



'Backlog, rising costs, market saturation threaten valley's horticulture sector'

SRINAGAR, SEP 25: Demand for Kashmiri apples has plummeted drastically this season, with rates dipping to less than half of what growers earned last year, leaving thousands of orchardists across the valley in distress.

Speaking to the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Bashir Ahmad Basheer, president of the Kashmir Valley Fruit Growers Cum Dealers Union, said the industry is facing one of its toughest phases in recent history.

"Rates are very low this year — less than even 50 per cent of what we earned last season," Basheer said. "The primary reason is the backlog of produce that remained stranded on highways, mandis, orchards, and other storage facilities. This backlog will take nearly a month to clear, and only after that, we may see some improvement. But by then, more apples will have already reached the market, adding to the crisis."

Growers from different districts expressed deep concern over the unprecedented slump. They said that an apple box, which fetched over Rs 1,000 last year, is being sold for barely Rs 400 this season.

"How can we survive when the cost of production itself is higher than the selling price?" asked Abdul Rashid, a grower from Shopian. "Fertilisers, pesticides, insecticides, freight, labour, boxes, paper, and packaging – everything has become costlier. But when we take our produce to the mandis, we are forced to sell it at throw-

away prices." Another grower, Ghulam Nabi from Sopore, said the situation has shaken

**GREATER NOIDA, SEP 25:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday said the reforms in GST will continue and the tax burden on citizens will further ease as the economy gains more strength.

Modi emphasised that the nation currently possesses strong willpower for reforms, backed by democratic and political stability, along with policy predictability.

Earlier this month, India effected next-generation reforms in GST. Modi said the structural reforms



in Goods and Services Tax (GST) are set to give new wings to country's

growth story.

Addressing the gathering after inaugurating the Uttar Pradesh International Trade Show 2025 here, Modi said his government has significantly reduced taxes, curbed inflation, and increased both income and savings for the people.

He said that by making income up to Rs 12 lakh tax-free and implementing new GST reforms, citizens are set to save Rs 2.5 lakh crore this year alone.

He further emphasised on real-time monitoring of housing development projects and aware-

ness campaigns for the buyers.

The Chief Minister highlighted the scale of destruction, noting that torrential rains have damaged over 350 bridges, around 2,000 km of road network, thousands of hectares of agricultural land, besides washing away standing crops and inflicting damages on both government and private buildings. "Given the enormity of restoration challenges, Jammu and Kashmir is looking forward to a comprehensive relief and rehabilitation package from the Central Government," he added.

Emphasizing the importance of first-hand assessment, Omar Abdullah said his visit to the remote and isolated areas of Kathua was aimed at understanding the ground realities. He also undertook an aerial survey of damages in Hiranagar and Lakhanpur, the entry point of Jammu and Kashmir.

Later, the Chief Minister convened a meeting with district administration, including Deputy Commissioner Kathua Rajesh Sharma, ADC, and senior civil and police officers. He directed the DC to conduct extensive tours of all affected areas and submit detailed ground reports at the

Speaking on the occasion, MLA Bani, Dr. Rameshwar Singh, underlined that the Bani region too has suffered extensive damages due to landslides triggered by torrential rains. He said that in villages such as Moar, Najote, and Kanthal-Majra, nearly 100 families have lost their land and property completely. He demanded allotment of five marlas of land for such affected families, besides highlighting other pressing concerns, including damages to the Jalana Bridge, delay in tendering of work for High School Lohai, upgradation of High School Sadrota, as well as amnesty from KCC loans and electricity bills for affected families.

The Chief Minister assured that the government would examine all these demands with due seriousness and extend all possible support to the affected families.

Gulabgarh, Er. Khurshied Ahmed, and other senior officials, the Chief Minister expressed deep solidarity with the affected families and reaffirmed his Government's commitment to prioritizing their relief and rehabilitation.

Addressing a gathering of flood victims, Omar Abdullah spoke with empathy and candor. "The purpose of my visit here is to share your pain and express my condolences for the loss of lives and property you have suffered. I want you to believe that you are not alone in this difficult time," he said, assuring people of sustained Government intervention to help them rebuild their lives.

The Chief Minister recalled that his wish was for Er. Khurshied Ahmed's first programme as MLA to be one of joy and development-laying the foundation of new projects or inaugurating new facilities. "But destiny had something else in store," he remarked. "It is not a favour that Khurshied Sahab and I are here; it is our duty and our way of repaying the faith you placed in us last vear.'

Reflecting on the unusual challenges faced by Jammu and Kashmir this year, Omar Abdullah said that J&K had gone from the threat of severe drought earlier in February-April, to unprecedented floods that wreaked havoc from Kathua to Kupwara. "In the beginning of the year, there was no sign of rain, and I had asked our irrigation, flood control, and PHE departments to prepare for drought. Yet, when the rains came, they came with such fury that plains and mountains alike were ravaged," he noted.

He candidly acknowledged that lapses in planning and road construction practices may have compounded the damage, particularly where mountain cutting led to landslides and road collapses. "Thousands of kilometres of roads under PWD and PMGSY networks simply vanished," he observed, stressing the need for better foresight in future infrastructure planning.

Interacting personally with affected families, the Chief Minister assured them that comprehensive relief measures and long-term rehabilitation plans were being put into motion. "We will not only help you tide over the immediate crisis but also ensure that your lives are rebuilt afresh with dignity and resilience," he pledged.

department till date. He emphasized the need for departments to enhance capital expenditure while rationalizing and curtailing avoidable revenue expenditure in order to strengthen the fiscal health of the UT.

The Chief Secretary underscored that capital expenditure not only supports infrastructure creation but also contributes directly to longterm economic growth and livelihood oppor-

He urged departments to maintain strict adherence to timelines for Centrally Sponsored

Schemes (CSS), noting that these schemes are designed to build durable assets and improve public services. He particularly stressed the smooth implementation of flagship programmes such as Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, PMGSY, NABARD and other key initiatives.

With regard to the newly rolled out SASCI initiative, the Chief Secretary directed departments to expedite the process of Administrative Approval and Technical Sanction for all new works. He further advised that at least 75% of each ongoing work under this scheme should be completed by December this year, while also calling for the expeditious clearance of the remaining 100 mother sanctions to enable timely execution of projects envisaged under Gol's SASCI initiative giving 50-year interest-free loans for completion of capital expenditure projects in a specific timeframe.

He also reviewed the performance of departments in mobilizing tax and non-tax revenues. He directed the Power Development Department (PDD) to improve billing efficiency and asked the State Taxes Department to plug leakages in GST collection. He stressed on leveraging technology to detect tax evasion and take stringent measures against defaulters to ensure full realization of revenues.

In his presentation, Principal Secretary, Finance, Santosh D. Vaidya, provided a detailed account of the expenditure status. He informed that out of the Budget Estimates (BE) of Rs 79,703 Cr in Revenue Expenditure, an amount of Rs 52,085 Cr has been released, with Rs 33,247 Cr spent till date. On the capital side, against a BE of Rs 18,451 Cr, Rs 7,435 Cr has been released to departments, while the expenditure booked so far stands at Rs757 Cr.

He further revealed that about Rs 1,038 Cr has been spent under CSS (Capex) and Rs 2,534 Cr has been utilized towards repayment obligations. It was also highlighted that while the power purchase bill has increased by 20%, the corresponding revenue realization has grown by only 10%, necessitating urgent corrective

On the revenue front, the collections till August 2025 include GST Rs 3,408.14 Cr Stamp DutyRs287 Cr, Motor Spirit Tax (MST)Rs708.67 Cr, Excise Rs 861 Cr, Transport sector Rs 370 Cr, Mining Rs 49.52 Cr, Water Supply Rs 31.19 Cr, Water Usage Charges at Rs 380 Cr. The cumulative non-tax revenue realized during the ongoing financial year has reached Rs 2,765 crore.

Under the Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SASCI) Part I scheme, the meeting was apprised that the government is making substantial investments in both ongoing and new capital projects across diverse departments.. Of these, 162 are ongoing projects with a cumulative cost of Rs12,393.6 Cr, against which Rs 2,235.3 Cr has already been spent and an additional Rs1,191.4 Cr sought in loans under this scheme. The Power Development Department leads in this category with 19 projects worth Rs 10,052.1 Cr, followed by the Jal Shakti Department with 36 projects amounting to Rs 311.1 Cr, besides significant works being implemented by Housing & Urban Development, and Public Works Departments.

Alongside, 60 new projects worth Rs 309.15 Cr are being launched under this scheme, with loans amounting to Rs 189.52 Cr sought for their execution. The Health & Medical Education Department is spearheading this category with 16 projects costing Rs 82.31 Cr, while Tourism, Youth Services, Sports and Skill Development Departments are also undertaking notable new initiatives under SASCI.

The Chief Secretary directed departments to redouble their efforts in maximizing revenue realization while maintaining fiscal discipline. He stressed that enhanced capital expenditure coupled with efficient revenue collection will be pivotal in sustaining the UT's developmental momentum and fiscal stability.

Those who attended this meeting includes Principal Secretary, Finance; Commissioner Secretary, FCS&CA; Director, FCS&CA, Kashmir/ Jammu; Controller, Legal Metrology besides other concerned officers.

During the meeting, the Chief Secretary stressed the need for strict enforcement to prevent unjustified pricing and directed the Legal Metrology Department (LMD) to constitute special market-checking teams. These teams will monitor retail and wholesale markets to ensure that commodity prices are reduced in proportion to the GST rate cuts recently announced by the Central Government.

The Commissioner Secretary, FCS&CA, Saurabh Bhagat informed the meeting that several companies have already initiated revisions in their product pricing in line with the new tax regime. Notably, 169 companies have revised their rates and submitted intimation to the Legal Metrology Department.

The Chief Secretary further emphasized that the reforms, effective from September 22, 2025, must yield visible relief for the common consumers in the coming days. The Legal Metrology Department will intensify inspections to verify compliance and take strict action against any violations.

He maintained that the objective of these reforms is consumer welfare. It is imperative that the reduction in GST rates translates into lower market prices so that people feel the real benefit, he underlined.

The meeting reaffirmed the government's commitment to safeguarding consumer interests and ensuring transparency in the market system.

Railway Manager Jammu, Vivek Kumar confirmed on Thursday.

While talking to reporters, Kumar said that the plan to link Jammu directly with Srinagar through Vande Bharat had been delayed due to widespread damage to railway tracks caused by recent incessant rains and floods. However, he assured that restoration work is underway at a rapid pace and the service will be launched once safety clearances are in place.

"We are working on it. The delay occurred because of massive damage to tracks due to floods and heavy rains. But sooner or later, this service will be available to the people of Jammu," he said.

The Katra-Srinagar Vande Bharat service, introduced earlier this year, has already eased travel time between the Valley and the base camp of Mata Vaishno Devi shrine. The extension to Jammu is expected to further boost connectivity, benefiting commuters, pilgrims, and tourists alike.

Divisional Railway Manager Jammu, Vivek Kumar, added that once the extension  $becomes \, operational, the \, train \, is \, expected$ to run on a daily schedule, connecting Jammu to Srinagar with improved travel comfort and reduced journey time compared to existing rail and road services. (KNT)

measures for the revival and promotion of languishing crafts, with special focus on the traditional Namda craft.

The spokesperson stated that Namda has recently been accorded Geographical Indication(GI) registration under the Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act, 1999, a landmark achievement that safeguards the authenticity of the craft while strengthening its competitive standing against cheaper, machine-made alternatives. The GI tag is expected to serve as a catalyst in revitalizing this centuries-old tradition and enhancing its market visibility at both national and international levels.

In pursuit of this objective, the Directorate has intensified its outreach by encouraging master artisans to avail the benefits of the Department's flagship Karkhandar Scheme, aimed at capacity building, skill development and knowledge transfer to younger generations. District offices have also been directed to actively engage passout trainees to strengthen the grassroots implementation of the scheme. At present, the Department is running nine Elementary and two Advanced Training Centres for Namda, creating a strong framework for skill development and knowledge trans-

Redoubling its efforts for revival of the craft, under the CAPEX Budget 2025–26, an amount of ₹26.50 lakh has been earmarked for the repair and restoration of the Carding Machine at the UNDP facility, a step that will guarantee uninterrupted availability of quality raw material and thereby reinforce the production base for Namda artisans.

The spokesperson appealed to the public to support the Government's "Vocal for Local" initiative by buying felted Namdas, emphasizing that collective patronage is essential to provide a level playing field to Namda artisans and to ensure the revival of this unique craft, which forms an integral part of Kashmir's cultural heritage.

the confidence of farmers. "We have been in this business for decades, but never have we witnessed such a disastrous season. It feels like we are working day and night only to incur losses. Many growers are worried about repaying debts taken for orchard management," he said.

The growers fear that if immediate steps are not taken by the government to stabilise the market, the valley's horticulture sector – which provides livelihood to lakhs of families – could face long-term damage.

"This is not just about farmers," Basheer added. "If apple growers suffer, the entire rural economy of Kashmir suffers with them. We urge the authorities to intervene before it is too late.'

The Prime Minister also accused opposition parties of spreading falsehoods to cover up their own governance failures, asserting that during the Congress regime, excessive taxation burdened ordinary citizens.

"The poor, new middle class, and middle class have all benefited with higher savings (due to IT benefits and GST reforms). Despite this, some political parties are trying to confuse people. Congress and its allies are lying to the people to hide the failures of their own governments prior to 2014.

"The truth is that there was 'Tax Loot' during Congress-led governments. The common citizens of the country were suffering due to the heavy taxes. Our government has reduced the burden of taxes in a big way and lowered inflation," Modi said.

He also emphasised that India is advancing toward its goal of becoming a developed nation by 2047. "Despite global disruptions and uncertainty, India's growth remains attractive," he said, and added that disruptions do not divert India – they reveal new directions.

Amidst these challenges, he said, India is laying a strong foundation for the coming

He reiterated that the nation's resolve and guiding mantra is Aatmanir bhar Bharat (self-reliant India).

Stressing that there is no greater helplessness than dependence on others, Modi said in a changing world, the more a country relies on others, the more its growth is

"India must become self-reliant. Every product that can be made in India must be produced in India." he said.

He called upon the entrepreneurs, traders, and innovators present at the event to design business models that strengthen India's self-reliance.

He further said the government is strongly focused on 'Make in India' and boosting domestic manufacturing, and spoke about the vision to produce everything from chips to ships within the coun-

The government is continuously working to enhance Ease of Doing Business and highlighted that over 40,000 compliances have been eliminated, and hundreds of rules that previously led to legal cases over minor business errors have been decrimi-

He remarked that every Indian is now connected with swadeshi and wants to buy local products.

The sentiment of proudly saying "this is swadeshi" is being felt across the country, he asserted and called on traders to adopt this mantra and prioritise products that are made in India, he said.

In his address, Modi also discussed the progress being made by Uttar Pradesh in various sectors. He said the state is brimming with extraordinary investment poten-

He informed that Uttar Pradesh now has the highest number of expressways in the country, leads in the number of international airports, and accounts for nearly 55 per cent of all mobile phones manufactured in the country.

He added that UP will also strengthen India's self-reliance in the semiconductor sector, with a major semiconductor facility set to begin operations.

The Prime Minister further said India's armed forces seek indigenous solutions and aim to reduce external dependence.

"In India, we are developing a vibrant defence sector, creating an ecosystem where every component bears the mark of 'Made in India'," he said while highlighting Uttar Pradesh's significant role in this transformation.

He said production of AK-203 rifles will soon commence at a factory established with Russian collaboration in the state.

Additionally, a defence corridor is being developed in the state, where the manufacture of BrahMos missiles and other weapon systems has already commenced. (Agencies)

# Agriculture department gears up for paddy procurement operations KMS 2025-26

Director reviews preparedness

**JAMMU, SEP 25:** A meeting to review preparedness for the Paddy Procurement Season, KMS 2025-26 was convened today under the chairmanship of Director Agriculture Jammu, Anil Gupta here in the Conference Hall Directorate of Agriculture, Krishi Bhawan Talab Tillo. The meeting was attended by senior functionaries of the Agriculture Department and the Food Corporation of India

The Director Agriculture reviewed in detail the arrangements for the crucial operations to ensure smooth, transparent and farmer friendly functioning of procurement centres. It was informed that FCI will procure paddy directly from farmers through the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) system, thereby ensuring directed payments into farmers' accounts within two working days at the notified Minimum Support Price (MSP) of Rs2,389 per quintal for

Grade A and Rs 2,369 per quintal for Common Grade paddy. An Aadhaar based biometric authentication system will be implemented at all procurement centres to eliminate intermediaries and

ensure transparency. The Director directed the Chief Agriculture Officers of Jammu, Kathua and Samba to appoint SMSlevel officers for effective supervision at procurement mandis and to conduct joint inspections of mandi sites with FCI. He further instructed that districts must ensure speedy processing of bills so that farmers receive timely pay-

It was informed that the specifications for KMS 2025-26 will remain unchanged and any necessary updates will be notified by FCI through its portal. Participants discussed the provision of uniform cleaning charges, timely supply of gunny bags and logistical support at procurement mandies, coordinated between FCI and the Agriculture Department. The proposal to establish additional procurement centres at Airwan (District Kathua) and Ramgarh (District Samba) is under consideration, pending approval from FCI based on demand and feasibil-

# Carry out dredging of water bodies, flood channels at the earliest

Over the past 15 years or so the union territory of Jammu & Kashmir has been hit by many disasters with people losing their lives and properties getting damaged. In such a scenario it was important that all necessary precautions should have been taken by the government so that future disasters could have been averted. However, on ground the situation is grim with disaster preparedness missing.

The lack of preparation from the people at helm in mitigating the disasters became evident after the recent floods in both the Kashmir and Jammu divisions of the union territory. Even though the government claimed that there is nothing to worry about, at the end of the day the people were at the receiving end. Lakhs of people suffered on account of floods and thousands of families had to shift from their native areas following the floods.

Referring to the floods of Kashmir valley chief minister Omar Abdullah said that the matters have been made worse since no dredging has taken place in the flood channels of the valley. Omar while talking to media persons during his visit to one of the affected areas said that since huge funds had been allocated for the dredging of flood channels a probe needs to be carried out as to where has the money gone.

While analyzing the statement of Omar one can say that he is right and investigations need to be carried out as far as allocation of funds for dredging purposes is concerned. Over the years virtually very little dredging has been carried out in the flood channels and as such there has been no change in the carrying capacity of these flood channels. As on date a rainfall of a few hours keeps the people of Kashmir valley on tenterhooks and the basic reason for the same is the less carrying capacity of flood channels.

Since the autumn season is about to start in the Kashmir valley it is important that the government takes up the dredging of flood channels and water bodies seriously and people heave a sigh of relief. It is important to carry out dredging of water bodies as the same would lead to increase in the carrying capacity of these natural resources. Once the water bodies are able to absorb more water then there are least chances of flood and areas getting inundated.

#### "Silence in Our Mother Tongue Is Dangerous" For Touquer, this effort is more than just a hobby

Cows' digestive systems differ from humans, so products made with ghee, sugar, and refined flour can be harmful. During this time, cows should only be fed green grass, straw, fruits, and fodder. Devotion and protection can coexist. The purpose of Navratri is not just devotion, but also prudent faith and animal protection. By maintaining balance, we can maintain both tradition and animal welfare.

Navratri is a highly significant festival in Indian culture and religious beliefs. It is not just a nine-day celebration, but also a symbol of devotion, restraint, health, and social responsibility. During Navratri, people often consume fruits, light sattvic foods, and milk to purify both the body and mind. Therefore, Halwa-puri should be consumed in moderation and with caution.

Now the question arises whether halwa-puri can be given to cows. Cows are considered extremely sacred in Hinduism. They are considered a mother, and religious texts emphasize the importance of serving and protecting them. However, cows' digestive systems differ from humans. They primarily rely on green grass, fodder, straw, and grains. Heavy and sweet foods like ghee, sugar, and refined flour can be harmful to them. Excessive ghee and sugar in halwa-puri can adversely affect their health, causing diarrhea, indigestion, and other gastrointestinal problems.

The need for balance becomes clear here. The purpose of Navratri is not only faith and devotion, but also to maintain coexistence with animals and nature. Devotion and protection can coexist. Offering halwa and puri is not good for the health of cows, and the best option is to provide them with natural fodder, green grass, and fruits. From a religious perspective, the true meaning of devotion is to use discretion while still practicing our faith.

Traditionally, the distribution of prasad during Navratri should be limited to human consumption only. Doing so adheres to religious beliefs and ensures the safety of animals. Many temples and religious sites maintain this balance by offering only fruits, green leaves, and dry

grains as prasad. This provides nutrition to cows and protects their

This topic is extremely important from a cultural perspective. In Indian tradition, the cow is considered a mother. Religious texts and folk tales specifically mention their protection, respect, and service. If we ignore the health of cows during Navratri out of devotion and tradition, we fail to uphold the principles of their protection and care. This is a matter where a balance between religion and science is essential.

Education and awareness play a crucial role in this regard. Religious organizers, temples, and families need to understand that every offering they make must be safe not only for humans but also for animals, if any. Awareness campaigns should be conducted through schools, social organizations, and religious organizations to ensure that people understand that halwa-puri is not

safe for cows. Health experts also believe that keeping cows away from human food is essential for their long-term health. Ghee, sugar, and oil-based foods can cause problems in their gastrointestinal system. Therefore, traditional offerings during Navratri should be enjoyed only for humans. This maintains religious values and ensures the safety of the animals.

The significance of Halwa-Puri during Navratri is not limited to taste or tradition. It is also a medium of devotion, collective enthusiasm, and spending time with family. But we must remember that devotion does not simply mean following tradition; it must also include discretion and prudence. Prasad should be distributed while keeping in mind the health of cows

and other domestic animals. Studies and experiences show that neglecting animals during religious events not only impacts their health but also highlights a lack of awareness in society. Therefore, prioritizing both animal safety and human health during Navratri is essential. This fulfills both our religious beliefs and social responsibil-

Through this tradition, we can also impart an important lesson to children. They can be taught that religious festivals are not just a means of celebration and joy, but also hold messages of wisdom, responsibility, and coexistence. When children learn that halwapuri is only for humans and that cows are fed natural fodder, they become sensitive and responsible

citizens in their own lives. The message of Navratri is to embrace faith, restraint, and prudence. While enjoying traditional delicacies and offerings, we must remember that the safety and health of our four-legged friends is paramount. If we maintain this balance, the Navratri celebration becomes even more meaningful and enjoy-

Finally, it must be remembered that the true purpose of Navratri is not merely to indulge in food and drink and festivities. This festival teaches us that faith and wisdom can coexist. It is our religious and social responsibility to take care of the health of both humans and animals. Therefore, during Navratri, halwa-puri should be consumed in moderation for humans, and cows should be given only natural fodder. This is the correct and balanced approach, which integrates faith, culture, and safety.

Through this balance and wisdom, the Navratri festival not only becomes religiously fulfilling but also serves as an inspiring example for our society and animal welfare. In this way, we can adhere to religious faith and cultural tradition while fulfilling our responsibility to our four-legged friends.

lost two sons of his battalion .....(MD)! Tragedies in Manipur have happened in a heap but we will recite two:

A tragic incident involved Colonel Viplav Tripathi, an Indian Army officer from Manipur, who was killed with his wife and son by militants in an ambush

More recently, the story of Serto Thangthang Kom, an Army jawan on leave in 2023, who was abducted and murdered by unidentified miscreants in his own village, highlights the dangers faced by soldiers and their families in the region. He was killed by a single bullet to the head, and his son was the sole eyewitness to the abduction. The jawan was abducted by "unidentified miscreants" while on leave in Manipur. His body was found in Khuningthek

Facts from history!

The Insurgency in Northeast India is an ongoing armed conflict in a number of India's northeastern states involving several militant groups with various political ideologies, including separatism and Christian nationalism and the Indian government. The northeastern states are connected to the rest of India by the Siliguri Corridor, a strip of land as narrow as 14.29 miles (23.00 km) wide.

Northeastern India consists of seven states (also known as the Seven Sister States): Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura, Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Manipur, and Nagaland.

Tensions existed between insurgents in these states and the central government as well as amongst their native indigenous people and migrants from other parts of India and illegal immigrants.

We will concentrate on Manipur

today: The annexation of Manipur in 1949 led to split in the polity of Manipur. Political organizations such as Manipur State Congress actively campaigned for union with India while organizations such as Praja Sangh and other parties opposed the union.s

During this time, Hijam Irabot, a leader of the Communist Party of Manipur was in touch with the Communist Party of Burma to arrange for the training of the militant wing of the party, the Red Guards. After Irabot's death the movement split into various factions.

In the second wave of the insurgency, the first separatist faction, known as United National Liberation Front (UNLF), was founded on 24 November 1964.

However, they did not take armed action until 1991. Between 1977 and 1980, the People's Liberation Army of



Manipur (PLA), People's Revolutionary Party of Kangleipak (PREPAK) and the Kangleipak Communist Party (KCP), were formed, immediately joining the war.

Naga insurgency began in the 1980s with the founding of the National Socialist Council of Nagaland.

This was followed by the formation of Kuki National Front and the Kuki National Organisation and its armed wing Kuki National Army in 1987 and 1988 respectively.

On 8 September 1980, Manipur was declared an area of disturbance, when the Indian Government imposed the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958 on the region; the act currently remains in force. The provision was lifted in various parts of Manipur in March 2023.

The parallel rise of Naga nationalism in neighboring Nagaland led to the emergence of National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN) activities in Manipur.

Clashes between the Isak-Muivah and Khaplang factions of NSCN further aggravated tensions, as Kuki tribes began creating their own guerrilla groups in order to protect their interests from alleged Naga violations.

Other ethnic groups such as Paite, Vaiphei, Pangals and Hmars followed suit establishing militant groups.

This was just a brief and now we will come to the subject in hand!

Two Assam Rifles personnel killed, five injured in terrorist ambush in Manipur's Bishnupur district The injured were taken to a hospital by police and locals, another official said.

Unidentified gunmen ambushed a minitruck carrying Assam Rifles personnel in Manipur on Friday, killing two and injuring four others.

The incident occurred at around 5:45 pm in the Nambol Sabal Leikai area of Bishnupur district. Nambol is around 15 km from the state capital of Imphal.

"In general area, Nambol Sabal Leikai, the column was ambushed by unidentified terrorists on the Highway, in the denotified area of Manipur. In the ensuing action, two personnel of Assam Rifles were martyred and five are injured who have since been evacuated to RIMS and are currently stable," an army statement

The attack came two days before a bandh called by valley-based rebel groups opposing Manipur's merger agreement of September 21, 1949. In recent months, the police and security forces apprehended several militants in the state.

2 Detained, Van Seized:

Two people were detained from Manipur on Saturday in connection with the ambush on an Assam Rifles convoy earlier this week that killed two soldiers and injured five others. Avan, suspected to have been used in the incident, was also recovered from Mutum Yangbi in Imphal - nearly 12 km from the incident site, officials said.

According to the police, the recovered vehicle has multiple owners, all of whom

Naib Subedar Shyam Gurung and Rifleman Ranjit Singh Kashyap attained martyrdom, Officials said that the terrorists fired at the paramilitary forces' 407 Tata vehicle while it was travelling from its Patsoi company operating base to Nambol base at 5.50 pm. This is on the same road that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had taken during his recent visit to Manipur.

A day after the incident, a high-level meeting was held, chaired by Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla, to discuss boosting security arrangements in vulnerable and sensitive areas of Manipur. Top state government officials and senior police personnel were present in the meeting.

"The discussion stressed the need for coordinated action among all security agencies to ensure swift identification of the perpetrators. It was also resolved that security arrangements must be further strengthened in vulnerable and sensitive areas, including highways, transit routes, and border zones," the Raj

Manipur has witnessed ethnic violence between two communities, the Meitei community and the Kuki tribes, since 2023, over a range of issues such as land rights and political representation. Over 260 have died in the violence, and nearly 50,000 have been internally displaced.

accused involved in the recent ambush

on security personnel at Sabal Leikai, Nambol, which killed two jawans of the Assam Rifles and injured five others, officials said.

According to a police report, acting on intelligence inputs about the presence of armed militants in the Kameng area of Imphal West district, a joint team comprising Imphal West Police, Bishnupur Police, 33 Assam Rifles, and other security forces launched a special operation around 1 am.

During the operation, one person identified as Khundongbam Ojit Singh alias Keilal (47), son of late Kh. Mani Singh of Awang Leikinthabi Awang Leikai, Imphal West, was apprehended.

"At the spot examination, he admitted that he is a bailed-out member of the PLA. He further stated that he continues to work for the PLA," the police said.

During interrogation, Singh revealed that he had been arrested earlier on April 22.2007. Officials further stated that his examination confirmed his direct involvement in the September 19 ambush at Sabal Leikai, Nambol, around 5:30 pm, which targeted personnel of the 33 Assam

After opening fire on the Assam Riflespersonnel, Singh and his associates fled towards the Loktak Lake side, where they hid their arms and ammunition at a secret location, the report added.

Based on his disclosure, security forces recovered a huge cache of arms and ammunition used in the ambush. The recoveries include one A4 rifle with four magazines, one HK rifle with two magazines, two AK rifles with five magazines, one INSAS rifle with three magazines, and three lathode shells. In addition, 170 rounds of AK ammunition, 216 rounds of M-16 ammunition, 67 rounds of INSAS ammunition, one mobile handset, a wallet, and an Aadhaar card were

Examination of the arrested person is ongoing, and police said certain leads have been established. Raids are being carried out to apprehend other suspects involved in the Nambol ambush, they

# **Reclaiming Workout** From The Camera

The gym, once a sanctuary for physical and mental transformation, has increasingly become a stage for content creation. Driven by the rise of social media, workout spaces are transforming into backdrops for carefully curated videos and photos, where dumbbells serve as props and squat racks double as filming locations. This shift undermines the gym's original purpose—a space for focused effort and personal growth—turning workouts into public spectacles. This article explores the physiological and psychological consequences of this trend, supported by global data, and proposes actionable solutions to restore the gym as a place of authentic fitness.

#### The Rise of Filming Culture

The global proliferation of social media platforms has redefined fitness culture. A 2024 report by Statista indicates that over 4.9 billion people use social media worldwide, with fitness-related content generating significant engagement. Platforms like Instagram, TikTok, and YouTube have created a culture where workouts are often evaluated not by personal progress but by metrics such as likes, comments, and shares. For many, the gym has become a content studio, where the pursuit of a viral post overshadows the pursuit of a personal best.

This trend is particularly pronounced among younger demographics. A 2023 study published in Frontiers in Psychology found that 68% of gym-goers aged 18–34 reported feeling pressure to document their workouts online. While social media can motivate some, it often shifts the focus from intrinsic goals like strength or health—to extrinsic validation, eroding the essence of fitness.

#### Physiological and Psychological Costs

The divided attention—between lifting and filming—undermines the focus required for safe, effective workouts. The pressure to impress an online audience often leads to "ego lifting," where individuals lift weights beyond their capacity, sacrificing form. The American College of Sports Medicine (ACSM) reports that improper form contributes to approximately 30% of gym-related injuries, including herniated discs and muscle tears. For example, a rounded back during a deadlift, often exacerbated by rushed filming, significantly increases spinal injury risk. Effective core engagement is critical for compound lifts like squats and deadlifts. When attention is diverted to camera angles or lighting, individuals may neglect to brace their core, exposing the spine to improper loading and shearing forces—a leading cause of lower back pain. Filming also prioritizes explosive, visually appealing lifts over controlled movements. Neglecting the eccentric phase (lowering the weight) reduces muscle activation and increases injury risk, undermining long-term prog-

The filming culture also takes a psychological toll. The constant need to broadcast workouts shifts the focus from self-improvement to self-presentation. A 2023 study in Body Image found that frequent exposure to fitness influencer content correlates with a 20% increase in body dissatisfaction and heightened anxiety among gym-goers. This phenomenon, known as self-objectification, leads individuals to view their bodies as objects for external judgment rather than tools for strength and resilience. For fitness influencers, whose livelihoods often depend on online presence, the gym is a workplace. However, this model has permeated the broader population, creating a culture where workouts are validated by social media engagement rather than personal achievement. The intrinsic joy of exercise—rooted in the sensation of effort and progress—is often replaced by anxiety over capturing the "perfect" shot.

#### Reclaiming the Gym: A Path Forward

Restoring the gym as a space for authentic fitness requires both individual and collective action. Gym-goers should prioritize intrinsic goals, such as improving strength by 10% over six months or mastering proper form. We need to remember why we started in the first place. Was it to build a following, or was it to build a stronger, healthier body? The answer for most is the latter. Let's begin by leaving our cameras in our bags. Let's redirect our focus to the sensation of the lift, the burn in the muscles, and the feeling of accomplishment that comes from within. The gym is not a studio—it is a space for sweat, effort, and transformation. The rise of social media has blurred the line between fitness and performance, compromising safety and mental well-being. By refocusing on the intrinsic value of exercise, implementing thoughtful policies, and building a community of mutual respect, we can reclaim the gym as a sanctuary for personal growth.

Let's prioritize our form over our feed. While some gyms have started to establish clear policies regarding filming, a collective change in mindset is perhaps the most powerful tool. The gym is a shared space, and a community thrives on mutual consideration and a common purpose. Let's make the gym a place of sweat, not selfies. A place of hard work, not performance. Let us reclaim the floor, the equipment, and the purpose of our time there. The gym is not a studio; it is a place of self-improvement. Let us treat it that way. Let us lift for strength, not likes, and make the gym floor a place of progress, not spectacle.

**KULGAM, SEP 25:** In its continued crackdown against the menace of drugs and to safeguard the younger generation from falling prey to substance abuse, Kulgam Police today achieved a major success by arresting a drug peddler in Qazigund and recovering contraband substance from his possession.

Acting on specific input, a police team from Police Station Qazigund established a checkpoint at Bonigam crossing. During the naka checking, a suspicious person was intercepted and identified as Waseem Ahmad

Reshi, son of Ghulam Rasool Reshi, resident of Berigam. On thorough search, police recovered 4.8 grams of heroin-like contraband substance from his possession. The accused was immediately taken into custody on

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 188/2025 under relevant provisions of law has been registered at Police Station Oazigund and investigation has been initiated. Police are probing all possible forward and backward linkages of the arrested peddler, including his source of procurement and distribution network. More arrests and recoveries are likely in

the coming days.

Kulgam Police reiterates its firm zero-tolerance policy against drug trafficking and assures the public that strict action will be taken against all individuals involved in this menace which poses a grave threat to society.

On this occasion, SSP Kulgam Shri Sahil Sarangal-IPS appealed to the general public to cooperate with police in the fight against drugs. He urged people, especially youth, to remain vigilant and report any information related to drug peddling or trafficking to the nearest police unit, assuring that identity of informants will be kept strictly confidential.

# Balwant Thakur Meets Director of National School of Drama

With the introduction of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which emphasizes artsintegrated learning and theatrein-education as vital tools for holistic development, the demand for trained theatre educators is growing rapidly. Jammu & Kashmir, with its rich cultural heritage and an emerging interest in creative education, stands at a critical juncture where specialized theatre edu-



cation can play a transformative

Balwant Thakur highlighted the urgent need to address this demand by creating platforms that

can nurture and employ young theatre practitioners. He urged the NSD Director to consider this initiative as a priority, emphasizing that a structured system of training and engagement would not only strengthen the cultural fabric of Jammu & Kashmir but also provide sustainable employ $ment\, opportunities\, to\, youth\, across$ the region.

"For decades, many talented and qualified young theatre enthusiasts, due to the lack of employment avenues, were compelled to migrate towards Bollywood and other entertainment industries. There is an urgent requirement for professional theatre educators, and Jammu & Kashmir can become a model region for implementing this policy," Thakur noted.

Director NSD, Chittaranjan Tripathi, welcomed the suggestions and acknowledged the importance of bridging the gap between theatre training and educational implementation. Both leaders agreed that a roadmap is needed to create dedicated programs, workshops, and teacher-training modules in the region to empower educators and open new horizons for cultural and educational development.

The meeting marks a significant step towards integrating theatre as a pedagogical tool within mainstream education while simultaneously creating meaningful employment for serious theatre practitioners. If implemented effectively, such initiatives can contribute not only to the advancement of theatre as an art form but also to the holistic growth of students, equipping them with creativity, empathy, and critical thinking skills for the future.

# Rs 900 Cr Scam: Economic Offender Bhupesh Arora's Bail Plea Rejected

NEW DELHI, SEP 25: A Special PMLA Court in New Delhi has rejected the bail plea of Bhupesh Arora, a key accused economic offender in one of the country's largest cyber-enabled investment frauds, carried out through the LOXAM app.

Arora was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on July 11, after evading law enforcement for several years.

He had fled to Dubai in early 2022, along with associates, to escape ongoing cyber fraud investigations, and was apprehended upon his clandestine re-entry into India via the Nepal border.

The ED launched a PMLA investigation against Xindai Technologies Pvt Ltd, Bhupesh

Arora, Rohit Vij, and others, based on a First Information Report (FIR) registered by the Cyber Police in Hyderabad.

The FIR alleged that certain Chinese nationals, in connivance with Indian associates, defrauded thousands of investors through the 'LOXAM' investment app by falsely projecting it as part of a reputed French multinational company and promising unrealistic returns.

 $The funds \, collected \, through \,$ the app were later diverted out of the country after being converted into foreign exchange via various money changers.

The ED has filed a Prosecution Complaint under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), exposing the LOXAM app as a fraudulent platform.



Thousands of unsuspecting investors were lured with promises of exorbitant profits, only to have their money siphoned

off through a complex web of shell companies, virtual accounts, and payment gateways. Searches conducted at

five premises during the investigation led to the seizure of digital devices and properties worth Rs 2.01 crore.

An analysis of more than 500 bank accounts revealed that Proceeds of Crime (PoC) amounting to over Rs 311 crore were routed through Xindai Technologies Pvt Ltd and related entities.

These funds were then layered into the accounts of Ranjan Moneycorp Pvt Ltd and KDS Forex Pvt Ltd, before being converted into foreign currency and remitted abroad via hawala channels.

The probe also uncovered foreign exchange transactions totalling nearly Rs 903 crore, routed through multiple shell entities that operated using common IP addresses, a red flag for money laundering typologies, as identified by the Financial Action Task Force (FATF).

Bhupesh Arora has been

identified as a central conspirator in laundering the illicit proceeds.

Evidence, including statements recorded under Section 50 of the PMLA, confirms his role in facilitating cash withdrawals, arranging forex conversions, and orchestrating the cross-border movement of funds in collaboration with money changers.

The LOXAM scam highlights how international cyber-crime syndicates are exploiting digital platforms to place, layer, and integrate illicit funds.

# **BJP launches 90-day** Swadeshi campaign nationwide

NEW DELHI, SEP 25: Marking the birth anniversary of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) today launched a 90-day national campaign to promote the ideals of Swadeshi and Aatmanirbhar Bharat.

The campaign will run until December 25, the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee.

Announcing the initiative at a press conference, BJP National General Secretary and Rajya Sabha MP Arun Singh said the campaign undertaken at the behest of Prime Minister Narendra Modi is aimed at transforming the 'Vocal for Local' push into a mass

Party cadres will mobilise communities through a range of outreach programmes, including melas, vatras, and awareness drives. Citizens will be encouraged to prioritise indigenous products, while shopkeepers will be asked to prominently display Indian-

"From September 25 to December 25, BJP workers across the country will reach every household with the message of Swadeshi. More than 20,000 Aatmanirbhar Bharat Sankalp meetings, 1,000



Swadeshi Melas, and 500 Sankalp Rath Yatras will be organised. Padyatras, youth conventions, women's meetings, traders' sammelans, college competitions, and social media outreach will also be part of the drive," Singh said.

"Every shop will be urged to display boards reading 'Proudly Swadeshi'. People will be asked to sign pledge forms committing to adopt Swadeshi. Certificates will be awarded to shopkeepers who sell only indigenous products," he added.

Singh referenced the 1905 Swadeshi movement during the Bengal Partition and invoked leaders such as Rabindranath Tagore and Bankim Chatterjee, who, he noted, had "voiced the spirit of selfreliance against colonial rule."

He also highlighted the progress made under the Modi government, stating that the Vocal for Local campaign has already delivered tangible economic

"Khadi sales have grown from Rs 31,000 crore under UPA to Rs 1.7 lakh crore today. India, which had just two mobile phone factories in 2014, now has 300 units and exports phones worth Rs 2 lakh crore," Singh said.

However, the party clarified that the initiative is not about boycotts, but about building long-term economic independence and cultural confidence.

"This vision will lead India towards becoming a developed nation by 2047, as envisaged by Prime Minister Modi," he said. UNI

# Trump blames "radical leftists" for deadly shooting at ICE field office in Texas

WASHINGTON, SEP 25: US President Donald Trump has blamed the "radical leftists" for the deadly shooting  $at \, a \, US \, Immigration \, and \, Customs \, Enforcement (ICE) field$ office in Dallas, Texas.

Condemning the attack as despicable, Trump wrote on Truth Social yesterday that the brave men and women of ICE are just trying to do their jobs, but they are facing an "unprecedented increase in threats, violence, and attacks by Deranged Radical Leftists."

"This violence is the result of the Radical Left Democrats constantly demonising Law Enforcement, calling for ICE to be demolished, and comparing ICE Officers to 'Nazis',' Trump said. "The continuing violence from Radical Left Terrorists, in the aftermath of Charlie Kirk's assassination, must be stopped," he said.

The US president said he will be signing an executive order this week to "dismantle these Domestic Terrorism Networks." Yesterday, one detainee was killed and two others critically injured in the shooting, while no officers were harmed. The Mexican Consulate in Dallas confirmed that one of the victims in critical condition is a citizen of

Officials have not yet revealed the motive of the shooter, who died of a self-inflicted gunshot. UNI

# **MEXICO SLAMS US FOR IMMIGRATION RAIDS**

MEXICO CITY, SEP 25: Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum on Wednesday condemned the immigration raids carried out in the United States by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), saying a diplomatic note was sent to Washington requesting an investigation into the recent deaths of two Mexican nationals.

"Yesterday, a diplomatic note was sent on this case, requesting that all investigations be carried out, and if anyone is responsible for human rights violations, that they be punished," the president said at her daily press conference.

Mexican migrants Ismael Ayala-Uribe and Silverio Villegas Gonzalez died following ICE raids and detention in the

Sheinbaum lamented the criminalisation of migrants in the United States and

stressed her government's initiatives in support of Mexicans living there, including establishing an emergency hotline and strengthening services that offer technical and legal advice.

Washington's aggressive anti-immigrant policies impact not just Mexicans but also the US economy, where business owners "in agriculture and services are reporting problems because they cannot hire workers," said Sheinbaum.

The president reiterated that Mexicans living in the United States, whether they are first, second, third, or fourth generation, contribute significantly to the US economy, and they also contribute to the Mexican economy through the remittances they send home.

"We oppose such treatment and the raids that have been carried out, which, in addition, cause fear and anxiety," she added. UNI

# Iran, Russia sign MoU on building small nuclear power plants

TEHRAN, SEP 25: Iran and Russia on Wednesday signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) on the construction of small modular reactors (SMRs) in Iran.

The MoU was signed between Mohammad Eslami, chief of the Atomic Energy Organisation of Iran (AEOI), and Alexey Likhachev, head of Russia's State Atomic Energy Corporation Rosatom in Moscow, according to a statement released on the AEOI's website. The statement said the MoU aims to expand cooperation on the peaceful uses of nuclear energy to promote sustainable development, strengthen energy security and advance technology, in compliance with the two countries' national regulations and international obligations.

It added that under the MoU, the two sides would prepare and sign contracts for designing and constructing nuclear



power plants based on SMRs in the future. Heading a delegation, Eslami arrived in Moscow on Monday to meet Russian officials and participate in the World Atomic Week forum, which runs from Sept. 25 to 28. Upon his arrival, Eslami said that within the framework of a contract between Tehran and Moscow, the latter is expected to build eight nuclear power plants in Iran, including four in the southern province of Bushehr, as the country seeks to generate 20,000 megawatts of electricity in the coming years. # SA-WIT20I series likely to be reduced due to clash with World Cup

The five T20Is were the only home series for the South Africa men's team this summer

**DUBAI:** South Africa may be forced to shorten their only men's international home series this summer-against West Indies-for both teams to get to the 2026 T20 World Cup in India and Sri Lanka on time. South Africa are scheduled to host West Indies for five T20Is between January 27 and February 6, but as reported by ESPNcricinfolast week, the T20 World Cup is set to be played between February 7 and March 8.

On August 28, the ICC sent participating teams a Member Information Pack, with information regarding warm-up matches. The document, seen by ESPNcricinfo, states that the ICC's support period - the time in which teams are expected to arrive in the host countries and play non-obligatory warm-up games - starts on January 31. That has moved up from February 3, while CSA had drawn up their home fixtures with the understanding that South Africa would have enough time to travel to the T20 World Cup.

It is not mandatory for countries

to spend the entire support period in the host venue, but the ICC asked participating countries to list by September 5 how many warm-up matches they want to play, with options ranging between none to a maximum of two. Only if a country opts for two matches, will the support period become one week prior to the tournament opener. CSA are currently in discussions with CWI to see when West Indies want to arrive in the subcontinent and how many matches they want to play there. If teams opt for no warm-up games, the mandatory support period is four days prior to the first match on February 7. If a team opts for one warm-up then the support period will five to six days prior to the tournament opener.

The warm-up information is significant only because it allows the ICC to confirm an arrival date for each team.

Even if West Indies do not want to play any T20 World Cup warmup matches, CSA will still have to cull at least two of the five T20Is; the last two games are on February



3 and 6. The fixtures cannot be played any earlier with the SA20 ending on January 25. CSA is currently deciding which venues should host the matches against West

Indies - at present, the venues are likely to be Paarl, Newlands, Buffalo Park in East London, Centurion and Johannesburg.

CSA always planned on having

England and Sri Lanka narrowly escape this problem; their three-T20I series in Sri Lanka will be played between January 30 and February 3. They also have the benefit of being in one of the host nations at the time.

South Africa do not have any other men's international fixtures at home this season, in part because their all-format tour of India ends on December 19, which left no space for matches before the original window of the SA20 in the first week of January. The SA20 has now been moved into the festive period and will start on December

However, the league is not the only reason for the lack of men's international fixtures. CSA always planned on having a less-crowded summer this year to prepare their venues for the 2027 ODI World Cup. Currently, drop-in pitches are in development around the country. Next season, South Africa play ten home Tests (eight men's and two women's), including three-match series against Australia and England.
