Some higher reaches of Kashmir valley and the ski



resort of Gulmarg and Tangmarg in North Kashmir's Baramulla experienced a fresh snowfall this afternoon turning the destinations into a winter wonderland.The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) on Tuesday predicted that a fresh Western Disturbance (WD) is likely to bring moderate to widespread rain and snowfall across Jammu and Kashmir over the next four days.

Srinagar, Feb 25 (UNI) Asia's largest Tulip Garden in Srinagar is set to showcase a breath-taking display of 1.7 million tulip bulbs this year, including two newly introduced varieties imported from the Netherlands, officials said.

Nestled in the foothills of the Zabarwan Range, overlooking the iconic Dal Lake, the Tulip Garden in Srinagar remains a major attraction for tourists and nature lovers from around the world.



"Every year, the Floriculture Department strives to introduce new tulip varieties to

enhance the garden's vibrancy and appeal. This year, we have added two new

varieties to make the display even more colorful," said Assistant Floriculture Officer (AFO) Asif Ahmad told UNI.

Last year, the garden featured 72 tulip varieties in an array of colours. This year, the number has increased to 74, offering visitors an even more mesmerizing floral spectacle. The garden is expected to open to the public after March 20.

'The two new tulip varieties—Triumph and Darwin Hybrid—imported from the Netherlands, will add a fresh burst of colour and charm to the garden," Asif added.

A Bench comprising Chief Justice Tashi Rabstan and Justice MA Choudhary stated that toll fees should not be collected from commuters if the highway is in poor condition due to ongoing construction.

The court said that tolls are intended to compensate users for smooth, well-maintained infrastructure. However, the current state of the highway, marked by diversions and potholes, fails to provide such facilities to travelers. "It is unfair to continue charging tolls when the road is in a deteriorated condition," the court said, acknowledging the concerns of commuters.

The decision came in response to a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by Sugandha Sawhney, who sought exemption from toll taxes at Lakhanpur, Thandi Khui, and Bann toll plazas on NH-44.

The highway is currently undergoing construction for the Delhi-Amritsar-Katra Expressway project. The plea highlighted the inconvenience caused to the public due to the construction work, which has reduced the four-lane highway to a single lane in many areas.

The court also noted that the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) and the concessionaire had acknowledged the deteriorated condition of the highway, with alternative service roads provided for traffic. Despite this, toll fees were being collected, which the court deemed unfair given the poor condition of the road. The Thandi Khui Toll Plaza had already ceased toll collection since January 26 last year.

The court criticized the government for raising toll fees at Lakhanpur and Bann toll plazas while the Thandi Khui plaza was closed. This move was seen as further burdening the public, especially since the highway was in such poor condition. The court referred to a statement by Union Minister Nitin Gadkari in June 2024, which stated that tolls should not be charged for roads that are not in good condition or up to required standards.

He explained that at the time of accession. Jammu and Kashmir's status had not been fully formalized, and it was understood that its future would be determined through democratic means. Over time, the accession was accepted as final, but Abdullah insisted that the framework governing it should have remained

"If accession is permanent, then the conditions and the framework that made accession possible are also permanent. One cannot be temporary while the other is permanent. Either both are temporary or both are permanent," he

He accused the central government of selectively interpreting Jammu and Kashmir's constitutional status. "We used to see both as permanent. We don't pick and choose. We say that accession is permanent, and the conditions and the framework of accession are also permanent. But you say that accession is permanent, while the framework is temporary. This is the difference in our thinking," he remarked.

Abdullah's remarks come amid continuing political debates over Jammu and Kashmir's special status, which was revoked on August 5, 2019. While the government argues that the move fully integrated the region into India, Abdullah and others continue to challenge the decision, citing historical commitments made at the time of accession. Addressing the economy, LG Sinha stated that 70% of J&K's population is associated with agriculture and horticulture, with 13 lakh families dependent on farming. The Holistic Agriculture Development Plan (HADP) aims to double the contribution of farmers to J&K's GDP. He credited Prime Minister Modi for revoking many regressive laws that had previously hindered investment.

RS 33,000 CRORE WORTH OF INDUS-TRIAL PROJECTS IN PROGRESS

"From 1947 to 2021, J&K saw only Rs 14,000 crore in investment. However, under the new industrial scheme with massive incentives unmatched by any other state or UT-investment has surged. Currently, Rs 33,000 crore worth of industrial projects are in progress, with projects worth Rs 10,000 crore already

He also mentioned the creation of a land bank to facilitate investment, assuring that those who were unable to acquire land earlier would receive it soon.

Tourism has seen exponential growth, with 2.36 crore visitors to J&K. "Many people who owned a single hotel have now built another one in the past four years," he said. The export of Pashmina and carpets has doubled, and horticulture products are reaching the Middle East.

He further highlighted that under the Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), J&K had remained the top-performing region for three consecutive years—(KNO)

WEATHER

Under the influence of WD weather system, widespread moderate rain or snow and thunderstorm is expected in most places of Jammu and Kashmir till February 28, the IMD

It said light to moderate rain/snow would first commence over places of North and central Kashmir on 25 February (evening/ night) and thereafter gradually increase in intensity and distribution throughout J&K.

The system will most likely to cause moderate to heavy snow mainly in middle and upper reaches of Kashmir Division including Gulmarg, Sonamarg, Baramulla, Bandipora, Gurez and Tulail Valley, Kupwara, Machil and Tangdhar Sector, Shopian, Pir Ki Gali, Qazigund-Ramban axis, Doda, Kishtwar and Pirpanjal Range of Jammu Division during the period.

There is a possibility of isolated heavy to very heavy snow over a few higher reaches of South Kashmir and Chenab valley on February 27 and 28.

The IMD has also issued an advisory stating that this weather system may lead to disruption of surface and air transportation like National Highway Srinagar-Jammu, Sadhna pass, Razdhan pass, Sonamarg-Zojila axis, Sinthan top & Mughal Road etc. All tourists/transporters&travellers are advised to plan their trip accordingly.

It has also warned that middle and higher reaches of Kashmir and Hilly area of Jammu most likely to receive moderate to heavy snowfall, while few higher reaches of South Kashmir and Chenab valley may receive heavy to very heavy snowfall particularly on Februarv 27 and 28.

Farmers have been advised to suspend irrigation and other farm operations during the period.

There is a possibility of landslides/shooting stones/mudslides at vulnerable places also. The day temperature is likely to witness significant fall due to the inclement weather

in Jammu and Kashmir. The night temperature increased at most weather stations of the Kashmir valley with Srinagar recording a minimum of 4.9°C and it was 3.1°C above the average for the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir during this period of the season.

The day temperature recorded in Srinagar on Monday at 18.0°C and this was 7.0°C above normal for the place.

The ski resort of Gulmarg recorded a low of-1.3°C and it was 4.3°C above normal while the tourist resort of Pahalgam had -0.3°C and it was 2.3°C above normal for the valley of shepherds in south Kashmir.

Unfair! Asking parents to pay 50% bus fee for winter months

The Directorate of School Education of Kashmir issued an order sometime back asking the parents to pay 50 percent of the bus fee for the winter months. The order has come in for sharp criticism from the people in general, especially the parents of the children. The parents say that it is unfair to direct them to pay bus fees for the period when their wards did not go to school as they were closed on account of winter vaca-

There is a general feeling among the people that the parents should not have been forced to pay the bus fee saying that the schools earn a lot of money and they could have paid the salary of the drivers and conductors out of the same. Some of the parents contend that since there is a Supreme Court ruling in this regard it is unjust for them to pay the bus fee during the winter break.

Most of the parents say that the Directorate of School Education has surrendered before the higher-ups of the private schools with the later issuing diktats to the parents whose children are studying in the different schools. Analyzing the things, it can be said that the parents are right in their contention and they should not have been forced to pay the bus fee for the winter months when the schools are closed on account of winter

Time and again there have been complaints against the management of different private schools on account of one complaint and the other. On most of these occasions the complaints are not looked into properly by the concerned department and as such the private schools run away with virtually no or less penalty. The Directorate of School Education needs to play a proactive role and they should be more concerned about the welfare of students rather than interests of the different private schools.

The monthly and annual fees being charged by the different private schools come up for discussion every now and then. There are complaints that the private schools charge the fee of their own and there is no system in the same. Virtually there is no uniformity in the fee structure and the parents are at loss as to how to cope up with this situation. In addition to this the schools charge the parents on account of one fund and the other and there is no one to stop them in this respect.

s regional theater traditions have evolved, India's theater and performing arts have been catalysts for social and political change. Theatre has proven to be a powerful medium for promoting justice, resisting authority, and drawing attention to social injustice. Growing regional nationalism, the question of nation, and the complex narratives of anti-colonial struggle have influenced the development of regional theater traditions. For example, the Bengali play Nil Darpan (1860) narrated how indigo farmers were exploited during British rule. Modern theatre The intersection of colonial models of cultural production and traditional cultural practices has shaped modern theater. Performing arts, including theater, have remained a powerful tool for promoting social change and a vibrant platform for debate. Theatre has long been a powerful tool for raising awareness, reform, and resistance in India, influencing political movements as well as social structures. From classical rituals to contemporary street plays, it has never stopped changing to reflect and influence social changes. Social injustice has long been brought to light through

The exploitation of indigo farmers during British rule was made public by the Bengali theatre's Nil Darpan in 1860. During the independence movement, people were largely organized through plays and folk performances. Through theatre, the Indian People's Theatre Association (IPTA) promoted anti-colonial sentiment in 1943. Lower-class communities have been able to express their identity through theater. Dalit empowerment and Ambedkarite philosophy are promoted by Bhima Natya (Maharashtra). Theater has been used to expose corruption and criticize policies. In the 1980s, Safdar Hashmi's Jan Natya Manch presented street plays that criticized government policies; this led to his assassination in 1989. Law and social reform have been influenced by theater. Vijay Tendulkar's 1972 book Sakharam Binder's discussion of women's rights and revelations of domestic abuse resulted in strict censorship laws. Religious and social traditions: Ancient theater had strong religious and social roots. Kutiyattam (Kerala), recognized by UNESCO in 2001, still upholds the traditions of Sanskrit theatre. Social commentary through folk theatre: Current socio-political issues are reflected in folk traditions. Class struggle was depicted in Jatra (Bengal) during the Naxalite movement. Human rights, democracy, and corruption became new themes in modern theater. Habib Tanvir's Naya Theatre in the 1950s portrayed social issues by combining folk and modern themes. State intervention and censorship: Politically sensitive plays are banned by the government. Vijay Tendulkar's 1972 film Ghasiram Kotwal was banned for exposing caste-based corruption and exploitation. The popularity of digital platforms has increased the influence and reach of theater. YouTube-based theater groups, such as Jana Natya Manch, use digital performances for social activism. Government and private sources in India and abroad have supported Indian theater in its many forms since independence, but it has always been driven by elite talents and influenced by Western culture, while also turning to indigenous resources. Modernist playwrights such as Vijay Tendulkar, Badal Sarkar, Dharmavir Bharati, Mohan Rakesh, Girish Karnad, Chandrasekhara Kambar, P. Lankesh, and Indira Parthasarathy were born during this period; their plays have been used and studied all over the world.

New research into GLP-1 receptor has opened a realm of new treatment possibilities to treat opioid use disorder (OUD), a report said on Tuesday.

A three-week Phase I study conducted at the Caron Treatment Centers in Pennsylvania in the US, enrolling 20 participants undergoing residential treatment for OUD, assessed Novo Nordisk's Saxenda (liraglutide), a GLP-1 receptor agonist (GLP-1RA), as a monotherapy for OUD.
