

Northern Railway To Resume 8 Long-Distance Trains From Jammu Starting October 2

IAMMU, SEP 29: The Northern Railway on Monday ordered the resumption of eight longdistance trains from Jammu station starting October 2, after ensuring the safety and continuity of tracks damaged by heavy rains and floods in August this year.

Heavy rainfall in the Jammu-Pathankot and Jammu–Katra sections had severely affected rail services in the division, with tracks and bridges bearing the brunt of the floods. More than 50 trains were suspended, leaving hundreds of passengers stranded at the Jammu railway station in late August.

women reservation in LAHDCs and protection to local languages. The process of recruitment for 1800 posts in government has already commenced in UT of Ladakh," it said, adding, "We are confident that continuous dialogue would yield the desired results in near future."

Earlier in the day, the LAB announced its decision to withdraw from the talks with the Centre, scheduled for October 6 in New Delhi. The LAB demanded a judicial inquiry into last week's violence and the withdrawal of cases against those arrested.

Pertinently, on September 24, there was violence during the protests over statehood demands during the hunger strike led by the environmental activist Sonam Wangchuk. The protesters had gone on rampage, attacking offices and burning down the BJP office. The security personnel had opened fire, which left four people dead and more than 50 injured. Restrictions were imposed in the town after the violence and since

then the relaxation is being given in phases and situation has remained calm.

On Friday, Wangchuk was arrested under the stringent National Security Act, accused of inciting the mob. He has been shifted to a jail in Rajasthan's Jodhpur. A Pakistan angle has emerged in the probe against him, with the DGP Ladakh pointing to his visit to Pakistan and the arrest of a Pakistani Intelligence Operative.

"We also arrested a Pakistan PIO in the recent past who was in touch with him and was reporting back across. We have a record of this. He (Wangchuk) had attended a Dawn event in Pakistan. He also visited Bangladesh. There is a big question mark on him," Ladakh Police Chief SD Singh Jamwal had said.

LG Kavinder Gupta chairs law & order review meeting

Meanwhile, Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, Kavinder Gupta, chaired a highlevel review meeting on the prevailing law and order situation in the Union Territory on Monday.

The officers briefed the Lt Governor on the latest developments, preparedness measures, and coordination among agencies to maintain peace and order in the Union Territory.

The Lieutenant Governor took a detailed assessment of the ground situation in view of the recent developments and the relaxation of restrictions in certain areas. He expressed appreciation for the responsible conduct of the people, who have largely cooperated with the administration in maintaining calm and discipline during the sensitive period. "The people of Ladakh have shown remarkable maturity, restraint, and commitment to peace even in challenging circumstances. Their patience and cooperation reflect the true spirit of harmony that defines our region," the LG said.

While acknowledging the role of security forces, police, and local administration for their coordinated efforts in ensuring normalcy, LG Gupta urged officials to remain vigilant, responsive, and people-friendly in their approach. He emphasised that law and order must be enforced firmly yet sensitively, keeping in mind the welfare and sentiments of the local population.

The Lieutenant Governor also issued clear directions for enhanced intelligence gathering, regular community engagement, and swift redressal of public grievances to strengthen trust between the administration and the citizens. Railway officials said that eight trains will now be restored in the fourth phase of resumption of services. The decision was taken after periodic reviews of various sections by Divisional Railway Manager, Jammu, Vivek Kumar and other officials.

Senior Divisional Commercial Manager Uchit Singhal said the trains are being reinstated only after ensuring track safety and continuity. "Train operations in the division are gradually being normalised as technical work on tracks and bridges is completed," he said, advising passengers to check schedules on the Northern Railway website or helpline numbers

According to officials, the Jammu Tawi-Kanpur train will run from October 2, followed by the Jammu Tawi-Barauni and Jammu Tawi-Guwahati trains from October 3. The Jammu Tawi-Gorakhpur service will resume from October 4, and the Jammu Tawi-Yoga Nagari Rishikesh train will operate from October 5. The Jammu Tawi-Bhagalpur train will be restored from October 7.

In addition, the Jammu-Sealdah and another Jammu-Guwahati train are scheduled to become operational from October 8, officials added.

Earlier, the railways restored train services in phases, including local services on Katra-Jammu, Katra-Budgam, Katra-Banihal, and Katra-Sangaldan destinations besides Jammu and other outside destinations, including running of freight trains in September. (Agencies)


Combined efforts key o sustaining fight against TB: DC Anantnag

Kashmir's Carpet Legacy Strengthened as IICT Starts Silk Weaving Training in Pulwama

PULWAMA, SEP 29: In a significant initiative to strengthen the traditional carpet industry of Kashmir, the Indian Institute of Carpet Technology (IICT), Srinagar has launched a two-month Short Term Skill Upgradation Programme in Silk Carpet Weaving at Wakherwan, Pulwama.

The programme is being implemented under the Guru Shishya Hastshilp Prashikshan Programme (GSHPP) of the National Handicrafts Development Programme (NHDP), sanctioned by the Office of the Development Commissioner (Handicrafts), Union Ministry of Textiles.

In a press statement issued today, Director IICT, Zubair Ahmad, stated that the programme has been initiated to build a skilled

workforce in South Kashmirwhere the presence of carpet weavers is comparatively limited. "The initiative seeks to revive and

sustain the region's age-old weaving traditions. A distinctive feature of this programme is the engagement of a Shilp Guru Awardee in Carpet Craft, who is imparting training directly to the participants, ensuring the transfer of rare, high-level weaving expertise to the next generation," he explained. At present, 30 registered carpet artisans, predominantly women, selected by a designated committee are undergoing training at the newly-established Advanced Carpet Training Centre in Wakherwan. "The centre is fully equipped with modern steel carpet looms and allied accessories to provide a professional learning environment," Director IICT added.

To encourage focused participation, each trainee is being provided with a stipend of ₹15,000 (₹7,500 per month) through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT). In addition, biometric attendance systems and loom-wise productivity targets have been put in place for effective monitoring and evaluation.

Building on this momentum, The Director stated that IICT has also announced the establishment of another Advanced Carpet Training Centre at Kupwara, where a similar Skill Upgradation Programme will commence from October 27, next month. "These measures will not only contribute towards the revival and preservation of Kashmir's centuries-old carpet heritage but also create sustainable livelihood opportunities, particularly for women artisans," he added.

The disposal exercise took place at IGC Lassipora, Pulwama, and involved narcotics seized in connection with 49 FIRs registered under the NDPS Act in Srinagar. It was conducted in the presence of the members of Drug Disposal Committee, as per the provisions laid down in NDPS Act.

In total, approximately 1140 kilograms of seized narcotic substances were destroyed, including:

144.47 kgs of Poppy Straw 45.63 kgs of Ganja

5.01 kgs of Charas

0.93 kgs of Heroin

9,247 bottles of Codeine Phosphate 6,664 tablets of psychotropic substances.

This translates to a combined weight of around 196 kilograms of banned drugs, forming part of the total 1140 kgs of seized materials disposed off.

This initiative underscores the unwavering commitment of Jammu & Kashmir Police in eradicating

drug abuse and dismantling the networks behind it. Srinagar Police remains steadfast in its commitment to making the district drug-free and continues to take strong action against those involved in drug

HANDWARA, SEP 29: Tension gripped Wahipora village of Langate in north Kashmir's Kupwara district after a 32-year-old woman, five months pregnant, was found dead on Sunday evening under suspicious circumstances. The family of the deceased has alleged that she was strangled to death by her husband. The woman has been identified as Jasmeena Begum, wife of Ghulam Hassan Nadroo. Emotional scenes unfolded when her body reached her native village, with relatives and locals breaking down in grief. Her family alleged that her husband attempted to portray the incident as suicide, but visible marks on her neck suggested otherwise. Jasmeena's elder sister claimed she had spoken to her minutes before the incident and that the victim had complained of harassment by her husband. She



was later shifted to Sopore Hospital, where doctors declared her dead on arrival. The body was then moved to GMC Handwara, where it remained in the mortuary overnight. Family members said her death has devastated them, leaving behind a three-yearold daughter and the unborn baby she was carrying. Her brother recalled that the couple had been living separately from the joint family, with relatives even helping them build their own house in Baagislam Colony, Unisoo. The incident triggered peaceful protests, with locals blocking the Kupwara–Sopore road for some time, demanding stern punishment for the accused. "The killing of a pregnant woman is inhuman and should be dealt with under the harshest provisions of law," protesters said. Police confirmed the accused husband has been detained for questioning under Section 194 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNSS). A senior officer told HEAD-LINES TODAY that all legal formalities were completed and the body was handed over to the family after post-mortem. He added that the report would confirm the exact cause of death. Assuring justice, police said strict action will be taken against those found guilty. Meanwhile, the bereaved family has vowed to continue their fight for justice, describing Jasmeena's death as a shocking crime that has shaken the entire locality.

Implement ITMS in totality in Srinagar, other parts of Kashmir

The Intelligent Traffic Management System (ITMS) is one of the important components of the traffic management system in the cities especially in those which have been designated as smart cities in the country. This type of traffic management system provides an insight to the motorists as well as those who have to cross the roads in cities located across the country. People as a whole have welcomed ITMS and hailed the same as a revolutionary step in the traffic management system.

Like the other cities of the country Srinagar too was entitled to have this type of traffic management system. Since the summer capital of the union territory of Jammu & Kashmir is one of the smart cities of the country, people of the city should have all the up to date facilities. Some months back the people at helm had claimed that ITMS would be installed in the Srinagar city and people would feel relieved while driving their vehicles and moving around.

Some of the steps might have been taken by the traffic police department in this regard but a lot more needs to be done. As part of ITMS, cameras have been installed at some of the traffic lights across the city so as to catch the people found violating the traffic rules and regulations. These cameras need to be installed at all the traffic lights not only in Srinagar, but at the other district headquarters as well as towns of Kashmir and Jammu divisions of the union territory.

A significant and important feature of ITMS is the timers installed at the top of a traffic light. In this regard the Srinagar city is lagging behind and there are one or two traffic lights that have the timers installed at their top. The other traffic lights don't have this facility and as such both the motorists as well as pedestrians experience difficulties. Once the timer is working at the traffic lights it gives an idea to the motorist as well as a pedestrian as when to start and when to stop.

Yet another interesting step related to this concept is that it depends upon the wish of the traffic police personnel to keep the timer system on or not. One fails to understand the thinking of the traffic police personnel in not making the timer system a regular feature at the traffic lights. There is no need to tinker with the timer system and the same needs to be understood by the traffic police personnel posted at the traffic lights.

The Legendary Personality; Remembering Molvi Ifthikar Hussain Ansari

There is a distinction to be made between a mere politician and a figure who fundamentally alters the political grammar of a region. Molvi Iftikhar Hussain Ansari was undeniably the latter. His journey into public life was not an opportunistic grab for power but an assertive, almost intellectual, response to a vacuum. Inspired by the call for self-reflection and empowerment by Ayatollah Khomeini, he took action at a time when a particular voice in Kashmir was beingquietly suppressed.


I remember the anecdotes passed down, the subtle ways the identity of a community could be suppressed. I have heard from my elders how people would routinely refer to Zadibal as 'Hawal' and Hassanabad as 'Rainawari' or Bagwanpora as 'Lal Bazar', a linguistic camouflage borne of political prudence, if not outright necessity. Molvi Sahab's decision to step into the political arena in 1978 was not just about contesting an election but a political declaration, all so he could give his people a separate identity. It gave a distinct population a public face and a space in the mainstream narrative, an identity they could finally assert without apology.

His defining political characteristic was a pragmatic, unyielding Indian nationalism. He was a staunch Indian, a fact he never compromised, even when it placed him in the crosshairs of extremism. He understood that the best way to secure the rights of his community was through engagement with the democratic structure of the country, maintaining necessary and often intense relationships with leaders across the spectrum, from the Gandhis to Abdullahs and Mufti Mohammad Sayeed, Gani Lone, Muzaffar Beig or even Mirwaiz Molvi Farooq for that matter. He did not just passively exist in mainstream politics but was one of its crucial, nonnegotiable pillars

negotiable pillars.

But the real measure of his stature lies outside the assembly halls. His genius lay in his institution-building, recognizing that political power is fleeting, but educational infrastructure is permanent. The massive expansion of Imambargahs, the establishment of the Jamia Imam Jafar Sadiq (a), and especially the founding of Hauz-e-Zanabia for higher Islamic learning for women was a truly progressive endeavor, which house and mould 18,000 students today.

The power of his personal charisma was immense, built on consistency and self-respect. His Sham-e-Ghariban majalis became a cultural touchstone, reaching across religious divides. His message resonated because it was authentic, transcending



sectarianism. This authenticity was reinforced by his financial independence. Choosing not to rely on traditional donations, he built a robust business empire. This was a critical choice. His success as a businessman, a major Maruti dealer and an importer allowed him to serve as a benefactor without being beholden to any political or religious lobby. This self-reliance empowered him to channel aid, education, and support to thousands of people indiscriminately, demonstrating leadership that was genuinely free of obligation The role of Molvi Sahab in Kashmir was defined by both his religious authority and his community connections. He maintained links with leading Mujtahids in Iran, Iraq, and Syria. Within the Valley, he worked closely with prominent figures such as Aga Syed Yousuf, Aga Mehdi, and Aga Syed Baqir. He also took responsibility for the sacred relic of Imam Hussain (A.S.), tracing its path to Kashmir and placing it at Imambargah Zadibal. His influence extended across Srinagar, Budgam, Bandipora, Baramulla, Pulwama, and reached Rajouri, Poonch, Uri, and Jammu, and his leadership was marked by quiet authority, built on trust, scholarship, and a lasting connection with people across regions.

The anecdotes of his influence underscore the moral authority he wielded. I often recall the story of a teacher from Karnah. When facing an unfair transfer order that jeopardized her ability to care

for her infants, her simple threat to take the matter to "Molvi Sahab" was enough to overturn the bureaucratic decision. The senior officer understood that challenging the name of Ansari was challenging a force greater than his own authority. This kind of influence is not earned through patronage but built on decades of principled action.

His enduring courage, surviving multiple assassination attempts while refusing overtures from Pakistan rooted in his uncompromising Indian identity elevates his story beyond mere political biography. His faith gave him an almost philosophical fortitude, as he declared, "I will not die because of an attack. I will die only when Allah calls me." This profound acceptance of destiny, coupled with his absolute agency in life, reminds me of the stoic resolve celebrated in classical thought: "The best revenge is not to be like your enemy," a principle he embodied by refusing to let violence or external pressure define his purpose or alter his fundamental loyalty. Indeed, as the great philosopher Plato noted, "The measure of a man is what he does with power." Molvi Sahab used his power, both political and moral not for self-aggrandizement, but for service and upliftment, especially for his

As they say, the one who comes into the world has to leave. But there are funerals that speak. Funerals that testify that the deceased has lived a life of depth and purpose. A life that touched others in ways words cannot fully capture. They remind us that while death is inevitable, the way one lives defines how they are remembered. This is exactly what happened on 30th September 2014. Molvi Sahab left this world for eternal abode, and his funeral became a testament to the popular reverence he commanded. He was a leader who never flattered the powerful but sought to empower the marginalized, leaving behind a permanent infrastructure of identity, education, and proud Indian commitment. He was, quite simply, the essential voice of his generation. While his physical presence may be gone, the infrastructure he created, the political space he secured, and the sheer legend of Molvi Sahab, a leader who stood tall against all odds,

We struggle to find the words that do Molvi Sahab justice. He was a person of such towering character that no simple summary could ever grasp the depth of his spirit or his influence. Though we know a book can only ever be a partial echo of the man, the work to record his life is passionately underway. It is our heartfelt effort to ensure that the remarkable warmth and wisdom he shared will continue to*The Legend of Molvi Iftikhar Hussain Ansari Sahab*

Zubeen Garg was an Indian musician, singer, composer, songwriter, instrumentalist, actor, director, filmmaker, poet and philanthropist who primarily worked and sang in the Assamese, Bengali, and Hindi-language films and music industries.

He had also sung in 40 other languages and dialects, including Bishnupriya Manipuri, Adi, Boro, Dimasa, English, Goalpariya, Gujarati, Kannada, Karbi, Malayalam, Marathi, Mising, Nepali, Bhojpuri, Odia, Sanskrit, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu, Tiwa and Urdu.

Garg was a multi-instrumentalist and played 12 instruments including anandalahari, dhol, dotara, drums, guitar, harmonica, harmonium, mandolin, keyboard, tabla, and various percussion

He was regarded as one of the most influential musicians in Assam, and was also the highest-paid singer in Assam.

Over a career spanning 33 years, he recorded more than 38,000 songs.

Garg was born into an Assamese Brahmin family in Tura, Meghalaya, to Mohini Mohon Borthakur and Ily Borthakur.

His first name was chosen in homage to Zubin Mehta.! His last name was initially given "Borthakur" but later instead of continuing with his parental surname Borthakur, he chose "Garg",

the title of his Brahmin gotra. Garg's family had ancestral roots in Tamulichiga (Jhanji), Jorhat, Assam.

His father was a Magistrate, and is also known as a lyricist and poet under the pen name Kapil Thakur.

As a son of an Assam Civil Service officer, his father was frequently transferred, due to which he spent parts of his childhood moving with the family.

His mother, Ily Borthakur, was a singer. His sister Jonkie Borthakur, who was a singer and actress, died in a car accident in February 2002 in Sonitpur district while travelling to perform a stage show along with her co-artists. He had released the album Xixhu in 2002, in memory of Jonkie Borthakur.

His younger sister Palme Borthakur is a geography professor.



Garg did his primary education at Carmel School, Jorhat, and later attended Karimganj High School and Bijoni Bandhov School. He passed his matric $ulation\, exam (class\, 10th) from\, Tamulpur$ Higher Secondary School, Nalbari in

In the same year, he moved to Bongalpukhuri, Jorhat, completing his higher secondary education in science at J.B. College between 1990 and 1992. He went to pursue Bachelor of Science degree in B. Borooah College, but dropped out to concentrate on his singing career.

Garg started to sing from the age of three. His first guru was his mother from whom he learnt to sing and he learnt playing the tabla from Pandit Robin Banerjee for 11 years. Guru Ramani Rai introduced him to Assamese folk music. Garg had been composing songs since his school days.

Garg went to become a professional singer when he got a gold medal for his western solo performance in a youth festival held in 1992. He entered professional music with his debut Assamese album Anamika, which was released in November 1992.

Garg's first recorded songs were "Tumi Junu Pariba Hun" and "Tumi Junaki Hubakh" for the album Ritu, but

it was not released until 1993. He released many other albums such as Xopunor Xur (1992), Junaki Mon (1993), Maya (1994), Asha (1995) and more. Before he moved to Mumbai in 1995, he released his first Bihu album Ujan Piriti which was a commercial success.

In the mid 1990's, Garg moved to Mumbai to work in the Bollywood music industry where he debuted his first Indipop solo album Chandni Raat. Later, he recorded Hindi albums and remixes including Chanda (1996), Shradhaanjali Vol. 1 (1996), Shradhaanjali Vol. 2 and 3 (1997), Jalwa (1998), Yuhi Kabhi (1998), Jadoo (1999), Sparsh (2000), and

He sang for films including Gaddaar (1995), Dil Se (1998), Doli Saja Ke Rakhna (1998), Fiza (2000), Kaante (2002). In 2003, he sang "Sapne Saare" and "Khwabon Ki" from the movie Mudda-The Issue, "Maango Agar Dil Se Toh Khuda" from the movie Chupke Se, "Holi Re" from the movie Mumbai se Aiya Mera Dost and "Jo Pyar Tumne" from the movie Jaal:

Garg got his biggest breakthrough in Bollywood from the movie Gangster where he sang the song "Ya Ali". The song won him the best playback singer Global Indian Film Awards (GIFA) in 2006. His next Hindi album Zindagi was released in 2007. In 2007, he collaborated with Ustad Sultan Khan to sing "Jag Lal Lal Lal" for the movie Big Broth-

Apart from singing in the Bollywood and Assamese film and music industries, he debuted in the Bengali music industry in 2003 where he sang two songs in the movie Mon. In the next year, he sang three songs in the movie Shudhu Tumi and was the film's music director. In 2005 he sang "O Bondhure" and "Lagena Bhalo" in the film Premi. In 2008, he recorded several Bengali songs like "Mon mane Na" from the movie Mon Mane Na, "Piya re Piya re" from the movie Chirodini Tumi je Amaar, and "Mon Jete Chay Shudhu" from the movie Love

Apart from singing, Garg also made his debut as an actor and director for the film Tumi Mor Matho Mor, which was released in early 2000 under NK Production. He acted some films like Prem Aru Prem (2002), Dinabandhu (2004), Mon Jaai (2008), Gaane Ki Aane (2016), Mission China (2017), Priyaar Priyo (2017), The Underworld (2018), Kanchanjangha (2019), Rajneeti (2022), Dr. Bezbaruah 2

(2023) and more.

On 19 September 2025, Garg died in Singapore, at the age of 52. He died while swimming in the sea without a life jacket. He was administered CPR and rushed to Singapore General Hospital, where he was pronounced dead in the intensive care unit!

On 22 September 2025, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma announced that Garg would be cremated with full state honours. The decision followed both cabinet discussions and the family's preference against cremation in Jorhat, where public groups had demanded the last rites.

His wife Garima Saikia Garg and sister Palme Borthakur cited the frail health of his 85-year-old father and the difficulties of performing rituals away from Guwahati. As a compromise, the government announced that Garg's ashes would be immersed in Jorhat and that memorials would be constructed both in Jorhat and at the Guwahati cremation site.





Belonging to the Khan Sahab area of Budgam district, Majeed Masroor has carved a special place in Kashmiri literature and music. He has penned hundreds of poems and ghazals, many of which have been brought to life by celebrated singers and veteran vocalists of the valley. His contribution continues to enrich the cultural and artistic heritage of Kashmir. At times, he writes articles and essays that are published in leading local and national newspapers. His primary focus remains on education, social evils, rising immorality, and culture. In 2022, his first collection of articles, titled Parvaazi-Shaoor, was published by Taj Printing Service, New Delhi. The book comprises 31 articles across 127 pages and is dedicated to the youth of the valley as well as

to men and women committed to propagating the message of the Prophet (PBUH). Pictures of Majeed Masroor with his mother, grandson, and friend adorn this book, reflecting his deep attachment to them. The author has written the foreword himself, wherein he states that his sole motive is to serve society through his pen. He also highlights the multidimensional aspects of human personality and society. Maulana Mohd Muzaffar Qadri, Imam of Khanqah Moula Sopore, has penned some thought-provoking remarks about the book and its author. According to him, Majeed Masroor is diligently working to eradicate social evils and promote community wellbeing by writing comprehensive articles on the social, moral, and cultural dimensions of society. Similarly, Ishfaq Gouhar observes that Majeed Masroor is deeply sensitive to the wrongdoings prevalent in society. They serve as primary preventive measures against communicable diseases by enhancing quality of life and promote social well-being. From ancient practices to modern scientific understanding hygiene has consistently been recognized as a vital safeguard for individuals and communities.

Health is not merely the absence of disease but a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being. While medical science has advanced in treating diseases, prevention remains more cost-effective and impactful than cure. Hygiene and cleanliness whether personal, environmental or societal constitute the first line of defense in preventing illness. They influence disease patterns, life expectancy and even socioeconomic development. In today's interconnected world, where infectious diseases can spread rapidly across borders, the importance of hygiene has become more pronounced than ever.

The Scientific Basis of Hygiene Hygiene refers to practices that maintain health and prevent disease, primarily through cleanliness. The relationship between hygiene and disease prevention is deeply rooted in microbiology and epidemiology:

Microbial Control: Proper handwashing with soap removes pathogenic microorganisms such as Escherichia coli, Staphylococcus aureus, and viruses like influenza and SARS-CoV-2. According to the various health surveys effective hand hygiene can reduce diarrheal diseases by up to 40% and respiratory infections by

Breaking the Chain of Infection: Infectious diseases spread via direct contact, contaminated food and water or environmental reservoirs. Hygiene practices like sanitation, safe water storage, food safety and waste disposal disrupt these transmission pathways.

$Types\, of\, Hygiene\, and\, Their\, Health$

Personal Hygiene: Practices such as bathing, oral care, clean clothing $and\,menstrual\,hygiene\,protect\,against$ skin infections, dental decay, parasitic infestations and reproductive health complications.

Hand Hygiene: Considered the single most effective measure in healthcare settings, hand hygiene prevents hospital-acquired infections, which are otherwise responsible for significant morbidity, mortality and economic burden.

Food and Water Hygiene: Safe preparation, handling and storage of food prevent outbreaks of cholera, typhoid, hepatitis A and food poisoning. Clean drinking water alone is estimated to prevent nearly 1.4 million child deaths annually from diarrheal

Environmental Hygiene: Proper waste management, sewage treatment and clean surroundings prevent vector-borne diseases like malaria, dengue and plague by disrupting breeding grounds of mosquitoes, flies and rodents.

Community Hygiene: Public sanitation facilities, school hygiene programs and workplace cleanliness enhance collective well-being and productivity, while reducing healthcare expenditure at the community level.

Hygiene and Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs)

While hygiene is often associated with infectious diseases, it also plays a role in reducing risk factors for chronic illnesses. For example, oral hygiene lowers the risk of cardiovascular disease through its association with periodontal health. Proper food hygiene reduces exposure to carcinogenic toxins such as aflatoxins. Clean and safe environments reduce stress and improve mental well-being, indirectly protecting against lifestylerelated disorders.

Social and Economic Signifi-

Hygiene and cleanliness go beyond medical benefits; they have profound socio-economic mplica-

Educational Outcomes: Children in schools with better sanitation and hygiene facilities have higher attendance and learning performance.

Economic Growth: Reduced disease burden translates into fewer lost workdays, increased productivity and lower healthcare costs.

Gender Equality: Access to menstrual hygiene facilities enables girls and women to participate fully in education and employment.

Challenges and Global Perspec-

Despite progress hygiene practices remain inadequate in many regions. The health organization across the globe estimates that nearly 2 billion people worldwide lack access to basic sanitation facilities. Urbanization, poverty and lack of awareness continue to hinder progress. Recent global health crises such as the COVID-19 pandemic have highlighted how fragile hygiene systems can compromise entire nations.

Hygiene and cleanliness are more than cultural or aesthetic values; they are scientifically validated determinants of health and development. They prevent disease, prolong life expectancy and ensure societal prosperity. Investment in hygiene infrastructure and education should therefore be considered a top public health priority, not a secondary measure. As medical science advances, the age-old truth endures: prevention through cleanliness remains superior to cure.

Regular Exercise May Reshape Heart Nerves: Researchers

Scientists have long known that regular exercise can lower your heart rate and strengthen your cardiovascular system. However, new research on rats suggests that aerobic workouts may also reshape part of the body's nervous system.

The study, published on September 23 in Autonomic Neuroscience: Basic & Clinical, examined the stellate ganglia, a pair of nerve clusters in the neck that help control the heart's activity.

After 10 weeks of moderate treadmill training, the rats' right-side ganglion showed a large jump in neuron numbers but a shrinkage in neuron size, while the leftside ganglion saw the opposite, with fewer changes in number but an increase in neuron size.

This side-to-side difference hints that exercise might prompt the autonomic nervous system to adapt in more complex, asymmetrical ways than previously thought, according to the authors.

This could potentially open doors to new treatments for heart rhythm problems and other conditions that involve nerve control of the heart.

Effects of aerobic exercise on heart-control nerves To learn how exercise might alter the structure of the stellate ganglia, researchers worked with Wistar rats, a common laboratory strain known for its reliability in physiological studies.

The animals were divided into trained and untrained

The trained rats followed a moderate-intensity aerobic program composed of running on a treadmill for 10 weeks. This level of exercise has previously been shown to lower heart rate without changing blood pressure in rats.

 $After the \, training \, period, scientists \, examined \, both$ the left and right stellate ganglia from each animal. These clusters of nerves sit on both sides of the neck, just in front of a deep neck muscle, and serve as an important connection between the brain and the

To get a detailed look at their structure, the team used advanced three-dimensional imaging combined with stereological methods, a type of quantitative microscopic analysis that allows researchers to measure volumes, cell counts, and cell sizes with mathematical

The researchers measured three main factors: total neuron count (the number of nerve cells in each ganglion), mean neuronal volume(the average size of each neuron), and overall ganglion volume (the total size of the ganglion structure).

Four experimental groups were studied: untrained left stellate ganglion, trained left stellate ganglion, untrained right stellate ganglion, and trained right stellate ganglion

In addition to structural measurements, the scientists recorded cardiovascular data, including systolic blood pressure (SBP), diastolic blood pressure (DBP), mean arterial pressure (MAP), and heart rate (HR).

This helped them link any changes in ganglion structure to possible effects on heart function.

Left and right side differences after exercise The differences between trained and untrained rats and between the left and right sides — were pro-

nounced. In untrained animals, the left and right stellate ganglia were fairly symmetrical in neuron count and

However, in trained rats, the right ganglion contained four times as many neurons as the left ganglion.


India, Kenya hold talks to strengthen maritime cooperation and bilateral ties

ED uncovers forex racket in Goa

NEW DELHI, SEP 29: The Enforcement Directorate's (ED) Panaji Zonal Office recently conducted search operations under the provisions of the Foreign Exchange Management Act (FEMA) at the premises of 'Loja Shamu', located at 22, Mapusa Municipal Market in Goa.

The action was initiated based on specific intelligence received from the Airport Customs in Goa regarding the seizure of foreign exchange worth \$35,000.

During the search, foreign currency equivalent to approximately Rs 3 lakh, Indian currency amounting to Rs 13 lakh, incriminating chits and records of illegal forex transactions, and two mobile phones were seized.

An initial examination of the digital evidence revealed telephone chats and communications indicating that the shop owner was engaged in unauthorized foreign exchange dealings. The total value of such transactions is estimated to be around Rs 2-3 crore.

The seized material provides strong evidence of systematic illegal forex trading in violation of FEMA, 1999. The seized records and devices are undergoing detailed examination to identify the wider network of individuals and entities involved.

Further investigation into the matter is ongoing. UNI

This personal equation between the two leaders has helped take the bilateral ties to a different level, leaving behind the bitterness that had crept into diplomatic ties following the 2012 killing of two Kerala fishermen by two Italian marines off the coast of Kerala, a case that had dragged on for years before it was closed in 2021.

EU renews all pre-2015 nuclear deal economic sanctions on Iran amid UN's sweeping reinstatement of restrictions

BRUSSELS, SEP 29: The EU, in light of the recent UN move to reimpose all economic sanctions pre-2015, confirmed today that it has followed through with the measure and reimposed sweeping financial sanctions on Iran over its nuclear program, after the global body determined that Tehran was non-compliant with the dictates of the deal. "Today, the EU reinstated sanctions against Iran in response to its continued non-compliance with the nuclear agreement. The door for diplomatic negotiations remains open," said the EU presidency in an official statement.

The European Commission's Vice President and former Estonian PM Kaja Kallas said that the bloc's sanctions included freezing the assets of

the Iranian Central Bank and other Iranian banks, as well as travel bans on certain Iranian officials.

Additionally, the bloc is banning both the purchase and transportation of Iranian crude, as well as the sale or supply of gold and certain naval equipment to the Islamic Republic.

The UN reimposed the sanctions under the 2015 nuclear deal's "snapback" mechanism, at the behest of the E3 nations - the UK, France, Germany – after they threatened Iran with the reimposition of all economic sanctions due to its lack of cooperation with the IAEA, and filed a formal appeal to the UNSC which gave it the greenlight.

The E3 countries had given Tehran a deadline of September 28 to resume full cooperation with the UN nuclear watchdog, and allow inspectors to its nuclear facilities, or otherwise face crippling sanctions.

The EU's sanctions go in hand in hand with the UN's broader arms embargo, and bar any dealing with entities known or suspected of funding Tehran's nuclear and ballistic missile activities.

Tehran has blasted the UN actions, calling them "unjustifiable" and threatened strong retaliation. Israel has hailed the move, and called it as pivotal to ensure that a nuclear-armed Iran never comes about.

Despite the reimposition, Western leaders stressed that diplomacy was still very much on the table, with communication channels open. Kallas confirmed this on Sunday, stating that the reimposition of all pre-2015 sanctions "must not be the end of diplomacy". UNI

"The invitation still stands," Peskov told the state news agency TASS. "Putin is ready and will be glad to meet President Trump. It will then all depend on Trump's decision." The two leaders last met in Anchor-

age, Alaska, in mid-August, where they described their summit as "frank" and "substantive." At the time, Putin proposed Moscow as the venue for their next encounter, and Trump said he was with Kyiv, declaring that it was incapable of winning, - citing a supposed economic collapse and massive loss of lifewith little gains - while maintaining that Ukraine could still win with the continued support of Europe and NATO, labelling Russia "a paper tiger."

The Kremlin had rebuffed the US claims, with Peskov mocking the POTUS' 'paper tiger' comment by stating that Russia has always been symbolised by a bear, adding, "there is no such thing as a paper bear."

He also rejected claims of economic collapse, arguing that Russia had adjusted to the pressures of war and Western sanctions, even if challenges remain. Moscow pointed to its growth of more than 4% in 2023 and 2024, with further albeit slower growth expected this year. Despite the diplomatic tussle, the Russian official said on Sunday that Putin "highly values" Trump's "sincere efforts" to broker a peace between Moscow and Kyiv, while also describing the personal rapport between the two leaders as "warm."

Trump, weirdly enough, also somewhat softened his tone this week, retracting his "paper tiger" comments, telling reporters at the White House he would avoid using the phrase again. UNI

Outgoing IDF commander Maj Gen Nimrod Aloni slams IDF for its failure in stopping Oct 7 massacre

JERUSALEM, SEP 29: Outgoing Israeli military commander, Maj. Gen. Nimrod Aloni, delivered a scathing critique of the military's leadership as he stepped down on Sunday, slamming the IDF of failing to take responsibility for its lapses before and after the Hamas-led October 7, 2023 massacre, as per Times of Israel.

"I am leaving an army in which the concept of responsibility has been trampled and desecrated, and which has lost the confidence to put its failures on the table," Aloni said at the

handover ceremony for the Depth Corps, which he had commanded in years prior to the

Aloni, who previously commanded the Gaza Division between 2020 and 2022, however stopped short of mentioning his own role in Gaza before the attack, though he did acknowledge the IDF's many broader strategic missteps.

"Two years ago, we tried to contain our enemies from south and north, thinking that time would do us good, for the economy and growth, and that we could preserve the status quo over time," he said. "We were wrong, all of us."

The remarks underscored growing unease within the İsraeli military's senior ranks as it continues to fight in a multifront war, facing Hamas terrorists in Gaza on one end, while also engaging in ever-escalating clashes with forces of Lebanon's hardline Islamic militia - Hez-

This was further compounded by Jerusalem's latest military incursions into Syria, where it launched several airstrikes into Damascus, to quell the religious hardline discrimination against its Druze community, owing to its stated policy of protecting

Druze on both sides of the bor-

Aloni had been serving as head of both the IDF's Military Colleges and the Depth Corps, a shadowy command overseeing operations beyond Israel's immediate borders.

Last month, Maj. Gen. Dan Noyman succeeded him at the Military Colleges. On Sunday, Maj. Gen. Dan Goldfus formally took over the Depth Corps.

Goldfus, in his first address as commander, warned that the threat environment had shifted rapidly and cautioned that the Iewish state could no longer rely on distance for safety.



"The transformation of the Depth Corps is not the result of an organisational initiative or

distant vision, but rather a matter of urgency," he said.

"Our enemies are learning, strengthening, and changing. The range of fire is extending, and their technological capabilities are expanding. And the threat is not dependent on their

geographical proximity." He pointed to a Houthi missile fired toward Israel earlier in the day as proof that threats from Yemen and elsewhere in the "second circle" - Iran's regional proxies - demand attention alongside the war in Gaza and daily exchanges of fire with Hezbollah.

The Depth Corps, reorgan-

ised in recent months, is now tasked specifically with confronting these distant adversaries, including militias in Iraq. Syria, and Yemen.

Goldfus, until now seen as a relatively junior figure on the General Staff, previously commanded the 98th Division in Gaza and the Northern Corps.

Aloni's unusually candid rebuke added to the public and political pressure on Israel's military establishment - itself at odds with the political command - with many Israelis still demanding that those who failed to stop the Oct 7 massacre be held accountable. UNI

Suryakumar:

'I Am Not Out Of Form, I Am Out Of Runs'

DUBAI: It was well past midnight on Monday in Dubai when Suryakumar Yadav walked into the press conference room. It had been a night mired in chaos and confusion. Who would present India the Asia Cup trophy? Would India accept it if it came from ACC chairman Mohsin Naqvi? Would Pakistan even turn up for their press conference, amid rumours that their team bus had already left? We got the answers by and by.

Suryakumar had endured a poor tournament, and the non-cricketing issues may or may not have taken a toll on his form.

There was the unbeaten 47 in India's second game of the tournament, against Pakistan, but he had scores of 0, 5, 12 and 1 to end the Asia Cup with. On Sunday, his dismissal attempting to loft Shaheen Shah Afridi on the up left India precariously placed at 10 for 2 in their chase of 147.

"I feel I am not out of form, I feel I am out of runs," Suryakumar said. "I believe more in what I am doing in the nets and my preparation. So in matches, things are on autopilot." His record as captain, though, has been impeccable. Since becoming full-time T20I captain, he has racked up series wins over Sri Lanka, South Africa and England and now at the Asia Cup, where India won seven games in a row to win their ninth title.

Having answered the question on his form, Suryakumar directed the mic jovially the other way, egging journalists on to direct some of the questions towards Abhishek Sharma, the Player of the Tournament who sat alongside him. "I've felt personally that when you are not scoring runs, it is difficult to take the team along. But Surya bhai is the same irrespective of whether he has scored runs or not," Abhishek said, throwing his weight behind his captain.

Suryakumar had to contend with more than just cricket at the Asia Cup. It began with a handshake with Asian Cricket Council and PCB chairman Mohsin Naqvi during the captains' press conference - a routine gesture that quickly turned contentious and set the tone for what followed.

Days later, at the toss on September 14, Suryakumar's refusal to shake hands with Pakistan captain Salman Agha added fresh spark to the issue. Next came a series of gestures and confrontations from both sides, eventually forcing the match referee to step in for disciplinary hearings.

"I feel it was not that difficult [to deal with]," Suryakumar said. "The boys took it in their stride. Since day one, I was just telling them to focus on cricket and enjoy the game. The boys took it in a positive way. We were very focused in every game." Suryakumar stressed that despite everything that went on, there was a bigger sense of satisfaction around where India were at in the runway to the T20 World Cup early next year, where they are defending champions.

"What we wanted to achieve in this tournament, we have achieved," he said. "There are a lot of things which you don't get to achieve in a bilateral tournament. This was like a knock out tournament. "As soon as we enteredthe Super Four, I told the boys that let's approach it like a quarter-final, semi-final and final. So we played a semi-final type of game against Sri Lanka, and then it was a perfect final. There are nerves, responsibility and pressure, and it was a perfect final." When asked about half-centurion and Player of the MatchTilakVarma,theonlynamebarelytouched upon in an unusually long press conference, Suryakumar chose to throw the spotlight on the entire team.
