

LG Lauds Yuva Shakti of J&K, asks them to be a catalyst for change



NEW DELHI, SEP 30: Defence Minister Rajnath Singh Tuesday said that Operation Sindoor demonstrated the effective synergy of the Tri-Services through a unified real-time operational picture, which enabled timely decisions, enhanced situational awareness and reduced the risk of fratricide.



# India's Pharma Exports To Cross \$30 Billion This Year: Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI, SEP 30: India's pharma exports, currently valued at nearly \$27.8 billion, are expected to cross \$30 billion by this year end, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science and Technology; Earth Sciences and Minister of State for PMO, Department of Atomic Energy, Department of Space, Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Dr. Jitendra Singh said here today.

Meanwhile, the Minister disclosed that India's domestic pharma market is \$60 billion, but is expected to double, that is, \$130 billion by 2030.

The Minister was speaking after the signing of an official Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Govt of India and the Government of Uttar Pradesh. The agreement, executed through DBT's Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC) and the Uttar Pradesh Promote Pharma Council (UPPPC) is part of a centre-state partnership model to accelerate innovation,

# India Won't Bow To Nuclear Blackmail: CDS Gen Chauhan

**NEW DELHI. SEP 30:** India won't bow to nuclear blackmail, Chief of Defence Staff, General Anil Chauhan said on Tuesday, asserting that the military must be ready to respond to nuclear and biological threats.

The Army, he said, must also be ready to respond to "low-probability but high-impact nuclear emergencies".

Speaking at a scientific session held as part

of the 100th Raising Day celebrations of the Military Nursing Service (MNS) at the Manekshaw Centre in Delhi Cantt, General Chauhan said that while the possibility of nuclear weapons use in the Indian context remains low, it is necessary to factor it into security planning.

He said radiological contamination would require separate treatment protocols, and training must include these aspects to ensure operational readiness.

#### Crime graph declines in J&K from 2021 to 2023: NCRB

JAMMU, SEP 30: Jammu and Kashmir has shown a decrease in the number of overall crime incidents from 2021 to 2023, recording a fall of 2,080 cases during the period, the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report 2023 said.

The Union Home Ministry on Tuesday released the 71st edition of the NCRB annual report, which presents a comprehensive analysis of crime statistics for the calendar year 2023.

As per the report, overall crime data, including Indian Penal Code (IPC) crimes and Special and Local Laws (SLL) crimes, have shown a decrease in cases from 31,675 in 2021 to 30,197 in 2022 to 29,595 in 2023.

The data shows a decline of 2,080 cases from 2021 to 2023.

As per the breakup of the cases, there is an increase in cases related to SLLs. The number cases went up to 4,468 in 2023 from 4,282 in 2022 and 4,228 in 2021, with the rate of chargesheets for such cases recorded at 90.7 per cent, it said.

However, the cases pertaining to the Indian Penal Code have decreased by 2,320 cases-from 27,447 in 2021 to 25,915 in 2022 to 25,127 in 2023. The report said that the rate of cognizable Turn on Page 2

complex interplay of traditional and nontraditional threats make jointness a core operational necessity. He said, "While each of our services has the capacity to respond independently, the interconnected nature of land, sea, air, space and cyberspace makes collaborative strength the true guarantor of victory."

Referring to the recent Combined Commanders' Conference held in Kolkata, Rainath mentioned that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had under-

lined the importance of jointness and integration. He said this reflects the government's commitment to ensuring that the Armed Forces are among the best in the world in terms of values and traditions, and pioneers of future-ready

Rajnath also spoke about the strides made in digital domains. He mentioned the Army's Computerised Inventory Control Group (CICG), the Air Force's Integrated Materials Management Online System (IMMOLS), and the Navy's Integrated Logistics Management System as examples that have transformed logistics by bringing automation, accountability, and transparency.

He announced that work has begun on the Tri-Services Logistics Application to integrate these systems, provide shared visibility of stocks, optimize cross-service resources, and reduce redundant procurement.

He pointed out that over decades, each service had developed operational practices, inspection frameworks and audit systems based on their distinct experiences, but these often remained confined within individual services. He said that this compartmentalization has limited the crosssharing of valuable lessons and must now give way to open sharing and collective learning.

He stated, "The world is changing rapidly. Threats have become far more complex, and no single service can operate in isolation. Interoperability and jointness are essential for success in any conflict."

Singh warned that divergence in standards in critical domains like aviation safety and cyber warfare could be harmful. He said, "Even a minor error in inspection can create cascading effects and if our cyber defense systems differ across services, adversaries can exploit the gap. We must close these vulnerabilities by harmonizing our

At the same time, he said integration must respect the uniqueness of each force and that the challenge is to create a shared baseline preserving uniqueness while building interoperability and trust. He added that achieving jointness requires not only structural reform but also a change in mindset, calling on senior leadership to communicate the value of integration continuously.

Rajnath Singh said, "We will face challenges as we move towards jointness, but through dialogue, understanding and respect for traditions, we can overcome these hurdles. Every service must feel the others understand their challenges and every tradition must be honored as we build new systems together."

He urged the Armed Forces to study international best practices and adapt them to India's context. He added, "We can learn from others, but our answers must be Indian answers shaped

by our geography, needs and culture. Only then can we build systems that are sustainable and future-ready.'

Singh reaffirmed the government's commitment to supporting jointness in every possible way. He called upon all services and institutions including the Indian Coast Guard, Border Security Force, and Directorate General of Civil Aviation to move decisively on this path.

He said, "Only when our Armed Forces operate in unison, in harmony, and in perfect coordination can we counter adversaries across all domains and lead India to new heights of glory. This is the need of the hour, and I am confident we will achieve it."

tournament was held in memory of the 1,614 police personnel who have lost their lives in service. "Four personnel were killed this year in an operation in Kathua district. The families of the martyrs have received financial assistance, including ex-gratia and other relief through state and central schemes, banks, and police welfare funds," he said.

"As part of the welfare measures," the DGP said, "Each martyr's family receives Rs 1 lakh in direct support and additional assistance for marriage of daughters and education of children, including support for private schooling up to Class

"Martyrs' children also get access to free education in police public schools and scholarships for higher education including postgraduate, medical, and doctoral studies. In 2025, five family members of martyrs received appointment letters for government service," he added.

The DGP said the police have also been organising sporting events regularly, including the upcoming cricket tournaments in Kathua and Kishtwar. Past initiatives include Jashn-e-Dal, Pedal for Peace, and Marathon Run for Peace, with a "Run for Fun" scheduled in Jammu. Nationallevel tournaments hosted in recent years include All India Police Football, Hockey, and Water Sports Championships.

The police are also running 10 drug de-addiction centres across the Union Territory, treating over 200 inpatients this year alone.

DGP Prabhat said legal action continues against drug traffickers, but the force is equally focused on rehabilitation.

He said 981 students were sent this year on educational and cultural tours across the country, up from 781 last year, as part of efforts to expose youth to national progress and diversity.

Mentioning achievements in sports, he named several police athletes who have won medals in national and international competitions.

The DGP thanked officers involved in organising the tournament and acknowledged the Lieutenant Governor for continued support to the

Jammu and Kashmir will likely require 4625 MWs of power in the coming nine years a mid thepredictions of 'unserved energy'.

The official documents said, "As J&K is likely to have unserved energy in coming years there is a need to contract non-fossil capacities for meeting energy requirements other than the planned capacities. The additional quantum of capacities required (other than already planned) to be contracted is about 2438 MW from Coal. 1200 MW from solar, 987 MW of DRE till 2034-

It also states that the coal capacity PLF is expected to remain in the range of 46 percent-81 percent for the years till 2035 (reducing from 81 percent in 2024-25 to 46 percent in 2034-35) ensuring higher absorption of higher renewable energy.

"In the alternate resilient scenario, coal requirement increases by around 287 MW compared to the base case in terminal year 2034-35. The STOA requirement in 2024-25 increases by around 144 MW in case of Alternate Resilient scenario in comparison to the base case," reads the document.

Besides, the document also states that J&K and Ladakh are likely to have surplus capacity available from April to September (in the range of 230-740 MW for 2027-28) which can be shared

A day before KNO reported that Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh is likely to witness an energy deficit ranging from more than 4,200 Megawatts (MWs) to 10,000 MWs in next ten years. J&K and Ladakh is likely to witness energy deficit ranging from 4293 MUs to 9929 MUs in di erent years from 2024-25 to 2034-35 with the existing and planned capacity addition."

Pertinently, in April this year, KNO reported that Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh is likely to witness around 62 percent of share from nonfossil fuel-based capacity in mixed electricity generation by 2034-35.

The news agency had reported that "The share of non-fossil fuel-based capacity in the generation mix is projected to be around 62% by 2034-35 with higher contribution from non-fossil fuelbased capacities in alignment with Renewable Purchase Obligation (RPO) trajectory."—(KNO)

entrepreneurship, and investment in the

pharma, biotech, and MedTech sectors. Currently there are around 800 Medical Device manufacturers in the country and India's annual growth of the Med Tech sector is 15 to 20%, said

Dr Iitendra Singh. Officials said the collaboration will focus on advancing research and innovation, building a stronger ecosystem for startups, enhancing skill development and knowledge exchange, fostering closer industry linkages with SMEs and MSMEs, and catalyzing greater investment in the sector.

Dr. Jitendra Singh said the rapid growth of India's biotech ecosystem – from about 50 Start-Ups in 2014 to more than 11,000 today – reflects the sector's potential to drive the country's economic and healthcare goals. He noted that India is now recognized as a global supplier of vaccines, with more than 60 per cent of the world's vaccines manufactured here and over 200 countries receiv-

ing Indian-made doses. The Minister credited the growth to policy support and a whole-of-government approach under which the DBT and its agencies have been reaching out to states to build collaborations. He said partnerships like the new DBT-UP agreement will help advance the vision of Viksit Bharat 2047 and reinforce India's position as a provider of affordable healthcare solutions "made in India, made for the world." DBT Secretary and BIRAC Chairman Dr. Rajesh S. Gokhale said the agreement with Uttar Pradesh would "unlock innovation pipelines and scale up affordable technologies." Senior state government officials underlined their commitment to positioning the state as a hub for pharma, biotech, and MedTech, pointing to projects such as the Biotech Park in Lucknow, the Medical Device Park in Greater Noida, and the Bulk Drug & Pharma Park in Lalitpur.

With India's bioeconomy already valued at around USD 165 billion, the government sees centre-state partnerships such as the DBT-UP collaboration as a way to accelerate India's emergence as a global hub for accessible biopharma and MedTech solutions.

At the ceremony, Awanish Kumar Awasthi, advisor to the Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister, said the state was committed to positioning itself as a hub for pharma, biotech, and MedTech.  $With DBT-BIRAC's \, support, he \, noted, initia$ tives such as the Biotech Park in Lucknow, the Medical Device Park in Greater Noida, and the Bulk Drug & Pharma Park in Lalitpur would be scaled up to nurture startups and foster research collaborations that can transform healthcare delivery.

Dr. Jitendra Kumar, Managing Director of BIRAC, said the partnership would focus on skill development, incubation, and commercialization, ensuring that innovations reach markets faster and generate wider social and economic benefits.

The event was attended by Additional Chief Secretary of Uttar Pradesh Amit Kumar Ghosh and senior officials from DBT, BIRAC, and the Uttar Pradesh government, underscoring the shared commitment of both Centre and State to expand India's biotechnology and pharma landscape.

Referring to recent developments, he mentioned that following Operation Sindoor, the Prime Minister had made it clear that nuclear blackmail would not deter India. Preparedness against such threats, he said, is an important element of deterrence.

General Chauhan further said that biological threats, whether arising from deliberate action, accidents, or natural causes, are expected to rise in the future. "The lessons from the COVID-19 pandemic have shown the need for updated and specialised treatment protocols to deal with infectious disease outbreaks," he said. The nursing force, accordingto him, will play a central role in responding to such scenarios and must be trained accordingly.

The Chief of Defence Staff said the Military Nursing Service has been a consistent part of the armed forces' medical infrastructure and has served in various operational and humanitarian environments. The nurses are not only central to delivering medical care but also to providing comfort and support during difficult times, he added.

He also noted that the focus must not only remain on developing professional capabilities, but also on ensuring the psychological well-being of medical staff, including nurses. According to him, those who provide care also require care, and emotional support systems should be part of institutional planning.

General Chauhan said the Military Nursing Service is currently the only organisation in the armed forces structured to function jointly across the Army, Navy, and Air Force. He said nurses can be posted across all three services without administrative or structural hindrance, setting an example of the kind of jointness the armed forces must aim for in other areas as well.

The Military Nursing Service was established in 1926. It is one of the oldest uniformed medical services in the country and continues to serve across operational, maritime, aerial, and humanitarian missions—(KNO)

Jammuand Kashmir recorded 84 murder cases involving 101 victims with a 0.6 crime rate per lakh in 2023, the report said, adding that it registered 1,004 cases of kidnapping involving 1,010 persons in the year.

Similarly, 231 cases of rape involving 231 victims were registered in the Union Territoryin 2023, along with 1,352 cases of assault against women and 70 cases of sexual harass-

However, the report said that there was no case of sedition registered in Jammu and Kashmir in 2023, but 425 cases of rioting involving 655 persons were registered. It said that there was no case of communal or religious violence or sectarian violence registered during the year.

The report further said that 673 cases involving 797 persons were registered in connection with deaths caused by negligence in 2023, including 639 cases of deaths due to road accidents such as hit-and-run.

It reported nine dowry cases against nine people and 44 cases of abetment to suicide. As many as 438 cases of attempt to murder and 434 cases of attempt to suicide were registered during the year. (Agencies)

Atal Dulloo stressed the importance of leveraging technology, instructing officials to make the process of framing and amending recruitment rules fully online, thereby eliminating delays and ensuring transpar-

He said that digitisation of recruitment rules would allow for smooth, exclusive, and real-time online operas, ensuring better monitoring and accountability.

Recognizing the need for continuous skill development in governance, Atal Dulloo ordered the creation of a dedicated Capacity Building Unit (CBU) under Mission Kar-

CBU, he said will be responsible for systematictraining and upskilling of employees, with the aim of fostering a culture of innovation, efficiency, and accountability in public administration

Chief Secretary also raised concerns over the non-compliance of employees in registering on the Karmayogi portal, designed to enhance core competencies for effective public service delivery.

Highlighting the importance of transparency and accountability, Chief Secretary reiterated the government's commitment to openness in governance. He directed all departments to ensure proactive disclosure of information within 15 days under relevant norms, so that citizens have easy access to key decisions and policies.

Atal Dulloo also called for the expeditious disposal of pending RTI cases, noting that timely response to information requests is a cornerstone of accountable governance.

Regarding Departmental Promotions and Service matters, Chief Secretary called upon the Administrative Secretaries to streamline service matters and instructed each department to formulate a concrete action plan detailing how many pending Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC)  $cases\,will\,be\,cleared\,within\,fixed\,time lines.$ He stressed that promotions are an important aspect of employee morale and organizational effectiveness and delays in the

process must be eliminated. As part of citizen-centric governance, the Chief Secretary directed the development of the Public Services Guarantee Act (PSGA) portal within one week. He said that the portal will act as a single-window platform to monitor the delivery of public services, reduce delays and provide greater accountability in

ensuring time-bound citizen services. Regarding the Regular Departmental Action Cases, Atal Dullo called upon the administrative departments to review the progress of pending RDA cases on regular

intervals for swift disposal of the cases. Regarding the compassionate appointments in favour of the kin of deceased employees under SRO-43 and newly christened Rehabilitation Assistance Scheme (RAS), the Chief Secretary underscored the need of further accelerating the process. He directed the concerned to put the cases before the designated committees for their clearances and issuance of orders in favour of the applicants.

A police team from Police Station Qaimoh, during routine naka checking, intercepted an auto-rickshaw bearing registration number JK18D-9586. Upon conducting a thorough search, officers recovered 2.5 kilograms of poppy straw-like contraband, concealed inside a bag. The accused has been identified as Manzoor Ahmad Baba, son of Ghulam Qadar Baba, a resident of Ghat Redwani Payeen. Following the recovery, a case under FIR No. 72/2025 has been registered at Police Station Qaimoh under relevant sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic  $Substances (NDPS) Act. Police \ have initiated further$ investigation to uncover the network and identify other individuals potentially involved in the illicit drug trade. Urging the community to remain vigilant, Kulgam Police reiterated the importance of public cooperation in eradicating drug abuse. Locals have been encouraged to share information about drugrelated activities, with the assurance that the identity of informants will be kept confidential.

**BUDGAM, SEP 30:** Residents of Wahabpura village in central Kashmir's Budgam district have expressed strong resentment over the government's failure to repair the Budgam-Wahabpura road, which they say has remained in a dilapidated condition for years.

Locals told news that the road, which serves as a vital link for hundreds of households, has become a daily ordeal for commuters. Large potholes, broken patches and muddy stretches during rains have made travel extremely difficult for both

vehicles and pedestrians.

"We were assured multiple times by the Roads and Buildings (R&B) Department that repair work would begin in 2024. Now, as 2025 is nearing an end, not even a single step has been taken," said Ghulam Ahmad, a

Residents alleged that successive governments had only made hollow promises. "Even during the tenure of the National Conference government, this road was ignored. These repeated assurances without action have completely eroded public trust," another villager remarked.

The deteriorating road, they said, has especially affected schoolchildren, elderly people and patients. "Ambulances get stuck, buses refuse to operate on this stretch, and children are forced to walk long distances because no public transport is willing to use the route," locals added.

Appealing to the Lieutenant Governor-led administration and the R&B Department, the residents demanded immediate repair and macadamization of the road. "We urge the authorities to stop making promises and start taking action. This injustice must end," they said.

# **ADDC Kulgam reviews** performance of Banks at **DLRC** meeting

 $KULGAM\,SEPTEMBER\,30: Additional\,District$ Development Commissioner (ADDC) Kulgam Altaf Ahmad Khan today chaired the District Level Review Committee (DLRC)-cum-District Consultative Committee (DCC) meeting in the VC Room, DC Office Complex to review the performance of banks for the quarter ending June 2025. A detailed discussion was held on sector-wise lending in priority and non-priority sectors, bankwise position of deposits and advances, and the progress of various financial inclusion schemes in the district.

While reviewing the Credit Deposit (CD) Ratio (90.60%) the ADDC appreciated the improvement made as compared to the national bench mark.

He emphasised that the flow of credit to priority sectors such as agriculture, renewable energy, social security schemes (PMSBY, PMJJBY and APY), Mission Yuwa housing and allied activities must be further enhanced to promote inclusive growth. In terms of financial inclusion, the ADDC directed all banks to submit weekly progress reports to the Lead District Manager (LDM), who will also conduct weekly reviews.

He called for launching an intensive campaign at the Gram Panchayat level, with specific targets set for the next six months to ensure a net increase in financial inclusion. He stressed the need for better coordination between banks and line departments to resolve grievances, ensure timely case processing and extend maximum benefits to the public. Highlighting the need to improve banking access in remote areas, he asked banks to explore possibilities for opening new bank branches/more BC points to in uncovered areas. The meeting was informed that YOY deposits in the district have increased from 2463.16Cr to 2725.40Cr witnessing 10.64% increased while as advances have grown from 2263.72Cr to 2470.81Cr witnessing a growth of 9.23%.

#### Open the road at Sanat Nagar Chowk connecting uptown areas with city centre

Some time back deputy chief minister Surinder Kumar Chaudhary who holds the portfolio of R&B ministry paid a visit to the construction site of Sanat Nagar flyover and reviewed the progress of work going on at the site. The minister ordered for the completion of work on the flyover by November 15 this year and issued a stern warning to the contractor for failing to meet the deadlines set in this regard from time to time.

The minister said that if the contractor fails to meet the latest deadline stern action under rules will be taken against him and the contractor would be blacklisted. The minister took a serious note of more than due payment made to the contractor. The contractor has so far received more than 70 percent of payment while the progress of work has not been up to the expected level. It is important that a probe is carried out in this regard and action is taken against the guilty.

During his visit the minister issued directions to the authorities to open the road linking Rawalpora area with Lal Chowk. As the work on this portion of flyover has been completed it is imperative that the road is thrown open for vehicular traffic. The road has already been macadamized and the encumbrances have also been removed. One fails to understand what is stopping the executing agency to open the road for the vehicular movement and movement of the people.

As on date the people coming from areas like Rawalpora, Wanbal, Rangreth and adjoining ones have to travel an extra mile and take turns on the bye-pass connecting Hyderpora area with the Nowgam area. As a result of this the motorists have to burn more fuel in reaching their respective destinations and the same does not look good given the inflationary economic situation prevailing in the market at present. The issue needs to be looked into and corrective measures need to be taken.

It is important that the concerned minister as well as the chief engineer R&B Central Kashmir take the issue seriously and direct the field staff to throw open the road considered to be an important road in the uptown areas. This would result in relief for the people and they would express gratitude to the minister as well as the engineers. The sooner it is done the better it will be for the people.

# Bhagat Singh: From the Revolution to the Present Day

Bhagat Singh's life is not just a revolutionary saga, but a symbol of an ideology. His ideas had power before his martyrdom, and their influence remains immortal even after his death. Today, as we grapple with economic inequality, communalism, and corruption, Bhagat Singh's ideas become even more important than ever. His dream wasn't limited to freedom from British rule; he envisioned an India

where everyone had equal rights and opportunities. March 23, 1931—The footsteps of three young men are heard in a Lahore jail. Bhagat Singh, Rajguru, and Sukhdev, smiling, walk toward the gallows. There's no fear of death, but a spark in their eyes—of revolution, of change. They know their ideas will never die. On March 23, 1931, Bhagat Singh, Sukhdev, and Rajguru were hanged. But can a revolutionary truly die? Their ideas, their thoughts, and their inspiration live on even today. They fought not just against British rule, but for an India based on equality, justice, and freedom.

#### Birth of a thinker

Born on September 28, 1907, in Banga village, Punjab (now in Pakistan), Bhagat Singh's childhood was spent surrounded by books and revolutionary discussions. His family was steeped in patriotism. However, the Jallian wala Bagh massacre of 1919 was a shock for him. He realized that freedom should not be just a dream, but a reality of struggle. Bhagat Singh was rebellious and curious from childhood. The Jallianwala Bagh massacre (1919) shook him to his core and made him decide that he could not remain a mere spectator.

#### The first step on the path to revolution

Joining the Hindustan Socialist Republican Association (HSRA), Bhagat Singh shaped his fight against British rule. Saunders Murder Case (1928) – Bhagat Singh, Rajguru, and Sukhdev assassinated police officer John Saunders to avenge the death of Lala Lajpat Rai. This sent a revolutionary message that tyranny would be resisted. Assembly Bomb Case (1929) – Bhagat Singh and Batukeshwar Dutt threw a bomb in the British Parliament, but it wasn't to harm anyone. They were willing to be arrested so they could convey their views to the entire nation from the courtroom. Their motive wasn't mere violence. Their intention was to awaken the people, to show them that freedom shouldn't just be about political change, but also about social change.

#### Revolution of ideas in prison

Bhagat Singh was not just a revolutionary with a gun; he believed in the power of ideas. While in prison, he went on a hunger strike for 64 days, forcing the British government to surrender. He wrote numerous articles that clearly reflect his views on socialism, religion, and freedom. He believed that a true revolution would occur when a wave of change swept through society. It would not be wrong to say that Bhagat Singh's true strength lay in his pen and his thinking. While in prison, he wrote numerous articles in which he expressed his profound thoughts about socialism, religion, freedom, and revolution. He once said, "If you want the deaf to hear, you must raise your voice very loudly."

#### Martyrdom and immortality

Bhagat Singh, Sukhdev, and Rajguru were hanged on March 23, 1931. But their deaths were not just an incident; they fueled the Indian freedom struggle. 

Whenever a blessed and luminous personality tears through the veil of non-existence and steps into the realm of life, every moment of their radiant existence testifies to divine grace, devotion, and light. Every page of such a sacred being's life announces that the book of their existence began with light.

The king of saints, guide of the spiritual path, imam of the sharia, and leader of the faith, Hazrat Sheikh Saeed Abdul Qadir Jilani (RA), is the chief of the saints of the world, a man of greatness, and a unique figure of monotheism. Many saints have appeared and will continue to appear until the Day of Judgment, but in terms of spiritual unveiling, miracles, and perfections, the Perfect Saint (RA) holds a distinct place among them. For this reason, many saints of high rank foretold his coming. His sainthood and greatness were so widely accepted that the entire ummah agreed on his title of \*Ghaus-ul-Azam\*.

Hazrat Ghaus-ul-Azam (RA) was born on the 1st of Ramadan, 470 AH, in the city of Gilan, Iran. His father's name was Syed Abu Saleh Jangi Dost, and his mother's blessed name was Umm-ul-Khair Fatima. From his father's side he descended from Imam Hasan (RA), and from his mother's side he traced lineage to Imam Hussain (RA). The Perfect Saint fulfilledthe responsibility of keeping the light of the Prophet's (PBUH) sharia alive and radiant. He was nurtured in piety and righteousness under the care of his virtuous mother, as his father had passed away in his childhood.

When the love of Allah began to stir in his heart, he sought his mother's permission to travel to Baghdad for learning the path of sharia and tariqa. His mother, after placing forty dinars in his robe and giving him her prayers, advised him: "Always speak the truth. Never let a lie leave your tongue."

He later narrated the story of this journey: "When the caravan passed beyond Hamadan, suddenly bandits attacked us and looted everything. They left me alone. One of them asked what I had. I truthfully replied, forty dinars. Thinking I was joking, he walked away. Another came and asked, and I gave the same answer. Finally, the bandit leader himself asked me. I again replied that I had forty dinars sewn in my robe. He opened it and found them. Shocked, he asked why I had not hidden them out of fear of bandits. I said, because my mother advised me always to speak the truth, and I cannot disobey her words."

The leader was so moved by this truthfulness that he wept, saying: "You refuse to break your mother's advice, yet I have for years broken the covenant of my Lord. How wretched I am." He fell at my feet and sincerely repented. When his followers saw him repent, they too followed, returned the stolen goods, and later became righteous worshippers. Hazrat Ghaus-ul-Azam said, "This was the first group to repent at my hands."

Upon reaching Baghdad, he enrolled at the famous Nizamia madrasa, studied under great scholars, and completed his education. He endured many hardships, even going without food for twenty days, but remained steadfast in pursuit of knowledge. He said, "I continued to study until I became the learned of the learned, and Allah granted me the treasures of

After completing his education, he dedicated himself to uplifting Islam



through teaching, preaching, and spiritual struggle. At first, his sermons attracted few listeners. But one night, the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) appeared to him in a dream, saying with affection, "My dear son, why do you not preach?" Hazrat replied, "O Messenger of Allah, I am a non-Arab. How can I speak before the eloquent of Iraq?" The Prophet (PBUH) then asked him to open his mouth and placed his blessed saliva in it seven times, saying, "Invite people to the path of Allah with wisdom and

good counsel." From then on, his sermons carried such power that gatherings grew to tens of thousands, with seventy thousand listeners and hundreds recording

He never hesitated to confront the rulers of his time. He criticized their wrongs boldly, and such was the power of his speech and sincerity that no ruler dared oppose him in his presence.

One of his greatest titles was \*Muhyi $ud\hbox{-}Din^* (Reviver of Religion). Seeing the$ decline of Islam, he devoted himself to

reviving its strength. He once said, "The walls of the religion of the Prophet (PBUH) are collapsing, its foundations are crumbling. O people of the earth, come together to strengthen what has fallen and rebuild what has collapsed. This cannot be done alone; all must join together." His efforts were successful because he himself embodied what he preached.

Under his influence, countless non-Muslims embraced Islam and thousands of Muslims reformed their lives. Every gathering of his sermons saw people repenting, some leaving Judaism, some leaving Christianity, and pledging allegiance to him. From kings to commoners, all were touched by his reform.

His character reflected the noble manners of the Prophet (PBUH). He honored the weak and poor, respected elders, showed compassion to the young, forgave the faults of his students and guests, and never turned away a seeker. Divine grace guided him, knowledge refined him, and closeness to Allah beautified him. His outward life was adorned with sharia, and his inner being was illuminated with truth.

At the time of his passing, the words of the Kalima remained on his blessed lips. He departed this world at the age of ninety-one on the 11th of Rabi-ul-

# Navratri Fasting: A Path to Fitness & Wellness

The nine-day Navratri fast, a cornerstone of our timeless 'Durga Upasana', a practice woven into the spiritual and health traditions of our ancestors for millennia, offers a profound opportunity for holistic renewal, moving beyond its spiritual intent to serve as a potent strategy for metabolic and psychological optimization. This structured regimen, when approached with the informed perspective of a fitness expert, aligns with modern nutritional strategies, specifically the practice of time-restricted feeding, to achieve tangible and lasting wellness goals.

In the last decade, a significant body of research has emerged, moving intermittent fasting, Google's most searched diet trend in 2019, from a fringe diet to a wholesome scientific strategy for health optimization. Beyond the simple mechanism of weight loss, studies have consistently demonstrated its profound effects on cellular health and metabolic function. Intermittwnt Fasting, is a potent trigger for a natural and essential cellular "housekeeping" process known as autophagy, for which Japanese scientist Yoshinori Ohsumi was awarded the Nobel Prize in 2016. During this state, the body clears out damaged cells, dysfunctional proteins, and waste, effectively resetting and repairing its systems. This mechanism is believed to be a central reason behind the "rejuvenating" effects of fasting, contributing not only to longevity and a reduced risk of age-related diseases but also to enhanced mental clarity and overall systemic resilience.

The fundamental parallel between the Navratri fast and modern intermittent fasting lies in the principle of caloric restriction within a defined daily window. The most  $common\,Navratri\,tradition-consuming\,one$ or two meals of specific, non-grain foods naturally establishes a prolonged daily fasting period that can be tailored to a 16:8 schedule, or even a more extended fast. This pattern is far from a simplistic caloric deficit; it initiates a systemic metabolic switch, compelling it to transition from burning carbohydrates for energy to utilizing stored fat, a key goal of IF. While Navratri fasting is rooted in spiritual devotion and cultural tradition, its physiological effects—such as improved insulin sensitivity, fat burning, and cellular repair (autophagy)—are the same as those sought through a scientifically-designed IF regimen.

The traditional Navratri diet, often termed sattvic, provides a unique set of challenges and opportunities. To maintain an active lifestyle during the fast, it is imperative to secure an adequate supply of protein. The absence of grains means relying on highquality, plant-based and dairy sources. Incorporating a variety of nuts like almonds and



walnuts, along with dairy products such as paneer and curd, is crucial for preserving muscle mass and supporting recovery. This strategic emphasis on protein serves a dual purpose: it provides the building blocks for tissue repair and significantly enhances feelings of fullness, which is a powerful psychological tool for adhering to a limited eating window and preventing overconsumption.

From a physical training perspective, the fast demands a shift in exercise philosophy. The primary goal is not to achieve peak athletic performance but to maintain muscle and improve metabolic flexibility without inducing excessive stress on a body with reduced caloric intake. High-intensity workouts or prolonged endurance sessions are counterproductive and can lead to overexertion and an elevated stress response. Instead, the focus should be on low-to-moderate intensity activities. The key is to choose a routine that supports fitness goals without placing undue stress on body. The best approach prioritizes low-to-moderate intensity exercises, which are effective for fat burning and muscle maintenance in a fasted state, while also being safe.

The psychological and spiritual dimensions of the Navratri fast are also integral to its efficacy. This is a period of self-imposed discipline that extends far beyond food. The act of consciously abstaining from certain desires—whether for a specific food or a highintensity workout—strengthens one's resolve and builds a greater sense of self-control. This discipline, when practiced over nine days, can rewire behavioral patterns, making the transition to healthy habits post-festival more natural and sustainable. This enhanced cognitive self-regulation is a powerful and often overlooked benefit of a structured fast.

Essentially, the Navratri fast is a wellestablished, traditional method for wellness that aligns perfectly with modern fitness science. By thoughtfully combining timerestricted eating, a protein-focused diet, and light exercise, this ancient practice becomes a powerful, nine-day plan for boosting health and mental clarity. It's a holistic blueprint for renewal, so long as it is approached with a conscious plan for safety and well-being.

## JMC strengthens environmental initiatives under NCAP

The Jammu Municipal Corporation envisions these initiatives as a step towards creating a healthier urban environment, where development and ecology move hand in hand, ultimately ensuring better quality of life for the residents of lammu.

He also demanded additional funds for the state for disaster relief and restoration, a Home Ministry statement said.



## Delhi govt declares mourning for Malhotra



## Ten people killed, 30 wounded in Quetta car bomb explosion

**QUETTA/NEW DELHI, SEP 30:** More than 10 people were killed and at least 30 wounded in a car bomb explosion outside Pakistan's para-military force headquarters in Balochistan's Quetta today.

Local media reported that a suicide bomber blew himself up near the Frontier Constabulary headquarters. Before the blast five-six gunmen in the car stepped outside and fired on the security forces. However, all the gunmen were killed in the encounter.

Officials told the local media that the wounded were being treated at the hospital. Some of the wounded were critical and the toll might go up. Some reports said 13 people were killed.

No group has so far claimed responsibility for the attack. Local media quoted Provincial health minister Bakhat Kakar as saying that the death toll could rise further and most of those killed and injured were civilians. Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi said six attackers were involved in the assault and all of them were killed by security forces.

Local television channels showed a car stopping in front of the gate of the paramilitary headquarters. The car explodes and gunfire is heard after the blast. In Islamabad, Pakistan's President Asif Ali Zardari and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif denounced the bombing. Balochistan Chief Minister Sarfraz Bugti also condemned the attack. UNI

## EFTA, TEPA to come into effect tomorrow, provision for 100 bn USD investment, one mn jobs in 15 yrs

**NEW DELHI, SEP 30:** The India-European Free Trade Association (EFTA) and the Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement (TEPA) will come into effect from tomorrow, an official statement said today.

TEPA offers binding commitment of 100 bn US Dollar investment and one million direct jobs in the next 15 years and will stimulate services exports in sectors like IT, business services, education, audio-visual etc. It also provides Mutual Recognition Agreements in Professional Services like nursing, chartered accountants, architects etc.

The agreement was signed on March 10, 2024. TEPA is a modern and ambitious agreement that incorporates, for the first time in any Free Trade Agreement (FTA) signed by India, a commitment linked to investment and job creation.

The agreement comprises 14 chapters with main focus on market access related to goods, rules of origin, trade facilitation, trade remedies, sanitary

and phytosanitary measures, technical barriers to trade, investment promotion, market access on services, intellectual property rights, trade and sustainable development and other legal and horizontal provisions.

The EFTA's market access offer under TEPA covers 100 percent of non-agri products and tariff concession on Processed Agricultural Products (PAP). Sensitivity related to PLI in sectors such as pharma, medical devices and processed food etc. have been taken while extending offers.

The agreement goes beyond goods and services and is committed to promoting investments with the aim of increasing the stock of foreign direct investments by USD 100 billion in India in the next 15 years, and to facilitate the generation of one million direct employment in India, through such investments, the statement said.

EFTA is an important regional group, with several growing opportunities for enhancing international trade in goods and services. EFTA is one important economic block out of the three (other two - EU &UK) in

Europe. Among EFTA countries, Switzerland is the largest trading partner of India followed by Norway.

The TEPA will empower India's exporters by providing access to specialized inputs and create conducive trade and investment environment. This would boost exports of Indian made goods as well as provide opportunities for services sector to access more markets.

As per Article 7.1 of TEPA, the EFTA States shall aim to increase foreign direct investment (FDI) from their investors into India by USD 50 billion within 10 years from the entry into force of the Agreement, and an additional USD 50 billion in the succeeding 5 years, amounting to a total of USD 100 billion over 15 years.

Concurrently, the EFTA States shall aim to facilitate the generation of 1 million direct jobs in India resulting from these investment inflows.

This investment commitment explicitly excludes foreign portfolio investment (FPI), focusing on longterm capital for productive capacity building. UNI

# Trump slams former defence secretaries, threatens to fire generals-admirals he doesn't like

**QUANTICO, SEP 30:** US President Donald Trump during his meeting with the top brass of the US military in Quantico, slammed the former Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Mark Milley and former Defence Secretaries Iames Mattis and Mark Esper, branding them "horrible", and threatened to fire generals he doesn't like, ahead of his speech, reports CNN.

Speaking to reporters at the US

Marine Corps Base, he praised his efforts at the military's resuscitation, despite poor leadership in the Pentagon.

"We had some real bad ones last time. I rebuilt the military, the entire military, but I had unbelievable people to do that," Trump said when departing the White House. "But I also had some bad ones at the top, like Milley, Mattis and Esper."

Trump, specifically singled out Esper in his statement and called him "horrible," claiming that the former

Defence Secretary had been steered into bad appointments by establishment Republicans.

"Theywere recommended by RINOs (Republicans in Name Only) and others, and they're not good. What we have now is the best," he said.

The remarks underline Trump's continuing feud with the top politicalmilitary brass in the US, as many senior officials - including Esper and Mattis -- have been critical of his recent policies. UNI

# ISRAEL ACCUSES FLOTILLA MISSION SAILING TO GAZA OF HAMAS TIES

**JERUSALEM, SEP 30:** Israel has called the flotilla currently sailing to the war-torn Gaza Strip in defiance of Jerusalem's blockade, proxies of Hamas. The claim was made after the IDF recently unearthed some of the terrorist organisation's documents in the Strip. The documents according to the Israeli Foreign Ministry showcase the terror group's "direct involvement" in the fleet of activists currently sailing

dozens of boats in 'solidarity with Gazans', reports Times of Israel.

According to the Jerusalem, the files tie flotilla organisers to the Palestinian Conference for Palestinians (PCPA), a Hamas-linked body established in 2018 that Israel designated a terrorist organisation three years later. Officials described the PCPA as Hamas's "embassy network" abroad, charged with organising marches, demonstrations, and flotilla campaigns against Israel.

One recovered document cited by

the ministry was allegedly a letter from 2021 written to the organisation by the group's former political chief Ismail Haniyeh, where he was explicitly backing the PCPA. Another, found in a Hamas outpost, listed senior PCPA figures, including Zaher Birawi, head of the group's UK branch. Birawi has been a central figure in pro-Gaza flotillas for over a decade, including the 2010 Mavi Marmara mission in which 10 activists were killed in clashes with Israeli com-

# **UNGA General Debate concludes after witnessing** difficult discussions, some for, some against

**NEW YORK/NEW DELHI. SEP 30:** The 80th UN General Assembly (UNGA) Debate in New York concluded today after a difficult Session both for the UN itself and for the multilateral spirit it is meant to embody.

General Assembly President Annalena Baerbock said the world body remains "the house of diplomacy and dialogue" in a divided world and as the UN marks its 80th anniversary, member States must show the people of the world why the organization matters and uphold its founding principles in the decades ahead.

The Debate concluded with strong speeches by the leaders of 189 countries. The deepening humanitarian crisis in Gaza echoed as the General Assembly heard calls by most world leaders for urgent global action to stop Israeli attacks. However, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin that today's multipolar world Netanyahu said Israel will not rest until Hamas is eliminated and hostages are freed.

Ukraine situation and calls for an end to the war was also mentioned by many leaders.

The Session witnessed cryptic remarks by some leaders about the relevance of the UN while some demanded strengthening and overhaul of the world body to address the new challenges.

UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres said "The United Nations is committed to fully supporting all meaningful efforts to end" the Ukrainian war. Against this backdrop, Mr. Guterres argued that the UN remains indispensable.

"At its best, the United Nations is more than a meeting place, it is a moral compass, a force for peace...a guardian of international law and a lifeline for people in crisis." He noted

could bring dynamism, but without cooperation it risks instability. International cooperation, he insisted, is not naïve but a necessity.

"No country can stop a pandemic alone. No army can halt rising temperatures. No algorithm can rebuild trust once it is broken." In this moment of crisis, the United Nations has never been more essential, the Secretary-General stressed. "The world needs our unique legitimacy. Our convening power. Our vision to unite nations, bridge divides and confront the challenges before us."

Deputy UN Chief Amina Mohammed, while addressing a 60,000 strong crowd at the 2025 Global Citizen Festival on the Great Lawn in Central Park, New York City, said "The UN doesn't give up. We faced a few shots fired this week, but we're not giving up.'



Amina Mohammed was obliquely referring to the potshots taken by US President Donald Trump in his UNGA address in which he described UN as a feckless institution and said "UN is not coming close to living up to its potential." The US President also criticized the UN over the failure to stop wars and said "The UN is supposed

to stop invasion, not promote them.

In his address to the General Assembly on September 27, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar outlined the failings of a "gridlocked" UN, while asserting the need for more international cooperation and a reformed Organisation.

Highlighting the issues of

Ukraine and Middle-East crises, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), tariff volatility and uncertain market access, Dr Jaishankar said these issues point to a need for more international cooperation. He questioned the UN's ability to solve them.

Dr. Jaishankar said the UN is "in a state of crisis," and gridlocked, partly due to resistance to reform even though most members want change. "It is imperative that we see through the cynicism and purposefully address the reform agenda," he said.

Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov said widespread violations of the principle of the equality of states are the cause of crises and conflicts and the founding principles of the UN are as relevant as ever in today's "age of multipolarity."

African leaders delivered a resounding and unified message: the United Nations must undergo meaningful reform and the global order must be reshaped to ensure fairness, equity and representation for all nations.

The UN symbolizes the highest expression of the aspiration for peace and prosperity but the ideals that inspired its founding 80 years ago are under threat as never before, Brazilian President Lula Da Silva told the General Assembly in his address.

Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said the world faces "testing times" marked by conflict, terrorism, and climate change. He called for urgent action for peace in South Asia, the Middle East and beyond.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy warned world leaders that international institutions are "too weak" to stop wars. He urged more countries to join Ukraine's security coalition and step up pressure on Russia. UNI

**OVAL:** Chris Woakes, the England allrounder, has announced his retirement from international cricket, bringing down the curtain on a 15-year career representing his country across all three formats.

Woakes was omitted from England's Ashes squad last week after a battle to regain fitness following a shoulder dislocation suffered in the fifth Test against India at the end of July. Rob Key, England Men's managing director, said afterwards that Woakes "isn't in our plans... at all" and he has now decided to call time, posting a statement on Instagram.

It means his final act in an England shirt - after 62 Tests, 122 ODIs and 33 T20Is - was walking out to bat at No. 11 in the Oval Test with his arm in a sling, in a vain attempt to help secure a series-sealing victory on the fifth

"The moment has come, and I've decided that the time is right for me to retire from international cricket," he said.

"Playing for England was something I aspired to do since I was a kid dreaming in the back garden, and I feel incredibly fortunate to have lived out those dreams. Representing England, wearing the Three Lions and sharing the field with teammates over the last 15 years, many of whom have become lifelong friends, are things I'll look back on with the greatest pride.

"Making my debut in 2011 in Australia seems like yesterday, but time flies when you're having fun. Lifting two World Cups and being part of some amazing Ashes series is something I never thought was possible, and those memories and celebrations with my teammates will stay with me forever.

"To my Mum and Dad, my wife Amie and our girls Laila and Evie, thank you for your unwavering love, support and sacrifices over the years. None of this would have been possible without you.

'To the fans, especially the Barmy Army, thank you for the passion, the cheers and the belief. To my coaches, team-mates and everyone behind the scenes both with England and Warwickshire, who helped me play for my country - your guidance and friendship has meant the
