

Two More Govt Employees Terminated For Having Terror Links

SRINAGAR, AUG 22: Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Friday terminated two government employees for terror $links, invoking Article\,311\,(2)(c)\,of the\,Constitution.$

Painstaking investigation clearly established that they were acting on behalf of terror outfits and law enforcement and intelligence agencies had collected incriminating material evidence

The duo has been dismissed in the interest of the security of the state. They include Khurshid Ahmad Rather, a teacher in the School Education Department, and Siyad Ahmad Khan, an Assistant Stockman in the Sheep Husbandry Department.

Sources said Khurshid Ahmad Rather was appointed in government service in 2003 (temporary under Rehber e Talim) and got confirmed as a teacher in 2008.

'Around 80 employees dismissed in 5 years'

SRINAGAR, AUG 22: The Jammu and Kashmir administration has intensified its campaign to root out alleged terror links within the government machinery, leading to the dismissal of nearly 80 employees over the last five years.

Since August 2020, the Union Territory administration under Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha has invoked provisions of the Constitution to terminate employees accused of maintaining links with militant outfits or supporting separatist activities.

The latest action came on Friday when two government employees were dismissed from service. They were identified as Khurshid Ahmed Rather, a teacher posted in Karnah, and Siyad Ahmad Khan, serving as Assistant Stockman in the Sheep Husbandry Department, Keran.

J&K Govt confiscates 215 schools affiliated with JeI, FAT

Jel-FAT School Committees Expired, Flagged Adversely by IA: SED Secy

SRINAGAR, AUG 22: The government Friday overthrow 215 schools that were affiliated proscribed organisation Jamat-e-Islami (Jel) and Falah-e-Aam Trust (FAT).

Secretary to government for School Education Department (SED) Ram Niwas Sharma said that the 215 JeI and FAT schools were reported adversely upon by the intelligence agencies.

According to the news agency—

Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Sharma in a order said that the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India in February 2019 and February 2024 issued under sub-section (1) of section (3) of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. 1967 (37 of 1967) declared the Jamaat-e-Islami (Jel), Jammu and Kashmir as an unlawful association

"The Intelligence Agencies (IA) have identified a number of schools which were found to be directly or indirectly affiliated with proscribed organisation Jamat-e-Islami (Jel) and Falah-e-Aam Trust (FAT)," reads the order. Sharma in the order further

stated that the validity of the managing committee of 215 such schools has expired and have been reported adversely upon by the intelligence agencies.

"In order to safeguard the academic future of the students enrolled in these schools in exercise of the powers conferred by the

Government of Jammu and Kashmir through the Jammu and Kashmir School Education Rules 2010 vide SRO 123 of 2010 read with SRO 292 of 2018 and SO 177 of 2022, it is ordered that the Managing Committee of 215 schools shall be taken over by District Magistrate and Deputy Commissioner concerned who shall propose a fresh Managing Committee in due course for the concerned schools after getting these duly verified," it reads.

KOLKATA, AUG 22: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday accused the opposition INDIA bloc, including the TMC, of shielding corruption and resisting legislative moves aimed at ensuring pro-

bity in public life. Addressing a rally here, Modi made indirect references to the Constitution (130th Amendment) Bill, 2025, introduced in Parliament earlier this week, which seeks to bar prime ministers, chief ministers, and ministers from holding office if they remain in jail for 30 days or more.

Citing the provisions of the proposed law, the PM said, "We decided to bring in a law that provides for dismissing a corrupt chief minister, or even the prime minister, if he or she spends 30 days in jail. But when we brought in a stringent law, the TMC,

"Hon'ble Prime Minister's mantra of 'Minimum Government, Maximum Governance' has enhanced ease of living for citizens and ensured seamless delivery of public services. Today, India is not only the world's fastestgrowing economy, but its future is Kurshid was working as OGW for Lashkar e Toiba (LeT) terror organisation. Despite being paid by the government to fulfil his duty and impart education to youngsters, Khurshid became an active conduit for terrorist activities of LeT.

Investigation has revealed that Khurshid was given assignment to procure arms, ammunition and narcotics by LeT handlers sitting in Pakistan for further distribution among active terrorists operating in the valley. He was in touch with $Pakistan\,based\,handlers\,Manzoor\,Ahmed\,Sheikh$ alias Shakoor and Javid Ahmed. The investigators have revealed that Khurshid had received several consignments containing weapons and narcotics through LoC at Karnah, Kupwara.

"The weapons were supplied to active terrorists, while the proceeds from narcotics sales were used to fund terror operations. His role was exposed after Law Enforcement Agencies received an input on 25th January 2024 that two Pakistani terrorists were involved in smuggling of arms with the help of 4 associates in Kupwara. These four names were Khurshid Ahmad Rather, Zahoor Ahmed, Ghulam Sarwar and Qazi Fazal. An FIR was registered and Zahoor Ahmed was picked for interrogation. Zahoor revealed the tentacles of his network and his other associates including Khurshid was arrested," the investigators revealed on the condition of ano-

On the basis of sustained interrogation of Khurshid and his associates, huge cache of arms and ammunition including 5 AK Type (Short) MP 5 rifles, 1 AK-47 rifle, 2 pistol, 5 MP 5 magazine, 2 pistol magazine, 1 AK-47 magazine, 20 AK-47 rounds were recovered. Khurshid was arrested. Currently he is lodged at District Jail,

"Education is what shapes the course of a country. It necessarily gains importance that those who teach ought to be persons of highest morals and integrity. In J&K's context, several individuals (like Khurshid) played the role of Pakistani proxies in schools, colleges and universities under the garb of 'teaching' or 'nonteaching' faculty for several decades. If the education system is infected with people like Khurshid, the entire country will be put to real peril," the investigators observed.

The sources said that Siyad Khan was appointed as Assistant Stockman in Sheep Husbandry Department in 2004. He willingly started working for Pakistan-based terror outfit Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) and was tasked to receive infiltrating group of terrorists, sheltering them and transporting their arms and ammunition.

According to investigators, Siyad Khan also activities. "He was intercepted and arrested on 12th January 2024 at Peer Baba Shrine, Keran, Kupwara by a Naka Party of J&K Police and Army. On search, 1 AK-47, was recovered from his possession which he was transporting for a terrorist. 1 Pistol, 1 Pistol magazine and 5 Pistol rounds were recovered from his associate Rafagat Ahmed Khan," the investigators said.

It was further revealed that Siyad Khan was in touch with Pakistan-based handler Basharat Ahmed Khan who used to smuggle arms, ammunition and narcotics through Siyad Khan and his associates at Keran near LoC fence for its further transport to active LeT terrorists to execute terror attacks in valley.

"People like Siyad, feed on government exchequer as parasites, and by their terrorist activities keep on hurting India. Such elements must be wiped out from the system. Siyad's disloyalty towards the nation by becoming an accomplice and a ring leader of LeT terror outfit has wreaked colossal damage to the society and the country," the Investigators said. Siyad was arrested in 2024 and he is currently lodged in District Jail, Kupwara.

The sources said that Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha has taken firm stance against terrorism and its ecosystem. His zero-tolerance policy against terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir is characterized by a multi-pronged approach that combines aggressive anti-terror operations, dismantling of support networks, strict legal action against facilitators, and community engagement to foster peace.

By aligning with national security strategies and emphasizing both security and development, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha's policy aims to eliminate terrorism and establish lasting stability in the region.

A senior government functionary confirmed that the dismissals were carried out under Article 311(2)(c) of the Constitution of India, which empowers the government to remove employees without holding an inquiry if their continuation in service is deemed detrimental to the security of the state.

Over the past few years, the administration has invoked these provisions against dozens of employees, including teachers, police personnel, revenue officials, and others. Officials argue that these individuals had either alleged direct links with militant organizations or were accused of providing logistical and ideological support.

"The government has adopted a zero-tolerance approach towards any employee found involved in activities that undermine national security. These actions are not only punitive but also preventive, aimed at dismantling the support ecosystem that allows militancy to sustain," the official said.

The crackdown has been accompanied by stringent vetting procedures for new recruits in government departments. Police verification has been made mandatory before appointments, a move that officials claim has minimized internal sabotage risks and discouraged sympathizers of militant groups from entering the system.

Observers said that the termination of employees has also sent a strong message within the bureaucratic structure, creating a deterrent

"The dismissals are part of a broader counterterror strategy aimed at curbing overground networks, which, according to security agencies, provide essential support to militant operations in Jammu and Kashmir," the official said.

While the government maintains that such actions are vital for safeguarding peace and stability, critics have at times raised concerns over transparency and the absence of formal inquiries. However, the administration insists that every case is carefully scrutinized before invoking constitutional provisions.

Forest Soil.....

Forest Divisions have been prepared. She called upon the field officers to plan their afforestation and plantation programmes keeping in view the parameters of soil health of the

area for success of plantation programmes.

She told that there is a seamless connection between vegetation and soils. Forest soils develop over a long period of time under the influence of forest cover, bedrock and microorganisms. Tree species/ vegetation growing in forested landscapes affect the soils as well as the microclimate, she added.

Similarly, growth and survival of trees and associated vegetation largely depends on the health of underlying soil layers. Therefore, understanding the nutrient status and health of forest soils is very essential so as to increase the forest productivity, enhance microbial populations and achieve success in plantation activities and maintain the forest ecosystem stability.

Further, DG, ICFRE said that few years back there was a general perception that forest soils are similar to the agriculture soils and there is no need to study the forest soils separately. But practically forest soils are influenced by the nutrient cycling and rhizosphere biology in the natural environment and it necessitates the need for assessment of forest soils separately.

Therefore, in this backdrop, ICFRE envisioned to take up a broad based study on the forest soils under the All India coordinated research project on Preparation of Forest Soil Health Cards (FSHCs) under different vegetation types in all the forest divisions of the India, with the financial assistance under the CAMPA Scheme from Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC), New Delhi. It is the first initiative of its kind in the forestry sector, aiming at broad assessment of nutrient status in forest soils and subsequently formulate suitable management practices for degraded areas. She said that ICFRE has a pan India presence with nine regional research institutes present in different bio-geo-graphic zones of

Suresh Kumar Gupta, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests& HoFF, Jammu & Kashmir, expressed gratitude to ICFRE and HFRI, Shimla for completion of Forest Soil Health Cards for territorial forest divisions of J&K. He advised all the field functionaries attending the programme to seek the guidance from the respective Forest Soil Health Cards of their divisions for raising quality planting material in the nurseries and successful afforestation in the

He also called upon continuous interaction and collaboration with ICFRE especially its institute i.e. HFRI, Shimla. He said that soils of world are under stress due to many anthropogenic and natural factors. He asserted that it is essential to assess and improve the soil health in forest ecosystems in view of the nationally determined goals of creating additional carbon sink of 2.5 to 3 billion tons by 2030.

Suresh Kumar expressed his concern that plantation activities cannot achieve the optimum results due to various soil related constraints and less availability of exact information about the nutrient status in forest soils.

In his address, he featured the key role of research organisation like ICFRE and HFRI for providing the concrete information to the forest department and support in management of precious natural resources.

Dr. Sandeep Sharma, Director, HFRI, Shimla made a key note address in the programme. Emphasizing on important and versatile role of soils for human beings, he presented a brief background of the seminal assignment of preparation of Forest Soil Health Cards (FSHCs) taken up by ICFRE and informed that as a regional institute, Himalayan Forest Research Institute, Shimla was entrusted with responsibility to prepare the Forest Soil Health Cards (FSHCs) of all the territorial forest divisions of

UT Jammu & Kashmir. Director HFRI shared that soil samples have been collected from multiple sampling locations falling across different forest types in various forest divisions of Jammu and Kashmir. Subsequently, the samples have been analyzed following the Standard Operating Protocols for assessing the vital soil parameters and finding out the status of soils

in forest ecosystems. Apprising of the training programme, he said that it also a part of larger objective to provide the working knowledge of forest soils and train field level functionaries to make practical use of Forest Soil Health Cards.

During the technical sessions, Dr. RK Verma, Scientist - G and training coordinator, Himalavan Forest Research Institute (HFRI), Shimla interacted with the participants. He made a detailed presentation about the Forest Soils Health Cards (FSHCs) and explained that soil samples have been collected from different locations in UT Jammu and Kashmir. He said that GIS and RS tools have been used for deciding the sampling locations and quantum of samples to be collected from different vegetation types in various forest division of Jammu and Kashmir.

Dr. Vijender Pal Panwar, Scientist-F and National Project Coordinator (NPC), Forest Research Institute(FRI), Dehradun shared his views and elucidated the genesis, conceptualization, and broad implementation of FSHCs project activities at national level. NPC told uniform methodology has been adopted to collect and analyse the samples.

The programme was attended by Sarvesh Rai, PCCF& Chief Wildlife Warden, TRabi Kumar, PCCF/CEO, CAMPA, Conservator of Forests, Divisional Forest Officers and Range Officers. More than 100 officers of various ranks attended the one-day programme, physically and

Dar said, "I think the Assembly session will begin in the first or second week of September. It is mandatory to convene it within six months, and the government is committed to fulfilling this obligation."

Ensure Sanat Nagar flyover is completed within latest deadline

The other day deputy chief minister Surinder Kumar Chaudhary who also happens to be the works minister visited the Sanat Nagar flyover and took a review of the work going on at the flyover. The minister took a serious note of the slackness in the work and directed for the completion of the project by November 15, 2025. The flyover has already missed many deadlines and the new deadline has been set as November 15.

The works minister expressed concern over the huge payment made to the contractor even though the work is going on at a tardy pace. Out of the total payment of Rs. 29 crores the contractor has been paid Rs. 23 crores. This means that the contractor has already received almost 80 percent of the payment even though the work is not completed to the extent of 50 percent. The slow pace of work has complicated the woes of the people living in multiple areas of up-town Srinagar.

The work on the Sanat Nagar flyover has been going for years now and going by the slow pace of work one fears that it may take yet another year for the executing contractor to complete the project. Once the project was commissioned it was said that the work would be completed in not more than one year. This promise has not been kept and the work on the project is going on. As on date one can see that just a few labourers and other professionals working at the site of the project.

The works minister during his visit threatened to blacklist the contractor in case he did not complete the work by the new deadline. This move has been hailed by the people in general and more so by those who are facing hardships in reaching their destinations due to the work on the flyover. However, at the same time it must be ensured that the progress of work is reviewed on a regular basis so that the project is completed on time now.

The work on the Sanat Nagar flyover has been hit by many roadblocks with the significant one being the presence of the transmission lines as the Rawalpora grid station falls in its vicinity. The lines had to be shifted but not before a lot of effort and trouble to the masses who receive the power from the Rawalpora grid station. This process should have been done earlier but it was taken up at a later stage.

Is It Possible for Plants to Think?

Investigating the Entertaining Field of Plant Neurobiology

Ever ponder whether plants are capable of thought? According to current scientific findings, plants are significantly more clever and receptive than previously thought, even though they may not have brains like humans or animals. Welcome to the enigmatic and rapidly expanding subject of plant neurobiology, where plants are acknowledged as dynamic animals with the ability to sense, communicate, remember, and possibly even make decisions, rather than as passive green creatures.

Even though they can't run, shout, or move, plants aren't ignorant.

In actuality, plants are always aware of their environment. They can perceive touch, wetness, light, gravity, temperature, and even chemical cues from other living things. One essential component of intelligence is the capacity to perceive and react to environmental cues.

I used to be amazed and curious about why the Touch-me-not (Mimosa pudica) plant shrank its leaves whenever I touched it as a child?

The time-tested "touch-me-not" trick! What you witnessed was a seismonastic response, which is a fast movement of plants. A light touch causes quick chemical and electrical signals in Mimosa pudica that cause the tiny "motor" cells to release water, causing the petiole to droop and the leaflets to fold in a matter of seconds. In 1926 J. C. Bose (1900s-1920s) Showed plants generate and transmit electrical impulses in His book "The Nervous Mechanism of Plants". He worked with Mimosa Pudica and showed plants take this action to safeguard In addition to making leaves appear smaller and less appetizing, sudden folding can shock or dislodge insects and lessen the likelihood of additional damage. Recent research links these quick movements to electrical and Ca2+ signals that strengthen defenses against herbivores.

Everybody has probably wondered why sunflowers constantly bend their shoots toward the light at some point in their lives and wondered how plants accomplish this?


Since light is the main source of energy for photosynthesis, sunflowers point their shoots in the direction of the sun. They can generate more energy and collect more light by changing their orientation. Young sunflower plants that trace the sun across the sky during the day a phenomenon known as heliotropism show this the most. On the other hand, mature sunflower heads typically face east all the time. This process is mediated by plant hormones mainly Auxins that control cell elongation. It was shown by Charles and Francis Darwin that the coleoptile tip senses light and signals the base to bend

as gravitropism (or geotropism). Positive gravitropism causes roots to grow downward, whereas negative gravitropism causes shoots to grow upward. This reaction guarantees that they are properly oriented to acquire resources (water, minerals, and light). Specialized cells and organelles allow plants to sense gravity. In the root cap and shoot endodermis, statocytes gravity-sensing cells contain dense, starch-filled plastids called statoliths. Tilting a plant causes its statoliths to silt due to gravity, which in turn activates mechanosensitive ion channels and causes auxin redistribution. Differential cell bending and elongation result from this. Removing gravity changes auxin transport and decreases statolith sedimentation, according to NASA and ESA experiments (Driss-Ecole et al., Plant Science,

Since plants cannot see or hear, have you ever wondered how one plant can detect the presence

The main ways that plants identify their neighbors are by light signals, volatile compounds, and root exudates. Plants notice variations in the ratio of red light (R) to far-red light (FR). In the presence of another plant, it absorbs red light for photosynthesis and reflects more far-red light. The plant uses phytochrome pigments to identify this changed R:FR ratio. In response, the detecting plant outgrows rivals for sunlight by lengthening its stem (a behavior known as shade avoidance syndrome). When the R:FR ratio is low, Arabidopsis thaliana and many other crops lengthen their stems to indicate the presence of neighbors. Photoreceptor signaling networks in plants' reactions to shade (Annual Review of Plant Biology), Casal JJ (2012). This study clarifies how phytochromes control auxins and other growth hormones in low R:FR environments.

Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) are used for detection.

As messages, plants emit and sense volatile compounds. In wild tobacco and sagebrush, wounded plants release volatile organic compounds (VOCs),

such as methyl jasmonate, which are detected by neighboring plants and trigger their own defense genes. In sagebrush, Karban et al. (2003) showed that plant-to-plant communication is mediated by volatile organic compounds.

Chemical Signals and Root Exudates in Soil through their roots, neighbors are able to detect the compounds that plants release into the soil. Allelopathic compounds emitted by barnyard grass are detected by rice plants, which then modify root growth accordingly. Allelopathic root signaling was examined by Bais HP et al. (2006) in the Annual Review of Plant Biology.

Plants lack a brain and neurons, which make up their central nervous system. They are still capable of complicated reaction and information processing, though. Because of this, scientists are now investigating the possibility that plants have a distributed intelligence system that is mostly concentrated in their vascular tissues and roots.

Knowing how plants behave changes the way we think about the green world. The ability of plants to feel, remember, and react intelligently calls into question our moral and environmental obligations. It also creates opportunities for environmental preservation, sustainable agriculture, and potentially future technologies that draw inspiration from plant intelligence.

So, are plants capable of thought? They see, remember, respond, and communicate in ways that are startlingly sophisticated, though perhaps not in the same manner as animals. Despite being a relatively new field of study, plant neurobiology is already demonstrating that plants are significantly more alive, conscious, and active than we previously thought.

He further directed all SDMs to closely monitor Aadhaar enrolment drives in their respective jurisdictions and ensure that 100% students in both schools and colleges are Aadhaar enrolled and updated.

DDC ordered that SDMs and CEO Budgam shall act as nodal officers for this purpose and take responsibility for achieving saturation targets.

He also directed BDOs in rural areas and EOs in urban areas to hold mass Aadhaar enrolment camps at block and municipal levels.

Dr Bilal stressed that during these camps, Date of Birth (DOB) certificates must be issued on the spot to facilitate enrolment of left-out children and resi-



He further instructed that Mandatory Biometric Updates (MBU) at 5 and 15 years of age must be ensured through aware-

ness drives in schools, with teachers mobilised for the purpose. School Education department was asked to match student records with Aadhaar details including name, DoB, phone number and email, which is crucial for Board and competitive examinations. DDC directed that all applica-

tions of 18+ residents on the State Aadhaar Portal must be verified within 30 days, and training be provided to officials for efficient He asked departments to identify suitable government

premises and high-footfall locations for establishing new Aadhaar enrolment centres or organising special camps. Dr Bilal stressed on the need

to encourage residents who have not updated their Aadhaar in the last 10 years to validate their demographic details and update Proof of Identity (POI) and Proof of Address (POA) documents.

He also called for promotion of the mAadhaar mobile app for

verification. DDC said that all departments must work in close coordination and in a time-bound manner so that Budgam achieves 100% Aadhaar saturation. He stressed that Aadhaar linkage is crucial not only for effective service delivery but also for enabling students and residents to benefit from government schemes, scholarships and other essential services.

Besides, ADC Budgam, CEO Budgam, all SDMS, ACD, DySP HQs, all Tehsildars, all EOs and representatives of UIDAI were present in the meeting.

NEW DELHI: Ajinkya Rahane has given up the captaincy of the Mumbai Ranji Trophy team ahead of the 2025-26 domestic season, saying he believes "it's the right time to groom a new leader". In a communication to the Mumbai Cricket Association(MCA), Rahane, now 37, said he wants to continue as a player for the team.

"Captaining and winning championships with the Mumbai team has been an absolute honour," Rahane wrote in a social media post. "With a new domestic season ahead, I believe it's the right time to groom a new leader. And hence I've decided not to continue in the captaincy role. I remain fully committed to giving my best as a player and will continue my journey with MCA to help us win more trophies. Looking forward to the season."

Rahane helped Mumbai break a nine $yeardrought\,by\,leading\,them\,to\,their\,42nd$ Ranji Trophy title in 2023-24. While his red-ball form over the past two years has been patchy (467 runs in 27 innings with just one century), he was more fluent in the shorter formats. At the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy in December last year, when he played under Shreyas Iyer, Rahane was the Player of the Tournament for his charttopping 469 runs in a title-winning season.

Rahane was most recently in charge of Kolkata Knight Riders at IPL 2025, for whom

Rahane helped Mumbai break a nineyear drought by leading them to their 42nd Ranji Trophy title in 2023-24. While his red-ball form over the past two years has been patchy (467 runs in 27 innings with just one century), he was more fluent in the shorter formats. At the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy in December last year, when he played under Shreyas Iyer, Rahane was the Player of the Tournament for his charttopping 469 runs in a


title-winning season

he was the highest scorer with 390 runs in 14 innings at a strike rate of 147.27. The team had a mediocre season, though, finishing eighth with just five wins.

In July, Rahane said he still possessed the "hunger and passion" for the game and for red-ball cricket, stating he even carried his trainers and cricket gear while on holiday in London to begin preparations for the upcoming domestic season.

"I still want to play Test cricket," Rahane had told Nasser Hussain and Michael Atherton in an interview with Sky Sports. "I'm really passionate about playing Test cricket. I'm enjoying my cricket at the moment. For me, it's all about focusing on the controllable things. Frankly, I tried to have conversations with the selectors, but [there are] things as a player I cannot control. I got no response. "As a player, all I can do is keep playing cricket, keep enjoying the game, and give my best each and every time. I love playing Test cricket, love playing red-ball [cricket], it's a passion. The love for the game keeps me going."

Mumbai are currently preparing for the upcoming season by playing the Buchi Babu Invitational Tournament in Chennai, with a young squad led by 18-yearold Ayush Mhatre. Mumbai allrounder Shardul Thakur, a key member of their 2024-25 Ranji campaign, was named captain of West Zone for the seasonopening Duleep Trophy.

Maharaj, who last held the spot in November 2023, returned to the top after gaining two places to move ahead of Theekshana (second) and India spinner Kuldeep Yadav (third). The 35-yearold picked up career-best ODI figures of 5 for 33 which gave South Africa a 98-run win and a 1-0 series lead.

Among the South African batters, Aiden Markram moved four spots up to No. 21 and Temba Bavuma five spots to No. 23 following their respective half-centuries in the first ODI.

Following the recently concluded ODI series against Pakistan, West In-



dies captain Shai Hope jumped two spots to No. 9 on the batters' list. Hope

finished as the top run-scorer in the series with 207 runs, helping West Indies win the series 2-1. His teammate Jayden Seales moved 15 places up to 18th in the bowling rankings following his ten wickets in the series. Following the T20Is between Australia and South Africa preceding the ODIs, fast bowler Nathan Ellis entered the top ten among bowlers, moving three places up to No. 9. Ellis picked up 3 for 31 in the third T20I to help Australia seal the T20Is 2-1. Josh Hazlewood, who picked up the most wickets for Australia in the series, rose two spots

South Africa's hard-hitting batter Dewald Brevis jumped nine spots to equal 12th on the list for T20I batters following his superb efforts in the series. Brevis scored 125 not out off 56 in the first T20I and followed it up with 53 off 26 in the second.
