Union Minister Says, No Deadline for Statehood Restoration

Srinagar, Feb: Union Minister Kiren Rijiju Saturday reiterated that Jammu and Kashmir's statehood will be restored but stopped short of providing a definite timeline for the process.

Speaking to reporters during his visit to Kashmir, Rijiju said that both Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah have previously assured that statehood will be reinstated "in due course of time." However, when pressed for a concrete timeframe, he declined to com-

"The prime minister and the home minister have already made their position clear that statehood will be restored at the appropriate time, with well-defined powers and functions," Rijiju said.

The minister, who holds the parliamentary affairs and minority affairs portfolios,



emphasized that his visit was focused on discussions related to the Union Budget rather than political or governance matters. He refrained from addressing questions on the division of powers between the lieutenant governor and the elected chief minister, stating that Jammu and Kashmir remains a Union Territory for now.

J&K Police raids Bookshops, seize banned literature

Srinagar, Feb 15 (UNI) Police on Saturday conducted stringent checks across various bookshops in the police district of Handwara in north Kashmir and seized banned literature belonging to Jamaate-Islami.Police said in a well-coordinated and legally supervised operation, the checking was conducted as per the provisions of the law, with special emphasis on sensitive areas such as Kralgund, Villgam, Qalamabad, and Handwara town.

During the intensive search, several bookshops were inspected, and multiple copies of banned books were recovered and subsequently seized, police said. These books were found to be in violation of legal regulations, and strict action is being taken against those found in possession of such material.

"The operation was aimed at curbing the spread of unlawful content that could disturb public order", police said. Police teams carried out the operation in a meticulous and systematic manner to ensure compliance with the law.

"Bookshop owners were categorically warned against stocking, selling, or distributing banned literature. They were also sensitized about the legal implications of engaging in the circulation of such material and were TURN ON.....PAGE 02

Over the past four years, more than 75 government employees in J&K have been dismissed under Article 311(2)(C), with the latest action reflecting the government's stringent stance on ensuring state security.

Reacting to the latest terminations, CM Abdullah said that every accused is innocent until anything is proven.

He said such steps are taken without hearing the dismissed employees.

'The law says that every person accused of any crime is considered innocent until proven guilty," Abdullah said.

Former Chief Minister and PDP President Mehbooba Mufti hit out at the government over the latest dismissals, saying the people had pinned hopes on the popular government expecting such actions will come to an end.

"Arbitrary & summary dismissals of government employees have become a daily occurrence since 2019. What is perhaps most surprising & puzzling is that it continues unabated despite an elected government in power that had promised to put an end to such practices once in office. People had pinned their hopes on the new government expecting at least some relief through vigorous advocacy of these issues with the LG," she said in a post on X.

The counsel for defendants inlcuding Commissioner Secretary to School Education Department, Chief Education Officer, Srinagar, and Joint Director, Directorate of School Education Kashmir, did not oppose the relief sought, stating that both the Chief Education Officer, Srinagar, and the Principal of Government Boys Higher Secondary School, Natipora, had recommended the registration renewal of these students. However, representatives of JKBOSE contended that the school had been engaged in irregular admissions, leading to previous penalties.

After hearing the arguments, the court observed that a prima facie case existed in favor of the plaintiffs. The court noted that delaying the matter could jeopardize the academic careers of the students.

Consequently, the court directed JKBOSE to accept the registration renewal and examination forms of the 22 students and permit them to appear for all subjects in the 2024-25 Class 10 examination.

The court further ruled that the order would be subject to objections from the defendants, who may seek its modification or revocation before the next hearing scheduled for February 28, 2025.

Notably, the dispute arose after Board of School Education reportedly refused to issue admit cards to 22 students of the Islamic Global School, citing irregularities in their admission process. The school management challenged the decision, arguing that the students fulfilled all necessary academic requirements and should not suffer due to administrative lapses.

With the court's directive, the students can now appear in the board exams while the case continues to be heard.

Five Arrested for Public Brawl in Srinagar's Kadi Kadal

Srinagar, Feb 15,: Police have arrested five young men for engaging in a violent altercation in the Kadi Kadal area of Srinagar, disrupting public order. According to officials, the group was involved in a street fight, exchanging blows, kicks, and verbal abuses, causing chaos in the area. A police team from Nowhatta Station intervened and took them into custody, registering a formal case gainst them. A police official confirmed the arrests, stating that the individuals were booked for disturbing public peace. He said all these accused have been booked under Section 194 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) which is about affray - a public fight that disturbs the peace. Meanwhile, local residents have appreciated the swift police action.

J&K High Court Slams Casual Probes in NDPS Cases, Upholds Acquittal of Two Accused

Srinagar, Feb 15,: The Jammu Kashmir and Ladakh High Court has expressed strong concern over incompetent officers being assigned to investigate cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, despite the grave nature of such offences.

A Division Bench of Justices Sanjeev Kumar and Muhammad Yousuf Wani observed that drug-related crimes are surging, particularly affecting adolescents and students. The Court lamented that while narcotics seizures are frequent, many genuine cases end in acquittals due to flawed, careless, and unscientific investigations, with authorities routinely violating mandatory provisions of the NDPS Act."It is shocking that most genuine NDPS cases collapse due to casual, unfair, and faulty investigations. The mandatory provisions under the NDPS Act are being disregarded," the Bench noted, calling for competent officers to handle narcotics cases with diligence and professionalism. The Court urged the Central and J&K governments to ensure that only experienced officers lead NDPS investigations, as mandated by law. The observations came while upholding the acquittal of two men accused of smuggling 10,000 painkiller capsules into Kathua. The trial court had dismissed the case in 2015 due to a lack of evidence, prompting an appeal by the J&K government.

Kashmir Industrial Body Seeks Revival of Sick Units, Submits Memorandum to Kiren Rijiju

Srinagar, Feb 15, : A delegation from the Kashmir Industrial Revival & Development Forum (KIR&DF), led by its president Abdul Gani Parray, submitted a memorandum to Union Minister for Parliamentary and Minority Affairs, Kiren Rijiju, urging the government to take immediate steps for the revival of sick industrial units in Jammu and Kashmir.

The forum highlighted the economic distress faced by industries, particularly small-scale enterprises, handicrafts, handlooms, and artisans, due to prolonged instability in the region. They pointed out that industrial operations have suffered since the 1990s and further deteriorated after the abrogation of Article 370 in 2019.

According to the memorandum, previous reha-



bilitation efforts have failed due to a lack of funds and ineffective implementation by nodal agencies such as I&K SIDCO. The forum stressed that many affected families are struggling for survival, with stagnant accounts and increasing financial stress due to loans from financial institutions.

The delegation urged the government to introduce a comprehensive incentive package for the revival and rehabilitation of sick industrial units, including those in handicrafts and handlooms. They also called for a significant budget allocation dedicated to industrial development and sup-

Emphasizing the importance of a collaborative approach, the forum requested that KIR&DF be included in discussions for

framing a rehabilitation package. Additionally, they sought relief in the form of a waiver of interest on small loans taken by affected industrialists and artisans.

The delegation expressed hope that the central government would take swift action to address their concerns and ensure the economic revival of Jammu and Kashmir's struggling industrial sector. [KNT]



H5N1 bird flu has silently spread from animals to some humans who treat animals, according to a study, by the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) that suggests bird flu cases may be undercounted.
