

Statehood Of J&K To Be Restored At **Appropriate Time: Amit Shah**

PATNA, OCT 18: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday promised restoration of statehood for Jammu and Kashmir at "an appropriate time" and a "good resolution" of demands raised by people of the Union Territory of Ladakh.

Speaking at a media conclave in Patna, he also claimed that after the abrogation of Article 370, terror-infested Jammu and Kashmir has "taken a U-turn" and "no local terrorist has been recruited in the last nine months".

"This is a qualitative change that Jammu and Kashmir, where separatism had been festering since the 1990s, witnessed. Earlier, Pakistan felt no need to send terrorists from across the border. They used to place arms in the hands of our children. Now the situation has changed. The people of Jammu and Kashmir feel they belong to the entire country and the entire coun-



try belongs to them," Shah said at the conclave organised by ABP News and Hindustan.

Today, democracy has been restored in Jammu and Kashmir. Panchayat and municipal polls have taken place, and so have elections for the legislative assembly. Rajya Sabha elections will also take place at some time," the home minister added.

He was asked about a statement by Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, who spoke of a "gulf" remaining in between Jammu and Kashmir and New Delhi on account of statehood not being restored even after a year of his swearing in.

Shah replied, "He (Abdullah) may be saying this out of political compulsions. But statehood would be restored at an appropriate time. And it will be done following discussions with him." About the $recent\,agitations\,in\,Ladakh, Shah\,said\,the$ Union government is "in talks with the



"We urge the people to have patience. There will be a good resolution of all their just demands," he said.

The allusion may have been to the combined leadership of Leh Apex Body and Kargil Democratic Alliance, which represent Ladakh's political and civil society groups.

The union home minister was also asked about the possibility of the release of Sonam Wangchuk, educator-turned-activist, who is in jail after being accused of inciting protests that led to the torching of the BJP office in Leh and vandalisation of some other public

Shah replied, "I can speak of the demands of the people. Not about any individual. As far as his (Wangchuk's) case is concerned, the matter is before the court, which will take a decision on the basis of evidence at hand".

The home minister also said the government was carrying out "a ruthless campaign" against Maoist insurgency, accusing the ultr-Left ideology of "the sin of forcing tribal areas to remain undeveloped".

"In the 11 years since Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been in power, we have demolished at least 600 Maoist camps, dried up their finances and blocked their access to weapons. I would like to declare that Maoism will be completely wiped out by December 31, 2026", asserted Shah. (Agencies)

The operation proved that victory has become a habit for India, he said.

The Union minister, along with Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, flagged off the first batch of BrahMos missiles manufactured at the BrahMos Aerospace unit in Sarojini Nagar here.

Singh described BrahMos as a symbol of India's rising strength.

"BrahMos is not just a missile, it is proof of India's strategic confidence. From the Army to the Navy and the Air Force, it has become a key pillar of our defence forces," he said.

He asserted that India's defence capabilities now serve as a powerful deterrent.

"Every inch of Pakistan's territory lies within range of BrahMos. What happened during Operation Sindoor was just a trailer. It made Pakistan realise that if India could create Pakistan, then if the time comes... I need not say more, you all are wise enough,"

Operation Sindoor proved that "victory is not just a small incident for us but it has become a habit", he added.

Hailing Operation Sindoor, Singh said it instilled a new confidence among Indians and proved BrahMos' effectiveness to the

"Maintaining this confidence is now our collective responsibility," he said.

"The entire world now recognises India's capability. BrahMos has strengthened our belief that India can turn its dreams into reality," he said.

Under Operation Sindoor, Indian defence forces targeted terror infrastructure and defence installations in Pakistan in May, following an attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam on April 22 that claimed 26 lives.

Indigenously developed BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles were used by India to destroy Pakistan's air bases during the

On the manufacturing of BrahMos at the Lucknow unit, Singh said the project symbolises India's growing confidence and capability in defence manufacturing.

"Lucknow is not just my parliamentary constituency, it resides in my soul. Today, it has become a city of technology and industry, apart from culture and tradition.

"The successful production of BrahMos missiles here shows that what was once a dream has now become a reality. The project represents patience, hard work and determination," he said.

Chief Minister Adityanath said it is a proud moment for Uttar Pradesh and a reflection of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 'Make in India' vision.

"Under the Defence Industrial Corridor. Uttar Pradesh is emerging as a major hub of indigenous defence manufacturing. The BrahMos unit is a shining example of that," he said.

"With a missile like BrahMos, India is now not only able to meet its own security needs but also those of its allies in the world," he

The CM said his government is committed to supporting projects which strengthen national security and create new employment opportunities and technical expertise in the region.

According to an official statement, Saturday's event is not only a milestone for the Uttar Pradesh Defence Industrial Corridor (UPDIC) but will also provide new energy to India's resolve to achieve self-reliance in defence manufacturing.

Inaugurated on May 11, the state-of-theart BrahMos Aerospace unit houses all modern facilities for missile integration, testing and final quality checks. After successful testing, the missiles are prepared for deployment by the Indian armed forces.

certain countries possess the capability to refine and convert these materials into high-end products.

In this context, he said, the plant inaugurated, which is one of the first private sector manufacturing units to produce aero-engine components and super alloy components, will go a long way in helping India produce rare materials.

"In the past, India had been dependent on other countries for the advanced materials and critical technologies needed for defence and aerospace, thereby slowing the growth of the defence sector, and the initiatives such as the Titanium and Superalloy Materials Plant indicate a reversal of this trend," Singh

He reiterated that India would acquire true strength only when it can manufacture its own materials, components, chips and alloys. He stated that this new plant puts India amongst a select group of nations which can make their own critical defence and aerospace materials.

"With this, we will be able to manufacture the parts used in our fighter jets, missiles, naval systems and satellites", he said.

The Defence Minister stressed that while technology is power, material is the real strength, adding that be it a semiconductor chip, bullet material or engine turbine part, none is possible without strategic materials. "We are building a foundation which will strengthen India's technological sovereignty in the coming years," he added. UNI

"This year, the School of Agriculture Science and Technology, Kargil formulated a floral calendar and accordingly introduced bee colonies in synchronisation with floral period of alfalfa and buckwheat and thus able to extract honey from both the crops resulting in a significance development in apiculture as honey was extracted for the first time from buckwheat crop," an official of the institute said.

He said the buckwheat crop was sown on July 22 and later in synchronisation with the flowering of buckwheat crop, bee colonies were introduced from Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology, Kashmir on August 24.

After a gap of one-and-a-half month, honey was extracted from these colonies marking a historic step, the official said, adding that the extraction of buckwheat honey has opened new pathways towards sustainable agriculture, rural livelihood development, and biodiversity conservation.

He said the unique altitude and climate of Kargil have given this honey a distinctive aroma and taste, setting it apart from other regional varieties and making a way for the untapped potential for high quality honey production from Kargil region.

The official said the institute is planning to expand more bee colonies in desirable villages, honey branding, and marketing and to promote buckwheat honey of Kargil as a unique GI-tagged product in the future. (Agencies)

Acknowledging various issues faced by dental doctors, Minister Sakeena emphasized that dental doctors are as important as MBBS doctors and dentists need to be given due recognition at par with other kind of doctors.

"Dentists are not merely tooth doctors; they are integral to preventive and systemic healthcare. It is high time that dental professionals are given due recognition and status, at par with MBBS doctors," she asserted, drawing a resounding applause from the audience of leading dental experts, practitioners and students.

Observer (KNO), a look back at previous indirect contests in J&K-where MLAs served as voters-reveals a history riddled with political surprises. Elections to the Legislative Council, known as the House of Elders, witnessed numerous instances of MLAs defying party whips. The Council, which no longer exists, had 36 members, 22 of whom were elected by MLAs.

The most shocking instance of cross-voting happened on April 13, 2011, when BJP's candidate Thakur Ranjit Singh secured only four votes, despite the party having 11 MLAs in the Assembly.

Embarrassed by the defiance of the party line, the BJP expelled seven MLAs and even wrote to the Speaker of the Jammu & Kashmir Assembly seeking their disqualifica-

The issue of cross-voting also echoed repeatedly in the Legislative Assembly during the NC-Congress alliance, with the Congress seeking the disqualification of BJP MLAs. The Speaker, however, didn't take any action against them.

Six of them were later reinstated in the party in 2014.

Another surprising result emerged in 2009 when Panthers Party with just 3 MLAS managed to send its candidate, Syed Rafiq Shah, to the Upper House of the J&K legisla-

ture, thanks to support from the PDP and BJP. "I got 34 votes from PDP and BJP MLAs-more than the required number," he told KNO.

Rafiq, who is currently associated with BJP, said that he didn't expect victory in the election.

"Panthers Party founder late Prof. Bhim Singh, BJP's Chaman Lal Gupta, and PDP founder late Mufti Muhammad Sayeed, played a significant role in my victory," he said—(KNO)

Govt to ban.....

Speaking to reporters in Baramulla, Minister Dar, as per the news agency— Kashmir News Observer (KNO) said artificial colouring has become a serious concern. "Colouring is affecting our fruit business across markets. Buyers in Delhi, Jammu and Kolkata have complained about it. We will be soon drafting a law to stop its use completely," he said.

Minister said the government is also finalizing the creation of a dedicated Enforcement Wing to regulate fertilizers and pesticides. "Many fertilizers and pesticides in use are of poor quality. We are strengthening enforcement to identify and act against violators," he

He warned that penalties will be imposed on traders and growers who bring coloured fruit to markets ahead of the season. "If a September apple arrives in August and shows colouring, it is malpractice. This must stop," he said.

On pest control, Minister Dar said the illegal import of rootstocks without quarantine checks has worsened the "leaf miner" pest problem. "Some people bring rootstocks through black marketing. We have identified them and strict action will follow," he said.

The Minister said the government will ensure safety standards in trade. "We are a progressive state. We will not ban licenses arbitrarily, but misuse will not be allowed," he said.

He also said a plan is being prepared to decongest and expand the Sopore Fruit Mandi. "Departments of Housing, R&B, Planning and Power will jointly develop a comprehensive plan to improve transport flow and expand market space," he said.

Minister confirmed that the Doabgah government juice plant remains functional and has been outsourced to a private operator. "It continues to operate smoothly under private management," he said—(KNO)+

J&K administration opposes detained MLA Mehraj Malik's Assembly participation, plea to attend session listed on October 27

Says postal ballot sent to him to cast vote in Rajya Sabha election.

SRINAGAR, OCT 18: The Jammu & Kashmir administration has opposed the participation of detained AAP MLA Mehraj Malik in the upcoming autumn session of the Legislative Assembly, even as it informed the High Court that a postal ballot has already been dispatched to him so as to enable him to cast his vote in the forthcoming Rajya Sabha election.

In its written objections, filed through Advocate Monika Kohli, Senior Additional Advocate General, as per news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), the UT administration has submitted that allowing Malik to participate in the session may have an impact on law and order situation.

"That it is submitted that, given the background and the petitioner/applicant's anticipated attendance/participation in the upcoming assembly session, carries a high risk of administrative and political sabotage and may have serious repercussions with respect to fomenting law and order situations at various places in Jammu province, because of his utterances and taking advantage of platform during assembly session," reads the objections filed by UT administration.

It has also cited an intelligence report to oppose Malik's participation in the upcoming session of Assembly.

"That, as per the report from the intelligence agency, allowing participation of the detenue during the Assembly session may have serious repercussions with respect to fomenting law and order situations at various places in Jammu province, because of his utterances and taking advantage of the platform during the Assembly session," the reply reads.

The government said the intelligence report indicated that the detenue may deliver provocative or hateful speeches that could incite discontent among the general populace and damage public perception of the government and its functionaries.

"He will likely create a nuisance or disruption within the Assembly, protected by legislative immunity, making it impossible for the UT government to take subsequent legal action for any unlawful or unwarranted conduct during the session," the reply states, citing the intelligence

According to the intelligence report, the detenue is also expected to use his detention status as a political tool to gain public and peer sympathy and to radicalize impressionable youth. "His ability to connect with the public and the media via the Assembly platform may undermine and negate the objective of his current preventive detention," the reply adds.

The administration has also cited the Supreme Court's observations in K. Anandan Nambiar and Another vs Chief Secretary, Government of Madras to support its

It has also submitted that Malik is a history sheeter in the records of Police Station Gandoh and has become a habitual offender involved in about 18 criminal/ anti-social case FIRs registered against him at various Police Stations across Union Territory of J&K, other than 16 adverse Daily Diary Reports registered in the different police stations/police posts of district

"The detenue had been frequently resorting to unlawful means to subdue the government procedures, rules and law, while making irresponsible statements as if law of land does not apply to him, being a lawmaker and while doing so, disturbs the public peace and tranquillity. The modus operandi of the detenue includes using social media handles especially "facebook live" to mount verbal and derogatory attack on anybody who tries to stand up against his illegal demands and while spreading false information to his more than two lakh followers on his social media handles and instigates the general public particularly youth to indulge in unlawful activities, create law and order problems and disrupt the public life particularly in sensitive areas of District Doda," the administration submitted.

In its order today, the High Court said Sunil Sethi, senior advocate and Monika $Kohli, Sr.\,AAG\,appearing\,for\,the\,state, have$ fairly admitted the legal position and submitted that a postal ballot, in fact has already been dispatched to the detenu, through Superintendent of the concerned jail, so as to enable him to cast his vote in the forthcoming election to the Council of

The case has been listed for hearing on October 27—(KNO)

Emphasis laid on intensified action to combat drug menace

SRINAGAR, OCT 18: To review the impact of ongoing efforts and strategize further measures in the fight against drug abuse and its trafficking, a meeting of the District Level Committee on Narco Coordination Centre (NCORD) was today convened under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner (DC) Srinagar, Akshay Labroo here at the Meeting Hall of the DC Office Complex.

Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Srinagar, Sandeep Chakravarthy was also present in the meeting.

At the outset, the Deputy Commissioner was given a comprehensive briefing on the key measures undertaken in the district to combat drug abuse, trafficking and ensure proper rehabilitation of affected indi-



viduals. The DC was apprised of recent seizures, arrests, financial investigations, and detentions carried out under the

NDPS Act.

Furthermore, the DC was apprised of steps taken to ensure accurate revenue entries

in NDPS cases to safeguard maceuticals in district. property records and cent percent use of computerization/ online billing system at phar-

On the occasion, the DC emphasised effective antidrug public awareness and

sensitization campaigns, strengthening of Addiction Treatment Facilities (ATFs), improved interdepartmental

coordination, and intensified surveillance and preventive measures at identified vulnerable hotspots.



Sheikh-ul-Alam (RA):

The Philosopher and Preacher of Monotheism





It is narrated that when Mir Muhammad Hamadani (RA) once met Sheikh Noor-ud-Din (RA), he found him extremely frail and weak. Upon inquiring about his condition, Sheikh-ul-Alam humbly replied, "I was not a worthy horseman, and therefore I was frightened by the thought of taming the wild horse." This symbolic response reflected his deep humility and spiritual detachment.

At the age of thirty, the Sheikh-ul-Alam (RA) renounced extreme asceticism and adopted a balanced, moderate path of devotion in harmony with Islamic teachings. He distanced himself from the practices of monks and Brahmins and embraced the life of a true Reshi (Sufi sage). He even refrained from eating wheat bread for six years as a form of spiritual discipline



In the paradise like valley of Kashmir, when the darkness of disbelief and polytheism faded by the grace of Almighty Allah, and the radiant sun of Islam rose over the land, a new era of spiritual awakening and intellectual enlightenment began. Along with the rise of knowledge, literature, and virtue, the valley blossomed with saints, ascetics, and mystics who raised the banner of Tawheed (the Oneness of God). Through their devotion, they dedicated every moment of their lives to spreading the message of divine unity, attaining nearness to the Creator, and achiev-

Among these great spiritual luminaries was Sheikhul-Alam Noor-ud-Din Noorani (RA) revered as Alamdare-Kashmir (The Standard-Bearer of Kashmir). He was not only a saint of the highest order but also a reformer and preacher whose spiritual light illuminated every corner of the valley. His teachings enriched the inner beauty of Kashmiri culture and spread the universal message of Islam across the land. People of all faiths and sects lovingly remember him as Sheikh-ul-Alam, Alamdar-e-Kashmir, Nund Reshi, and Koshur Waz Khawn (the spiritual feast of Kashmir).

Historical accounts record that Sheikh Noor-ud-Din (RA) was born on Eid-ul-Adha, 777 AH (1375 CE). His father's name was Sheikh Salar, and his mother was Sadr . From his early childhood, signs of purity, piety, and devotion were evident. The discerning eyes of the wise foresaw that the child possessed extraordinary spiritual potential.

During his youth, Sheikh-ul-Alam (RA) practiced severe austerities engaging in continuous spiritual retreats, fasting, and meditation in caves and wilderness for many years. He devoted his life to worship and self purification, detaching himself from worldly desires

and dedicating himself entirely to divine love. It is narrated that when Mir Muhammad Hamadani (RA) once met Sheikh Noor-ud-Din (RA), he found him extremely frail and weak. Upon inquiring about his condition, Sheikh-ul-Alam humbly replied, "I was not a worthy horseman, and therefore I was frightened by the thought of taming the wild horse." This symbolic response reflected his deep humility and spiritual

According to Baba Nasib-ud-Din (RA), Sheikh Noorud-Din's transformation began with a divine dream in which he saw the Holy Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) accompanied by his companions. When asked his name, the Sheikh-ul-Alam replied, "Ya Rasul Allah, (PBUH) my name is Nunda." The Prophet (PBUH) then said, "Your name is good; be good yourself so that your name may not become a stain upon you." He then placed his blessed hand on Sheikh-ul-Alam's shoulder and prayed for his closeness to Allah. Upon awakening, the Sheikh-ul-Alam felt spiritually enlightened his inner and outer vision expanded, marking the beginning of his spiritual revo-

He later confessed, "In the beginning, I believed asceticism and seclusion to be the pinnacle of spiritual life, but I eventually realized that there is no monasticism in Islam." He famously remarked:

Living in caves and jungles is the work of monkeys and mice. The truly righteous are those who, while living among their families, remain steadfast in prayer

and purify their hearts."

Sheikh Noor-ud-Din (RA) dedicated his entire life to preaching Islam and guiding the people of Kashmir. He traveled across the valley, residing in various places for years, nurturing both the elite and the common people. Through his words and example, many notable individuals of his time embraced Islam and adorned their lives with piety.

A well-known anecdote describes that once, while approaching a wealthy man's home for a feast, the gatekeeper mistook him for a beggar and refused entry. Sheikh-ul-Alam left silently but soon returned, dressed neatly. This time, he was received with great respect and honor. During the meal, instead of eating, he dipped his sleeves into the dishes. When asked why, he replied, "This invitation was not for me but for my fine garments." This story reflects his deep insight into human vanity and social hypocrisy.

After Lalla Ded, Sheikh Noor-ud-Din (RA) stands as one of the most important poets of Kashmiri literature. His verses, widely known as Kashir Quran (The Kashmiri Quran), are imbued with the teachings of the Holy Qur'an. Through his poetry, he eloquently expressed the essence of monotheism, divine love, and moral discipline. One of his renowned verses proclaims:

"Awwal alif kune Allah, Awwal path, akhir zawal na tas."

"In the beginning was the Alif – Allah.

He is the First and the Last, without decline." In another verse, he beautifully conveys the experi-

ence of divine unity:

"La ilaha illallah sa i korum,

Wahi korum panun pan,

Wujud traavath maujood myulum, Har mokh vuchum panun pan."

"I declared with certainty, 'There is no god but Allah';

I found the revelation within myself. The created merged with the Creator

In every face, I saw only my own reflection."

Sheikh-ul-Alam (RA) used poetry as a means to convey profound truths. His verses are a treasure of divine wisdom, urging reflection upon the Qur'an, obedience to Allah and His Messenger (PBUH), awareness of the Hereafter, and avoidance of hypocrisy and vanity. Regarding prayer, he wrote that neglecting Salah hardens the heart, and those who abandon worship engage in unfaithful acts, facing punishment greater than that of disbelievers.

In his final years, Sheikh-ul-Alam (RA) resided in Rupwan, Charar-e-Sharif, where he passed away during the reign of Sultan Zain-ul-Abidin (Budshah) in 842 AH (1438 CE) at the age of sixty-three. His funeral prayer was led by his closest disciple, Baba Nasib-ud-Din (RA), and attended by numerous scholars, saints, and the Sultan himself. He was laid to rest at Charar-e-Sharif, where his shrine remains a center of spiritual devotion. Pilgrims continue to visit throughout the year, and gatherings of Ziker (remembrance) and recitation illuminate the sacred site.

As the poet aptly says: "Do not underestimate these wearers of coarse robes;

They conceal the radiance of Moses' hand within their sleeves."

Sheikh Noor-ud-Din Noorani (RA) thus remains not only the spiritual guardian of Kashmir but also the eternal voice of monotheism, enlightenment, and love for humanity.

The history of Northeast India is marked by its existence as a collection of distinct kingdoms and tribal territories before British rule, followed by integration into the British Raj and the creation of modern states post-indepen-

During the colonial era, the British established the separate province of Assam in 1874 and introduced the Bengal Eastern Frontier Regulation, which led to the isolation of the region.

After 1947, the modern states were formed through a series of reorganizations, with Nagaland, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, and Mizoram separating from Assam, and Manipur and Tripura gaining statehood in 1972.

Pre-colonial and colonial periods: Before the 19th century, the area was a collection of different kingdoms and tribal areas, with limited written records for most groups, except for the Ahoms of Assam and Meiteis of

The Ahom and Manipur kingdoms were taken over by Burmese invasions in the early 19th century.

The British fought the First Anglo-Burmese War and gained control, marking the start of the colonial period.

During the British Raj, Northeast India was often treated as an extension of Bengal Province. The separate province of Assam was created in 1874.

Regulations were introduced to restrict outside entry and settlement, which contributed to the region's isolation from its neighbors.

Under the British, many communities in present-day Mizoram, Nagaland, and Meghalaya converted to Chris-

Post-independence period: After India's independence, the Northeast comprised Assam, and the princely states

of Manipur and Tripura. $Nagaland, Meghalaya, Arunachal \, Pradesh, and \, Mizoram$

were part of the larger territory of Assam. The North-Eastern Areas Reorganisation Act of 1971

led to the creation of states and union territories. Meghalaya was separated from Assam and became a

territories in 1972, gaining full statehood in 1987. Sikkim was an independent country after 1947 and

was annexed by India in 1975, later joining the North-Eastern Council in 2001. Today we will cover up first five battalions of Assam

The "First Assam Rifles" is not a current unit but refers to the Cachar Levy, the militia formed in 1835 that was the predecessor to the modern-day Assam Rifles. Raised by the British, it was initially a force of about 750 men tasked with protecting tea estates from tribal raids. It underwent several name changes over the years before

officially becoming the "Assam Rifles" in 1917. Initial Name and Purpose: The force was established as the "Cachar Levy" in 1835 to protect British tea gardens and settlements.

Role Expansion: Its role was expanded to include punitive operations beyond Assam's borders, and it was reorganized into the Assam Frontier Force.

Further Reorganizations: It was reorganized again into the Assam Military Police in 1870, with its members later serving in World War I.

Official Name Change: Recognizing its contributions during World War I, the force was officially renamed the "Assam Rifles" in 1917.

The Second Assam Rifles:

The "Second Assam Rifles" is not a historical unit; it refers to the history of the Assam Rifles, which began as the Cachar Levy in 1835. The force was initially created to protect tea estates, and its role expanded over time to include punitive actions and border security. It was later reorganized, renamed the "Assam Military Police," and then officially became the "Assam Rifles" in 1917 after its distinguished service in World War I.

Early years and evolution: Cachar Levy (1835): The force originated as the Cachar Levy with about 750 men to protect British tea plantations from tribal raids.

Assam Frontier Force: Its role expanded to conduct operations beyond Assam's borders, leading to its reorganization as the Assam Frontier Force.

Assam Military Police: By 1870, the force was reorganized into three battalions: Lushai Hills, Lakhimpur, and Naga Hills. Another battalion, Darrang, was raised before World War I.

World War I and renaming: Wartime service: During World War I, the Assam Military Police was deployed to Europe and the Middle East to support the British Army. Renamed Assam Rifles: In recognition of its service,

the force was officially renamed the "Assam Rifles" in The force continued its role in the northeast and was deployed in various conflicts, including the Sino-Indian

Modern role: Today, the Assam Rifles remains one of India's oldest paramilitary forces, serving as a counterinsurgency force and responsible for guarding India's borders, particularly in the northeast.

The Third Assam Rifles:

The 3rd (Naga Hills) Battalion of the Assam Rifles is the oldest and was originally formed in 1835 as the Cachar Levy. It was tasked with guarding the eastern frontier of Assam and has fought in World War II against the Japanese. Today, it is located in Kohima, Nagaland.

Oldest Battalion: The 3rd (Naga Hills) Battalion is the



oldest in the Assam Rifles, which are known as the "Sentinels of the North East".

Original Role: It was established in 1835 as the Cachar Levy to guard the eastern frontier from the Brahmaputra river to the Cachar Hills.

World War II: The battalion fought against the Japanesein World War II, helping to stop their advance into India.

Current Location: Its present-day headquarters are in Kohima, Nagaland.

Affiliation: The unit is often referred to as the "Naga

The Fourth Assam Rifles:

The "Fourth Assam Rifles" can refer to a specific unit within the Assam Rifles paramilitary force, which has a history of service in the North East region of India, including involvement in flood relief and security operations.

It also most recently gained attention for hosting the annual "4th Assam Rifles Half Marathon" in Shillong,

The unit, like other Assam Rifles battalions, was recognized in 2024 for its performance with the DGAR

As a military unit Role and History: The 4th Assam Rifles is a battalion-level unit of the Assam Rifles, an Indian paramilitary force that acts as a "right arm of the civil and left arm of the military". This specific unit has been involved in proactive efforts like joint training for flood relief operations in areas like Khowai, Dhalai, and Haora River in Tripura.

Casualties: The unit has also suffered casualties in the line of duty, such as the ambush in Manipur in 2020 where four personnel were killed.

Awards: In 2024, the unit won the Directorate General of Assam Rifles Banner for its performance.

As an event The 4th Assam Rifles Half Marathon: The unit is also the name of a popular annual half-marathon held in Shillong, Meghalaya.

The Fifth Assam Rifles: The "fifth Assam Rifles" most commonly refers to the 5th Battalion of the Assam Rifles, which is famously known for its role in escorting the 14th Dalai Lama to safety in India in 1959. Raised in 1920, the battalion has a long history of service and played a significant role in the Sino-Indian conflict of 1962. While it's a specific battalion, the term can be confused with the 5th Assam Police Commando Battalion, which is a different security force recently inaugurated in October 2025, notes this Facebook post.

Historical significance: This battalion is most famous for escorting the 14th Dalai Lama and his entourage from

the border in Arunachal Pradesh to India in 1959. Deployment: Since 1958, the battalion's posts have been in the Kameng Frontier Division of Arunachal Pradesh.

Other conflicts: During the Sino-Indian conflict of 1962, the battalion fought in forward posts against overwhelming Chinese forces, holding their ground on orders from their commanders.

Other duties: In earlier years, the battalion was employed to restore law and order in Assam and assisted in containing Nople rebels in Madras and Chittagong.

Other mention: 5th Assam Police Commando Battalion: This is a separate entity recently inaugurated in October 2025, focused on strengthening the internal security of Assam.

Arunachal Pradesh, located in a remote area near the Indo-Myanmar border. It is part of the Pangchao circle and is known for its traditional Wancho culture and architecture. The village is also recognized for its geographical features, including the nearby Longho Sath

Khasa is situated in the Longding district, within the Pangchao circle, close to the border with Myanmar.

Administration: It is administered by a Sarpanch (Head of Village) elected under the Panchayati Raj Act. Traditional homes are built with local materials like

wood, bamboo, and palm leaves. The village has a tradition involving log drums, as seen

in local rituals. Environment: The area is characterized by its natural

landscape. The Longho Sath waterfall is a natural feature located

near the village.

Recent events: In October 2025, the Assam Rifles conducted a medical camp in Khasa as part of their Civic Action Programme, providing healthcare and medicines to the remote village.

The medical student's life is tense with study for hours on end, clinic duty and test-anxious exams. Such a lifestyle may hide health issues, increase stress, and lead to fatigue or poor nutrition. A key highlight of the meeting was the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding(MoU) between the University of Kashmir and the Voluntary Medicare Society (VMS).

The agreement envisions skill-based workshops and training programmes for persons with disabilities, with a focus on enhancing human resources, improving infrastructure accessibility, providing technical support, and

exploring the introduction of a Bachelor's Programme in Special Education through the University's academic bodies.

Speaking at the inaugural session of the workshop Vice-Chancellor, KU, Prof. Nilofer Khan, said that the University

Synergise, Share Databases To Make Extradition **Efforts For Fugitives More Effective: CBI Director**

NEW DELHI, OCT 18: CBI Director Praveen Sood has emphasised the need for greater coordination and seamless data-sharing among the country's law enforcement agencies to strengthen efforts to extradite fugitives from abroad.

The CBI chief was addressing the state police chiefs and senior officers of the central agencies on Friday during the two-day conference on 'Extradition of Fugitives-Challenges and Strategies' organised by the agency.

Sood stressed the need for different agencies to come together and share their databases to bring more synergy in efforts against wanted criminals, the agency's spokesperson said, sharing details of the events.

Chairing the valedictory session of the conference on Friday, Union Home Secretary Govind Mohan emphasised that the deliberations of the two-day conference would lay the road map for future strategy.

He said that there is a need to improve the documentation so that the country's requests for assistance can withstand international legal

"He also elaborated on the steps and initiatives being taken by the Home department to ensure that wanted fugitives are brought back to India," the statement said.

Director General National Investigation Agency Sadanand Date said the provisions of new criminal laws, especially those relating to Trial in Absentia, can be used against the absconding offenders.

The two-day conference on 'Extradition of Fugitives-Challenges and Strategies' was organised by the CBI and was inaugurated by Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah on Thursday.

Shah had emphasised the need for a coordinated approach to bring back wanted fugitives from abroad.

"During the two days, more than 200 officers from 45 State and Central Law Enforcement agencies, including officers from MHA and MEA, participated in the discussions and deliberated on legal and practical issues in tracking wanted fugitives and coordinating efforts to bring them back to India," the spokesperson said.

A total of 25 officers from different

agencies, including the MEA, MHA, ED, NCB, FIU, NIA, NTRO, DRI, CBDT, Mumbai Police, INTERPOL and the CBI, made presentations on issues

related to the extradition of fugitives. "Effective use of channels available for seeking cooperation from abroad, use of technology in locating fugitive criminals, a strategic approach for extradition of these fugitives and analysis of the financial trail of fugitives were discussed," the statement mentioned.

The deliberations focused on narco, terror, cybercrime, organised criminals and financial offenders.

"The provisions of the Fugitive Economic Offenders Act were also discussed for exploring the possibilities of taking action against the global assets of wanted fugitives. In one of the sessions, the focus was on targeting fund flows of fugitives and using the Anti Money laundering framework to trace fugitives and their assets," it said.

Besides tracing of illicit funds using state-of-the-art platforms and networks, the newly introduced Silver Notice by the Interpol was also discussed during the conference. (PTI)

The Bank's net profit for half-year (H1) witnessed an increase to Rs 978.95 Cr from Rs

The Bank announced financial numbers after its Board-of-Directors reviewed and approved the quarterly and half-yearly figures during a meeting held at the Bank's Corporate Head-

966.41 Cr recorded for H1 last

Key Highlights

Moderated by the provisioning of Rs 92 Cr towards its investment in the Regional Rural Bank - Jammu and Kashmir Grameen Bank – following the amalgamation of Ellaquai Dehati Bank with the erstwhile J&K Grameen Bank under Central Government's "One State, One RRB' direction, the Bank today recorded a net profit of Rs 494.11 Cr for the Q2 and Rs 978.95 Cr for H1 of the CFY.

Reflecting steady core operations, the Bank's Net Interest

Income (NII) for the half-year (H1) is marginally up by 3.4% Year-on-Year at Rs 2899.43 Cr, while for Q2 NII stood at Rs 1433.99 Cr. In line with its market guidance, the Bank has maintained its NIM at 3.64% for the half-year (H1). The Bank's other income for H1 was at Rs 405.19 Cr while the Cost to Income Ratio for the half-year stood at

Commenting on the Bank's Q2H1 numbers, MD & CEO Amitava Chatterjee said, "In spite of widespread disruptions during the first quarter following the Pahalgam incident and the extensive damage caused by floods in the second quarter, the overall growth we have recorded is both encouraging and reas-

"Even though profitability for Q2 was moderated due to an additional impairment provision of Rs 92 Cr made during the quarter in compliance with regulatory requirements, the performance is better than what was anticipated under the challenging circumstances.", he added. Notably, the Bank has made a total provisioning of Rs 180 Cr towards Jammu and Kashmir Grameen Bank during the first two quarters of the current financial year. Excluding the



impact, the Bank's H1 profitability would be upwards of 15%

Asset-Quality

Despite difficult situation arising out of Pahalgam attack in Q1 and floods, landslides thereafter in Q2, the Bank has

gained further stability in asset quality. During the quarter, the Bank's Gross NPA Ratio has declined 18 basis-points QoQ to

3.32% and decreased by 63 bps

YoY from 3.95% recorded in Sep-

tember, 2024. The Net NPA ratio has also moderated by 9 bps YoY to 0.76% from 0.85%, while declining 6 bps from 0.82% recorded for the June quarter of current financial year. Meanwhile, Provision Coverage Ratio (PCR) of the Bank continued at above 90% level, while the Return on Assets (RoA) stood at 1.17% for the half-year.

On the Bank's asset-quality, MD & CEO expressed optimism, saying, "With GNPA around 3.30% half-way through the year, I think on asset quality front, our progress is steady. And with our robust and focused risk-management practices in place, I remain optimistic about meeting our annual guidance of below 3% GNPA by the financial year-end. Besides, our PCR is also healthy at 90.39%."

Business Growth

During the quarter, the Bank's deposits witnessed growth of 10.23% Year-on-Year basis reaching Rs 152030 Cr, while as the net advances increased by 9.38% YoY to Rs 105153 Cr from Rs 96139 Cr recorded last year. Up by 18 bps in sequential terms from 45.71% recorded in Q1, the Bank's CASA stood at 45.89% for the Q2 and continues to be one of the highest in the industry.

Regarding business growth, MD & CEO said, "Marking a nearly 10% year-on-year growth in business numbers reaching Rs 2.57 Lac Cr, our Q2 performance demonstrates the Bank's operational discipline."

"Our deposit growth is at par with the industry average, while advances primarily driven by Agri/corporate segments have shown good credit growth both in sequential and YoY terms. Our CASA ratio also exhibited a slight uptick to 45.89% on sequential basis, underscoring our commitment to sustained, quality growth", he added.

He further said, "Despite tough challenges, this steady performance in the first half of the financial year affirms my confidence that we are very much on track to achieve our annual guidance growth numbers."

Capital Adequacy

Chhattisgarh High Court verdict on Hasdeo Aranya sparks alarm over forest rights rollback

NEW DELHI, OCT 18: A recent verdict by the Chhattisgarh High Court overturning forest rights granted to a village community in the Hasdeo Aranya region has ignited sharp criticism from Congress leader Jairam Ramesh.

The judgment, which cited prior land diversion for mining and claimed that the Forest Rights Act (FRA) of 2006 does not override state control over mineral resources beneath forest land, has raised fears about the erosion of indigenous rights.

Addressing the ruling on social media platform X, Ramesh voiced his strong disapproval: "In the

latest of a series of unacceptable and unprecedented events since the Modani Government took power in Chhattisgarh, a singlejudge Bench has set aside forest rights granted to the Ghatbarra village community under the Forest Rights Act, 2006."

He questioned the court's reasoning, asserting, "The FRA guarantees villagers access to forest produce, a right that cannot be sustained without land rights. Making this conditional on government policy undermines the entire foundation of the FRA. This is a dangerous precedent."

The case centers on community forest rights recognized for the Ghatbarra villagers—Scheduled Tribes and traditional forest to Hasdeo Aranya's forests. The rights, vesting legal ownership

and occupation to communities living in forests.

Critics warn this decision risks prioritizing mining and industrial interests over the socio-economic and environmental well-being of indigenous populations. The verdict could trigger displacement, disrupt livelihoods, and cause irreparable damage to the fragile forest ecosystem.

As the debate intensifies, the ruling raises urgent questions about balancing developmental ambitions with the constitutional rights of forest-dwelling communities-highlighting the fragile state of environmental justice in resource-rich regions like Hasdeo Aranya. UNI

ED arrests key accomplice in fake passport racket run by Pakistani national

NEW DELHI, OCT 18: The

Enforcement Directorate (ED) announced today that its Kolkata Zonal Office has arrested Indubhushan Haldar, also known as Dullal, for his involvement in a case concerning Azad Hussain- a Pakistani national using the fake identity 'Ajad Mallik'.

Haldar was produced before the Special Court at Bichar Bhavan in Kolkata, which granted the ED five days of custody for further investigation.

The ED initiated its investigation under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) based on a First Information Report (FIR) registered by West Bengal Police against Ajad Mallik under the Foreigners

Investigations revealed that Azad Hussain, a Pakistani national, was living illegally in India under the assumed identity of 'Azad Mallik, son of Mona Mallik'. He was involved in fraudulently obtaining Indian identity documents for illegal immigrants from Bangladesh in exchange for money. Hussain was arrested on April 15, 2025, and is currently in judicial custody.

The ED probe further found that Hussain referred Bangladeshi clients seeking Indian passports to Indubhushan Haldar, a resident of Chakdah in Nadia. Haldar played a

pivotal role in facilitating the issuance of Indian passports for these nationals by creating forged documents for their applications, thereby generating proceeds of

Haldar, through his close association with Ajad Mallik, has been linked to facilitating passports through illegal means in approximately 250 cases so far. His anticipatory bail applications, filed before the Special PMLA Court in Kolkata and the Calcutta High Court, were both rejected.

A Prosecution Complaint under the PMLA has already been filed against Azad Hussain in 2025.

Further investigation into the matter is ongoing. UNI

ED files supplementary chargesheet against naxal leader in terror funding case

NEW DELHI, OCT 18: The Enforcement Directorate (ED), Ranchi Zonal Office, today filed a supplementary chargesheet before a special PMLA court against Dinesh Gope, the self-styled chief of the proscribed Naxal organisation, the People's Liberation Front of India (PLFI), and 19 others.

The chargesheet involves a case of terror funding and money laundering, where the total proceeds of crime generated through systematic extortion and levy collection by the PLFI are estimated to be about Rs 20 crore. The ED investigation has so far traced and identified a money laundering trail of Rs 3.36

The ED initiated its PMLA investigation based on multiple FIRs and chargesheets filed by the Jharkhand Police and the National Investigation Agency (NIA) against Dinesh Gope and his associates.

The predicate offences include a wide array of organised criminal activities such as murder, attempt to murder, extortion, and acts of terror under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act.

The investigation revealed that Dinesh Gope, as the supremo of PLFI, commanded a criminal enterprise that systematically extorted levies from contractors, businessmen, and transporters in Jharkhand and adjoining states through violence, arson, and

The probe unearthed a complex, multi-layered money laundering operation masterminded by Dinesh Gope. The modus operandi involved funneling the extorted cash into a network of shell companies fronted by his two wives, Shakuntala Kumari and Hira Devi.

These entities, having no legitimate business, were used to deposit large amounts of illicit cash into the banking system.

The funds were then layered through various complex mechanisms, including hawala transactions, a network of local money transfer operators, and third-party businesses, to obscure their criminal origin. The laundered funds were integrated into the legitimate economy through the acquisition of high-value assets, including luxury vehicles and fixed deposits, and were also used to fund the family's personal expenses.

The ED had earlier filed a prosecution somplaint against Nivesh Kumar, a key PLFI aide, for laundering money to the tune of over Rs 4 Crore, which included Rs 2 Crore received from Dinesh Gope for procuring arms and ammunition. Following this, Dinesh Gope was arrested by the ED on August 20.

In the present complaint, the ED has sought the prosecution of all 21 accused for the offence of money laundering and the confiscation of assets (comprising seized cash, bank balances, and vehicles) identified as POC. Further investigation into the matter is ongoing. UNI

PM MODI'S GST CUTS FUELS SHOPPING FRENZY AHEAD OF DIWALI

NEW DELHI, OCT 18: Prime Minister Narendra Modi's strategic GST rate cuts have unleashed an unprecedented wave of consumer spending, transforming this year's Navratri into one of the most spectacular shopping festivals in recent memory, and fueling anticipation for a historic Diwali bonanza. With inflation cooling to an eight-year low—CPI at a mere 1.54 percent and food inflation plunging into negative territory at -2.3 percent—households across India found their wallets breathing easier.

This financial relief paved the way for an exuberant festive spirit and soaring expenditure. The impact was immediate and dramatic. Festive and wedding season turnovers are projected to surpass a staggering Rs 7 lakh crore, marking India's largest consumer spending spree in years. Digital payments skyrocketed overnight, soaring from Rs 1.18 lakh crore on September 21 to a jaw-dropping Rs 11.31 lakh crore on September 22, as shoppers rushed to seize the savings sparked by GST cuts.

Delhi alone witnessed festive sales estimated at Rs 75,000 crore, while Ahmedabad saw a nearly 10 percent surge in cotton fabric demand after GST reductions on garments priced under Rs 2,500.

These policy moves have not only slashed costs but revitalized local supply chains and empowered the "Make in India" movement to reclaim market dominance. The automobile sector roared to life with its best Navratri in a decade. Maruti Suzuki doubled last year's sales, moving 1.65 lakh vehicles in just eight days, including a record-breaking 30,000 cars sold on Ashtami, the highest singleday tally in 35 years. Mahindra & Mahindra saw a 60percent jump in SUV sales, spearheaded by the XUV700 and Scorpio N. Tata Motors surpassed 50,000 vehicles sold, while two-wheeler giants Hero MotoCorp and Bajaj Auto reported double the showroom footfall compared to last

The Federation of Automobile Dealers Associations (FADA) hailed a historic 34 percent year-on-year growth in Navratri auto sales, attributing the surge to GST reforms and renewed consumer confidence. Consumer electronics also basked in the festive glory.

Sales of televisions, refrigerators, and washing machines surged sharply post-GST cuts, with premium product categories growing 40–45 percent. Haier boasted an 85 percent growth, nearly selling out its stock of

large-screen TVs. Reliance Retail, Vijay Sales, LG, and Godrej Appliances all recorded robust double-digit growth.

E-commerce platforms emerged as prime beneficiaries of the GST-driven shopping rush. Amazon India logged over 276 crore customer visits this season, with 70 percent of shoppers hailing from tier 2 and tier 3 cities.

Prime memberships swelled in smaller towns, while same-day and next-day deliveries rose 29 percent year-on-year in metro areas, and two-day deliveries increased 37 percent in smaller cities. Meesho set new records, registering 206 crore customer visits and 117 million hours of shopping during Dussehra week

Bolstered by this consumption wave, India's stock market surged with the Nifty 50 reaching a 52-week high of 25,709, buoyed by strong foreign investment inflows and a strengthened rupee. PM Modi's carefully timed GST cuts ahead of the peak festive season have done more than just lower taxes-they have empowered consumers, invigorated businesses, and reinforced India's economic resilience. This festive season, India's growth narrative shines as brightly as the Diwali diyas, illuminating the path towards a truly Viksit Bharat. UNI


Moreover, passenger vehicle dispatch has been 3.72 lakh in September alone.

NEW DELHI: The symbolism was striking. During India's main training session ahead of the first ODI against Australia, Virat Kohli was having a typically intense hit with Rohit Sharma to his left in the next net at Optus Stadium.

Shortly after, India's last two Test and ODI skippers were joined in the nets by their successor Shubman Gill, who started preparation ahead of his ODI captaincy debut as a new era begins. Having set such a commanding tone launching his Test captaincy against England, where he finished as the highest run-scorer with 754 runs at an average of 75.40, Gill has suddenly become the face of Indian

Although his predecessors, especially Kohli, still hog most of the attention publicly as gleaned by a strong Perth media presence and smattering of fans around Optus Stadium following their every move.

It could be viewed as an awkward balancing act amid a transition for this India team after Kohli and Rohit dominated the leadership over the past decade, a particularly fruitful period across formats.

But their presence will undoubtedly deflect some spotlight off Gill, who can ease into the role with the support of his sage team-mates as India make their first steps towards the 2027 World Cup.




