

JAMMU, SEP 01: Reiterating that the government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi stands firmly with the flood hit people of Jammu and Kashmir, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday assured that Centre would provide prompt relief, financial assistance, and technical support to facilitate recovery and reconstruction, and will ensure the safety and wellbeing of the sufferers.

The Union Home Minister arrived in Jammu on late Sunday evening to assess the damaged caused by the floods in the region.

After conducting a whirlwind tour of the flood affected areas the Union Home Minister, according to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) chaired a high level meeting on relief measures at Raj Bhavan here.

Mata Vaishnodevi Yatra **Remains Suspended For** 7th Day Amid Heavy Rains In Katra

JAMMU, SEPT 1: Amid heavy rainfall in Katra town on Monday, the pilgrimage to Mata Vaishno Devi shrine remained suspended for the seventh consecutive day in Jammu and Kashmir's Reasi district since a landslide on a yatra route claimed 34 lives last Tuesday.

The Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board said it has cancelled all bookings, including helicopters and accommodations, with a 100 per cent refund until the yatra is resumed.

"Yatra has remained suspended for the past one week. Bad weather conditions still persist, so the decision to continue the suspension of yatra has been taken keeping in view the safety of pilgrims," an official said. Heavy rains began in Katra and the Trikuta hills, the abode of the Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine, on Monday.

500 Houses Suffer Damage In Heavy Rains, Flash Floods In Doda

JAMMU, SEP 1: As many as 500 houses have suffered damage due to heavy rains and flash floods in Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district, with relief and rehabilitation operations underway in the affected areas to restore essential supplies and road networks.

"A total of 50 houses have been fully damaged, 100 houses severely damaged, and 350 residential buildings partially damaged. Fourteen animals have lost their lives, and five human lives were lost," Deputy Commissioner Doda Harvinder Singh said on Monday.

Deadliest Month: Over 100 Dead As August Sees 30+ Extreme Weather Events

6th wettest August in 125 years at 73% excess rainfall

SRINAGAR, SEP 01: Jammu and Kashmir has endured the deadliest month, August, as the back-to-back natural calamities have led to the loss of over 100 lives across the region, experiencing over 30 extreme weather events during the last 31 days.

According to the details available alarming surge in extreme weather with the news agency—Kashmir news Observer (KNO), the region has experienced its sixth wettest August since 1901, with the region recording 319.3 mm of rainfall against the normal of 184.9 mm, marking an excess of 73% precipitation.

The month of August witnessed an

Director Meteorological department (meT), Dr Mukhtar Ahmad, confirmed to KNO that more than 30 incidents of flash floods, cloudbursts, landslides, gusty winds, heavy rains and thunder-

In the morning the Home Minister, according to the officials, conducted an aerial survey of the flood-hit areas across the Jammu region.

The survey covered severely affected areas, including Katra, the base camp for the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi shrine and Kishtwar, where a catastrophic cloudburst on August 14 triggered flash floods in Chashoti village, claiming 65 lives, mostly pilgrims, and injuring over 100 others.

The aerial assessment provided the Home Minister with a firsthand view of the widespread destruction caused by record rainfall, landslides, and flash floods, particularly in Kishtwar, Kathua, Reasi, and Ramban districts, the officials said.

During the meeting the Union Home Minister expressed grief over the loss of lives in the recent incidents. "In this hour of crisis, from the very first day, PM Modi has spoken to the Lieutenant Governor and Chief Minister of the UT and the Government of India has put in all its strength in the rescue efforts," he said, adding, "The Union Territory and all agencies together have significantly reduced potential damage, and through coordinated efforts, we have successfully saved many lives. In this hour of crisis, the Government of India

is standing by the side of J&K people."
APPRECIATES J&K GOVT FOR SUCCESSFUL RESCUE OPERATION

The Union Home Minister appreciated the efforts of all the agencies and said that the UT Government carried out the successful rescue operation very quickly and efficiently. More than 5000 people have been evacuated to safer places as a precaution. "Seventeen teams of the NDRF and 23 Army columns, helicopters from Indian Air Force, UTDRF, J&K Police and Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) personnel are still engaged in the entire operation and helping people. Health facilities and food arrangements have been made in relief camps by the UT government and the situation will return to normal very soon," he

MET AND NDMA SHOULD JOINTLY IDENTIFY CAUSES, ESTABLISH AN EARLY WARNING SYSTEM Shah said that a critical analysis of all Early Warning Apps (EWAs), their accuracy, and their

reach to the grassroots level is necessary. He emphasized that improving our systems through critical analysis is the only way to move toward a zero-casualty approach. He highlighted the need for a critical review of the GLOF Early Warning System.

The Union Home Minister said that the Meteorological Department and NDMA should jointly study the relationship between the tendencies leading to cloudbursts and moisture content in clouds, identify causes, and establish an early warning system.

He stressed that the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) must take steps in this direction by leveraging data analytics and AI.

Shah also mentioned that the Food Corporation of India (FCI) should arrange for additional rations, and a decision on offline ration delivery could be made after assessing connectivity in 10 days.

He said that, advanced survey teams from the Ministry of Home Affairs would assess the damage, and further assistance would be provided.

He announced that a meeting of relevant departents from the Central Government and th Territory administration, along with the Union Home Secretary, would be held within 1-2 days.

The Union Home Minister directed that teams from the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Union Territory government should prioritize damage assessment. He emphasized that the Health and Water Departments must proactively focus on water supply and health services.

He stressed that medical units from the Army, Central Armed Police Forces, and Air Force should also provide support.

The Union Home Minister said that since Jammu & Kashmir is prone to natural calamities, therefore, an amount of Rs. 209 crores for State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) are allocated to the UT as Centre share, due to which relief work has started.

He said that timely warnings by the Central Government and Union Territory Disaster Management Authority (UTDMA) helped in minimizing the loss of lives. National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), Army, Union Territory Disaster Response Force (UTDRF), Other Response Teams, all were on alert and helicopters were also standby. "We had also informed everyone about the mobilization of the Army and the NDRF," the Home Minister

ASSISTANCE UNDER SDRF FOR DAMAGED HOUSES WILL BE DISBURSED SOON

Shah said that private property of people has been damaged and assistance under SDRF for damaged houses is being assessed and will be disbursed in shortest possible time.

He added that multiple roads have been damaged and repair & restoration work has started. Traffic movement has started on most of the roads and relief has also started arriving, wherever needed.

More than 80 percent electricity supply has been restored in affected areas, people have started receiving pure drinking water and health

facilities are running smoothly. Infrastructure of critical sectors has been affected and its temporary restoration is underway at war footing. The damages are being assessed

by the UT government and all possible assistance will be provided. It may be recalled that more than 130 people were killed and 33 have gone missing in cloud-

"The entire administration went from home to home, monitoring and assessing the situation at the grassroots level. Normal life is being brought back on track," he said.

On the restoration of surface communication, he said that fully damaged roads have been temporarily restored. "The highway, Bhaderwah road and PMGSY (Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana) roads have been restored." Asserting that the damage is huge and widespread, the DC said that it will take time to cover these losses. "The funds we receive from time to time, or any package given to us, will be used for permanent restoraon," he said.

agriculture, businesses, and public infrastructure. The memorandum highlighted that the devastation is beyond the financial capacity of the Jammu and Kashmir government, and outside the

purview of SDRF norms, the spokesperson said. In the memorandum, the BJP urged Shah that the calamity be declared a national disaster, and a special comprehensive relief and rehabilitation package be sanctioned to enable immediate assis-

tance and long-term rehabilitation. The delegation pointed out that roads, bridges, and essential services like water supply, electricity, and communication have been badly disrupted, while thousands of kanals of agricultural

land have been destroyed. The BJP also demanded adequate support for families whose houses and belongings have been damaged, including repair grants for partially

damaged dwellings. "Businesses, shops, and small-scale industries have been hit hard and require revival assistance. Educational institutions across urban and rural areas, both government and private, have sustained significant damage, necessitating compensation to restore normal functioning," the memorandum pointed out.

The memorandum also underlined the urgent need for the restoration and upgradation of public infrastructure, particularly in the water supply, power, sewerage, and drainage sectors. It stressed desilting of drains and nallahs on a war footing to avert health and sanitation risks.

For long-term measures, the BJP delegation proposed dredging of major rivers such as the Chenab, Jammu Tawi, and Balol Nallah, along with their tributaries in Kajouri, Poonch, Odhampur,

Samba, and Kathua. A comprehensive plan for the Chenab has already been submitted to the Government of

forces personnel have been rescued from inundated areas," he said. Approximately 21 tonnes of relief material including food packets, medicines and essential commodities have been delivered on ground and

Assuring support, the Union Home Minister said the Centre stands firmly with the people of Jammu and Kashmir and all necessary steps will be taken to ensure timely relief and restoration.

Reasi district is one of the worst-hit areas in the Union Territory due to the current spell of heavy rains. A landslide triggered by a cloudburst struck the route to the shrine at Adhkuwari in the Trikuta hills of the Katra belt last Tuesday, killing 34 pilgrims and injuring 20 others.

The yatra was suspended on Tuesday last till further orders. It was followed by the constitution of a high-level three-member inquiry committee by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha.

The committee will be spearheaded by Shaleen Kabra, Additional Chief Secretary of the Department of Ial Shakti, I&K, and will also include the Divisional Commissioner and the Inspector General of Police, Jammu.

Chief Minister Omar Abdullah and Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Choudhary had accused the Lieutenant Governor administration of allowing the yatra to the cave shrine despite a warning on the weather front.

The Shrine Board has refuted allegations of allowing the yatra to proceed in disregard of weather advisories and at the cost of pilgrim safety, saying that the pilgrimage was suspended at noon on August 26, ahead of the cloudburst that triggered the landslide. (Agencies)

Several other people lost their lives in different events, including in Katra, Ramban and other laces, taking the toll up to over 100 in August.

The first major incident occurred on August 14, when a cloudburst struck Chesoti village in Kishtwar district. The bodies of 65 victims were

recovered, while several others are still missing. On August 17, a cloudburst hit Jodh Ghati and Janglote villages in Kathua district, killing seven people and injuring many.

On August 26, a massive landslide at Adhkwari cave temple, on the route to the Vaishno Devi hrine, claimed 35 lives and over 20 were injured. Seven members of a family were among 12

people killed in Ramban and Reasi districts during the early hours of last Saturday due to a landslide and cloudburst on August 30. The spate of extreme weather events has raised serious concerns over disaster preparedness and the impact of changing weather patterns in the region.

Experts attribute the surge in flash floods, cloudbursts, and landslides to increasingly erratrainfall patterns linked to climate change.

Furthermore, J&K has experienced its sixth wettest August since 1901, with the region recording 319.3 mm of rainfall against the normal of 184.9 mm, marking an excess of 73% precipitation.

The highest-ever August rainfall was recorded in 1996 at 481.3 mm, followed by 345.8 mm in 1908, 343.0 mm in 2013, 336.5 mm in 1994, and 331.0 mm in 1955, an Independent Weather Forecaster, Faizan Arif Keng, told KNO.

This year, several districts in the Jammu region witnessed extreme rainfall departures. Doda topped the chart with 290% excess rainfall, receiving 488.2 mm against the normal 125.1 mm. It was followed by Udhampur (159% surplus, 897.9 mm), Ramban (133% surplus, 286.2 mm), and amba (126% surplus, 720.5 mm).

Other major gains, according to him, were reported in Reasi (64%), Jammu (53%), Kathua (45%), Rajouri (42%), Kishtwar (21%), and Poonch (17%)

In Kashmir, rainfall patterns remained mixed. "Anantnag (35%), Pulwama (18%), Kulgam (13%), and Srinagar (15%) recorded above-normal rainfall while other districts like Kupwara (-23%), Bandipora (-20%), Budgam (-1%), Baramulla (-2%), Ganderbal (-17%), and Shopian (-69% - data probably incorrect) experienced deficits," he said.

Meanwhile, Ladakh recorded exceptional departures from normal. Kargil received 32.6 mm of rainfall against the normal 2 mm, a 1,530% surplus, while Leh registered 54.7 mm against the normal 5.6 mm, an 877% surplus. Overall, Ladakh UT recorded 49.5 mm of rainfall compared to the normal 4.8 mm, a massive 930% departure.

from it. That is why India has always emphasized unity in the fight against terrorism," he said, noting India's efforts through SCO-RATS (Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure).

Referring to the recent terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam, PM Modi said India has suffered the "brunt of terrorism" for four decades. He thanked partner nations that stood by New Delhi in its fight.

Modi said the Pahalgam attack was not only an assault on India's conscience but also an open challenge to every nation and individual who believes in humanity. "We must, in one clear and united voice, state that double standards on terrorism will not be

tolerated," he said. PM Modi thanked Chinese President Xi Jinping for the hospitality and extended reetings to Uzbekistan and Kyrgyzstan on their national days.

"It gives me great pleasure to participate in the 25th SCO Summit. I extend my heartfelt gratitude to President Xi for the warm welcome and gracious hospitality. Today is Uzbekistan's Independence Day, and yesterday was Kyrgyzstan's National Day. On this occasion, I convey my best wishes and congratulations to the leaders of both nations,'

Addressing the 25th Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) Summit, PM stressed India's three-pillar vision for the grouping

Security, Connectivity, and Opportunity. On regional connectivity, Modi highlighted projects such as the Chabahar Port and the International North-South Transport Corridor, while cautioning that all initiatives must respect sovereignty and territorial

The Prime Minister sent a strong message linked to the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) without naming it directly. 'Connectivity that bypasses sovereignty loses trust and meaning. Connectivity projects should respect the sovereignty of nations," he said.

"Connectivity that bypasses sovereignty

loses both trust and meaning," he asserted. Turning to opportunity, Modi said India had infused new energy into SCO cooperation under its chairmanship in 2023, introducing areas such as start-ups, innovation, youth empowerment, and shared Buddhist heritage. He proposed setting up a Civilizational Dialogue Forum to strengthen cultural ties.

On global reforms, Modi called for modernization of multilateral institutions, particularly the United Nations.

"Locking the aspirations of the Global South into outdated frameworks is grave injustice to future generations. The vibrant dreams of the new generation cannot be displayed on an old black-and-white screen. The screen must change," Modi said.

The Prime Minister concluded by reiterating India's commitment to cooperation within the SCO and extended best wishes to Kyrgyzstan's President Japarov, who will take over as the next chair. UNI

ic, financial, and energy sectors. In his televised remarks, Modi also said that 140 crore Indians are "eagerly waiting" to welcome the Russian leader in India in

December. 'This is a reflection of the depth and scope of our Special and Privileged Strategic Partnership. India and Russia have always stood shoulder-to-shoulder even in the most dif-

ficult situations," he said. "Our close cooperation is important not only for the people of both countries, but also for global peace, stability, and prosperity," Modi said. Before the official talks, the two leaders held informal conversation as they travelled to the venue of their bilateral meeting in the same car after concluding engagements at the SCO summit. The Russian president waited for about 10 minutes for

PM Modi to join him before boarding the car. Modi and Putin spent another 45 minutes in the car even after reaching the venue, people familiar with the matter said.

In his remarks at the meeting, Modi also said that India welcomes all the recent efforts towards establishing peace in Ukraine, adding it is humanity's call to find a way to end the hostilities as soon as possible.

"We've been having regular discussions on the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. We welcome all the recent efforts towards establish-

ing peace," Modi said.
"We hope that all parties shall proceed ahead constructively. A way must be found to end this conflict and establish lasting peace. 'his is the aspiration of the entire humanity,' he added. It is understood that the Indian side briefed Putin about Modi's phone conversation with Ukrainian President Volody-

myr Zelenskyy on Saturday. After dialling Modi, Zelenskyy said India is ready to make the necessary efforts and to deliver the appropriate signal to Russia.

In his comments, Putin said Russia and India have maintained "special friendly and trust-based" relations for decades and it is the foundation for the future development of the ties.

"These relations are entirely above party politics and enjoy the support of the overwhelming majority of our peoples," he said,

according to the Kremlin.

An Indian readout said PM Modi reiterated his support for the recent initiatives that have been taken to address the conflict in Ukraine, and emphasised the need to expedite a cessation of the conflict, and find a

"durable peace" settlement.

The Modi-Putin talks came over two weeks after US President Donald Trump held a summit with the Russian leader as part of efforts to end the war.

Bolstering bilateral cooperation in critical areas such as energy, fertiliser and trade also figured prominently in the talks between the prime minister and the Russia president. Though there is no official word on the implications of the US tariff on India. it is

believed that the two leaders discussed it during their informal conversation in the The relations between New Delhi and Washington are on a downturn after Trump doubled tariffs on Indian goods to a whopping 50 per cent, including a 25 per cent addi-

tional duties for India's purchase of Russian crude oil. The strain in the relations has been exac-

erbated by constant criticism of New Delhi by officials in Trump's administration. In a post on 'X', Modi described his talks with Putin as "excellent" and that they dis-cussed ways to deepen bilateral cooperation in all sectors, including trade, fertilisers, space,

security and culture. "We exchanged views on regional and global developments, including the peaceful resolution of the conflict in Ukraine. Our Special and Privileged Strategic Partnership remains a vital pillar of regional and global stability," he said.

The Indian prime minister also posted on social media a photo of him and Putin travel-

ling together in the car.

"After the proceedings at the SCO Summit venue, President Putin and I travelled together to the venue of our bilateral meeting. Conversations with him are always insightful." he said.

The Indian readout said Modi and Putin discussed bilateral cooperation, including in the economic, financial, and energy sectors and expressed satisfaction with the sustained growth in bilateral ties in these areas. "The two leaders reaffirmed their support

for further strengthening of the Special and Privileged Strategic Partnership between the two countries," it said. In his remarks, Putin also referred to 15

years of elevation of India-Russia relations

to the level of a special privileged strategic partnership.
"It can be stated with confidence that our multifaceted Russian-Indianties continue to

develop actively on these principles," he said. "We have established multi-level cooperation. Trade and economic ties as a whole are showing positive dynamics. Tourist exchanges are growing. It said that rising water levels in rivers are expected, and people should stay away from water bodies, nallas, river embankments, and loose structures. In a separate advisory, the MeT late evening

said that a system is approaching Srinagar, with heavy or intense showers, accompanied by thunderstorms, lightning, and gusty winds expected over many parts of Srinagar, Ganderbal, and Budgam. People were advised to stay away from electric poles, cables, old trees, and loose

structures. The MeT recommended suspending shikara riding and boating in all water bodies, including Dal Lake. Moreover, the district administration issued an advisory in light of the forecast of

inclement weather, advising people to refrain from venturing into slopes and water bodies. The advisory states that, due to heavy intense showers and gusty winds forecasted over parts of Kashmir from August 31 to September 1, according to the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) Srinagar Station, residents of the district, especially those in Fakir Gujri, adjacent areas, and Khonmouh, should avoid slopes and water bodies until

the weather improves. Tourists and local shikara operators are advised to suspend activities at Dal and Nigeen lakes. Sand miners at the River Jhelum and other water bodies should verify conditions before crossing. The general public can contact the District Emergency Operation Centre Srinagar, Emergency Response Support System (ERSS) Srinagar, and Police Control Room Srinagar for any information. (KNO)

Srinagar Court convicts five in Rs 4.5 crore land fraud case after 15-year trial

SRINAGAR, SEP 1: In a landmark verdict, a Srinagar court on Monday convicted five individuals in a high-profile cheating case involving fraudulent land transactions worth several crores.

The City Judge delivered the judgment, bringing closure to a protracted legal battle that began in 2010.

The case revolved around the accused, including Ghulam Qadir Dar and four others, who

420 and 506 of the Ranbir Penal Code for cheating, forgery, and criminal intimidation.


According to the prosecution, led by Additional Public Prosecutor Vikas Kunar, the accused conspired to defraud the International Building House Cooperative Society by selling 109 kanals of land in Shariefabad, Budgam, through forged agreements and fake documents, including a fabricated Army NOC.

Complainant Akhtar including company employees

were charged under sections Rasheed Wani, chairman of the society, deposed that he initially paid Rs 2.61 crore—later escalating to Rs 4.5 croreunder a fraudulent agreement dated March 15, 2008.

> Despite the payments, neither ownership documents nor possession of the land was handed over. Instead, the accused allegedly sold portions of the land to third parties while misrepresenting its status using a fake Army NOC.

Prosecution witnesses,



and the investigating officer, corroborated the claims, confirming that the land was under Army claim and that the NOC was forged.

The defense argued the matter was a civil dispute lacking criminal intent and pointed to the absence of original documents and bank statements. However, the court dismissed these arguments, holding that the prosecution had proved guilt beyond reasonable doubt through consistent testimony and documentary evidence.

The court convicted accused No. 1 and 2 under sections 420 and 506 RPC, while accused No. 3 to 5 were convicted under section 506 RPC. All five were sentenced to two years' simple imprisonment and fined Rs 5,000 each, with sentences to run concurrently.

While awarding what it termed a comparatively lenient punishment due to the 15-year duration of the trial, the court underscored the seriousness of fraudulent property dealings.

Srinagar Police Solves Theft Case; **Accused Arrested, Stolen Property Recovered**

SRINAGAR, SEP 1: On August 24, 2025, Police Station Nishat received a written complaint from Mohammad Aslam Lone, S/O Abdul Gani Lone, resident of Gupkar Mohalla, Nishat, alleging the theft of cash and gold ornaments worth several lakhs by unknown individuals.

Based on the complaint, FIR No. 69/2025 under sections 305, 331(3) BNS was registered at Police Station Nishat, and investigation was promptly



initiated.

During the course of investigation, several suspects were questioned and one suspect namely Shahid Mehraj Bhat, S/O Mehraj-ud-Din Bhat, resident of Meerakabad, Shalimar was identified as the accused and subsequently, he was arrested for the commission of the crime.

Upon his disclosure, the stolen property, including Rs. 50,000 in cash and gold ornaments valued at Rs. 2,65,000, was recovered.

The investigation remains ongoing, and further recoveries are anticipated from the accused person. Srinagar Police remains committed to ensuring the safety of the citizens and eliminating crimes from the society.

Encroachment Chokes Deeri-Herpora Road, Locals Appeal to DC Pulwama for Urgent Intervention

PULWAMA, SEP 1: The residents of Deeri village in Pulwama district have raised serious concerns over the continued encroachment on the Deeri-Herpora road by two families, which has significantly narrowed the vital passage and created a bottleneck for both pedestrians and potential road development.

According to the local inhabitants, the road—which serves as a crucial link for hundreds of

residents—has been partially seized on both sides, obstructing free movement and endangering public safety. The matter has reportedly been flagged by the Roads and Buildings (R&B) Department, Pulwama, which acknowledges that the encroachment is a major hurdle in upgrading or expanding the

hours. It has become a daily inconvenience and a serious safety concern for school-going children, elderly people, and emergency services," said a resident of Deeri.

In a formal representation submitted to the Deputy Commissioner (DC) Pulwama, the residents have urged immediate action to remove the illegal occupation and restore the road to its original width. Photographic evidence has also been

"The road is public property meant for collective use and development. No individual or family has the right to obstruct or privatize a public thoroughfare," the letter stated. "We appeal to the Worthy DC to intervene personally and direct the concerned authorities to initiate swift action."

This is not the first time that rural infrastructure in South Kashmir has suffered due to unauthorized encroachments. However, locals say this case is particularly troubling because it impedes a proposed development project and compromises basic mobility in the village.

Authorities are yet to issue a formal response, but the urgency of the situation demands prompt redressal, especially with growing calls for improved infrastructure and civic amenities across the district.

As the matter now lies before the district administration, all eyes are on the office of the Deputy Commissioner to act decisively and uphold the rule of law for the greater public good.

lenges, the team worked relentlessly to restore connectivity." The Kishtwar–Gulabgarh road is the only all-weather link catering to the Gulabgarh and wider Paddar belt. Its closure not only

disrupted daily life but also blocked access to essential supplies, healthcare facilities and emergency services.

The swift restoration effort has drawn widespread appreciation. "We were effectively cut off from the rest of the district," said Mushtaq Ahmed, a local resident. "The BRO's timely intervention has brought immense relief to the entire community," he added.

With traffic now flowing smoothly, the BRO has assured continued vigilance and monitoring of vulnerable stretches to ensure safe and uninterrupted connectivity to the far-flung border regions.

The DC also interacted virtually with ADC Bhaderwah Sunil Bhutyal and Tehsildars of Doda, Kahra, Kastigarh, Bhagwah, Barath Bagula, Dessa, Mohalla, Assar, Thathri, Bhalla, Bhaderwah, Chilly Pingal and Chirralla to review the damages caused by the heavy rainfall.

He directed all Tehsildars to provide accurate data and information about the damages. He further instructed them to collect photographs of damaged houses and maintain complete records for accurate estimation.



The meeting also reviewed the scale of damages to roads. The DC directed to close vulnerable roads, especially the Paddri road, for public transport.

The DC further interacted virtually with BDOs of Bhaderwah, Bhellessa, Changa, Chilly Pingal, Chirralla and Marmat blocks. The main purpose of the interaction was to review restoration works under MGNREGA. He directed the ACD to ensure proper estimation of bridges and culverts washed away due to the heavy rain and to prepare complete data.

The DC emphasized that Tehsildars of the district have the authority to finalize the assessment of damages. He also directed ADC Bhaderwah to ensure proper water supply in the area.

The DC concluded that teams of concerned officers and officials will be deputed to the affected areas for on-ground assessment of damages caused by the heavy rainfall.

Plantation of high density apple plants not feasible everywhere

Better sense seems to have prevailed upon a group of farmers in South Kashmir's Kulgam district since they have decided to cultivate paddy in their high density apple fields. The initiative of these farmers seems to go against the tide as most of the farmers have said goodbye to the cultivation of paddy and instead taken up the plantation of high density apples.

It is quite disturbing that a mad race has started among the farmers and they want to take a lead over each other as far as cultivation of high density apple plants is concerned. It must be kept in mind by the farmers that the plantation of high density apple plants is not feasible in each and every part of the Kashmir valley. A pick and choose policy needs to be adopted in this regard so that better results are achieved.

Since most of the farmers are busy in a mad race as on date the desired results are not achieved and most of them are ruing their decision of shifting to plantation of high density apple plants from cultivation of paddy. The decision of these farmers has led to food grains crisis in the valley and people could be seen discussing and debating about the same irrespective of the occasion. It is important that experts are consulted by the farmers as and when they want to shift from one pattern of farming to another.

Resorting to knee jerk reaction does not augur well for the farmers or any section of the society. In such a scenario one might have short term gains but in the long run they have to suffer losses. The farmers might have had some profit by shifting from cultivation of paddy to plantation of high density apple plants but with the passage of time these people are suffering losses. Had they stuck to their original and traditional farming they would not have incurred losses.

The group of farmers who have shifted to plantation of high density plants can still regain the lost position and they can go back to their traditional pattern of cultivation of paddy. The initiative taken by the farmers of Kulgam can open new vistas for the other farmers who want to go back to the cultivation of paddy in their fields. These people should take the advice of the experts in the field so that optimum results are achieved for posterity.

The Unheard Agony of Students

The golden sanctity of education has been eclipsed by relentless competition, societal expectations, and an uncertain future. The plight of our youth is not incidental; it is the cumulative consequence of pressures imposed upon tender minds.Foremost among the causes is the tyranny of competition. Education, rather than being the art of awakening curiosity, has been reduced to a grim contest of marks and ranks. Young learners, instead of flourishing, are shackled to rote memorisation and mechanical performance. This suffocation leaves little room for individuality, creativ-

Only when the teacher becomes a mentor and the classroom a sanctuary can the suffering of students be alleviated. The destiny of a generation rests not upon examination scores but upon the ability of its educators to see, understand, and uplift the human being behind the textbook.

WHY IS THERE FLOOD IN PUNJAB - IS NATURE ANGRY?

Nature warns, it does not get angry - the real reason is human negligence and unbalanced development

It would not be right to call the floods in Punjab a mere natural disaster. The nature of the rivers, abnormal rainfall and climate change are the reasons, but the real culprits are unplanned construction, illegal mining, neglect of drainage and paddydominated agricultural system. Nature warns, it does not get angry. If we give the rivers their way, use water judiciously and adopt crop diversification, then the impact of floods can be reduced. Punjab should establish a new path of development by maintaining a balance with the environment.

Punjab, which is called the country's foodproviding land, is today repeatedly grappling with the horror of floods. Fields get submerged, villages get drowned, roads and houses collapse. Every time the question arises that why does flood occur in Punjab? Is it only nature's anger or are our own mistakes also responsible for it? The truth is that nature is never angry with anyone, it only works on the basis of its rules and balance. When we humans cross its limits, we have to suffer the consequences in the form of floods, drought, pollution

Punjab is known as the land of five rivers. Sutlej, Beas, Ravi, Chenab and Jhelum define the identity of this state. Most of these rivers originate from the Himalayas and during the monsoon season, the water level suddenly rises due to melting of snow and rainfall. The currents of the rivers are fast and when they enter the plains, the water spreads and takes the form of floods. Big dams like Bhakra, Pong and Ranjit Sagar may have been built for flood control and irrigation, but when water is suddenly released from them, the surrounding areas get submerged. This highlights natural causes as well as lack of management.

The monsoon pattern has changed a lot in the last few years. Earlier, where the rain used to occur gradually and for a long time, now heavy rainfall occurs suddenly in a short time. This increases the water pressure in rivers and streams rapidly and a situation like flash flood arises. Climate scientists believe that the increase in greenhouse gases and global warming are the major reasons for this. Due to this, the Himalayan glaciers are melting rapidly. As a result, the water level of the rivers increases uncontrollably during the summer and rainy sea-

Human intervention has played the biggest role in making natural floods destructive. Indiscriminate construction work was done on the banks and foothills of the rivers. Villages and cities settled on drains and old water streams. Excessive mining of sand and gravel changes the depth and flow of rivers. When the path of water is blocked, it enters the nearby settlements. There is a network of drains and canals in Punjab, but in most places their clean-



ing and repair is not done on time. As a result, instead of flowing out, rain water fills back up in the villages and cities. Along with this, crops like paddy exploited groundwater excessively. The water holding capacity of the soil decreased and the natural water storage system broke down.

Punjab was the centre of the Green Revolution. Cultivation of wheat and rice here gave the country food security, but it also had its adverse effects. Paddy crop demands a lot of water. Every year, groundwater was extracted from lakhs of tube wells. Due to this, underground water sources dried up rapidly. When there was heavy rain or flood from above, the ground could not absorb it and the problem of waterlogging increased. Deforestation and shrinking of green areas also disturbed the natural balance. The roots of trees on the banks of rivers used to stop water and bind the soil, but now erosion has increased.

The floods in Punjab are not just a natural disaster but also a socio-economic crisis. Thousands of acres of crops are destroyed. Farmers are forced into debt. The rural population is rendered homeless and forced to migrate. Roads, bridges and power infrastructure are severely damaged. Diseases spread, especially diarrhoea, malaria and dengue. The mental trauma leads to a feeling of insecurity and frustration in the society.

In reality, nature has no emotions. It only wants balance. When we violate its limits, it comes as a warning in the form of flood, drought or disaster.

Therefore, it is not correct to say that nature is angry. The truth is that man has created conditions that make nature angry.

The solutions are clear. Flood zones along the river banks should be identified and construction should be completely banned there. Old drains and gutters should be cleaned and widened regularly. Illegal mining should be strictly prohibited so that rivers can flow in their natural form. Cultivation of maize, pulses and vegetables should be promoted instead of paddy, which will reduce water consumption and improve the groundwater level. The state and central governments will have to make a longterm plan together to deal with the effects of climate change. It is also necessary to train local people for flood prevention and management.

The flood crisis in Punjab is not only due to natural causes. It is the result of the unbalanced direction of our development policies. If we still do not learn a lesson, then floods can become more terrible in the coming years. Nature is repeatedly warning us not to tamper with it. We have to remember that the permanent solution is not to fight with nature, but to be in harmony with it. The flood in Punjab is not just a disaster, but a test of our policies, habits and priorities.

The main legend of Jodhpur centers on Rao Jodha, the founder of the city, who established it in 1459 on a hill known as the bird's nest to build his fortress, Mehrangarh Fort. This act led to a curse from a hermit, Cheeria Nathji, who was displaced, promising the land eternal water scarcity. The city is also known for its blue-hued buildings, a practice legend attributes to Brahmins painting their houses blue to denote their caste and for insulation from the sun.

The Founding of the City and the Curse: Rao Jodha's Vision: In 1459, Rao Jodha, a Rathore chief, chose a rocky hill, previously home to a hermit named Cheeria Nathji, to establish a new capital for his kingdom.

Displacement and Curse: Cheeria Nathji, devoted to his birds, was reluctant to move. After his attempts to appease the hermit failed, Rao Jodha sought the



help of the warrior sage Karni Mata. Cheeria Nathji eventually moved but not before cursing Jodha's land with a promise of perpetual drought.

The Solution: To lift the curse, Rao Jodha sought for giveness from the hermit. Rao Jodha also built a shrine to the hermit near the fort to appease him.

The Blue City Legend: The distinctive blue-colored houses of Jodhpur's old city are said to have originated with the Brahmins (priestly class) who painted their homes blue.

Symbolism: This blue color was a symbol of their high caste. Additionally, it was believed to help keep the houses cool in the scorching heat of the summer months.

Mehrangarh Fort's Legacy: A Symbol of Power: The fort, now known as Mehrangarh, was built by Rao Jodha atop the

A Living Chronicle: Successive rulers continued to enhance the fort, adding their imprints to its architecture. This includes the defenses built by Rao Maldeo to withstand the attacks of Sher Shah

The Sun City: Sun City" does not have specific mythological significance in India; instead, the mythological association is with Surya, the Hindu Sun God, and places dedicated to him, such as the UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Konark Sun Temple. The term "Sun City" typically refers to Jodhpur, a city known for its abundant sunshine, not a specific mythological origin, though Surya worship is a significant part of ancient Indian traditions.

Surya (The Sun God) and His Significance: Life-Giver: Surya, the Hindu Sun God, symbolizes light, energy, and knowledge, and is a vital source of life and nourishment for the world.

Ancient Worship: Surya has been worshipped since Vedic times and remains central to many Hindu rituals and festivals, such as Makar Sankranti and Chhath Puja.

Sun Temples in India: India is home to numerous Sun Temples, which are both marvels of ancient architecture and important cultural sites dedicated to Surya.

Famous Examples: Konark Sun Temple: A UNESCO World Heritage Site in Odisha, built in the form of a giant chariot dedicated to Surya.

Modhera Sun Temple: Located in Gujarat and dedicated to Surya.

Martand Sun Temple: An ancient temple in Kashmir built in the 8th century.

Sun City (Jodhpur). Always there has to be first:

The First General Officer Commanding (GOC) of India's Southern Command was General Maharaj Shri Rajendrasinhji Jadeja, who commanded the Southern Army (which became the Southern Command) after the 1908 merger of the Indian Army's commands.

Historical Context: The Indian Army was reorganized into regional commands after the 1895 abolition of the Presidency armies, with Southern Command becoming one of the four commands.

In 1908, these four commands were

merged into two armies, Northern and Southern, a structure that continued

General Jadeja commanded the Southern Army, the precursor to the Southern Command, in the early 20th century.

Later Commanders: Several notable officers have served as GOC of Southern Command since then, including General Rajendrasinhji Jadeja, SM Shrinagesh, KS Thimayya, Jayanto Nath Chaudhuri, and Bipin Rawat, among others.

The Desert Corps: The first GOC of the Desert Corps" was Lieutenant General A K Chatterjee, the first General Officer Commanding(GOC) of the Indian Army's XII Corps (also known as the Desert Corps), which was raised on February 26, 1987, in Jodhpur. This corps was established to protect the desert sectors of Rajasthan and Gujarat.

The Corps: The XII Corps, or Desert Corps, was formed to address the growing operational importance of the desert

Formation: The corps was sanctioned in January 1987 and came into existence on February 26, 1987, which is the Hindu festival of Maha Shivaratri.

Purpose: Its role is to safeguard the desert regions within India's states of Rajasthan and Gujarat.

Symbol: The corps adopted the formation insignia of Konark, taken from the Konark Sun Temple, symbolizing the radiating sun and a spiritual connection to Jodhpur, the Sun City.

He was previously the appointment of General Officer Commanding-in-Chief South Western Command.

He earlier held the appointment of General Officer commanding Delhi Area, prior to that he was General Officer Commanding XXI Corps.

Early life and education: General Seth is an alumnus of the National Defence Academy, Khadakwasla, and of the Indian Military Academy, Dehradun. He is also an alumnus of the Defence Services Staff College, where he was recognised as the best all-round student in his course; in 2006, he attended the prestigious Defence Services Command and General Staff Course at the French Collège interarmées de Défense.

The general is also a graduate of the Higher Command Course at the Army War College, Mhow, and of the National Defence College at New Delhi. Additionally, he qualified in the International Defense Acquisition Management Course of the Naval Postgraduate School in the United States.

Military career: The general officer

was commissioned into the 2nd Lancers (Gardner's Horse) on 20 December 1986 from the Indian Military Academy.

He was awarded the Silver Centurion in the Young Officers Course, he stood first in the order of merit in several courses he attended, including the Junior Command Course.

He has commanded the Skinner's Horse, 98 Armoured Brigade and was General Officer Commanding (GOC) of a Rashtriya Rifles force in Jammu & Kash-

He has served as brigade major of an independent armoured brigade, as Assistant Military Secretary in the Military Secretary Branch and as Brigadier General Staff (Operations) of the South West-

Role: The corps serves as a crucial defensive formation for India's western frontier, specializing in desert warfare

Location: Its headquarters are located in Jodhpur, a historic city in Rajasthan.

Operational Focus: The Desert Corps focuses on enhancing combat readiness through exercises like night tank drills and drone system validation to maintain a strong defense in the strategically vital desert region.

(Pros, Cons and the Future of Electrical Psychiatry)

The depression is one of the most disabling mental health disorders which is affecting millions of people across the globe. The person suffering from depression suffers physical and psychologically with symptoms ranging from persistent sadness, loss of interest in life and fatigue to suicidal thoughts. The most common traditional treatments used to counter depression includes antidepressant medications, psychotherapy and lifestyle interventions. Although this could help many persons but a significant proportion of patients suffer from treatment-resistant depression (TRD). With the advancement in medical science neuroscientists and clinicians have turned to the advanced neuromodulation therapies among which the brain pacemaker or deep brain stimulation (DBS) has emerged as a promising intervention. This therapy involves the surgical implantation of electrodes that delivers weak electrical impulses to the specific brain regions with the aim of restoring normal neuronal activity and alleviating depressive symptoms.

The Science Behind Brain Pace-


A brain pacemaker is conceptually similar in functioning to a cardiac pacemaker.Whereas cardiac pacemakers are used in regulating abnormal heart rhythms the brain pacemakers modulates the dysfunctional brain circuits.

The device typically consists of: **Electrodes implanted into targeted** areas of the brain which needs to be stimulated by weak electrical impuls-

An electrical impulse generator usually implanted under the skin in the chest which can produce controlled

electrical signals. Connecting wires that link the electrodes to the electrical impulse genera-

By delivering finely tuned electrical impulses, Deep Brain Stimulation therapy aims to rebalance the neural circuits that are underactive or overactive in the brain during the depression. This therapy thus improves the mood regulation



and cognitive function of the brain.

Pros of Brain Pacemakers 1. Hope for treatment-resistant

This therapy provides relief for the individuals who do not respond to medication or psychotherapy.

2. Targeted therapy:

Unlike systemic drugs DBS therapy acts directly on the specific brain regions resulting in minimizing the widespread side effects which are a must in other

3. Adjustable and reversible:

The physicians can modify stimulation parameters without the need for another surgery and the device can be turned off or removed if needed.

4. Continuous effect:

Offers sustained symptom relief compared to medications that require

daily compliance. 5. Potential neuroplastic benefits:

This therapy may promote long-term reorganization of neural circuits leading to lasting improvements.

Cons of Brain Pacemamers 1. Invasive surgery:

The DBS Therapy requires neurosurgical implantation, which carries risks such as infection, bleeding or device malfunction.

2. Cost and accessibility:

High costs limits the availability of this unique therapy to the wealthy patients or those in advanced healthcare systems.

3. Variable effectiveness:

The numbers of patients responding positively to the therapy is considerable but not without notable exclusions; some patients may experience little or no benefit at all during the course of the

4. Possible side effects:

Mood swings, anxiety, speech problems or cognitive changes may occur during the duration of the therapy.

5. Ethical concerns:

Direct brain manipulation raises a number of heated debates about identity, autonomy and consent of the patients.

Cost of Brain Pacemaker Therapy

The cost of deep brain stimulation varies by country and healthcare system. On average DBS therapy is quite expensive and even it's annual maintenance is costly. In regions with universal healthcare, partial or full coverage may be available, but in most cases, the expense remains a major barrier for patients.

The Future of DBS Therapy The field of neuromodulation is rapidly evolving. Promising directions include:

1. Closed-loop systems:

Future pacemakers may automatically adjust stimulation based on realtime brain activity, offering personalized therapy for the patients.

2. Smaller, wireless devices: Advances in bioelectronics may make devices less invasive and more energy-

efficient to use. 3. Combination therapies:

The cost of deep brain stimulation varies by country and healthcare system. On average DBS therapy is quite expensive and even it's annual maintenance is costly. In regions with universal healthcare, partial or full coverage may be available, but in most cases, the expense remains a major barrier for patients

DBS may be paired with psychotherapy or pharmacological treatments for synergistic effects.

4. Expansion of targets:

Ongoing research is testing new brain regions that may yield higher success

5. Ethical frameworks:

With the growing circle of DBS therapy bioethicists and policymakers will develop clearer guidelines to protect patient rights while encouraging innovation.

The concept of a brain pacemaker is amongst the most exciting breakthroughs in psychiatry and neuroscience. By directly modulating dysfunctional brain circuits this therapy provides new hope for patients with symptoms of treatment-resistant depression. However the high cost of therapy combined with expensive annual maintenance, invasive nature and ethical complexities are few hurdles that need to be crossed if the therapy is to be developed as universal solution for depression. With the scientific and technological advances and development the brain pacemakers may become safer, cheaper and more effective tools for countering depression with potential for transforming the future of mental health treatment.

SRINAGAR, SEPT 1: To mark the 34th Foundation Day of the Indian Buildings Congress (IBC), the J&K Chapter organized a national-level webinar titled "Performance of Built **Environment in Recent Disasters:** Lessons Learnt." The event brought together engineers, architects, urban planners, academicians, policymakers, and students from across India to deliberate on how infrastructure has performed during recent disasters and how lessons can be translated into resilient development practices.

In his welcome address, Er. Aamir Ali, Chairman, IBC J&K Chapter, emphasized that while development is vital, "resilience in the built environment is non-negotiable." He highlighted the critical role of safe and robust infrastructure in ensuring community safety and maintaining essential services during calamities.

The session was inaugurated by Er. Chinmay Debnath, President, Indian Buildings Congress, who spoke about IBC's evolution into a key contributor to national policy, building codes, and sustainable construction innovation. He underlined the importance of embedding resilience as a core principle in planning, design, construction, and maintenance, particularly in regions prone to seismic activity, landslides, and climaterelated disasters.

The keynote address was delivered by Professor Dr. Amir Ali Khan, Head of Resilient Infrastructure Division at the National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM), Ministry of

Masroor Ahmed Shah, Building Centre Srinagar; Dr. Rajni Srivastava, Allahabad; Dr. Suhail Aijaz Shah, Professor, Kashmir College of Engineering and Technology; Er. Irfan Shafi Parray; Er. B.L. Rawat; Er. Ankur Nanda, and Er. Sunil Seth, all from the IBC J&K Chapter.

PM Modi wraps up 'successful' visits to Japan, China. Departs from Tianjin for home

TIANJIN/NEW DELHI, SEP 1: Prime Minister Narendra Modi wrapped up a "produc-

tive" two-nation visit to Japan and China where he attended 15th Annual India-Japan Summit on August 30 and the 25th SCO Summit in the Chinese port city of Tianjin today.

In China Prime Minister Modi also held bilateral meetings with the Presidents of Russia and China on the sidelines of the SCO Summit.

In a post on X Prime Minister Modi said he had emphasised India's stand on key global issues during the SCO Summit. He thanked President Xi Jinping of China for the successful holding of the summit.

'Concluding a productive visit to China, where I attended the SCO Summit and interacted with various world leaders. Also emphasised India's stand on key global issues. Thankful to President Xi Jinping, the Chinese government and people for the successful organisation of this Summit."

The two visits and meetings with President Putin and President Xi on the margins of the SCO Summit are significant as these come in the aftermath of US President $Donald\,Trump's\,imposition\,of$ 50 percent tariffs against India and signal a shift in Asian geopolitics towards multilateralism and against US protection-

On August 29 Prime Minister Modi attended the India-Japan Economic Forum meeting and on August 30 the 15th India-Japan Annual Summit with Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba.

The External Affairs Ministry said that in Japan the two countries signed 13 agreements/Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) including India-Japan Joint Vision for the next decade and a Joint Declaration on Security Cooperation. The Joint Vision document sets out eight areas to guide the partnership ranging from economic security and ecological cooperation to health, innovation and peopleto-people links. Japan also pledged 68 billion US Dollar investment in India over the next ten years. Prime Minister Modi also visited the Japanese port city of Sendai.

On the sidelines of the Summit, Prime Minister Modi also held talks with Russian President Vladimir Putin today and a bilateral meeting with Chinese President Xi Jinping yes-



On the 45-minute meeting with President Putin the External Affairs Ministry said "The leaders discussed bilateral cooperation, including in the economic, financial, and $energy\,sectors\,and\,expressed$ satisfaction with the sustained growth in bilateral ties in these areas. The two leaders also discussed regional and global issues, including the latest developments concerning Ukraine. Prime Minister reiterated his support for the recent initiatives that have been taken to address the con-

flict in Ukraine and emphasized the need to expedite a cessation of the conflict and find a durable peace settle-

On his bilateral meeting with the Chinese President Prime Minister Modi said, "An agreement has been reached between our Special Representatives regarding border management. Kailash Mansarovar Yatra has been resumed. Direct flights between the two countries are also being resumed. The interests of 2.8 billion people of both countries are linked to our coop-

eration. This will also pave the way for the welfare of the entire humanity. We are committed to taking our relations forward on the basis of mutual trust, respect and sensitiv-

In his opening statement at the SCO Summit, Prime Minister Modi sought a united stand by SCO member countries against terrorism and radicalization and indirectly targeting the West, decried the "double standards" against the scourge.

'Terrorism is not only a threat to the security of indi-

vidual nations, but a shared challenge to all of humanity. No country, no society, no citizen can consider themselves completely safe from it... We must state it clearly and in one voice: double standards on terrorism are unacceptable. Together, we must oppose terrorism in every form and manifestation. This is our responsibility towards humanity," Prime Minister Modi said in his statement.

Raising the gruesome incident of Pahalgam terrorist attack, Prime Minister Modi described the attack not only an assault on the conscience of India, but also an open challenge to every nation, and every individual who believes in humanity. Without naming Pakistan the Prime Minister said that in such circumstances, it is natural to ask: "Can the open support for terrorism by certain countries ever be acceptable to us?"

Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif was also attending the Summit.

Chinese President Xi Jinping, in a statement, said SCO member states have signed the Treaty on Long-Term Good-Neighbourliness, Friendship and Cooperation, conducted effective security cooperation and maintained overall stability in the region.

"We should continue to uphold the principles of nonalliance, non-confrontation and not targeting any third party. We should combine our efforts in addressing various threats and challenges, give full play to the newly established SCO Universal Center for Countering Security Challenges and Threats and the SCO Anti-drug Center, and build a community of common security in the region. We should remain a force for stability in this volatile world," he said.

He said SCO member states should continue to dismantle walls, not erect them, seek integration, not decoupling, advance high-quality Belt and Road cooperation and push for a universally beneficial and inclusive economic globaliza-

He announced that China will establish three major platforms for China-SCO cooperation in energy, green industry and the digital economy and will set up three major cooperation centers for scientific and technological innovation, higher education, and vocational and technical education.

India now home to 21 of the world's 121 bio-firms: Dr Jitendra Singh

NEW DELHI, SEP 1: India has taken a significant leap in the global biotechnology arena, now hosting 21 out of 121 bio-companies worldwide, union Minister of State for Science and Technology, Dr. Jitendra Singh said.

Launching the High-Performance Biomanufacturing Platforms under the new BioE3 (Biotechnology for Economy. Environment and Employment) Policy here at an event, he described the initiative as a critical milestone in positioning India as a global hub for biotechnology-led

"India now accounts for 21 out of the 121 Bio-Companies globally. This is not a small achievement for a country that once followed others; today, we are among the first movers in institutionalising biomanufacturing



policy," he remarked, according to a statement here.

"BioEnablers are the foundation of India's next wave of biotechnology-led growth. By providing world-class platforms, tools, and infrastructure, BioEnablers empower our scientists, StartUps, and industry to move faster from ideas to innovations, and from laboratories to markets," Dr. Singh added.

The newly launched initiative includes 21 advanced bio-enabler facilities across the country, offering shared infrastructure to startups, SMEs, industries, and academic institutions. These facilities span domains such as microbial biomanufacturing, smart proteins, sustainable agriculture, functional foods, carbon capture, marine biotechnology, and next-generation cell and gene therapies, said the statement.

DBT Secretary Dr. Rajesh S. Gokhale hailed the launch as a "pioneering step" expected to accelerate India's leadership in the global bioeconomy and foster sustainable solutions across sectors.

Industry leaders and researchers at the event underlined the vital role of government-supported infrastructure in advancing frontier technologies like CAR-T cell therapy, mRNA platforms, marine biofoundries, synthetic biology, and probiotics. However, they also pointed out challenges, including the lack of indigenous large-scale production of vectors and plasmids, regulatory bottlenecks for probiotics, and the need to integrate marine and blue economy opportunities more effectively, as per the statement. ment, which took over Kabul in August 2021, it is continuing with its developmental and humanitarian aid for the Afghan people. India has a "technical" team in place at the Indian Embassy in

In a post on X, the EAM said: Spoke with Afghan Foreign Minister Mawlawi Amir Khan Muttaqi today. Expressed our condolences at the loss of lives in the earthquake.

"Conveyed that India has delivered 1000 family tents today in Kabul. 15 tonnes of food material is also being immediately moved by Indian Mission from Kabul to Kunar. Further relief material will be sent from India starting tomorrow.

"Wish early recovery of those injured. India stands by Afghan-



istan at this difficult time."

Muttagi expressed his gratitude for India's solidarity with the Afghan people during this

 $tragedy\, and\, assured\, that\, the\, aid$ will be delivered to those in need in a timely manner.

As a result of the earthquake

that struck Kunar, Nangarhar, and Laghman provinces shortly before midnight on Sunday, at least 812 people have so far been confirmed dead and almost 3,000 injured.

The Indian embassy in Kabul delivered the 1,000 tents to the Ministry of Refugees and Repatriation to assist those affected by the earthquake.

Former Afghan President Hamid Karzai has expressed deep sorrow over the loss of life and property caused by Sunday night's 6.0-magnitude earthquake in Afghanistan's eastern provinces.

The worst hit province was Kunar, but other provinces that were also badly affected included Nangarhar, Laghman, Nuristan, and Panjshir. UNI

Xi Jinping urges SCO to resist bloc confrontation, announces USD 281 million grant

TIANJIN/NEW DELHI, SEP1: Chinese President Xi Jinping today called on Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) member states to resist bloc confrontation and bullying while safeguarding a world order centered on the United Nations. He was speaking at the 25th Meeting of the SCO Council of Heads of State in Tianjin.

'We must uphold justice and impartiality, promote the correct view of the history of World War II, resist the Cold War mentality, bloc confrontation and bullying, and defend the system of international relations with the central role of the United Nations," Xi Jinping said.

Xi also called for safeguarding the UN-centered international system, and supporting the multilateral trading system with the WTO at its core.

Xi announced a grant of 2 billion yuan (about USD 281 million) for SCO member states this year, along with an additional 10 billion yuan in loans over the next three years through the SCO Interbank Consortium. He noted that China's cumulative investment in other SCO member states has already exceeded USD 84 billion, while annual bilateral trade has surpassed USD 500 billion.

The Chinese President also urged the SCO to "strive for real



results and high efficiency," calling for the early operationalisation of the SCO Universal Center for Countering Security Threats and Challenges and the SCO Anti-Drug Center, as well as the establishment of an SCO Development Bank to strengthen security and economic cooperation.

Xi asked the member countries to uphold fairness and justice while addressing the 25th Meeting of the Council of Heads of State of the SCO session.

The largest SCO summit in the history of the association is being held in the Chinese city of Tianjin from August 31 to September 1, with

more than 20 foreign leaders and representatives of international organizations taking part.

The Shanghai Cooperation Organization is an international organization founded in 2001. It includes India, Iran, Kazakhstan, China, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Tajikistan, Pakistan and Uzbekistan. Belarus officially joined the organization at the Astana summit on July 4, 2024. Observer countries are Afghanistan and Mongolia, dialogue partner states are Azerbaijan, Armenia, Bahrain, Egypt, Cambodia, Qatar, Kuwait, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Türkiye, Sri Lanka. CM assures that Delhi is prepared to tackle flood situation

NEW DELHI, SEP 1: Amid rising concerns over likely increase in the Yamuna's water level, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta today said that the Delhi government and all its flood-related departments are fully prepared and maintaining high alert.

The CM has appealed to the people residing in the Yamuna riverbed to exercise caution, and strictly follow the instructions issued by the administration. Gupta informed that, given the high volume of water released from the Hathni kund Barrage on Monday morning, which is over 3 lakh cusecs, it is estimated that the water level may rise to 207 metres or, even slightly higher. She informed that the concerned departments have been working tirelessly for the past six months and have conducted desilting of the drains and in the river as well, which has helped in the waters flowing ahead after entering the river's span in the city. Presently, the situation remains under control and there is no reason for panic, CM assured the people, adding that any floodrelated issue will be dealt with immediately.

Delhi government's top priority is to ensure the safety of the residents of the national capital, and to minimise any type of inconvenience to the people of the city. According to CM, the situation is being monitored round-the-clock, and that this year extensive as well as advance measures have already been implemented for flood control and management.

The CM also shared that the large-scale desilting of the Yamuna river, and its drains carried out over the past six months, has significantly strengthened flood defences. UNI

Ashwin in talks with ILT20, may register for auction

NEW DELHI: R Ashwin, fresh from retirement from all forms of the game, including the Indian Premier League (IPL), has evinced interestinInternationalLeagueT20(ILT20) and in all likelihood will register for the auction. If all goes fine, he will feature in the next season of the UAE league, which will run from December2toJanuary4nextyear.Cricbuzz understands that the ILT20 organisers are in discussions with the ace spinner, and his name may appear on the auction list once the enrolment formalities are completed. The registration process is currently underway, with September 10 as the last date for enrolment in the

"Yes, I am in talks with the organisers. Hopefully, I will have a buyer if I register for the auction" Ashwin told Cricbuzz, confirming his interest. The league used to follow a draft system for recruiting players, but the organisers have

introduced the auction system this year. The auction is scheduled to take place on September 30 in Dubai.

Should Ashwin be picked in the auction, he would become the biggest name from Indian cricket to feature in the UAE league, now in its fourth season. Robin Uthappa and Yusuf Pathan have previously been picked but yet to debut, while Ambati Rayudu is the only other Indian to have featured in the competition when he played eight games for MI Emirates.

It is likely that Ashwin has had some assurances from teams before he decided on participating in the league. A veteran of 282 international games across formats, Ashwin is one of the biggest matchwinners and has been a regular in the IPL since season 2 in 2009.

The 38-year-old all-rounder represented five different franchises in the IPL - Chennai Super Kings, Rising Pune Supergiants, Delhi Capitals, Punjab Kings and Rajasthan Royals - in 221 games.

Besides, he played for his Tamil Nadu state team and his TNPL sides in T20 cricket. He also featured in

65 Twenty20 Internationals. As previously reported by this website, Ashwin is eyeing a playercum-coach role in international leagues, and it is almost certain that he will feature in Major League Cricket (MLC) in the US and The Hundred in England next year.

Top internationals like Alex Hales, Andre Russell, Jason Holder, Liam Livingstone, Phil Salt, Sherfane Rutherford and Sunil Narine, Lockie Ferguson, Sam Curran, Shimron Hetmyer, Wanindu Hasaranga, Dushmantha Chameera, Mustafizur Rahman, Rovman Powell, Shai Hope, Azmatullah Omarzai, Moeen Ali, Rahmanullah Gurbaz, Chris Woakes, Fazalhaq Farooqi, Kusal Perera, Romario Shepherd, Adil Rashid, Kusal Mendis, Tim Southee, Maheesh Theekshana, Sikandar Raza and Tim David have already been recruited by different sides.

Parag focuses on game-time and 'fun' on return to competitive grind

BENGALURU: East Zone captain Riyan Parag's focus at the seasonopening 2025-26 Duleep Trophy was on easing himself back into the grind $of competitive \, cricket \, and \, getting \, some$ game-time after he had spent most of last season managing a shoulder in-

Paraglast turned out for India in a T20I against Bangladesh in October 2024. He had to undergo surgery for his shoulder injury, after which he played in the Ranji Trophy 2024-25 for Assam in January. Before the Duleep Trophy, Parag had last played competitive cricket in IPL 2025 for Rajasthan Royals (RR). He was their second-highest run-scorer during the season, but was "managing a lot of stress" due to the shoulder injury.

"It was good," Parag said after the final day of the Duleep Trophy game against North Zone. "I mean, that was the main goal when I came here to play the game. Performances, I didn't really focus on that much. I just wanted to have some fun. "I haven't played competitive cricket in a long time. Since



the IPL, I haven't really played. [In the] IPL also, I was managing a lot of stress and stuff like that. But it was nice, was a good outing. Not in a good way with the amount of overs we fielded. But then still, rolled my arm for a few overs, batted for a while. Could have converted it for a bigger score, but then I'm happy. The shoulder feels much

Leading the side in the absence of Abhimanyu Easwaran, who was ruled

Parag was dismissed for 39 in the only innings East Zone batted. He didn't bowl in the first innings, but bowled 22 overs in the second as North Zone made 658 for 4, building on their firstinnings lead of 175.

While the game ended in a draw, North Zone qualified for the semifinals on the basis of their first-innings

"They played better cricket, I got

to give credit to that," Parag said on North Zone's performance. "I feel we could have done better in the first innings while bowling but then we should have got at least close to like 350 and then try to restrict it. "But once we did not do that, they had the lead of around 200 runs. Then, just the batters batted $really\,well\,and\,just\,took\,the\,game\,away$ from us and the last day was just formality, I think, for them to get their milestones." East Zone were without Mukesh Kumar on day three and four after the fast bowler picked up a thigh strain on the opening day. Mohammed Shami also did not take the field on the final day after he cut his toe, which meant East Zone had to rely on their part-time options.

"That was one of the tough things to manage," Parag said. "Shami bhaiya didn't bowl today, Mukesh got injured in the first innings, I'm coming back from an injury so I had to bowl 20 overs. Utkarsh [Singh], our non-bowler, he had to bowl around 30 overs so that did play a part for us in fielding a lot of overs but then nothing we can do about it. We just take it as a loss."
