an extra batter or a bowler."
