



## **Autumn Session of Assembly** To Begin on Oct 23

**SRINAGAR, SEP 27:** The autumn session of the Jammu & Kashmir Legislative Assembly will commence on October 23, with Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha summoning the House

According to the summons issued by the Legislative Assembly Secretariat, a copy of which is in possession of news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), the Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir has summoned the Assembly to meet in Srinagar on Thursday, October 23, 2025, at

The LG has exercised his authority under Section 18(1) of the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganization Act, 2019, to summon the Assembly.

A tentative calendar for the autumn session will be issued on Monday or Tuesday, following consultations between Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather and Chief Minister Omar Abdullah regarding its framing.

Sources told KNO that the session is expected to include five to six sittings. "There will be no business conducted in the House on October 24, as MLAs will vote to elect Rajya Sabha members," the sources added.

The Cabinet had initially resolved to recom-

 $the Assembly on October\,13. However, the \, date$ was revised after Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather raised concerns with Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, citing that the time allotted was inadequate for the proper examination of questions, private member bills, and resolutions.

After the LG summoned the House, the Assembly Secretariat, in accordance with Rule 3 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the I&K Legislative Assembly, directed all members to attend the session on the appointed date, time, and venue.

Meanwhile, the Legislative Assembly Secretariat today announced that each MLA may submit up to 10 questions, two resolutions, and one bill for the session.

As per the bulletin issued by the Secretariat, each MLA is permitted to submit 10 questions-five starred and five unstarred-along with two resolutions and one bill.

The deadlines for submission are October 4 for questions and bills, and October 7 for resolutions.

The upcoming autumn session is expected to be stormy, with the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), the largest opposition party, led by Leader of Opposition Sunil Sharma, preparing

## Revival of 400+ Heritage, Religious Sites Planned: Director Archaeology

SRINAGAR, SEP 27: Directorate of Archaeology and Museums, Jammu and Kashmir Saturday said that the government is committed to the preservation and revival of the Union Territory's heritage and religious sites, stating that over 400 projects will be taken up in the upcoming third phase of restoration.

Director Archaeology & Museums, K.K. Sidha told the news agency—Kashmir News Observer(KNO) that under the government's heritage revival scheme, several prominent monuments and shrines are being restored. "The revival is not just about repairing structures but about preserving the cultural and religious sentiments associated with them," he said.

Sidha said that the foundation of three major religious projects was laid today, including the historic Martand Temple at Mattan. "The Baba Naseeb-ud-Din Gazi shrine revival is a project of around Rs 4 crore, while the Lokbhawan shrine restoration is pegged at Rs 4.45 crore. Work at the Martand Sun Temple will also commence shortly," he said.

## **CBK Special Crime Wing Raids Srinagar, Budgam in Cheating & Forgery Case**

**SRINAGAR, SEP 27:** The Special Crime Wing of Crime Branch Kashmir (CBK) on Saturday morning launched coordinated raids at several locations in Srinagar and Budgam districts as part of an investigation into a major cheating and forgery case. The operation, which involved multiple teams, targeted the premises of individuals suspected to be linked with an organized fraud racket.

According to officials, the searches were carried out in connection with FIR No. 05/2025 registered at the Special Crime Wing. The case has been booked under sections 420 (cheating), 468 (forgery for the purpose of cheating), 471 (using as genuine a forged document), and 120B (criminal conspiracy) of the Indian Penal Code. The FIR, registered earlier this year, pertains to allegations of large-scale forgery of documents

about the demands of Rehbar-e-Khel teachers, confirming that their matter has been formally taken up with the Centre.

On the plight of Physical Education teachers, Sharma assured that the government is working to fix long-pending service matters. "The Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC) process is going to happen soon, and their due contribution will be recognized. We are confident the process will be completed at the earliest," he said.

Speaking on the recent LPG shortage, Sharma explained that supplies were disrupted after weather-related damage to the national highway. He assured that dumping of gas cylinders has been directed to restore supply at the earliest.

Expressing concern over road accidents, the minister said awareness is crucial. "Life is precious. Last year, 1.7 lakh people in India lost their lives in road accidents. The Government of India has already announced 25,000 for those who take injured victims to hospitals, and we will implement this

Highlighting the government's efforts in sports development, Sharma said equipment has been provided to promote grassroots activities. "Our priority is to nurture young talent and build healthy communities through sports," he added.(KINS)

two infiltration attempts so far this year," he said, adding that the use of advanced surveillance tools and equipment has strengthened the security presence along the border.

According to Yadav, infiltration attempts tend to rise in the period leading up to winter when harsh weather conditions make crossing more difficult.

He said terrorists try to cross the border before snowfall blocks the mountain passes, which usually happens by November. "With two months remaining before winter fully sets in, security agencies are anticipating

possible attempts and have prepared accordingly," he added.

The IG further outlined the challenges associated with the upcoming winter months, highlighting the continued presence of terrorist training camps across the border. These camps, located opposite sectors such as Bandipora, Kupwara, and Baramulla, are under close observation, he said.

Yadav said the forces are monitoring these activities carefully to prevent any disturbances to peace in the area.

Regarding changes in infiltration tactics, the IGP BSF said terrorists are now minimising their communication to evade detection. This, he said, has made intelligence gathering more complex. "However, agencies are carefully analysing every piece of information, which assists in tracking terrorists and uncovering their hideouts," he added.

The IG said BSF has implemented a layered security approach that includes tools such as thermal imaging, ground sensors, night patrols, and coordinated operations with the Army. This cooperation among different forces has enhanced their ability to respond swiftly and effectively to any infiltration bids, he said.

Meanwhile, the BSF, in a statement, said the Kashmir Frontier will host the "Save Wular Run with Borderman" marathon on October 12, 2025, as part of its environmental preservation initiative.

The event aims to promote environmental awareness, strengthen ties with the local community, and encourage youth to focus on constructive activities.

The T-shirt for the marathon was unveiled at the Hangul Officer's Institute, BSF Frontier HQ Humhama, in the presence of senior officials, including IG Ashok Yadav, IG Shashank Anand, IG Soloman Minz, and ADG Satish S Khandare.

The marathon will feature 5 km, 10 km, and 21.1 km races, open to all participants, with free registration already underway. Around 3,000 runners from across the country, especially the Kashmir Valley, are expected to take part.

The BSF added that the event will help identify local talent and sponsor them under the Khelo India scheme for further training and participation in national and international competitions—(KNO)

He said facilities like universal accessibility, ramps and washrooms for specially-abled persons are being added in line with Supreme Court guidelines. "We are also installing solar energy facilities in shrines to make them sustainable," he added.

The Director underlined that after years of neglect, a systematic focus is being placed on heritage. "The third phase, which is about to be approved, includes 350 to 400 sites across J&K that will be restored and revived. This is a historic step," Sidha said.

He further said that the department has three wings—archival, archaeological and museums—and nearly 70 per cent of archival records have been digitized.

"For the first time in the history of this department and UT, excavation will also begin at Baramulla, where an ancient Buddhist site has been identified, in collaboration with the University of Kashmir," he

On Museums, Sidha said the long-shut SPS Museum, which had remained non-functional since 2007, is being revived under a project of Rs 19.5 crore. He added that rare manuscripts, including the oldest Girgit manuscript, are being preserved.

Highlighting the government's approach, the Director said that many sites in J&K showcase unique interfaith heritage. "You can see temples, Mosques and Gurdwaras in the same premises. Our revival plan will not only restore monuments but also strengthen ancestral harmony," he said—(KNO)

for financial and business gains. Teams from CBK's Special Crime Wing executed search warrants at multiple sites after obtaining clearance from a competent court. Locations raided fall under the jurisdiction of Bemina, Saddar, Karan Nagar, and Kralkhud police stations in Srinagar, along with several places in Budgam district.

One of the houses searched was the residence of Farooq Ahmad Bhat, at Owaisabad Bemina. Officials confirmed that documents and materials suspected to be incriminating were recovered from the premises. In Karan Nagar, a house belonging to Shahid Khanyari, was also searched. Khanyari, a handicraft businessman by profession and owner of a Hotel in the area, was among those under investigation.

A team, executed the warrant in Karan Nagar. Local police, provided assistance during the search. Officials said the exercise was conducted lawfully and without disturbance to the public.

"The raids are part of our broader effort to uncover the full extent of the fraud. We are examining the seized documents and materials to establish their evidentiary value," a senior CBK official told KNT. The officer added that such cases often involve multiple actors working in coordination, which is why searches at different locations

were necessary.

Sources said the searches are still ongoing at several sites and more premises could come under scrutiny in the coming days. The operation has been described as one of the most extensive in recent months, with multiple police station jurisdictions in Srinagar and adjoining areas of Budgam covered simultaneously.

Locals in Bemina and Karan Nagar reported seeing teams of CBK personnel arriving in the morning hours and conducting thorough checks inside the targeted houses. Some locals described the presence of officers as unusual for a Saturday morning but said the operation was carried out peacefully and in an organized manner.

Crime Branch Kashmir has, over the years, handled a series of high-profile cases involving fraud, forgery, and financial irregularities. Officials said the agency has been under instructions to intensify its focus on white-collar crimes, which often cause serious economic harm and erode public trust in institutions.

He asked the Deputy Commissioner to furnish a report on the status of the air strip for which a proposal has already been approved by the Government of India. He said with the development of a full-fledged airstrip, the district would get round-theyear facility, especially during harsh winter

The Union Minister told the Deputy Commissioner to project requirement of funds under Central Road and Infrastructure Fund for Kishtwar so that allocation is made for the district by Ministry of Road Transport

Dr Jitendra Singh highlighted the importance of addressing public grievances, improving health and education infrastructure, and strengthening livelihood opportunities for the youth through skill development and entrepreneurship initiatives. He urged the district administration to conduct training programmes for upskilling of the local youth who can be engaged in the ongoing projects of the National Hydroelectric Power Corporation(NHPC) in the district.

The Minister also called for creating awareness about Sansad Khel Spardha youth. He said camps should be organised for on-the-spot enrolment of interested youth in the coming days. The Minister said the scheme offers sportspersons an opportunity to participate in competitions at the national

level. The Deputy Commissioner gave a presentation on the implementation of various schemes. He informed that 100 per cent targets have been met under PMAY(Gramin). ## **Kulgam Police Destroys Large-Scale** Wild Cannabis Growth in Joint Operation

## Increase stipend of medical, dental graduates of J&K

The medical and dental interns of Jammu & Kashmir are at the receiving end at present since they are getting peanuts in the name of monthly stipend. These professionals are receiving an amount of Rs. 12,130 per month as stipend while as their counterparts of the different parts of the country are receiving many times more as monthly stipend. This discrimination needs to be put to an end to the earliest so that there is no more exploitation.

As soon as the Omar Abdullah led government assumed charge in October last year the health and medical education minister Sakeena Masood Itoo promised that the issue would be looked into and corrective measures will be taken. The union territory government is all set to complete one year on October 16 and no headway whatsoever has been made on the issue of stipend for the medical and dental graduates of Jammu & Kashmir and they continue to receive peanuts during their internship.

The health and medical education minister should convene a meeting of all the stakeholders in this regard at the earliest so that there is some relief for the medical and dental professionals of the union territory. Once there is a hike in the monthly stipend of these professionals it is bound to cast a positive impact on their overall psyche. They would feel relieved and consider themselves at par with their counterparts of different states and union territories of the country.

Medicine is considered to be the most sacred profession across the globe and the medical professionals are treated as intelligent people. It takes a lot of hard-work for a boy or girl to pass the medical entrance examination and this is followed by burning of mid-night oil in completing the five year course. Once the course is completed and the professionals have to join an internship they need to be paid adequately. Paying them peanuts is an insult to the profession and a disservice to humanity.

It is imperative that the present government turns out to be proactive in this regard and as such they increase the stipend of medical professionals. Sooner it is done better it will be for all especially those who are working as interns in different medical colleges and associated hospitals of the union territory. Need of the hour is that swift action is taken and the stipend of the medical professionals of Jammu & Kashmir is brought at par with the interns of other places of the country.



# The Sangh and Women: A Journey from the Sevika Samiti to the Centenary

During a series of lectures held in September 2025, Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) Sarsanghchalak Mohan Bhagwat stated that women's participation in society and nation-building is more essential today than ever before. He clarified that women's power is not limited to the family, but should also have an equal role in social, political, and economic spheres. Bhagwat stated that "a nation is incomplete without mother power." He emphasized that women have always been given a revered and decisive place in Indian culture, and therefore, the active participation of women in the branches and activities of the Sangh Parivar will determine the future direction. The Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) is a significant organization in India's socio-political landscape. Founded by Dr. Keshav Baliram Hedgewar in 1925, the organization was primarily for male volunteers. Its branches, discipline, and ideol $ogy\,gradually\,exerted\,a\,profound\,influence$ on Indian politics and society. However, when we look at the role of women, the picture is somewhat different. The Rashtriya Sevika Samiti, born in 1936, parallel to the RSS, paved the way for women's participation. Today, as the Sangh celebrates its centenary, it is important to reflect on this journey: where women's participation began and where it has reached by 2025.

Early period: 1925 to 1936

The RSS was founded in Nagpur in 1925. The organization was based on discipline, parades, branches, and nationalism. However, its structure remained

male-dominated. Hedgewar himself believed that women needed a separate platform, as the social climate of the time did not allow women to directly join male-dominated branches. Against this backdrop, in 1936, Laxmibai Kelkar founded the "Rashtra Sevika Samiti" in Wardha on Vijayadashami. Hedgewar welcomed this initiative and suggested that women run their own organization so they could independently develop their power, culture, and leadership. Thus, women's participation formally began.

## Establishment of Sevika Samiti and

initial struggle In 1939, the Samiti organized its first training class. Gradually, its branches began to form in different provinces. The Samiti's aim was not only to spread nationalist ideas, but also to develop qualities such as "motherhood, action, and leadership" (matritva, kartritva, netrita) in women. This included physical training, yoga, song, sports, discipline, and social service. The Samiti's women also played an indirect role in the freedom movement. However, their activities were largely limited to cultural and social spheres.

1940s to 1970s: Towards expansion The Samiti's network expanded in the decades following independence. By the time of Laxmibai Kelkar's death (1978), the organization had spread to several states. Saraswati Apte succeeded her as chief coordinator. By this time, the number of branches had reached thousands. The Samiti focused on women's education, culture, and service projects. During the Emergency (1975–77), women associated with the Samiti also participated in protests. This period made them more

### politically conscious and active. 1980-2000: A Confluence of Modernity and Tradition

In the 1990s, as the BJP and the Sangh Parivar's influence in Indian politics grew, women's participation also came into focus. The Samiti attempted to reach out

to urban and professional women during this time. Female teachers, doctors, and working women began joining the Samiti's programs. In 1994, Ushatai Chate and in 2006, Pramilatai Medhe emerged as prominent leaders. These leaders connected the women's wing to contemporary issues—such as the challenges faced by working women, education, health, and family balance.

## 2012 onwards: Shanthakka's

In 2012, Venkatrama Shanta Kumari, oopularly known as "Shanthakka," became the chief coordinator of the Rashtriya Sevika Samiti. Born in 1952, she had long been active in the work of the Sangh Parivar. Under her leadership, the Samiti expanded rapidly. Today, the Samiti has four to five thousand branches, spread across more than 800 districts. Although the organization does not release exact figures, it is estimated that millions of women are directly or indirectly associated with the Samiti. The Samiti runs education, health, service, hostel, and women's empowerment projects. Its branches are also becoming active in urban metropolitan areas.

## The Confederacy and the woman

Women are not granted formal membership or leadership positions within the Sangh. RSS branches are exclusively for men. Women become part of the Sangh's ideological world only through committees. Critics say this system excludes women from the mainstream, preventing them from reaching decisionmaking positions on par with men. However, supporters argue that having a separate organization allows women to develop independent leadership and activities. RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat has repeatedly stated that women's participation is increasing "naturally." However, inequality remains evident in the leadership structure.

Current status (2025)

The Sangh is celebrating its centenary. Approximately 83,000 branches are reportedly active across the country. The Rashtriya Sevika Samiti's branches are also steadily growing. The Samiti now operates in villages as well as metropolitan cities. Its training classes are attended by everyone from schoolgirls to professional women. In 2025, the Samiti's vision is a blend of tradition and modernity-on the one hand, it emphasizes motherhood and family-based values, while on the other, it also offers opportunities for social service and women's leadership. The Samiti organized millions of women, instilling selfconfidence and collectivism. Education, service, and cultural programs have had a tangible impact on society, providing women with opportunities for leadership and management. Women remained excluded from decision-making roles in the mainstream RSS. The organization's ideological framework confines women to traditional roles. The Samiti's perspective conflicts with modern feminist discourse, emphasizing motherhood and culture rather than freedom and equality.

During a lecture series held in September 2025, Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) Sarsanghchalak Mohan Bhagwat stated that women's participation in society and nation-building is more essential today than ever before. The lecture series also stated that India in 2025 is at a point where women's leadership is playing a "decisive" role, not just a "complementary" one. Speakers also added that as women advance in modern education, technology, and economic self-reliance, the Sangh Parivar must also expand its structure and working methods.

# Ladakh: Land Of High Passes



Ladakh, the name comes from "La Dvags" which means the Land of the High Passes. Most of us are well aware of the fact that it's a Trans Himalayan Desert. But there are other finer parts of the geography which make it more interesting and unique. It has got the majestic mountains, the rivers, Pristine lakes, lots of snow but very little greenery and vegetation. Ladakh should be viewed in terms of its imposing mountain ranges, high altitude passes, glaciers, rivers, crystal clear but saline lakes, sand dunes, hot springs, valleys and ancient monasteries perched on cliffs. It is a photographers delight and a paradise for the motor bikers. And stargazers.

Ladakh is one of the loftiest inhabited regions of the world, (9000 to over 25,000 ft above sea level). Its short but warm summers enable very limited grain and fruit crops to ripen. Owing to the great aridity of the atmosphere, the climate is one of fierce extremes, from burning heat of some of the deserts to several degrees below freezing-point at night. The climate is harsh, with long winters and short summers, but the warmth of its people and the vibrancy of its traditions more than compensate. The bare mountains also exhibit the exquisite desert coloration of the rocks due to the peculiar solar weathering.

Ladakh, often called the "Land of High Passes," is a breathtaking region nestled in the northernmost part of India. Its beauty is stark, spiritual, and aweinspiring, marked by contrasts that are both dramatic and serene.

3. Plan Wisely & Acclimatize. A Ladakh itinerary isn't just about covering spots — it's about allowing your body to adjust. Give yourself 24-48 hours in Leh before heading to higher altitudes. This simple step can save your entire trip.

4. Ladakh weather is dry. Keep yourself hydrat-

### Historical aspects of Ladakh:

The initial inhabitants of Ladakh are said to the Changpas nomadic tribes from the Tibattan Plateau. These were followed by the Aryans and the Dards (from Gilgit) as Ladakh became a gateway to the

Around the 1st century AD Ladakh was part of the Kushan empire. Budhism was established in the 2nd century. Budhism found its way to Ladakh via Tibet through Guru Padma Sambhav who is said to have been invited from Kashmir to Tibet by the then ruler. He established Budhism in Tibet and from there to Ladakh.

In the 7th Century there was a clash between Ladakh & Tibet and in 635 AD, Tibetan commissioner was appointed. In 677 AD there was a rebellion against the Tibetan rule.

In 737AD, Tibet launched an attack against king Bru-Za of Gilgit with the help of Chinese.

In 842 AD, the Tibet monarchy collapse and suzerainty over Ladakh vanished. There was a large migration from Tibet into Ladakh. Nyima-Goh of the ancient Tibet royalty house established the first Ladakh Dynasty.

13th – 16th: century, several Muslim invasions and raids took place and Ladakh was broken into Lower & upper Ladakh. Islam arrived in the 15th century through traders, mystics and warriors from Kashmir, central Asia and Baltistan. Basgo king overthrew the king of Leh and reunited Ladakh and established the Namgyal Dynasty with Jamyang Namgyal as the king. Concerted efforts were made to convert Ladakh into Islam and destruction of Budhist Artefacts was carried out. It was the decision of king Jamyang Namgyal that steered Ladakh towards being a cradle of diverse cultures. He entered into an alliance with Gyal Khatun the daughter of the Balti king Amir Mir. Their son, Sengge Namgyal, half Budhist and half Muslim ascended the throne in 1616 AD and became the most famous king of Ladakh.

1616-1642 AD; Sengge Namgyal known as the 'Lion King' made efforts to restore Ladakh to its old glory by reclaiming lost land and rebuilding several gompas/ monasteries and shrines. The most famous being the Hemis Monastery. He moved the royal headquarter from the Shay Palace to the Leh palace. He also expanded the kingdom into the Zanskar and Spiti. He tried to expand his empire beyond but was defeated by the Mughals who had already occupied Kashmir and Baltistan.

1642-1694: Deldan Namgyal the son of Sengge Namgyal picked a quarrel with his ally, Tibet prompting the 5th Dalai lama to invade Ladakh. Deldan sought help from Kashmir which was granted under the condition that the king convert to Islam and had to placate Mughal emperor Aurangzeb by building a mosque in Leh.

Early 19th century: Mughal Empire collapsed, Punjab and Kashmir came under the Sikh Rule.

1834: Gen. Zorawar Singh (Military general of the Dogra king Maharaja Gulab Singh) invaded Ladakh, king Tshespal Namgyal was dethroned and exiled to Stok.

1834-1839: Gen. Zorawar Singhled 3 expeditions to Ladakh putting an end to all possible rebellions

1846: Ladakh was brought under the Dogra rule and became part of the Jammu & Kashmir.


1947-48: Partition and the Pakistani raid. Pakistanis occupied Zanskar and Leh but was later evicted by the Indian army.

1949: China closed the border between Nubra and Sinkiang blocking the 1000-year-old route to 1950: China invaded Tibet. Dalai Lama and

## Sleepless nights may raise risk of heart disease: Study

People with poor sleep for just three nights may be at an increased risk of developing heart diseases, according to a

With chronic lack of sleep growing as a public health concern, researchers from Uppsala University in Sweden found that disturbed sleep may raise inflammation, increasing the risk of heart disease.

"Many of the larger studies that have been done on the link between sleep deprivation and the risk of cardiovascu-



lar diseases have generally focused on slightly older individuals who already have an increased risk of such diseases. That is why it was interesting that the levels of these proteins increased in the same way in younger and previously perfectly healthy individuals after only a few nights of sleep deprivation. This means that it's important to emphasise the importance of sleep for cardiovascular health even early in life," said Jonathan Cedernaes, a physician at Uppsa-

The team analysed 16 healthy young men of normal weight -- all with healthy sleep habits.

The participants spent time in a sleep laboratory where their meals and activity levels were strictly controlled in

In one session, participants got a normal amount of sleep for three consecutive nights, while during the other session, they got only about four hours of sleep each night. During both sessions, morning and evening blood samples were taken, and following high-intensity exercise lasting 30

The researchers measured the levels of around 90 proteins in the blood and were able to see that the levels of many of these that are associated with increased inflammation rose when the participants were sleep-deprived.

Many of these proteins have already been linked to an increased risk of cardiovascular disease such as heart failure and coronary artery disease, said the researchers, in the study published in the journal Biomarker Research.

Further, the team found that physical exercise generated a slightly different response after a lack of sleep.

However, the number of key proteins increased equally, whether the person was sleep-deprived or not. Thus, proteins that can be linked to the positive effects of exercise increased, even if the person had too little sleep.

The researchers have previously shown that exercise in the presence of sleep deprivation can result in a slightly increased load on the heart's muscle cells.

Cedernaes said that "further research is needed to investigate how these effects might differ in women, older individuals, patients with heart disease, or those with different sleep patterns".



# Delhi Court Grants Bail To BMW Case Accused, **Questions Prosecution's Homicide Theory**

NEW DELHI, SEP 27: A Delhi court granted bail to Gagampreet Makkad, the main accused in the BMW accident case, noting the CCTV footage of the incident contradicted the prosecution's claim of a deliberate high-speed ramming, showing instead an accidental loss of control and flip of the vehicle.

NavjotSingh(50), an employee of the Ministry of Finance, was killed in the accident while his wife was severely injured.

The court also found that the "highly unprofessional" conduct of ambulance paramedics, who

left the scene without helping the victims, broke the causal chain linking the accused's actions directly to the death.

Furthermore, the judge noted the prosecution failed to provide evidence, like a postmortem report, to prove the victim could have survived with different medical care, thereby weakening the serious charge of culpable homicide not amounting to murder.

Additional Sessions Judge Ankit Garg ordered her release on a personal bond of Rs 1 lakh with two sureties, ruling that the prosecution's case for the severe charge of "culpable

homicide not amounting to murder" was on a "fragile foundation" at this stage. The decision hinged significantly on the court's analysis of CCTV footage, which presented a sequence of events starkly different from the initial police report.

The court found that the CCTV footage critically weakened the prosecution's narrative. Instead of a high-speed ramming from behind as alleged, the video showed the BMW losing control, hitting a divider, flipping over, and then tragically coming into contact with the motorcycle. This, the court noted, pointed more

crew that arrived instantly but left within 40 seconds without rendering any aid to the unconscious victims. The judge stated that this lapse by the paramedics, the first responders, "materially erodes the prosecution's claim that the golden-hour loss is attributable solely, or even primarily, to the accused."

While granting bail, the court imposed a set of stringent conditions to ensure the integrity of the ongoing investigation. "Gagampreet Makkad is prohibited from tampering with evidence or contacting any staff from Nulife Hospital or the

ambulance service involved in

the case. She must surrender her passport, regularly report to the police, and appear for all court hearings."

The court acknowledged the gravity of the incident, the death of Navjot Singh, but emphasised that bail is the norm and jail the exception, especially given the accused's clean record, roots in the community, and the current lack of compelling evidence requiring her continued custody. The prosecution retains the right to seek cancellation of bail if any of these conditions are violated.

## Cabinet approves 10,023 new medical seats within next five years

**NEW DELHI, SEP 27:** The union Cabinet has approved addition of 10,023 new medical seats with an investment of Rs. 15,034 crore as part of the goal to create 75,000 medical seats within the next five years. These include 5,000 post-graduate and 5,023 undergraduate seats in existing government colleges and hospitals by 2028-29, an official spokesman

At a meeting here chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi it was also decided to double the number of medical colleges to 808 in 2025-26 from 387 in 2013-14, with undergraduate seats up 141 percent and postgraduate seats up 144 percent.

New 2025 regulations allow experienced government specialists to become professors without mandatory residency requirements. Initiative specifically targets underserved communities while positioning India as a global hub for affordable

"This will improve our healthcare system and enhance medical education infrastructure. It will ensure that every part of India has availability of skilled doctors," the Prime Minister Narendra said in a post on X on September 24.

The country has significantly expanded its medical infrastructure over the past decade, yet the demand continues to outpace supply.

The total investment is Rs. 15,034 crore covering the period from 2025-26 to 2028-29. Of this, 68.5 percent amounting to Rs. 10,303.20 crore will be funded by the union government while the remaining Rs. 4,731.30 crore will be contributed by the

states. The investment per seat is Rs. 1.5 crore. Prime Minister Modi envisions 75,000 additional medical seats in the next five years, and this new approval made on September 24, 2025, is a step towards that goal, the spokesman added.

India has the highest number of medical colleges (808) and has been expanding its medical educational infrastructure for years.

There are 1,23,700 MBBS (Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery) seats today. In the last decade, 69,352 seats were added, a growth of 127 percent. During this period 43,041 post-graduate seats were added, a growth of 143 percent. A total of 22 new All India Institutes of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) were approved under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana, which aims to make affordable and reliable tertiary healthcare accessible to all people and regions and improve the quality of medical education in the country, the spokesman added. UNI

## CISF overhauls training to transform into battle-hardened & future-ready force

NEW DELHI, SEP 27: The Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) has unveiled major upgrades to its training modules and standards to transform into a battle-hardy, tech-savvy, and future-ready force.

The reforms were finalized during the Annual Training Conference 2025, held at the National Industrial Security Academy (NISA), Hyderabad, chaired by CISF Director General Rajwinder Singh Bhatti.

The two-day conference brought together senior officers from across the country and set out a bold roadmap to raise the security force's operational preparedness to the highest levels.

One of the prominent reforms announced is the adoption of a "One Force, One Outdoor Standard" policy across all ranks.

This means that all CISF personnel, including officers, from their basic training, will now be

trained to meet the same rigorous physical and battle benchmarks followed by elite forces like the National Security Guard (NSG).

Similarly, Battle Obstacle Assault Courses (BoAC), with all 26 obstacles having the same difficulty level and timing standards as followed by NSG, have been implemented in the CISF.

To further boost physical fitness, the force has introduced half marathons across all basic courses.

The training curriculum will now also include modules from counter-terrorist experts drawn from the special forces, who will impart practical skills in field operations and battle craft.

These measures are aimed at instilling toughness, tactical acumen, and confidence in every CISF recruit, preparing them to handle high-stress security scenarios effectively.

Based on the various security solutions implemented by CISF in its security protocol, the force is developing integrated training modules to incorporate 20 cutting-edge technologies, used for screening, monitoring, and detec-

tion, into its training programs. Recruits will gain direct exposure to drones, counter-drone systems, cybersecurity tools, artificial intelligence applications, and Integrated Command & Control Centres.

For the first time, trainees will get hands-on exposure to these technologies from day one of their academy training.

Digital Integrated Command and Control Centers will be established at all training centers to consolidate the above modules and provide trainees with handson experience in operating and handling these advanced technologies.

All personnel will be trained to act as first responders in cases of fire, disaster, and medical con-

They will undergo certification courses in fire safety, disaster management, and medical first response from reputed institutions.

The force will build a pool of 2,000 empanelled instructors, with 10 percent of training seats reserved for women personnel.

To meet the manpower demand of a steadily expanding force, CISF is also increasing its training capacity.

With the approval of the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), the intake capacity of all Recruit Training Centres (RTCs) has been increased by 50 percent, raising it to 1,500.

Approval has also been granted for the establishment of three new RTCs, which will be completed on priority.

DG Bhatti said that these reforms will make CISF battleready in the field, tech-driven in operations, and a multi-skilled, future-ready force. UNI

## US reveals 21-point proposal for ending Israel-Hamas war in Gaza, calls for demilitarisation, future Palestinian state

**NEW YORK, SEP 27:** The US has revealed its proposal for ending the Israel-Hamas war in Gaza, which quaintly enough sees Washington explicitly encouraging Palestinians to remain in the war-ravaged Strip, outlining a potential pathway for the establishment of a potential future Palestinian state, according to a copy obtained by The Times of Israel. The 21-point document shared by the US with a handful of Arab and Muslim countries earlier this week on the UN General Assembly sidelines combines longstanding Israeli demands with new concessions to Palestinians. The plan calls for the release of all hostages, the removal of Hamas from power, demilitarisation of Gaza, and deradicalisation of the enclave. Simultaneously, it also envisions post-war reconstruction, reform of the Palestinian Authority,

for peaceful coexistence.

The exact sequencing for these steps isn't specified, but it appears that they are intended to come into effect in parallel with the ending of the war.

The plan marks a major shift for Washington, given that back in February, Trump had given the bizarre proposal of a US military takeover of the Strip to aid in the relocation of its two million population to another area

His statement had emboldened the far-right figures in Prime Minister Ben $jamin\,Netanyahu's\,coalition\,who\,have$ openly supported "voluntary migration." By contrast, the new proposal envisions a potential pathway to a future Palestinian state, after Gaza's redevelopment has advanced and the Palestinian Authority's reform has been completed, also appears to be a major departure from the Trump administration's policy to date, given that it has

and the creation of a "political horizon" avoided expressing backing for a twostate solution. The plan-largely crafted by US special envoy Steve Witkoff—and poised to be fine-tuned in the coming days - reportedly would even see the US establishing a dialogue with Israel and the Palestinians to agree on a "political horizon" for "peaceful coexistence." However, its provisions also support Jerusalem's key demands for ending its war, with many calling its adoption dubious, owing to Hamas' likely rejection, particularly as the terror group has refused any calls for disarming. The Israeli premier has been fiercely against any establishment of a Palestinian state, and echoed his animosity to such a suggestion during the UNGA session on Friday, where he stated "Giving the Palestinians a state one mile from Jerusalem after October 7th is like giving Al-Qaeda a state one mile from New York City after September 11th. (UNI)

## Natural gas found on East Coast of **Andaman** islands

NEW DELHI, SEP 27: India has announced "an ocean of energy opportunities" in the Andaman Sea with the occurrence of natural gas on the east coast of Andaman islands at a depth of 295 meters.

Petroleum Minister Hardeep Puri said this occurrence of natural gas will help India in taking forward exploration ambitions in coordination with global deepwater exploration experts and will be a significant milestone in our journey through Amrit Kaal.

"Very happy to report the occurrence of natural gas in Sri Vijayapuram 2 well at a distance of 9.20 NM (17 km) from the shoreline on the east coast of the Andaman Islands at a water depth of 295 meters and target depth of 2650 meters," the Minister said on X.

Initial production testing of the well in the range of 2212 – 2250 meters has established the presence of natural gas with intermittent flaring. The gas samples were brought by ship to Kakinada, were

tested and found to be 87 percent methane. The size of the gas pool and commercial viabil-



ity of the discovery will get verified in the coming months but establishing the presence of hydrocarbons in the Andaman basin is a major step in con $firming \, India's \, long \, held \, belief \, that \, Andaman \, bas in$ is rich in natural gas, in line with discoveries in the entire area from Myanmar in North to Indonesia in the south in this belt.

Under the deepwater mission announced by Prime Minister narendra Modi on Independence Day, large number of deepwater exploration wells are planned in our offshore basins in order to find new discoveries and fully exploit our hydrocarbon

'This occurrence of natural gas will help us in taking forward our exploration ambitions in coordination with global deepwater exploration experts and will be a significant milestone in our journey through Amrit Kaal," he said. UNI

## UAE FM presses for Gaza ceasefire, affirms total rejection of West Bank annexation in meeting with Israeli PM

ABU DHABI/JERUSALEM, SEP 27: UAE Foreign Minister Abdullah bin Zayed met with Israeli PM Benjamin Netanyahu on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly, and stressed on the need for an urgent ceasefire in Gaza and firmly rejected Jerusalem's potential annexation of Palestinian territories.

According to statements by the UAE Foreign Ministry, the top Emirati official also warned that the UAE's normalisation agreement with Israel could be harmed, if Tel Aviv moved ahead with the initiative, as per Times of Israel.

According to the UAE Foreign Ministry, the meeting, also attended by Ambassador to Israel Mohammed Mahmoud Al-Khaja and special envoy Lana Nusseibeh, focused heavily on the humanitarian toll

"The foreign minister stressed the urgent need to end the war in Gaza, reach a permanent and sustainable ceasefire, prevent further loss of life, and put an end to the tragic conditions facing civilians," the ministry said in a statement on X.

He also reaffirmed Abu Dhabi's support for efforts to achieve a 'comprehensive peace based on the two-state solution" and endorsed international initiatives for the release of hostages.

Abdullah bin Zayed's meeting with Netanyahu marked Israel's first public encounter with a senior Gulf official since Israel's failed and globally condemned Sept 9 strike against the Hamas leaders in Qatar.

The UAE – which was party to the global condemnation – had summoned Israel's deputy



ambassador in protest.

Jerusalem has not offered any comments on the meeting as of now, though the situation is a domestic politics hotpot, as the premier's right-wing flank has strongly demanded the annexation of parts of the West Bank in response to the global spree of Palestinian statehood recognition by various countries this week, such as the UK, France, Canada, Australia, Canada.

# Suryakumar Told To Refrain From Making Political Comments

Suryakumar Yadav, India's T20I captain, has been told to refrain from making comments that could be construed as political following an ICC hearing conducted by match referee Richie Richardson on Thursday in Dubai. It's not yet clear if Suryakumar faces any other sanctions.

An official hearing was necessary because the Pakistan team management had filed a complaint alleging that Suryakumar made political remarks following India's Asia Cup group-stage win over Pakistan on September 14, which the PCB's top brass had pointed out at a press conference in Lahore last week.

ESPNcricinfo understands Suryakumar's use of the term "Operation Sindoor" - a term coined by the Indian government during the military skirmish between the two countries that followed the Pahalgam terror attacks in April - was one of the PCB's points of objection. Suryakumar had used the term at the postmatch press conference following that September 14 match, while dedicating the win to the victims of the terror attacks as well as India's armed forces.

That match also caused another controversy, with Pakistan lodging a "formal protest" against match referee Andy Pycroft because he had "requested the captains not to shake hands during the toss". At the time, the PCB had demanded Pycroft to be taken off the roster for their matches, which the ICC rejected.

That incident threatened to snow-ball into something bigger when Pakistan didn't arrive on time for their match against UAE. They eventually relented after Pycroft apologised for the "miscommunication" over the handshake incident.

Meanwhile, India's complaint to the ICC over gestures made by Sahibzada Farhan and Haris Rauf during their Super Fours clash will be heard on Friday since Pakistan were involved in a match on Thursday evening against Bangladesh.

The gestures were made on the field during a tense game where the two sets of players exchanged words multiple times.

At a press conference ahead of Pakistan's match against Sri Lanka on Tuesday, Farhan had been asked about hismachine-guncelebration after reaching his half-century against India. "That celebration was just a moment at that time," he had said. "I do not do a lot of celebrations after scoring fifty. But, it suddenly came to my mind that let's do a celebration today. I did that. I don't know how people will take it. I don't care about that."
