SRINAGAR, FEB 17: Jammu and Kashmir Director General of Police RR Swain on Saturday said those who get involved in terrorism are victims to us and those who actually mislead them are the real

Swain said police has adopted a new approach to tackle the terrorism and narcotics in Jammu and Kashmir.

"We want our youth to save themselves from narcotics and terrorism. Civil society and masjid Ulmas have a responsibility. ..The ones who get involved in terrorism are victims to us, but those who supply weapons, provide money, and mislead them are the real culprits and not the young one who does have a moustache or a beard. That is why we will have a new approach. We will reward the police accordingly," DGP told reporters after a Public Darbar in Baramulla district in North Kashmir.



"We believe prevention is better than cure," he said.

Kashmir Braces For Major Spell Of Snow

SRINAGAR, FEB 17: The Kashmir region is bracing for a major spell of snowfall even as night temperatures rose above sub-zero levels, officials said on Saturday.

The meteorological centre in Srinagar said an extended wet spell is likely to begin over J&K and adjoining areas from Saturday night and will continue till the afternoon of February 21.

This year, J&K witnessed an extended dry spell, with just two spells of light to moderate snowfall between January 28 and February 3.

The wet weather forecast this time is expected to be intense as compared to the previous spells

Observer (KNO), besides Prime Minister, Rajnath Singh, Union Home Minister Amit Shah and Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari are also likely to visit Jammu and Kashmir in March-April. The visits of union minister including Prime Minister's significance in view of the coming Lok

Prime Minister will inaugurate various projects, including AIIMS, Jammu, world's highest railway bridge over Chenab and north India's first river rejuvenation project — Devika river project — in Udhampur. He will also address a public rally in Jammu's MA Stadium from where he will commence his 2014 election campaign with Lalkar Rally.

The Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will be visiting Northern Command Headquarters at Udhampur on February 24, his second visit to the Jammu region in less than two months, during which he will inaugurate the new building of the Command Hospital and interact with top Army Commanders on prevailing situation in the Union Territory.

"The Defence Minister is scheduled to inaugurate new building of Command Hospital in Northern Command Headquarters on February 24 followed by his address to the Army officers and jawans," the sources said.

The package under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) was approved by the Union Ministry of Rural Development.

With this, the spokesperson said, a total of 233 road projects spanning 1,750 km and 66 bridges falling in the alignment of these roads have been sanctioned for upgradation at an estimated cost of Rs 2,245.46 crore under the

PMGSY III programme for Jammu and Kashmir. The PMGSY programme was launched in Jammu and Kashmir in 2001-02 to provide connectivity to unconnected habitations with

a population above 250 as per the 2001 census. Under this programme, 2,140 rural habitations were found eligible to be connected. For this, the Ministry of Rural Development sanctioned 3,425 works, including 239 bridges (2.741 new connectivity works and 684 upgradation works), under PMGSY-I and II for the construction of 19,049 km of roads at an estimated cost of Rs 12,565 crore.

Despite adverse working conditions, Jammu and Kashmir has achieved 98.50 per cent of the target under PMGSY-I and II, the spokesperson said.

He said 2,118 habitations have been connected so far and the remaining 23 are likely to be connected by March.

A total of 17,985.10 km of roads has been constructed under the scheme, he said.

Under PMGSY-III, the spokesperson said, 521.09 km of road length has been upgraded

so far at a cost of Rs 11,723.57 crore. Jammu and Kashmir has performed exceptionally in making progress and achieving goals under the PMGSY since 2019, constructing 9,000 km of roads, he said.

Notably, the union territory ranked third at the national level in 2020-21 and 2021-22 in terms of road length constructed in a year.

Lieutenant Governor (LG) Manoj Sinha expressed gratitude to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Minister of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj Giriraj Singh for the approval of the road infrastructure projects.

In a statement, Sinha said the road upgradation projects will benefit hundreds of habitations in six districts of Jammu and Kashmir.

The two-lane bridge for the border district of Poonch will ensure greater ease of travel and connect villages to prosperity and con-

They added that to set this exercise into motion, the National Automated Fingerprint Identification System (NAFIS) labs have been started in every district of Jammu and Kashmir to collect fingerprints of criminals.

"The manpower dealing in handling NAFIS operations are also being trained by the expert

They said that NAFIS Lab has recently been started in Jammu district, where a database of fingerprints of criminals is being prepared as they are helpful in criminals investigation, adding, "those involved in crimes like terrorism, bovine smuggling, narcotics smuggling can be easily be identified and the involvement can further be proved with photographs and fingerprints of the arrested criminals by the police before producing him in the court."

"The fingerprint data along with photographs of such criminals are being updated online in the labs while Station House Officers in all the districts of the division including Jammu have been provided with fingerprint scanners for following the necessary procedure at their level," sources added.

They revealed that the criminals hiding their identities will no longer be able to dodge the police through NAFIS Lab exercise, adding they said, "with the help of fingerprints, previous records of the criminals will be known by the police.'

"The NAFIS labs have been started in all the districts and they have been made operational. A database of fingerprints of criminals is being prepared for record," a senior police official confirmed.

Banihal-Sangaldan.....

"The Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) project is one of the most ambitious Himalayan railway projects post Independence," he

According to sources in the railways, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is likely to inaugurate the section by virtually flagging off a train from San-

However, an official confirmation in this regard is awaited.

Talking about the project, a senior railways official said, "Spanning the challenging terrain of the Pir Panjal ranges, the USBRL aims at establishing an all-weather, comfortable and economicallyfeasible transportation network, connecting remote Himalayan areas with the rest of the country." The USBRL project seeks to integrate the Kashmir Valley with the Jammu region and the national rail network, spanning a total length of 272 kilometres out of which 161 kilometres have already been

commissioned. According to the railways, the Banihal-Khari-Sumber-Sangaldan section, which was constructed at a cost of Rs 15,863 crore, is ready for operation and the existing train services from Baramulla to Banihal will now be extended up to Sangaldan, a town near the district headquarters of Ramban.

"It features 16 bridges – 11 major ones, four per cent of this section is in tunnels, with a total of 11 tunnels covering 43.37 kilometres, including the country's longest transportation tunnel, T-50, stretching 12.77 kilometres in the Khari-Sumber

section," a senior official associated with the proj-

"For safety and rescue, there are three escape tunnels with a combined length of 30.1 kilometres. Additionally, the section includes 30 curves spanning 23.72 kilometres. To further enhance passenger safety and comfort, several advanced features have been incorporated, such as ballastless tracks and canted turnouts (a first for the Indian Railways),"

Besides, CCTV monitoring and state-of-the-art tunnel-safety technology, including ventilation and firefighting systems, are some of the other added

So far as electrification is concerned, the Baramulla-Srinagar-Banihal-Sangaldan section of the USBRL project, which spans 185.66 RKM (route kilometres) and serves 19 railway stations, is complete, the sources said.

"Constructed for Rs 470.23 crore, with electrification, it is possible to operate the state-of-the-art Vande Bharat trains in the section. Other noteworthy features include 25-KV OHE inside the longest operational tunnel (tunnel T-80 in the Banihal-Quazigund section), specialised equipment for high-altitude operations and 132/33-KV traction substations at altitudes exceeding 1,600 MSL," one of the sources said. Kashmir Braces.....

Director MeT Srinagar, Mukhtar Ahmad said the weather will partly remain cloudy until February 17 afternoon, after which the weather activity is expected to set in, bringing light snowfall in upper areas towards late night.

The middle and upper reaches across different parts of Kashmir are likely to witness heavy to very heavy snowfall on February 18 over isolated higher reaches of North, Northwestern, Central and South Kashmir, he said.

From February 19-20, there is possibility of light to moderate rain, snow at most places-plains and lower reaches, with possibility of heavy to very heavy snowfall over middle & higher reaches of Kupwara, Baramulla, Bandipora, Ganderbal, Budgam and districts of South Kashmir, MeT Director added.

On February 21, there is a possibility of intermittent light to moderate snow at many places till afternoon or late afternoon and there would be gradual improvement thereafter.

 $In Jammu, there \, is \, also \, possibility \, of intermittent \,$ light to moderate rain with thunder, lightning in plains and light to moderate snowfall over higher reaches with heavy snowfall over isolated higher reaches of Ramban, Poonch, Doda and Kishtwar from February 18-21.

The wet weather will likely lead to temporary closure of roads of higher reaches and important passes like Sinthan pass, Mughal Road, Sadhna, Razdan passes and Zojila.

"Travellers are advised to plan accordingly while the farmers are advised to withhold irrigation and fertiliser application and drain excess water from orchards during the above period," MeT Director Ahmad said.

The weather system will also bring a significant drop in day temperature during the five days wet

that the School Education Department has said that in the past five year's student enrolment in government-run-schools have increased by over 17 percent.

Pertinently, KNO earlier this week reported

It said that till the academic year 2023-24, the enrolment increased by 17.7 percent. "Prior to 2019 there were a total of 12,37,000 students enrolled in government-run-schools of Jammu and Kashmir."

However, it also states that in the past five years the student enrolment has increased by 17.7 percent. "Till academic year 2023-24, around 14,18,000 students were enrolled in government-run-schools."

Cancer Institute.....

Oncology, Radiation Oncology, Surgical, Pain & Palliative, and Preventive Oncology, were initiated on February 4, 2023.

He said daycare services for chemotherapy under the Department of Medical Oncology began on February 20, 2023, and are operating smoothly. A total of 6651 patients have availed themselves of the outpatient services, while 3600 chemotherapy sessions have been conducted until January 31, 2024, he added.

The National Board of Examination (NBE) has approved two seats in DNB Medical Oncology (Super specialization) for the State Cancer Institute Jammu following a satisfactory inspection and reports on the institute's progress.

According to the official, the Ayushman services became available at the State Cancer Institute Jammu on June 26, 2023, and treatments worth 2.5 crore have been provided to patients under the AB-PMJAY Sehat scheme.

He said the inpatient department (IPD) services commenced on November 6, 2023, and all these services are operational on the ground floor, first floor, and second floor. "The installation of the PET CT Scan Imaging system has been completed and will be made functional soon, subject to the availability of technical manpower as per AERB guidelines," he said.

The official said the turnkey works for the installation of the Brachytherapy machine have been completed, and the machine supplied by JKMSCL has arrived at the SCIJ and will be installed soon. Turnkey works for the installation of digital radiography and CT-Simulator have commenced, he

"The works in the basement and on the third floor for the installation of machinery and equipment, such as LINAC area, PET CT Scan, Modular OT, CT Simulator, and other high-end machines, are expected to be completed by the vendors allotted through JKMSCL within the next 4 to 5 months," the official added.

SRINAGAR, FEB 17: The Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education (BOSE) Saturday notified amended norms and regulation governing the change of subjects and re-admission for senior secondary classes students from the ongoing academic year.

According to the news agency— Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Director Academics of the board in a notification said that the amendments were made on the recommendations of the committee constituted in this behalf and on the approval of authorities.

It said that the norms and regulation governing the change of subjects and re-admission has been amended from current Academic 2023-24.

Existing rule for changing of sub-

According to the BOSE, in the existing rules with regard to changing of subjects, under General, Rule 14): Unless otherwise provided in these regulations, candidates of Higher Secondary Examination Partland Part-II desiring to change their subject in which they have failed or have been placed in re-appear category be allowed to do so at any

Subsequent to the one at which they have failed or have been placed under reappear category along with prescribed fee, without requiring them to appear again in the subjects in which they have already passed provided the change is within the

session.

However, in accordance to the existing rules, If the candidate wants to change their entire stream of subjects they may also be allowed to do so provided they seek cancellation of their results in all subjects, excepting English in which the candidates can retain the earlier awards (If successful and if they so desire).

According to the BOSE, in the existing rules with regard to changing of subjects, under General, Rule (14): Candidates of Higher Secondary Examination Part-land Part-lldesiring to change their subjects in which they have failed or have been placed in re-appear category shall be allowed to do so at any session subsequent to the one in which they have failed or have been placed under re-appear category, without requiring them to appear again in the subjects in which they have already passed provided the change is

within the stream that they pursued. However, the BOSE in the amendment rules said that if the candidate either re-appear, failure or before declaration of result wants to change their entire subject stream (from Arts to science or commerce and

vice versa), they may be allowed to do so provided they seek cancellation of their previous results in all subjects, at their own risk and responsibility.

BOSE said that such candidates shall have to appear in all compulsory subjects of the changed stream and cannot retain awards of any of the previously passed subjects.

In case of pass-out candidates who have already passed Higher Secondary Examination Part-I (Class 11th) and want to change their whole stream of subjects shall be allowed to do so after seeking cancellation of their previous result, at their own risk and responsibility and such candidate can appear either as fresh private or seek re-admission in class 11th in regular mode, for the imme-

diate subsequent session only. However it said that the candidates who have once passed Higher Secondary Part-II (Class 12h) examination shall not be allowed to seek cancellation of result for changing their stream of subjects.

Existing rules of readmission BOSE said that in accordance to the existing rules regarding readmissions, a candidate who has left his or her school or institution without appearing in any board examination (after securing Roll No Slips and are shown absent in marks card) are eligible to seek fresh admission in regular mode for the immediate

subsequent session. Italso said that if a candidate who has once appeared in any examination and declared under re-appear or failure category conducted by board shall not be eligible to seek further re-admission as regular students in any of the institutions

affiliated with Board. However BOSE said that the candidates may be eligible to appear in private capacity under re-appear or

failure category. Amended rules for readmission BOSE in the amended rules with regard to readmission said that the desirous candidates seeking re-admission in class 11th in regular capacity shall be allowed to do so in next subsequent academic session only even if they have appeared, not appeared, passed, declared re-appear or fail, as the case may be in the same class withthe provision that they can seek admission in any stream of their choice, if

they so desires. It also said that the previous result of pass-out, re-appear, failure candidates who desire to change their subject stream shall be cancelled at their own risk and responsibility for which they should apply within fifteen days from the declaration of

their result. BOSE in the amendment rules further said that such students cannot retain awards of any of the pre-

viously passed subjects. It said that no re-admission shall be granted to the students who have already passed their Higher Secondary Part-II (Class 12th) examination.

A senior official revealed to the news agency— Kashmir News Observer (KNO) that discussions are underway at the directions of the divisional administration Kashmir to amalgamate public transport operations, encompassing Smart City's E-buses, JKRTC, and private mini buses, within a centralized route plan and timing system.

The official outlined the initial strategy, indicating plans to consolidate approximately 100–200 high-end private minibuses with E-Buses from Smart City and buses from RTC.

"In the first instance, we are discussing clubbing top-end 100-200 private minibuses with e-buses from Smart City and RTC. A common route plan and timing will be mapped for uniform traffic management. This consolidation aims to establish a cohesive route plan and schedule for uniform traffic management across the city," the official said.

Highlighting the purpose behind integration, the official stated that the private stakeholders should not perceive this integration as an encroachment upon their market share by the government or e-buses. Instead, the focus lies on fostering a public transport system that operates on standardized and uniform principles for the convenience of the public.

"Moreover, as part of the integration process, private buses will be required to adhere to a certain guideline mandating the installation of GPS systems. This step will facilitate the mapping of their vehicles within Srinagar Smart City's "Chalo" App, enhancing accessibility and convenience for commuters," the official stated.

The senior official added that the proposed integration signals a concerted effort to modernize and optimize the public transportation infrastructure in Srinagar, ultimately aiming to provide people with a more efficient and reliable commuting experience.

As per the revised entry fee, adults visiting all parks and gardens (except Tulip Garden and Children Park Hazuri Bagh, Srinagar) will have to pay Rs 30 each while the children below 12 years of age will have to pay Rs

Both children as well as their adult guardians will have to pay Rs 10 each. AS per the revised entry fee, the adults will have to pay Rs 75 each to enter into Tulip garden here while Rs 30 has been fixed for the children below 12 years of age.

Moreover, the fee has also been revised for the foreign nationals including adults as well as the children, who will have to pay Rs 200 each for Tulip garden.

In other parks, they will now have to pay Rs 100 each. Handicrafts Department Ramps Up GI Tagging: Over 34,000 Products Labelled in Two Years

SRINAGAR, FEB 17: The handicrafts department has intensified its Geographic Indication (GI) tagging process as more than 34000 handicraft products have been labelled in the last two years.

As per the figures accessed by the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), a total of 34296 handicraft products including shawls, paper mache, walnut wood and others have been GI tagged in the last two years.

Data revealed in the first three quarters (April to December 31) of the year 2023, a total of 21392 handicrafts products have been GI tagged.

Prior to that in the years 2022-23, 12904 handicrafts products were GI tagged by the handicrafts department.

Out of the 21392 handicrafts products GI tagged last year, a total of 11290 Pashmina shawls have been labelled. Data suggested that 4840 and 3596 Sozini and carpet, respectively, were also labelled last year. 577 Paper Machie, 286 Kani Shawl, 797 walnut wood, and 6 Khatamband were also GI tagged last year.

GI tagging is a recognition granted to products that have a specific geographical origin and possess qualities, reputation, or characteristics that are essentially attributable to that place of

This recognition guarantees that customers are receiving genuine, high-quality products while also protecting traditional production techniques and add-



ing value to the products. As per an official document, Jammu and Kashmir has become the first Union Territory/State in India to issue QR-based labels for all its crafts.

Documents also revealed that the granting of GI tag has subsequently enhanced the exports of these two particular handicrafts in the last two years.

Official data revealed that handicrafts worth Rs. 1116.37 crore were exported in FY 2022-23 against Rs. 563.13 Crore in FY 2021-22

13,000 Patients Attended By 'Doctor On Wheels' In Udhampur Constituency's Remote Areas: Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI, FEB 17: Nearly 13,000 patients have been attended so far in Udhampur-Kathua-Doda Lok Sabha constituency's remote areas by "Doctor on Wheels", the first-of-its-kind, stateof-the-art, Artificial Intelligence (AI) driven free Mobile Telemedicine Clin-

This was stated by here today in a media interview by Union Minister Dr litendra Singh who said that this novel experiment makes use of the latest technology tools whereby the patient attended by the Mobile Telemedicine Clinic is screened, thoroughly investigated and then the consultation is obtained from the concerned super specialist doctor in the one of the leading hospitals in metros like Hyderabad and Bengaluru with whom an arrangement has been tied up for the purpose. This entire exercise of patient examination and providing a prescription is accomplished in around 45 minutes which may otherwise take several days if the patient has to physically go to the hospital, he said.

The majority of beneficiaries of the 'Doctor on Wheels' initiative are women, said Dr Jitendra Singh, stating that out of a total of 11,431 beneficiaries in Doda, Hiranagar and Kathua - Billawar areas 6,643 were women.

Same trend is visible currently in the fourth phase in remote Dudu Basantgarh in the upper reaches of RamnagarblockofdistrictUdhampurwhere as many as 835 women have availed consultation out of a total of 1,452 beneficiaries in 56 villages under 22 Panchayats where the Clinic van has camped so far, he said.

Dr Jitendra Singh further explained that while the entire process of patient's examination and consultation calls for a very heavy cost, in this case it is being done free of cost to the patients in his constituency through the funds raised from voluntary sources.

The state-of-the-art, Artificial Intelligence (AI) supported "Aarogya-Docits kind Telemedicine Mobile Clinic, Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh said

Its huge success will inspire other similar initiatives elsewhere across the country as well, he said.

"Aarogya-Doctor on Wheels" functions on the latest methodology wherein a patient can narrate his illness or complaint in his native language and the AID octor understands the language and responds to the patient in the same language, said Dr Jitendra Singh.

Dr Jitendra Singh said, this free telemedicine facility overcomes the problems of 'Accessibility, Availability and Affordability'. He said, the obstacles like quality of services, specialised doctor, distance of travelling and cost of consultation/treatment are targeted and solved efficiently through this facility. Ordinarily, a metro hospital will cost a patient very heavily and may take two to three weeks' time. This type of free telemedicine mobile camp solves all the problems especially for those having weak socio-economic

background, he said. For the convenience of patients, the prescribed medicines are also being provided free of cost and in addition, medicine kits containing commonly used drugs are being distributed across the constituency free of cost to all the families in general, Dr Jitendra Singh informed. The mobile telemedicine clinic "Aarogya-Doctor on Wheels" is an initiative, said Dr Jitendra Singh, to tie up with various doctors of leading super speciality hospitals of the country providing t quality healthcare to the remotest and inaccessible areas.

This latest super speciality mobile hospital, inspired by the Prime Minister's Digital Health Mission and Ayushman Bharat, is providing doorstep consultation with doctors and helped bridge the Urban and Rural divide in preventive healthcare, he said.

Dr Jitendra Singh informed that the mobile Aarogya clinic is presently being conducted in Dudu Basantgarh in the

upper reaches of Ramnagar block of Udhampur under the 4th phase from 17th January 2024.

Dr Jitendra Singh, who represents the Udhampur parliamentary constituency that also covers Kathua and Doda districts, said, the first phase of this facility covered more than 60 villages in the far-flung Gandoh area of district Doda where it spent three months. The second phase was conducted along the Zero Line villages of the International Border, and the third phase was held in the upper reaches of Bilawar, where such healthcare facilities are either not available or inadequately available, he said.

The Union Minister said the mobile telemedicine service, the first such healthcare service that is delivered via digital mode, is being provided purely from non-government sources.

Dr Jitendra Singh appealed to the local people to avail the facility, saying that through this latest super speciality hospital, doctors are coming right to their doorsteps. The 'Doctor on Wheels' ambulance is equipped with the latest technology and system to connect patients with senior doctors from across the country, he said.

Emphasising that India today is technologically at par with the most developed countries, Dr Jitendra Singh, who is himself a renowned Diabetologist, asserted that these services are of the same standards as the ones provided anywhere in the world. He also claimed that advanced robotic surgeries will be done in the future using telemedicine services.

The sources said the former Madhya Pradesh chief minister, who arrived in Delhi on Saturday, has not met Union Home Minister Amit Shah or Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and has only heard leaders like BJP Madhya Pradesh President VD Sharma saying that he is welcome to join the party.Citing that people in Madhya Pradesh's Chhindwara - a constituency he represented as an MP for nine terms - want him to join the BJP to fast-track development, the senior Congress leader has said that the matter is under his consideration, the sources said. Kamal Nath's son, Nakul Nath, is the MP from Chhindwara now and speculation is rife that he will



his father.

"Kamal Nath has conveyed his unhappiness to the Congress leadership. He feels that Rahul Gandhi is busy with the Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra and the party is now being run by the likes of senior leaders Jairam Ramesh, KC Venugopal and Randeep Surjewala," he said. When the sources were asked whether the cause of Mr Nath's unhappiness was that he was not nominated for the Rajya Sabha polls, they said that was not true. in his bio to begin with. The Congress has denied reports of Mr Nath leaving the party, citing his long association with it and

stressing on the fact that Indira Gandhi had called him her "third son" while campaigning for him in Chhindwara in 1979.

Jitu Patwari, who had replaced Mr Nath as the Madhya Pradesh Congress president after the party's huge defeat in the Assembly elections last year, said, "When Jyotiraditya Scindia had quit the party (in 2020) and our government had fallen, every Congress worker had taken Kamal Nath's ideology and leadership to heart and worked with him. The reports doing the rounds are baseless."

"Can you think even in a dream that Indira Gandhi's 'third son' will quit the Congress? Can he think of leaving the workers who fought the Assembly elections under his leadership and worked tirelessly to try and make him the chief minis-

Objectives, Eligibility Criteria For PM Vishwakarma Scheme

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the PM Vishwakarma Scheme on September 17 last year to provide end-to-end support to artisans and craftspeople nationwide and empower them.

Further, this scheme is aimed at improving the quality and reach of products and services of the 'Vishwakarma', ensuring their integration with the domestic and global value chains. It provides support to them in both rural and urban areas.

In August last year, the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs approved the scheme with a financial outlay of 13,000 crore over five years, starting from FY 2023-24 to FY 2027-28. It will strengthen and nurture the 'Guru-Shishya Parampara' or family-based practice of traditional skills by artisans and craftspeople working with their hands and tools, an official statement said.

This scheme is designed to benefit artisans and craftspeople involved in 18 designated trades, including carpenter, boat maker, armourer, blacksmith, hammer and tool kit maker, locksmith, goldsmith, potter, sculptor, stone breaker, cobbler/shoesmith/ footwear artisan, mason basket/mat/ broom maker/coir weaver, doll and toy maker, barber, garland maker, washerman, tailor and fishing net

It is conjointly implemented by the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises; Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship; and the Department of Financial Services, Ministry of Finance.

PM Vishwakarma Scheme: Objec-

Recognising artisans and craftspeople as 'Vishwakarma', thereby making them eligible to avail several benefits under the scheme.

Providing skill upgradation to hone their skills and introduce them to relevant and suitable training oppor-

Provide them easy access to collateral-free credit and reduce the cost of credit by providing interest subvention, as per the official website.

It also provides a platform for brand promotion and market linkages to help 'Vishwakarma' in accessing new growth opportunities. PMVishwakarmaScheme: Benefits

The holistic scheme envisages to provide end-to-end support to the artisans and craftspeople around the country through various means: 1. PM Vishwakarma Certificate and

ID Card Once they become a member of the scheme, the 'Vishwakarma' will be provided with a PM Vishwakarma Certificate and PM Vishwakarma ID Card, which will be having a unique digital number. It will enable the applicant's recognition as a 'Vishwa-

2. Upgrading the skills The scheme's skilling intervention aims to improve the skills of traditional artisans and crafters, who have been using traditional tools for generations. As per the official website of PM Vishwakarma, this consists of three components: skill assessment, basic training and advanced training.

for all the benefits. This is available

in both digital as well as physical form.

3. Skill Assessment To ascertain the existing skill levels of all registered beneficiaries, a skill assessment will be done.

Basic Training: This will be held for around 40 hours (over 5-7 days) and will include formalisation of acquired skills and upgradation.

Advanced Training: Those eligible beneficiaries interested in further skill upgrades will have the opportunity to enrol for advanced training, which will be held for 15 days (120 hours) or more at the designated training centres.

Russian emigres gather across Europe to mourn Navalny, denounce Putin

Hundreds of protesters, many of them Russian emigres, gathered in cities across Europe and beyond on Friday to express their outrage over the death of Kremlin critic Alexei Navalny.

Often gathering outside Russian embassies, they chanted slogans critical of Russian President Vladimir Putin, whom they blamed for the activist's death, holding up signs calling him a "killer" and demanding accountabil-

Putin's most formidable domestic opponent, Navalny fell unconscious and died on Friday after a walk at the Arctic penal colony where he was serving a three-decade sentence, prison authorities said.

In Berlin, a crowd of 500 to 600 people, according to police estimates, gathered on the city's Unter den Linden boulevard, chanting in a mixture of Russian, German and

Some chanted "Putin to the Hague", referring to the



international criminal court investigating possible war crimes committed in Ukraine. Police used barriers to close off the road between the Russian embassy and the crowd.

"Alexei Navalny is the leader of the Russian opposition and we always kept hope in his name," said a Russian man draped in a blue-and-white anti-war flag, giving his name only as Ilia.

In Lithuania, formerly run from Moscow but now a member of NATO and the European Union and home to a sizeable community of emigres, protesters placed flowers and candles by a portrait of Navalny.

"He was always with us, so it is all surreal," said Lyusya Shtein, 26, a Pussy Riot activist who has lived in Vilnius since leaving Russia in 2022. "None of us yet understand

In Russia itself, prosecutors warned Russians against participating in any mass protest in Moscow. Police watched as some Russians came to lay roses and carnations at a monument to victims of Soviet repression in the shadow of the former KGB headquarters.

Rights group OVD-Info, which reports on freedom of assembly in Russia, said that more than 100 people had been detained at rallies in memory of Navalny. Reuters could not immediately verify the report. Groups also gathered in Rome, Amsterdam, Barcelona, Sofia, Geneva and The Hague, among others.

Trump fined \$355m, barred from New York business in fraud trial

NEW YORK: A judge ruled on Friday that Donald Trump must pay \$354.9 million in penalties for fraudulently overstating his net worth to dupe lenders, handing the former US president another legal setback in a civil case that imperils his real estate empire.

Justice Arthur Engoron also banned Trump from serving as an officer or director of any New York corporation for three years.

Engoron cancelled his prior ruling from September ordering the "dissolution" of companies that control pillars of Trump's real estate empire, saying on Friday that this was no longer necessary because he is appointing an independent monitor and compliance director to oversee Trump's businesses.



In the ruling, Engoron wrote that Trump and the other defendants in the case "are incapable of admitting the error of their ways".

"Their complete lack of contrition and remorse borders on pathological," Engoron wrote. "Instead, they adopt a 'See no evil, hear no evil, speak no evil' posture that the evidence

The lawsuit brought by New York Attorney General Letitia James accused Trump and his family businesses of overstating his net worth by as much \$3.6 billion a year over a decade to fool bankers into giving him better loan terms. Trump's lawyer Alina Habba said in a statement that the ruling was a "manifest injustice" and "culmination of a multiyear, politically fuelled

witch hunt" against him.

"This is not just about $Donald\,Trump-if\,this\,deci$ sion stands, it will serve as a signal to every single American that New York is no longer open for business," Habba said, adding that she plans to appeal.

Berlin, Paris ink 'historic' security pacts with Kyiv

BERLIN: Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky signed a security deal with Germany on Friday in Berlin, hailed by Chancellor Olaf Scholz as a "historic step" anchoring sustained support for Kyiv in its raging battles against Russia.

Hours later, Zelensky and his French counterpart, Emmanuel Macron also signed a similar security pact calling for French military and civilian aid for Kyiv in its war against Russia, officials said. The deal covers aid pledge for up to three billion euros (\$3.2bn) for 2024, after 1.7bn in 2022 and 2.1bn last year.

With the Ukraine war about to enter a third year, the president was set to make a new plea for sustained help with financing and armaments at the



Munich Security Conference, where leaders like US Vice President Kamala Harris are to gather.

Zelensky's European tour comes at a critical time with Ukraine facing mounting pressure on the eastern frontlines because of ammunition shortages and fresh Russian attacks.

Fierce fighting raged around beleaguered Avdiivka, on the eastern frontline, which has become a main Russian target, ahead of the Feb 24 invasion anni-

The long-term future of billions of dollars of Western aid is meanwhile in doubt, with the biggest contributor, the US, in the throes of an election year. A possible \$60-billion package of military aid has been held up in Washington since last year because of wrangling in Congress. The EU has also admitted that it will only be able to make good on half of the one million artillery shells it promised to send by March.

Pakistan, Turkiye resolve to boost security ties

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Turkiye on Friday concluded the 18th edition of their High-Level Military Dialogue Group, reaffirming the commitment to enhancing bilateral defence and security cooperation.

1.4bn kids at risk of diseases and poverty globally: UN

ISLAMABAD: Globally, 1.4 billion children aged under 16 lack any form of social protection, leaving them vulnerable to diseases, poor nutrition and poverty, according to new data released by the International Labour Organisation, Save the Children and Unicef.

In low-income countries, less than one in 10 children have access to child benefits, highlighting a significant disparity compared to the coverage enjoyed by children in high-income countries. In South Asia, child benefits coverage has increased from 9.2 per cent to 24.3 pc between 2009 and 2023, says the data released on Wednesday. Child benefits are a critical form of social protection, intended to promote the long-term well-being of children.

Paid in cash or tax credits, child benefits are essential for reducing poverty, as well as accessing healthcare, nutrition, quality education and water and sanitation. Additionally, these benefits support socio-economic development, particularly in times of crisis.

JAKARTA: Indonesian Defence Minister Prabowo Subianto was on course to win the presidential election by a wide margin, election commission results showed Friday, with 50 percent of votes counted.

The official result is not expected until late March but early indications all point to the 72-year-old exgeneral being anointed successor to popular outgoing leader Joko Widodo.

But both of his rivals said they would wait for the official result and have not conceded.

With half the ballots now counted, Prabowo holds a commanding 56.89 percent of votes, more than double his nearest rival and enough for a first-round majority, the election commission's website showed.

Former Jakarta governor Anies Baswedan stood at 25.27 percent on Friday morning and former Central Java governor Ganjar Pranowo had 17.84 percent of the vote.

Prabowo needs more than 50 per cent of the overall vote and at least a fifth of ballots cast in over half the country's 38 provinces to officially secure the presidency. Analysts say his win is almost assured.

The former general said Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese had called to congratulate him, as well as the leaders of Singapore, Malaysia and Sri Lanka in his Instagram post, which showed him with a phone held to his ear.

But the United States has been more cautious, only congratulating the Indonesian people on the election's "robust turnout" in a statement that did not mention Prabowo's name.

Jokowi, as the incumbent leader is popularly known, told reporters Thursday he had met with Prabowo the previous evening to offer his "congratulations".

Putin "Responsible" For Kremlin Critic Alexei Navalny's Death, Says Joe Biden

Washington: US President Joe Biden on Friday said he was "not surprised" but "outraged" after the reported death of Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny.

"He bravely stood up to the corruption, the violence and all the bad things the Putin government was doing," Biden said at the White House of Russian President Vladimir Putin. "Putin is responsible for Navalny's death."The White House was seeking more information about Navalny's death at a Russian penal colony north of the Arctic

Circle, where he was dispatched less than two months ago. The development has put a further chill into already bitter US-Russian relations. The 47-year-old Navalny had been a leading critic of Putin, and Biden had said after meeting Putin in Geneva in June 2021 that Nalvany's death would risk devastating consequences for Putin. Biden and Putin remain deeply at odds over Russia's invasion of Ukraine two years ago, and Biden is urging Republican hardliners in the US Congress to support additional funding to pay for more weaponry for Ukraine's military.Russia has figured prominently on



the campaign trail as Biden seeks reelection in November. His expected Republican opponent, former President Donald Trump, triggered bipartisan outrage last week by saying he would do nothing to defend NATO allies from Russia unless they paid a greater share for the common defenses. The top Republican in Congress, House of Representatives Speaker Mike Johnson has not put a Senate bill for new funding for Ukraine up to a vote. After Navalny's death, he said the US and its allies should use "every means available to cut off Putin's ability to fund his unprovoked war in Ukraine.

In the 2022 T20 cricket world cup, the longest six of the tournament was hit by United Arab Emirates (UAE) batter Junaid Sidique using a Kashmir willow bat manufactured by GR8 sports based in Anantnag district. (UNI)

Stoinis ruled out of NZ tour, Hardie called up



LONDON: Marcus Stoinis has been ruled out of Australia's three-match T20I series in New Zealand due to a back issue with fellow West Australian allrounder Aaron Hardie called in for Australia's last series before the T20 World Cup in June.

Australia vice-captain and wicketkeeper Matthew Wade is also set to miss game one of the series on Wednesday in Wellington due to the impending birth of his third child but is expected to be available for the final two games in Auckland on Friday and Sunday. Stoinis tweaked his back in the warm-up of the second T20I against West Indies in Adelaide last Sunday but was still able to play. He made 16 off 15 with the bat but played a role in feeding the strike to Glenn Maxwell in an 80-run stand before picking up 3 for 36 to continue his excellent bowling form.

But after the long flight to Perth, he missed Tuesday's third match against West Indies and has subsequently been ruled out of the T20I series against New Zealand having not fully resolved the back complaint. Stoinis is expected to be fit for the IPL which begins in late March.

Hardie is currently playing for Western Australia in a Sheffield Shield match against Tasmania in Hobart and did not travel with the squad on Saturday but will join the squad before the opening match.

Stoinis remains a key figure in Australia's T20I set-up despite losing his place in the ODI side for the World Cup semi and final last year. He was one of Australia's most important players in the T20 World Cup triumph in 2021, playing match-winning hands against South Africa and then Pakistan in the semi-final. He also made a stunning half-century against Sri Lanka in the 2022 T20 World Cup in Australia. His bowling has been important for Australia as well, having become a key wicket-taker over the past year in both the powerplay and middle overs.

But his injury issues remain a concern for both he and Australia's hierarchy. Australia have been reluctant to bowl him in back-to-back games due to his history and he missed games in the lead-up to and during the ODI World Cup because of several different soft tissue injuries.

Australia's other allrounders also have their bespoke injury concerns with captain Mitchell Marsh's ankle requiring ongoing management as does Maxwell's previously broken leg.

Spin bowling allrounder Matthew Short also has an injury cloud heading to New Zealand after suffering a lowgrade hamstring injury in the ODI series against West Indies which forced

him to miss the T20Is. Hardie gets his chance to put forth a case for the T20 World Cup as a backupallrounderwhocan bat in the middleorder if Stoinis has more injury trouble at the tournament proper. Cameron Green was not considered to be called into the New Zealand series with Australia's selectors preferring him to remain red-ball focussed ahead of the New Zealand Test tour. Green will then play a full IPL with Royal Challengers Bangalore to push his case for the World
