


#### A Ceremony Steeped in **Spiritual Essence**




















# Delhi's AQI continues to be 'very poor,' may deteriorate further

**NEW DELHI, OCT 20:** The national capital's air quality index today continued to reel under the "very poor" quality, going up a few more notches compared to the previous day.

According to the Central Pollution Control Board, the Average AQI recorded today was 345, falling under the 'very poor' category. On Sunday evening, it had crossed the 300 mark.

Amid the present scenario of the city's air quality, the Commission for Air Quality Management in the national capital region and adjoining area (CAQM) anti-pollution measures under the Graded Response Action Plan's stage-II remain invoked to prevent the situation from worsening.

The Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM) today, in its forecast, stated, "the air quality



is likely to be in the Severe category from 21.10.2025 to 22.10.2025 in case of enhanced emissions from firecrackers. The air quality is very likely to be in the Very Poor category on

23.10.2025."

As per the weather agency, it seems there are chances that the city's AQI may deteriorate further tomorrow. CAQM had yesterday invoked the GRAP-II measures along with the stage-I curbs as part of the pollution prevention plan. Measures to curb dust, like mist sprayers and others, were seen in several places to settle the

The CAQM is monitoring the situation and may take actions accordingly, in a bid to prevent the situation from worsening.

Meanwhile, as per the GRAP-2, there are several restrictions put in place in terms of construction and demolition activities and disposal of waste and other things in the city.

Under stage II of GRAP, CAQM has asked agencies concerned not to permit inter-state buses from NCR states, other than EVs, CNG, BS-6 Diesel, to enter Delhi, excluding buses and tempo travellers with an All India permit.

The committee has also urged the public to prefer public transport and take less congested routes, to prevent congestion.

The agencies responsible for implementing the orders have been asked to be strict regarding compliance, to ensure the GRAP is implemented without fail. UNI

#### Two shot dead, one injured in Greater Noida

**GREATER NOIDA, OCT 20:** A dispute between two neighbouring families over a drainage issue in Sethli village, under the Jarcha police station area of Greater Noida, turned violent this morning, resulting in the death of two family members and serious injury to another.

The families of Ajay Pal, a retired CISF Sub-Inspector, and Prince Bhati had reportedly conflicted for some time over the flow of wastewater near their homes. Tensions had escalated the previous day, and the situation worsened the next morning.

According to police reports, Prince Bhati allegedly contacted some acquaintances, who arrived in two vehicles, a Swift and a Thar. The group is said to have confronted Ajay Pal's family near their residence. A verbal argument quickly escalated, and a physical altercation broke out.

As the situation intensified, members of the visiting group reportedly attacked Ajay Pal and his family members. During the clash, shots were fired, injuring Ajay Pal and his nephew, Dipanshu Bhati.



Another young man was also hurt during the incident. Local residents immediately took the injured to the hospital, where doctors declared Ajay Pal and Dipanshu Bhati dead. The third victim remains hospitalised in critical condition.

After the incident, the suspects left the scene in their vehicles. In response, family members of the deceased and local residents gathered outside the nearby police outpost and blocked GTRoad, demanding the arrest of the accused.

Police officials from Jarcha station arrived on the scene and assured the protestors of swift and strict action. Following assurances from the police, the protest was called off and the road cleared. The bodies of the deceased were sent for post-mortem

DCP Saad Miya Khan confirmed the details of the incident, stating, "In the Sethli outpost area, a violent incident occurred in which two people, Ajay Pal and Dipanshu Bhati, lost their lives. An FIR has been registered based on the family's complaint against Prince Bhati, Bobby Tomar, and Manoj Nagar."

The DCP added that four police teams have been formed to investigate the case and locate the suspects. Some individuals have been detained for questioning, and the investigation is ongoing. UNI

#### Govt opens 99 percent of offshore area for oil & gas exploration, widens crude import basket: Puri

NEW DELHI, OCT 20: union Minister for Petroleum Hardeep Singh Puri today announced that the government has widened the import basket of crude to over 40 countries, up from 27 earlier. Furthermore, the country has opened up 99 percent of India's offshore area for oil and gas exploration.

The Minister said the move is part of a fourpronged approach that is shaping "a future where energy is secure, affordable & sustainable." These four strong pillars for India's energy journey include: diversification of crude imports, innovation, an increase in domestic exploration of oil & gas, and a clean transition reflected in the Green Hydrogen

Mission and the 10.60 crore families who have benefited under the 'Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana' for subsidised LPG as clean cooking fuel.

Taking to social media platform X, Minister Puri said, "Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, Bharat is building a cleaner, stronger and self-sufficient energy



Puri reiterated that India has diversified its sources for buying oil in the global market, previously pointing out that India's oil purchases from Moscow played an important role in stabilising prices in the global market.

The Minister highlighted that crude oil prices could have skyrocketed to \$130 per barrel in the absence of the India-Russia oil trade when the Ukraine war began in 2022; prior to the conflict, India used to buy a mere 0.2 percent of its crude import requirement from Moscow.

Earlier this week, Puri also held discussions with Geraldo Alckmin, Vice President and Minister of Development, Industry, Trade and Services of Brazil,  $on strengthening the \, expanding \, energy \, partner ship$ between India and Brazil, noting that the meeting  $focused on the growing \, energy \, cooperation \, between$ the two nations under the dynamic leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. ## Delhi govt releases Rs 325 cr for education, student development in 2025-26

**NEW DELHI, OCT 20:** The Delhi government has released Rs 325 crore so far in the fiscal 2025-2026 for the overall development of students and strengthening modern education infrastructure in the national Capital.

According to the Chief Minister's Office (CMO), Rs 108 crore has been provided to 12 colleges affiliated with Delhi University for salaries, infrastructure, and operations, to make higher education institutions more efficient and well-organised.

Taking to social media platform X, the CMO today stated that an additional Rs 24 crore has been approved for maintenance and sanitation, ensuring campuses remain clean, safe, and conducive to learning.

# Diwali security beef-up: Delhi Police deploy personnel to ensure safety measures

**NEW DELHI, OCT 20:** Ahead of Diwali, Delhi Police have put in place a comprehensive, multitiered security plan across the national capital to ensure residents can celebrate safely, an official statement said.

Enhanced security measures have been deployed at major markets, busy public areas, and commercial centres with heavy foot-

Delhi Police has stationed sufficient personnel in all districts, supported by the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF), to bolster

security on the ground.

during the festive season, Delhi Traffic Police has deployed maximum personnel to manage vehicles, ensure pedestrian safety, and facilitate smooth movement for the public.

Regular traffic advisories are being issued, providing updates on restrictions, diversions, designated parking areas, and essential guidelines for commuters.

Authorities have urged the public to adhere to traffic rules, follow official instructions, opt for public transport, and minimise the use of personal vehicles whenever possible.

# JNU: STUDENT UNION PRESIDENT AMONG 28 DETAINED; 6 POLICE PERSONNEL INJURED DURING ABVP PROTEST

**NEW DELHI, OCT 20:** At least 28 Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) students were detained during a protest march to the Vasant Kunj police station, sparking tension on campus

While left-affiliated student groups accused the Delhi Police of using force, the police alleged the protesters broke barricades and injured personnel.

The All India Students' Association (AISA) alleged that JNUSU president Nitish Kumar and several students were "brutally assaulted" and detained by police at the university's West Gate. JNU students were

seen being pushed into buses commotion led to the detention by Delhi Police personnel in videos that surfaced on social

The JNU Students' union (JNUSU) and left-affiliated student groups held a march yesterday demanding that police register an FIR against the RSSlinked ABVP for alleged violence during campus general body meetings. Conflict erupted at JNU's West Gate, with police and students protesting and pointing fingers at one another

over who started the scuffle. According to police, students became aggressive despite assurances that their concerns would be addressed and manhandled officers. The ensuing

of 28 students and the injuries of six police personnel.

Meanwhile, the All India Students' Association (AISA) claimed that JNUSU president Nitish Kumar and several other students were "brutally beaten" and detained by police at JNU's West Gate. "Delhi Police have taken Nitish and the students to Kapasera," the group said.

A senior police officer said around 6 pm, roughly 70-80 students gathered at JNU's West Gate, where barricades had been set up to prevent them from moving towards Nelson Mandela Marg. "Despite repeated warnings, the students forcefully pushed past the barricades, manhandled police personnel, used abusive language, and entered Nelson Mandela Marg, causing a temporary traffic obstruction," the officer quoted.

Reacting to the JNU incident, former JNUSU leader and Congress politician Kanhaiya Kumar wrote on X that the ABVP has been persistently trying to create disruptions since the

Student union election was announced.

"It is extremely shameful that assaults have been carried out on several people, including the current president of JNUSU. In such a situation, instead of taking action against the culprits, the police administration is engaged in protecting them," he wrote.

Adding to his statement further in the post, he stated, "For the past ten years, despite all the attempts by RSS-ABVP-BJP, the government, and their sycophantic media to defame JNU, JNU is fighting back, and just like every time before, this time too they will fail in their intentions." UNI



# **Armed Forces Coordination Brought** Pakistan To Its Knees: PM Modi

**PANAJI, OCT 20:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday said the exceptional coordination among the three armed forces -" fear instilled by the Navy, extraordinary skills of the Air Force and bravery of the Army -" forced Pakistan to its knees during Operation Sindoor in no time.

Addressing the Navy personnel onboard INS Vikrant off the Goa coast, he said the indigenously built aircraft carrier was a "powerful symbol of Aatmanirbhar Bharat' and its handover to the Navy led to renouncement of a major colonial legacy.


"A few months ago we had seen how INS Vikrant had given Pakistan some sleepless nights. INS Vikrant, the name itself puts an end to the courage of the enemy," Modi said. Modi spent a night onboard INS Vikrant and witnessed the Navy's air power at the high seas with MiG 27 aircraft demonstrating its skills on the aircraft carrier built at the Cochin

He said that when the enemy is in front and war is imminent, the side that possesses the strength to fight independently always holds the advantage.

"The fear instilled by the Indian Navy, the extraordinary skill demonstrated by the Indian Air Force, and the bravery of the Indian Army, along with the exceptional coordination among all three services, brought Pakistan on its knees swiftly during Operation Sindoor," the prime minister said, adding that the armed forces deserved a special salute for their actions.

"For the armed forces to be strong, self-reliance is essential," he said, asserting that over the years India's forces have steadily advanced towards selfreliance.

## Flash floods delayed completion of hydel power projects: Chatterjee

SRINAGAR, OCT 20: Jammu and Kashmir Bank MD and CEO Amitava Chatterjee on Monday said the flash floods caused by heavy rains a couple of months earlier have delayed the completion of hydel power projects in the Union Territory by three to five months.

He, however, said that while there was no direct impact of it on the bank as of now, there was a possibility of cost overrun in these

Jammu and Kashmir has been battered by a series of natural calamities like cloudbursts, extremely heavy rains and huge landslides in the past couple of months, which left several dead,

flattened infrastructure, and upended normal life.

"Most of the infrastructure projects, like the hydel (power) projects which are in progress in the state, are being delayed by three to five months. That is the negative impact that has happened (due to rains and floods).

"We had a review recently. The DCCO (Date of Commencement

and Commercial Operations) has been impacted by three to five months, which will impact the commercial production, and that will again have a negative impact,' Chatterjee said in an interview.

However, he said, there is no direct impact of it on the bank. "Our funding is in place. Mostly, in all these units, we have a share from our bank. The progress has

been halted, but I don't see a major cost overrun. I have spoken to these (executing) companies, and they can fund it on their own."

There are five major power projects with a combined generation capacity of nearly 3,100 megawatts, which are currently at various stages of construction in

Jammu and Kashmir. These Turn on Page 10

# GMC Handwara's Associated Teaching Hospital Set to Transform Healthcare Infrastructure in Kupwara

**HANDWARA, OCT 20:** A major milestone in the healthcare development of north Kashmir is underway with the construction of the Associated Teaching Hospital at Government Medical College (GMC) Handwara. The state-ofthe-art facility, being executed by the Roads and Buildings (R&B) Division Handwara at an estimated cost of ₹60 crore, is poised to become one of the most advanced medical infrastructures in the region. The hospital, designed as a 200-bedded facility, will span a plinth area of 2,500 sqm and a built-up area of around 12,000 sqm, spread over five storeys (G+4). Once completed, it will enhance the healthcare capacity of Handwara to a total of 500 beds, significantly strengthening patient care services across district Kupwara.

According to AEE R&B Division Handwara, Er. Mohd Hussain, the new complex will include four modular operation theatres, seven lecture halls, a modern conference hall, modular wards, doctor-onduty rooms, HOD offices, and nurse stations, along with an inbuilt canteen. The structure will feature modern lifts, ramps, modular washrooms, and noise-proof windows and doors to ensure a patientfriendly environment.Despite challenges such as late site handover, limited construction space, uneven terrain, and high traffic flow, the project has recorded remarkable progress. Officially launched in April 2025, the work has already achieved around 30% completion, with the target date for completion set for March 2026. Meanwhile, Executive Engineer R&B Division Handwara, Farooq Ahmad Shah, emphasized that this



project marks a first-of-its-kind modern construction in the district, designed with advanced engineering standards and sound-proof infrastructure.

"The site posed several challenges, from uneven contours and space constraints to traffic congestion, but our team worked tirelessly even in double shifts to keep the work on track," said Shah. "We are grateful to the district administration, the contractor, and our engineering staff for their dedication. With continued support, we are confident of completing it within the stipulated timeframe."Once operational, the Associated Teaching Hospital will not only bolster GMC Handwara's  $a cade mic \, and \, clinical \, capabilities \,$ but also serve as a regional healthcare hub, addressing the rising patient load from Kupwara district and neighboring areas.

# With winter around developmental works come to standstill in Kashmir

The summer season has already come to an end in the Kashmir valley and the autumn season is in progress. As on date the day temperature is in 20s and the night temperature between 7 and 8 degrees Celsius. In such a scenario it becomes very difficult to carry out the developmental works in the Kashmir division and all such works come to a standstill.

Most of the people living in multiple areas of the Kashmir valley are up in arms since they complain that macadamization has not been carried out in such areas. These people say that since the winter season is knocking at the doors it is virtually impossible to carry macadamization now. Since there are maximum chances that the macadamization cannot be taken up in Kashmir this all important developmental aspect would not be covered this year and people would have to wait until next year.

The legislators of the different assembly segments have complained that their constituency development fund (CDF) was not released on time and the same resulted in delay in taking up the developmental works in their respective constituencies. Given this situation the allocation of funds for the different developmental activities could not be done on time and there was a delay in taking up as well as execution of developmental works across the valley. The same has led to problems for the common masses more so when winter is round the corner.

Some years back during the PDP-BJP rule then works minister had claimed that macadam can be laid in Kashmir during winter as a chemical named as Evotherm is added to the same due to which the macadam does not come off the roads during winter even at freezing temperatures. For a year or so the process was carried out but the plan was shelved as complaints came that the macadam had come off from the roads after it was laid in winter season.

If the incumbent government is serious in laying macadam during winter in Kashmir it should consult the experts in the field. If the experts give their nod for laying of macadam during winter in Kashmir then the process should be taken forward. This would come as a huge relief for the common masses and they would believe that the present government is the government of the people in real sense. Any failure in this regard would not go well with the people and the politicians would have to face the music.



# Sir Syed Ahmad Khan:

# Educational Pioneer and Contested Religious Reformer



Sir Syed emphasized

rational inquiry,

scientific thinking, and the reinterpretation of Islamic history to align with modern sensibilities. His insistence on the study of Western sciences alongside religious studies reflected a commitment to intellectual adaptability, a trait essential for survival in the colonial and postcolonial world. In the broader panorama of 19th-century Indian Muslim reform, Sir Syed stands out as a figure who blended social activism with educational innovation, leaving a legacy that continues to shape the community's intellectual infrastructure. Despite his undeniable achievements in education, Sir Syed's approach to religion remains a matter of significant debate



Sir Syed Ahmad Khan (1817–1898) occupies a pivotal place in the history of modern India, particularly in the context of Muslim social and educational reform. His legacy is often celebrated for the founding of the Muhammadan Anglo-Oriental College in Aligarh, which later became Aligarh Muslim University, an institution that dramatically transformed the educational and socio-economic landscape for Indian Muslims. Yet, alongside this monumental contribution, Sir Syed's intellectual and religious positions invite critical scrutiny. While he undeniably catalyzed the modernization of Muslim society in India, his approach to religion, theology, and engagement with Western knowledge reflects serious deviations from orthodox Islamic  $teachings. A \, balanced \, appraisal \, must \, examine \, both$ dimensions: the transformative impact of his educational initiatives and the controversies arising from his religious misgivings. The most celebrated achievement of Sir Syed is undoubtedly the establishment of educational institutions designed to empower Indian Muslims in a rapidly changing colonial context. Following the catastrophic defeat of the Indian Muslim elite in the 1857 Revolt against the British, Muslims faced severe socio-economic marginalization. Sir Syed recognized that without modern education and proficiency in English, Muslims would be excluded from the emerging administrative and professional opportunities under British rule. The founding of the Muhammadan Anglo-Oriental College in 1875 was therefore a strategic response to this crisis. The Aligarh institution not only imparted Western-style education, including science, literature, and administrative skills, but also became a hub for social mobility. It produced generations of professionals-civil servants, engineers, teachers, and scholars—who gained employment in government and private sectors. By linking education with tangible economic and administrative opportunities, Sir Syed helped uplift a community that had been rendered vulnerable and politically marginalized. In this sense, his contribution to Muslim society was both pragmatic and visionary: he created pathways for social and economic empowerment in a context of colonial subjugation. Furthermore, Sir Syed emphasized rational inquiry, scientific thinking, and the rein $terp retation \, of \, Is lamic \, history \, to \, a lign \, with \, modern \,$ sensibilities. His insistence on the study of Western sciences alongside religious studies reflected a commitment to intellectual adaptability, a trait  $essential for survival \, in \, the \, colonial \, and \, post colonial \,$ world. In the broader panorama of 19th-century Indian Muslim reform, Sir Syed stands out as a figure who blended social activism with educational innovation, leaving a legacy that continues to shape the community's intellectual infrastructure. Despite his undeniable achievements in education, Sir Syed's approach to religion remains a matter of significant debate. His engagement with Western thought, while intellectually pioneering, led him to reinterpret Islamic doctrines in ways that many scholars consider departures from orthodox teachings. Sir Syed's insistence on rationalist and historical-critical approaches to the Quran and Hadith, his engagement with comparative religion, and his promotion of a rationalist interpretation of Islam were controversial. For instance, he often emphasized reason over traditional jurisprudence, and his writings reflect a tendency to harmonize Islamic principles with European rationalist thought. While this approach was intended to make Islam intellectually palatable to a Western-educated audience, it raised questions about fidelity to classical Islam-

ic scholarship. Sir Syed's controversial stance on

certain theological issues, including the status of miracles, the interpretation of Prophetic traditions, and the role of Islamic law in contemporary governance, also attracted criticism. Many scholars argue that his rationalist tendencies diluted core religious principles and encouraged a selective reading of Islamic sources. His willingness to accommodate Western epistemology sometimes resulted in what critics consider religious compromises, weakening the authoritative weight of classical scholarship in favor of pragmatic alignment with colonial modernity. Moreover, Sir Syed's historical interpretation of events like the 1857 Revolt reflected a tendency to exonerate British policies and downplay Muslim resistance. By portraying the revolt as a religiously misguided uprising rather than a legitimate struggle against colonial oppression, he alienated traditional scholars and pious segments of society. Critics argue that this approach contributed to a religious and intellectual disjunction between Aligarh's modernist elites and the broader Muslim populace, fostering an enduring tension between reformist and orthodox strands in Indian Islam. The dual nature of Sir Syed's legacy is evident in how his contributions reshaped Muslim society while simultaneously creating ideological fissures. On one hand, his institutions equipped Muslims with the tools to survive and thrive in the modern world. They fostered critical thinking, technical competence, and administrative skill—qualities essential for navigating colonial India's complex socio-political landscape. On the other hand, his religious misgivings and selective adaptation of Islamic principles fostered a trend of rationalist reform that many considered a deviation from traditional religious norms. This duality has implications for understanding contemporary Muslim identity in South Asia. Aligarh graduates and their intellectual descendants have often pursued modernist, secular, and reformist agendas, sometimes at odds with orthodox scholarship. While this has enabled Muslims to engage effectively in professional and political spheres, it has also generated debates over authenticity, religious authority, and the balance between tradition and modernity. Sir Syed's life exemplifies the tension between pragmatic accommodation and theological fidelity—a tension that continues to shape Muslim intellectual debates today. In sum, Sir Syed Ahmad Khan remains a towering figure in the history of modern Indian Muslim reform, yet his legacy is neither unambiguously positive nor free from criticism. His establishment of educational institutions and advocacy for scientific and administrative literacy significantly transformed the social and economic prospects of Indian Muslims, providing avenues of empowerment previously unavailable. However, his rationalist reinterpretation of Islam, selective engagement with Western thought, and occasional deviations from orthodox religious teachings expose the limitations of his approach. A critical assessment of Sir Syed must therefore balance these dimensions. He was a visionary reformer who understood the practical necessities of his time but simultaneously a thinker whose theological choices sparked enduring debates within Muslim intellectual circles. His life reminds us that reform and modernization are complex processes: they can empower communities materially while challenging long-held religious and cultural frameworks. The legacy of Sir Syed Ahmad Khan is, thus, both inspirational and cautionary—highlighting the transformative power of education and the perils of theological

KATHUA, OCT 20: In a landmark move for the agrarian landscape of Jasrota, Rajiv Jasrotia, MLA Jasrota, today inaugurated the Paddy Procurement Mandi (Registration-cum-Facilitation Centre) at Dhanni Bhakhta, Block Barnoti—a remote Kandi region that now stands to benefit more than 35 Panchayats. Prominent among those present on the occasion included Chief Agriculture Officer Kathua, Jitendra Khajuria and his worthy team, SDAO Ashwani Sharma, BDO Barnoti Suraj Singh, AEE PWD Mahesh, AEE PHE Himanshu, XEN Flood Control Kathua ,Abnish Kumar, Sarpnachs Shivdev Singh, Balwant Singh, Randeep Singh, several Pancha and hundreds of promi-

Speaking on the occasion, Jasrotia said that newly-established centre is designed to ensure smooth, transparent, and timely procurement of paddy at the Minimum Support Price (MSP) of ₹2,369 per quintal for Common Paddy and ₹2,389 per quintal for Grade-A Paddy, thereby guaranteeing fair and assured returns to local farmers. He emphasised that such centres will strengthen the rural economy, eliminate middlemen and empower farming communities. He noted that the establishment of the Paddy Mandi in Jasrota Constituency fulfils a persistent demand of local farmers, offering better accessibility and convenience.

Jasrotia reiterated the government's unwavering commitment to farmer welfare through improved procurement infrastructure, enhanced transparency, and prompt payment disbursement. have proven their capabilities during Operation Sindoor. Several countries around the world are now interested in purchasing these missiles," Modi said.

He said that the armed forces have identified thousands of items that will no longer be imported, resulting in most essential military equipment now being manufactured domestically.

He said that in the last 11 years, India's defence production has more than tripled, crossing Rs 1.5 lakh crore last year.

A by-election was necessitated in Nagrota by the demise of BJP legislator Devender Singh Rana on October 31 last year, while the Budgam seat fell vacant following Chief Minister Omar Abdullah retained Ganderbal — his family's bastion — after winning the two assembly seats.

According to the order, all offices shall reopen at Jammu, the winter capital, on November 3.

Lt Governor Manoj Sinha-led administration had scrapped the Darbar Move tradition

'The restoration of Darbar Move is a very big decision of the NC-led government as it will not only benefit shopkeepers in Raghunath Bazar or Afsara road but will revive the age-old tradition and bring people closer," Choudhary said.

He alleged that the BJP is expected to fight the elections on misleading narratives and dividing people on the basis of their religion, creed and caste.

"The people are expected to vote for the ruling party candidate rather than the opposition for overall development. The 28 BJP legislators could do nothing for the people in their constituencies during the recent floods," the deputy CM said.

months in preventive custody.

Justice M.A. Chowdhary, while delivering the judgment, observed that the authorities had violated key constitutional safeguards guaranteed under Article 22(5) of the Constitution. The court noted that the detaining authority had failed to inform Bhatti of his right to make a representation against the detention order and had not provided him with the complete material relied upon for his detention.

Waqar Bhatti, aged 40 and a resident of Saaj village in Thanamandi Tehsil, was detained under Order No. DMR/PSA/01 of 2025 issued on February 21 by the District Magistrate of Rajouri. His detention was challenged through a habeas corpus petition filed by his brother, Ghulam Mustafa Bhatti, before the High Court at Jammu.

The District Magistrate had cited several FIRs registered between 2018 and 2025, along with a police DDR entry, to justify the detention, alleging that Bhatti posed a threat to public order. However, the court found that the grounds of detention were a "photocopy of the police dossier," indicating a lack of independent application of mind by the authorities.

The judgment also pointed out that Bhatti had not been supplied with the entire record supporting his detention, nor was the material explained to him in a language he understood. The court observed that the failure to do so amounted to a denial of a fair opportunity to contest the order.

Justice Chowdhary further criticized the administration for suppressing facts, noting that Bhatti had already been acquitted in one of the FIRs cited in the detention order-FIR No. 303/2018 under Section 124-A RPC registered at Police Station Bahu Fort, Jammu.

In a strong defense of personal liberty, the court stated that "personal liberty is one of the most cherished freedoms" and emphasized that even a minor violation of procedural safeguards warrants the quashing of a detention

Following the court's order, Bhatti was released from District Jail Kathua. His wife, Roohi Bhatti, expressed relief over the decision, saying, "Waqar was detained in February, and it has been a long and painful wait for our family. We are relieved that the court finally restored his liberty." She added that her husband was booked in multiple cases due to his outspoken views.

The High Court concluded that the detention was unsustainable and directed that Waqar Bhatti be released from preventive custody immediately unless required in connection with any other case. (KNT)

Other districts with reported infections include Reasi (42), Rajouri (52), Poonch (25), Doda (24), Ramban (29), and Kishtwar (7). Additionally, 23 cases have been reported from Kashmir division and 41 from outside states.

An official told KNO that a total of 20,277 tests have been conducted this year. "Out of the confirmed cases, only 45 patients required hospitalisation, while nine are still under treatment. One resident of J&K succumbed to the disease at DMC Ludhiana," he said.

He cautioned that with no specific vaccine or antiviral treatment available for dengue, prevention remains the most effective strategy. "People must adopt preemptive measures to combat this painful infection by destroying mosquito breeding sites and maintaining clean surroundings," he added.

Health experts said that dengue, caused by the Aedes aegypti mosquito, continues to pose a major public health challenge in the region.

"The Aedes mosquitoes breed in stagnant water found in flower pots, buckets, discarded tyres, and even bottle caps. Eliminating these water sources is the first line of defense," they said, adding that people should regularly clean water containers, use mosquito repellents, and wear full-sleeved clothes to minimise exposure.

The doctors advised that denguecarrying mosquitoes are most active during early morning and late afternoon hours, and people should use mosquito nets or screens while sleeping, even during the day.

They said the common symptoms of dengue include high fever, severe headache, pain behind the eyes, muscle and joint pain, nausea, vomiting, and rashes. "Warning signs of severe dengue include abdominal pain, persistent vomiting, bleeding gums or nose, blood in vomit or stools, fatigue, or restlessness. Such cases require immediate medical attention," they warned.

J&K has witnessed fluctuating dengue patterns in recent years. The Union Territory reported around 7,000 cases in 2024, 6,403 in 2023, and the highest-ever 8,269 cases in 2022, which also saw 18 deaths. In contrast, dengue was almost negligible a decade ago, with only two cases reported in 2009 and none in 2010.

Health authorities have once again urged citizens to join hands in combating dengue by ensuring cleanliness and removing stagnant water from their surroundings—(KNO)

projects include Ratle (850 MW), Pakal Dul (1,000 MW), Kiru (624 MW), Kwar (540 MW) and Parnai (38 MW).

Asked if the bank has seen any surge in borrowings from the flood-affected areas, Chatterjee said there has not been any indication of such a thing.

They have not come as an opportunity yet. All (rehabilitation) efforts are being taken care of at a level where they have not asked for any funding from the bank," he added.

Chatterjee said the inclement weather and the closure of the national highway did affect the horticulture sector in the Valley, but the people have shown resilience and are heading back to nor-

"It will be wrong to say if I say it has not affected. It has affected, but not to the extent I had expected. The Union Territory government has declared this event as a disturbed geography for the purpose of application of the RBI's master policy on agriculture. We have already implemented it. So far, only 85 units have come to us with a request for rehabilita-

"Now consider that almost 2.35 lakh units are eligible for it, for a total amount of Rs 16,000 crore — that is the basket that is available. But only 85 people have come. That shows the resilience in the people in this economy," he added.

Chatterjee said people have been affected adversely as the revenue streams have slowed down.

I have spoken to the business people here, especially from the tourism industry; it has been very badly affected. Tourists are coming, but they are generally budget tourists; the high-end tourists are not yet coming here. It will take some time for this to totally recover," he

Chatterjee said he was very hopeful that the economy would be able to

recover. "As a bank, we will be providing all kinds of relief. That will have two impacts - it will help the business directly to get up and running once again through our support, and the application of that master circular will reduce the stress in our accounts. Both ways will be benefi-

cial," he said. Reflecting on the second quarter results, which were released last week, the MD said the growth story of the bank

was going strong. "If you are talking about profits, you need to understand there was a one-time impact of the merger of Ellaquai Dehati Bank with JK Grameen Bank. As per the latest RBI guidelines, we had to provide for investment impairment of Rs 180

crore during this half-year. "If you add back that Rs 180 crore, the profit is 20 per cent. Effectively, the growth story is extremely good. If you look at what has happened in quarter two as far as the top line is concerned, both in deposits and advances, we have grown better than what we had grown

last year," he said. Chatterjee said the regional rural bank that was merged with JK Grameen Bank was in very bad shape, but has now

been turned around. "It has posted profits for this quarter. There is another positive that we will be able to write back these provisions in subsequent quarters. So, that will again

add to the profits," he said. On NPAs, the bank MD said, "We have brought the NPAs below three per cent and are on course to bring it on par with the industry standard of less than two per cent by the end of the

current fiscal". Chatterjee said the bank was on course for another year of record profits as all guidance for the 2025-26 fiscal

year was being achieved so far. "The guidance that we have given, I am sure we will achieve 12 per cent improvement in credit top line, 10 per cent improvement in liability, and another record profit. We would have been much better placed if not for the impairment provision for the regional rural bank," he added. (Agencies)

# Salt, Brook fireworks set up crushing England win

**CHRISTCHURCH:** Phil Salt and Harry Brook combined to blow New Zealand out of the water in the second T20I, as England sealed a dominant 65-run win in Christchurch to take an insurmountable 1-0 lead in this three-match series.

Both Salt (85 off 56 balls) and Brook (78 off35) were independently brutal but came together in devastating fashion with a partnership of 129 from just 69 deliveries. England's 236 for 4 was a new record T20I score at Hagley Oval, comfortably bumping off the previous best of 208 with 10 balls still to go in their innings. New Zealand were eventually dismissed for 171 with two overs to spare. Mitchell Santner's decision to bowl first upon winning the toss was a case of rinse-and-repeat; both teams opting for the same XIs after Saturday's washout in the first T20I. Unfortunately for the Black Caps skipper, this was a truer surface than the one which saw England scrape to 153 for 6.

Drier with more pace, Santner's bowlers were up against it from the off, with all six used posting double-figure economy rates. They were not helped by two dropped catches that would have given them a more

The one that mattered more gave Brook a life on 40, after he had successfully overturned a caught behind decision on 22. The visiting captain was at his destructive best, with 54 runs through boundaries, including five sixes, two of which were carted out of the ground. Despite Kyle Jamieson accounting for both Brook and then Salt in the space of three deliveries, Tom Banton's unbeaten 29 from 12 added the record-busting cherry on top.

Brydon Carse's twin strikes in the secondover clipped the Kiwis' wings in pursuit of 237. And though Tim Seiffert and Mark Chapman restarted the chase with an engaging stand of 69, their respective demises to the spin duo of Adil Rashid and Liam Dawson all but confirmed the result.

Santner did his utmost to inject some late jeopardy with a breezy 36 off 15, before falling to Rashid's final delivery, the legspinner finishing a solid evening's work with 4 for 32. Luke Wood then had the honour of capping of fvictory in the 18 th over with twodismissals in four deliveries, with New Zealand losing all 10 wickets to catches.

This new iteration of Salt is developing a knack of cashing in after missing out. His career-best 141 not out against South Africa in September came two days after a first-ball duck. And with as many days since 3 off 4 in the first T20 I at Hagley Oval, he looked oncourse for a fifth century in the format.

No doubt Salt will feel he missed out in a different way, falling for 85 when he was caught on the long-off sponge, 15 short of three figures with as many balls of the innings remaining. Once again he spearheaded a record total a month after leading the breaching of 300. He upheld his first-over responsibility by putting Matt Henry's second ball on to the grass bank at midwicket, then whipping behind square leg along the floor once Henry had corrected. By the time Jos Buttler faced his second ball, Salt had already struck 20 from nine. That was as dominant as Salt was in his stands. Once Buttler was dismissed for 4, he adopted a secondary role during his work with Bethell (scoring 19 of their 44 together) and Brook (46 of their 129). Hardly a passenger but more than happy to cede the driving.
