9-day autumn session of J&K **Assembly to begin today**

SRINAGAR, OCT 22: The nine-day autumn session of the Jammu & Kashmir Legislative Assembly is expected to be stormy, with opposition parties gearing up to corner the ruling National Conference (NC)-led government over a range of issues.

The session, comprising six sittings, will begin tomorrow with obituary references for six former legislators who passed away after the last budget session held in Jammu.

The proceedings are expected to be stormy, with the opposition expected to target the government over governance failures, unfulfilled promises made in the NC's election manifesto, demands for statehood, and reservationrelated concerns.

Talking to news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Leader of Opposition Sunil Sharma said the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) will demand accountability from the NC-led government for what he described as a "betrayal of electoral promises." "The government has failed to deliver on its commitments made during the elections—whether it is the promise of 200 free units of electricity, 12 LPG cylinders per household, or other assurances given to the

SRINAGAR, OCT 22: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Wednesday exuded hope that the National Conference (NC) would emerge victorious in all four seats in the Rajya Sabha elections, slated to be held on October 24. He also urged the Leader of Opposition (LoP) in the Legislative Assembly, Sunil Sharma, to stop issuing baseless statements.

On the sidelines of the joint strategy meeting, the Chief Minister, told media persons that ahead of every Assembly session, a Legislature Party Meeting is conducted, and today, NC and other independents held a meeting to devise a strategy.

"This session is different from others as elections for the Rajya Sabha are being held, and a strategy was being prepared to secure victory in all the seats," he said, terming today's meeting as significant.

Nagrota Bypoll: BJP's Devyani Youngest Candidate, Vows To Fulfil Father Devender Singh Rana's Dream

JAMMU, OCT 22: From a young entrepreneur to a political hopeful, 30-year-old Devyani Rana has stepped into the electoral arena of Jammu and Kashmir's Nagrota Assembly constituency, determined to carry forward the legacy of her late father and senior BJP leader Devender Singh Rana. Riding high on a wave of public sympa-

thy and goodwill, she has vowed to secure a resounding victory and transform Nagrota into a model constituency based on 360-degree development.

The Nagrota bypoll is slated to be held on November 11. It was necessitated following the demise of BJP legislator Devender Singh Rana on October 31 last year.

The BJP officially named Devyani as its candidate from Nagrota on Wednesday.

Filing her nomination papers as the youngest among 12 candidates contesting the Nagrota bypoll, Devyani described herself as the people's "sevadar". She said that she had promised her father on his deathbed to fulfil his unfinished dreams.

Doctors call for using iodised salt to combat iodine deficiency

Warn lapses in iodine intake can lead to serious health issues

SRINAGAR, OCT 22: "There is a need for consuming iodised salt to prevent iodine deficiency - a silent but serious nutritional disorder that continues to affect millions across the globe," doctors in Kashmir said.

Although awareness about the

use of iodised salt has improved significantly in Jammu and Kashmir, experts warn that lapses in its use can still lead to grave health complications, particularly among women and children.

Speaking to the news agency— Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Dr Shabir Ahmad Dar from the Directorate of Health Services

is a vital micronutrient required for the production of thyroid hormones, which regulate metabolism, growth, and development.

"When the body does not get enough iodine, the thyroid gland enlarges in an attempt to capture more iodine from the bloodstream, leading to the formation of a goi-

Kashmir (DHSK) said that iodine tre—a visible swelling in the neck," Dr Dar said that iodine defi-

ciency is one of the leading causes of preventable brain damage in children. "In pregnant women, the deficiency can lead to miscarriages, stillbirths, and mental disability in newborns. Children born to iodine-deficient mothers often

suffer from developmental delays, stunted growth, and lower IQ levels," he added.

Dr Bashir Ahmad Mir, a paediatrician, said that despite significant progress under the National Iodine Deficiency Disorders Control Programme (NID-DCP), there is still a need for

people," Sharma said. He further said that the BJP will question the government on its inability to create employment opportunities for the youth. "In the election, the government promised to create one lakh jobs for the youth, but they have done nothing. We will ask them what they have done for the youth in the past year," he added.

Meanwhile, smaller Kashmir-based opposition parties such as the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), Peoples Conference (PC), and Awami Ittehad Party (AIP) are expected to agitate over issues like statehood restoration, reservation rationalisation, and other challenges confronting the region.

As previously reported, the Assembly Secretariat has disallowed a resolution submitted by Peoples Conference president Sajad Gani Lone seeking the restoration of statehood, citing that the matter is sub

The focal point of the session will be three government bills slated for introduction. The cabinet has already approved amendments to the Jammu & Kashmir Panchayati Raj Act, 1989, and the Goods & Services Tax Act, 2017, along with the enactment of the Jammu and Kashmir Shops and Business Establishments Bill, 2025.

The Legislative Assembly Secretariat has received 450 questions, 13 private members' bills, and 55 private members' resolutions for the session. Additionally, 33 private members' bills submitted during the last Assembly session remain pending and will be given priority on October 28-the day designated for private members' business. However, many of these bills are unlikely to be introduced in the House.

Meanwhile, the Business Advisory Committee of the Assembly met today in the Speaker's office to discuss the allocation of time for legislative business during the session-(KNO)

The NC will also deliberate on the Rajya Sabha elections for four seats from Jammu and Kashmir, which will be held on Friday.

The NC had invited alliance partner Congress also to the meeting, but no one from the national party has turned up so far.

J&K Congress president Tariq Hamid Karra also convened a meeting of the Congress legislature party at the party headquarters.

The meeting was in progress when the NC meeting began less than a kilometre away.

The relations between the two alliance partners have been said to be strained after the regional party refused to give a "safe seat" to the national party for the Rajya Sabha elections.

Congress was reportedly offered the seat where it was expected to face a stiff contest from the BJP.

Congress refused to field a candidate and also did not take up the NC offer of contesting the bypoll in the Nagrota assembly segment, where polling will be held next month.

The NC has fielded its candidates for four Raiya Sabha seats as well as the Nagrota assembly Bypoll.

Private member's resolutions are generally balloted before they can be scheduled for discussion in the House.

The MMU is a conglomerate of religious bodies headed by Hurriyat Conference chairman Mirwaiz Umar Farooq, which believes that the 2025 Waqf Amendment Act undermines Muslim control over religious trusts and is discriminatory.

Furthermore, the Chief Minister, while replying to a query about Congress's nonparticipation in the meeting, said that they did not join as they had their own meeting. "Congress has always maintained that they will not allow the BJP to emerge victorious. Congress has its own system. There is a difference between their party and ours. They have to wait for the party high command's decision, whereas we take decisions here," he said.

'The Congress high command cannot be in favour of the BJP," he said, referring to Congress's participation in the Rajya Sabha elections. He added that although, at the local level, Congress was ready to contest the bypolls, the high command decided to leave the seat for NC, and therefore, the candidate was announced.

Regarding PDP's support, the Chief Minister said, "Our leader, Shami Oberoi, met PDP Chief Mehbooba Mufti today and requested, on behalf of the party, to support the NC candidate in the Rajya Sabha elections. Earlier, Dr. Faroog Abdullah also spoke with her. Although no decision has been made public by the party yet, they have promised us that a decision will be taken after internal discussions," he said. On the LoP's statement, the Chief Minister said that he must clarify who made the offer to form a government with the BJP. "We have not made any such offer. We don't hide anything. The LoP must stop issuing these

He underlined the necessity of capacity building, continuous medical education, and hands-on staff training, noting that these are pivotal to ensuring the success and sustainability of the Tele-ICU framework in J&K.

Expressing gratitude for the guidance and technical inputs shared by Dr. Paul, the Chief Secretary reiterated the UT Administration's resolve to integrate advanced healthcare innovations into its public health system. He stated that the Government of Jammu and Kashmir is working towards establishing Tele-ICU facilities under a hub-and-spoke model, ensuring 24×7 critical care monitoring, expert consultation, and real-time clinical support for peripheral hospitals. Under this model, newly established GMCs will serve as spokes connected to a central command hub within the UT.

To ensure effective implementation, the Chief Secretary proposed deputing an expert team from J&K to leading healthcare institutions across the country to study the design and operational modalities of existing Tele-ICU hubs and command centres. He emphasized that while J&K faces challenges arising from difficult terrain and human resource limitations, the administration is committed to developing a customized, scalable model that addresses regional needs and strengthens healthcare delivery at the grassroots level.

Highlighting the next steps, the Chief Secretary directed the Health & Medical Education Department to work out the technical, administrative, and financial contours of the initiative. He stressed the importance of creating a state-of-the-art Tele-ICU hub within J&K equipped with expert professionals and technology partners to provide continuous clinical guidance, training, and quality assurance. The hub would also serve as a training and mentoring centre for medical staff across the UT, eventually leading to the creation of additional regional hubs for wider Tele-ICU

Secretary, Health & Medical Education Department, Dr. Syed Abid Rashid Shah, informed that the Department has proposed the establishment of at least a 10-bedded Tele-ICU unit in each of the new GMCs. He outlined the preparatory groundwork completed so far and presented a roadmap for phased implementation, including infrastructure readiness, technology procurement, and training modules.

The participants shared insights based on the their experience in administering the critical care medicine and suggested mechanisms for seamless integration of Tele-ICU facilities with existing hospital systems. Principals of various GMCs also shared their perspectives on operational feasibility, interconnectivity, and potential clinical benefits of the initiative.

Others who were present throughout this session includes MD, NHM; MD, JKMSCL; Principals of GMCs, Dental Colleges and other concerned officers.

The deliberations underscored the J&K Administration's focused approach towards leveraging telemedicine and digital health technologies to bridge gaps in healthcare access, particularly in remote and underserved areas. The proposed Tele-ICU network is expected to significantly enhance the Union Territory's capacity for critical care delivery, ensuring timely medical intervention, expert supervision, and improved patient outcomes across all tiers of the healthcare system.

Despite being a debutant in politics, Devyani enjoys strong public sentiment and a broad support base across communities, aided by her father's legacy as a bridge between Hindus and Muslims.

"I am fortunate to have the blessings and support of the people of Nagrota. They stood by Rana Sahib, and I am confident they will bless me too on November 11 and make me victorious with a record margin," she said.

An economics graduate from the University of California, Devyani manages her family's media and automobile businesses. She said she intends to bring a "fresh, professional approach" to politics while upholding the BJP's principles of service and integrity.

"I believe in a 360-degree view of development - inclusive, participatory, and empowering. My focus will be on strengthening villages, panchayats, and the entire constituency to ensure growth that benefits every section of society," she asserted.

In her election affidavit, Devyani declared movable assets worth Rs 91.23 lakh, no immovable property, and reported annual incomes of Rs 29.54 lakh (2024–25) and Rs 33.26 lakh (2023-24).

Her late father, Devender Singh Rana, had twice represented Nagrota – in 2014 and 2024 - winning the last election with a record margin of 30,472 votes against his NC rival Joginder Singh. He was known for advocating a Dogra chief minister for Jammu and Kashmir.

Devyani is the niece of Union Minister Jitendra Singh and the granddaughter of former bureaucrat Rajinder Singh Rana.

As the November 11 polling date draws closer, Devyani says her campaign is not merely about contesting an election but continuing a "bond of trust" built over decades.

"For me, this is not politics; it is a responsibility, a promise to my father and to the people of Nagrota," she said.

He said Nagrota, represented by the BJP thrice and NC twice since 1996, still lacks real development and needs a leader committed to genuine progress.

As a member of the INDIA bloc, Singh added that his supporters expect the Congress and others to back him instead of fielding their own candidates.

Since the 1996 Assembly elections, the BJP has won the Nagrota seat three times — in 2002, 2008, and 2024 – while the National Conference secured victories in 1996 and 2014. (Agencies)

loggerheads with the party leadership over the reservation policy as he sided with protesting students against the Omar Abdullah government last year.

The students were demanding a review of the quota system, which provides for only 30 per cent of seats for the general category candidates who account for nearly 70 per cent of the population.

Mehmood sought to clarify his earlier statement about Ruhullah, blaming the media for distorting his comments.

"I did not say that it does not matter whether he comes to campaign or not. Ruhullah belongs to a dynasty. He has a (strong) backing," he said.

Mehmood, however, stood by his assertion that Ruhullah was an MLA three times and now an MP because of the National Conference.

"He is in the Parliament or was in the assembly earlier because of the National Conference. He became a Parliament member only after the National Conference gave him a mandate. He could not have won on his own. He has become MLA three times since 2002 and MP last year due to NC. Aga Syed Mehmood is contesting because of the party," he asserted.

After filing his nomination papers on Monday, Mehmood had claimed that Ruhullah would campaign for the National Conference.

However, within minutes, the Lok Sabha member poured cold water on the claim.

"My loyalty is to my conscience and principles. While I hold respect for my elders in my family, I request them not to belittle my fight (our fight). If they can't comprehend it and be part of it, at least don't drag me and my struggle to this level," Ruhullah posted on X. (Agencies)

Referring to 'Operation Sindoor' that was launched to avenge April 22 Pahalgam terror attack that left 26 civilians dead, the Army Chief said that when the situation was discussed with him it was nothing new as when the Uri attack had happened all the options were discussed to deal with the situations that could arise in future. "So, I must concede very frankly, when this situation came to me, it was a very normal thing for me because I had already seen this earlier."

Pertinently, earlier this month the Army Chief had issued a fierce warning to Pakistan. "If the neighbouring country continues to support terrorism it will lose its geographical presence. If Pakistan wants to retain its place on the map, it must stop state-sponsored terrorism," the Army Chief had said speaking at an Army post in Rajasthan's Anupgarh.

He had maintained that the Indian forces won't show any restraint this time, hinting that a second version of 'Operation Sindoor' wouldn't be far away if Islamabad refuses to med its ways.

"This time we will not maintain the restraint that we had in Operation Sindoor 1.0. This time we will do something that will make Pakistan think whether it wants to retain its place in geography or not," General Dwivedi had said

He had also asked the soldiers to stay prepared. "If God wills, you'll get an opportunity soon. All the best."

It may be recalled that 'Operation Sindoor' the mega military operation was undertaken by India to give a fitting reply in the aftermath of the Pahalgam terror attack. Nine terror camps were hit in Pakistan and PoK (Pakistan-occupied Kashmir) by Indian forces using longrange precision weapons on May 7, 2025.

The attack on terror camps led to skirmishes between the two countries for four days. A ceasefire followed on May 10 after the Pakistani commanders pleaded with their Indian counterparts to stop the offensive—(KNO)

The invitation for the talks had been made by the Centre on September 20. The last round of talks between the two sides was held in May.

Lok Sabha MP from Ladakh Mohmad Haneefa, who took part in the meeting, said the Ladakhi leaders participated in it with an open mind for a positive outcome of their demand for statehood to Ladakh.

"This was our first meeting, and we can't expect much from it. But we raised the issue of immediate release of all those who were arrested on or after September 24, including Sonam Wangchuck," he told

reporters after the meeting here. Wangchuck, arrested under the stringent National Security Act (NSA), is currently lodged in Jodhpur jail. The NSA empowers the Centre and states to detain individuals to prevent them from acting in a manner "prejudicial to the defence of India".

The maximum detention period under the NSA is 12 months, though it can be revoked earlier.

Sajjad Kargili of the Kargil Democratic Alliance said the representatives of Ladakh sought the immediate release of all those who were arrested and compensation for those killed in police firing.

"We are hopeful that the government will respond positively to our demands," he said. On October 17, the MHA announced a judicial inquiry commission headed by a retired Supreme Court judge into the violent clashes of September 24 in Leh.

According to a notification issued by the MHA, the judicial probe, to be headed by Justice BS Chauhan, a former judge of the Supreme Court, is mandated to investigate the "circumstances leading to the serious law and order situation, the police action and the resultant unfortunate deaths of four people".

Retired district and sessions judge Mohan Singh Parihar will function as judicial secretary, while IAS officer Tushar Anand will be the administrative secretary of the inquiry commission.

The September 24 clashes between security forces and protesters – who were demanding statehood and Sixth Schedule status for the Union territory - left four civilians dead and 90 injured, escalating a months-long agitation.

The appointment of a retired Supreme Court judge to head the inquiry directly addressed the demand by local groups for a high-level, impartial judicial investigation.

The announcement of the probe comes as an attempt to restore dialogue with the representatives of the ongoing movement, the Leh Apex Body and the Kargil Democratic Alliance, which suspended talks with the home ministry's high-powered committee (HPC) following the violence.

The main issues that were on the agenda for discussions with the HPC remain the core demands of the LAB and KDA, seeking constitutional safeguards and greater political autonomy for the Union territory created in 2019.

Their demands include full statehood with its own legislative assembly to ensure greater political representation and self-governance, to protect the unique culture, fragile ecosystem, and land rights of the predominantly tribal population by granting Autonomous District Councils, two Lok Sabha seats, and the formation of a dedicated recruitment body to tackle high unemployment among the local youth, and ensure job reservations for Ladakh residents. continuous awareness and monitoring. "The use of iodised salt is one of the simplest and most effective ways to prevent iodine deficiency. Every household must ensure that the salt they use is adequately iodised." he said.

However, officials caution that proper storage and usage are equally important, as iodine can evaporate if the salt is exposed to moisture or heat for prolonged periods.

Doctors said that preventive measures include the iodised salt for daily cooking and ensuring it is stored in an airtight container away from moisture and sunlight, educating communities about the importance of iodine in the diet, conducting regular health check-ups and awareness programs, especially in remote and rural areas and encouraging monitoring of iodine levels in commercially sold salt to ensure compliance

with health standards. They have urged the people to be vigilant and consistent in using iodised salt, stressing that the cost of prevention is negligible compared to the lifelong

impact of iodine deficiency disorders. "A pinch of iodised salt each day can save generations from avoidable physical and mental disabilities," doctors advised—(KNO)

Four Medical Establishments Sealed in Shopian for Regulatory Violations

SHOPIAN, OCT 22: In a decisive action to enforce regulatory compliance and protect public health, the Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) Zainapora, Bilal Ahmed (JKAS), on Tuesday led a joint operation in collaboration with the Drug Control Authorities Shopian, resulting in the closure of four medical establishments, including a wholesale dealer.

The enforcement drive was conducted to ensure strict adherence to the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985, and the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, with particular emphasis on maintaining NRx Scheduled H1 records, implementing new GST labelling, and ensuring compliance with GST rates. During the inspections, several violations were detected, including poor record maintenance, lack of computerized billing, and non-functional



CCTV systems, leading to immediate closure of the establishments found in breach of norms. The SDM and Drug Control Officer reaffirmed their commitment to upholding the highest standards of regulatory compliance and accountability within the healthcare sector. They cautioned that such enforcement drives will continue rigorously to ensure $transparency \, and \, legality \, in \, the \, sale \, and \, distribution$ of medicines.

All medical establishments have been advised to strictly comply with the prescribed rules and regulations to avoid similar punitive action and to safeguard patients' interests as well as the integrity of the pharmaceutical supply chain.



Promoting Simplicity: The underlying goal of a mosque wedding is to deliberately avoid non-Islamic customs, unnecessary rituals, and wasteful spending, thereby ensuring the Nikah is conducted in the simplest and most Sunnah-compliant manner.

However, it is crucial to maintain the mosque's sanctity. If there is a risk of noise, chaos, or any actions that violate the respect of the mosque, it is better to avoid holding the ceremony there.

Simplicity is the Core Principle

While performing the Nikah in the mosque is highly recommended, the core element of the marriage contract is the offer and acceptance (Ijab-o-Qubul). This can be performed at home or any suitable, pure venue, as long as the gathering is free from any indecency or extravagance.

In conclusion, the focus is not merely on the location—be it the mosque or the home—but on simplicity. The most favored wedding is the one that aligns with the simplicity of the Prophet's Sunnah, ensuring it is easy and blessed. Muslims must reject the curse of extravagance, embrace moderation, and make Nikah simple again, lifting the heavy financial burden from the community.

A Literary Legacy



Fiction of Alice Munro, the Nobel Prizewinning Canadian author, is renowned for her psychologically rich short stories that explore the intricacies of memory, identity, and cultural inheritance. As Jedrzej Burszta notes. Munro's narratives are "intimate and psychological portraits... embedded in the dynamic clash between individualism and community" (Burszta). Similarly, "The Moons of Jupiter" explores the strained relationship between a writer and her dying father. The protagonist's memories of childhood are refracted through adult disillusionment, revealing how cultural scripts of fatherhood and filial duty shape emotional perception. Munro's use of fragmented chronology mirrors the instability of memory itself, suggesting that identity is always in flux. She is deeply concerned with the formation of psychological identity, particularly in women. In her fiction, her protagonists often struggle to reconcile internal desires with external roles—daughter, wife, mother, lover. This tension is most vividly portrayed in stories like "Runaway," where Carla, a young woman trapped in an abusive marriage, vacillates between escape and submission. In "Walker Brothers Cowboy" (Dance of the Happy Shades), the narrator recalls a childhood outing with her father, which gradually reveals the economic hardship and emotional repression of Depression-era Ontario. The story's power lies in its subtle evocation of class memory and familial silence.

Munro's attention to place is not nostalgic but forensic—she excavates the emotional sediment of geography. In "Hateship, Friendship, Courtship, Loveship, Marriage," the pro-



 $tagonist Johanna\,navigates\,a\,world\,shaped$ by social class and gender norms. Her psychological identity is forged through acts of quiet rebellion, such as traveling alone or marrying unexpectedly. The story's setting—a remote town and a train journey-mirrors Johanna's internal transformation, suggesting that movement through space can catalyze shifts in self-perception. Time in Munro's fiction is non-linear, often looping back to earlier moments or jumping forward unexpectedly. This temporal fluidity reflects the workings of memory, which is rarely chronological. In "Dear Life," Munro blends autobiographical fragments with fictionalized recollections, blurring the line between lived experience and narrative construction. The result is a meditation on how memory shapes identity, and how storytelling becomes a form of self-making.

Munro's stories frequently engage with trauma-emotional, physical, and psychological. Yet she resists sensationalism, opting instead for quiet revelations and elliptical disclosures. Trauma in Munro's fiction is often encoded in silence, in what is not said or remembered. In "Dimension," a woman visits the psychiatric hospital where her husband is incarcerated for murdering their children. The story unfolds through her internal monologue, revealing how trauma distorts memory and reshapes identity. Munro's portrayal of grief is restrained yet devastating, emphasizing the ethical complexity of remembering. Munro also explores the trauma of social exclusion. In "Red Dress-1946," a young girl experiences humiliation at a school dance, which becomes a formative memory of shame and alienation. The story captures how cultural norms-beauty, popularity, femininity—imprint themselves on the psyche, shaping identity through

emotional injury.

Alice Munro's fiction offers a profound exploration of cultural memory and psychological identity. Her stories illuminate how individuals are shaped by familial legacies, social expectations, and the quiet violence of memory. Through her nuanced portrayals of women, her forensic attention to place and time, and her ethical engagement with trauma, Munro constructs a literary world where identity is always in negotiation. Munro's work challenges readers to reconsider the boundaries between self and society, between memory and narrative. In doing so, she affirms the power of storytelling as a means of understanding who we are, where we come from, and how we carry the past within us.Munro's fiction is deeply rooted in place, particularly the rural landscapes of Ontario. These settings are not merely backdrops but active participants in memory transmission. The towns, farms, and lakes are repositories of familial and cultural memory, where characters confront the ghosts of their past.

In "Home," the narrator returns to her childhood house, now inhabited by her stepmother. The physical space triggers memories of her father, her mother, and her own emotional development. Munro uses the house as a metaphor for the layered nature of memory-each room holds a different story, a different version of the self. In "Fiction," a woman discovers that a young writer has fictionalized her life. The story raises questions about ownership of memory and the ethics of storytelling. Munro implies that memory is communal, shaped by both teller and listener. The transmission of memory across generations is not passive but active, involving interpretation, negotiation, and sometimes conflict. Place also serves as a bridge between generations. In

"Working for a Living," Munro recalls her father's fur-trapping business and the economic struggles of her family. These memories are tied to the land, to the rhythms of rural life. Munro suggests that identity is shaped not only by people but by the environments they inhabit. Munro's characters often use memory to resist cultural norms and to reclaim agency. In "Friend of My Youth," the narrator revisits her mother's stories about a woman named Flora, who defied expectations by refusing to marry. The narrator's interpretation of Flora's life changes over time, reflecting her own evolving identity. Munro portrays memory as a site of contestation, where different versions of the past compete for legitimacy. The narrator's attempt to understand Flora becomes a way of understanding her mother, and ultimately herself. Munro suggests that reclaiming memory is an act of empowerment, allowing individuals to rewrite inherited narratives.

Munro's fiction engages with cultural memory and psychological identity, particularly through the lens of gender, place, and time. Drawing on selected stories from collections such as The Moons of Jupiter, Runaway, and Dear Life, the paper argues that Munro's narratives function as intimate excavations of the self, shaped by familial legacies, social expectations, and the quiet violence of memory. Alice Munro's fiction is often described as "novelistic" in its depth and complexity, despite its brevity. Her stories are rooted in the rural landscapes of southwestern Ontario, yet they transcend geography to explore universal themes of memory, identity, and emotional survival. Munro's protagonists—often women navigate the tensions between personal desire and cultural expectation, between past trauma and present consciousness. Munro constructs psychological identity through the prism of cultural memory, revealing the subtle interplay between individual experience and collective inheritance. Cultural memory, as theorized by Jan Assmann, refers to the shared pool of knowledge and experience that shapes a community's identity over time. In Munro's work, cultural memory is embedded in domestic rituals, family histories, and the social codes of small-town life. Her stories often begin in the present but spiral into the past, uncovering buried truths and unresolved tensions.

Raw Milk Face Pack



The accrued interest on both existing term loans and working capital accounts up to the eligible date shall be converted into a separate Funded Interest Term Loan (FITL), repayable over an extended period as per bank guidelines. In addition, the bank shall provide an additional credit facility of 15% on the existing working capital limits to enable business units to meet short-term operational and liquidity requirements in the wake of the current disruptions.

CTTIK appeals to all eligible borrowers particularly those from the tourism, trade, industry and transport sectors to approach their respective J&K Bank branches to avail the benefits under the rehabilitation package 2025. This timely initiative offers much-needed financial relief and support to businesses affected by recent disturbanc-

Mr. Padha urged the bank to consider accounts having more than two overdue installments after the stipulated date of 21st April 2025 as eligible under the rehabilitation package so that maximum number of businesses can avail this facility. Raj Kumar Dubey emphasized the need for the bank to extend an additional 15% credit facility on term loans similar to that provided to working capital and SOD accounts while Munish Kapoor made request to offer short term loans at reduced interest rates to new accounts to help the business community to tide over the current challenges.

Black Day: SOS International honours PoK martyrs, slams govt neglect

JAMMU, OCTOBER 22: S.O.S. International - An Organization for PoK Displaced Persons - observed Black Day with participants from Muzaffarabad, Mirpur, Poonch, and Gilgit districts paying homage to martyrs who made supreme sacrifices defending Jammu & Kashmir against Pakistani Army and tribal invaders aiming for demographic change.

The event, led by Chairman Rajiv Chuni, featured speeches by VK Datta, Ved Raj Bali, Bhai Ram Singh, Amarjeet Singh, Jagjit Singh, Daleep Singh Chib, Dharam Vir Gupta, and others.

Proceedings began with floral tributes to genocide victims, two minutes of silence for those who saved the state, and a Sarva Dharma Prarthana. On October 22, 1947, the first bullet struck a PoK DP, halting invaders; 70,000 unarmed civilians were butchered, women abducted and raped in horrific atrocities - marking this as Jammu & Kashmir's darkest day.

Addressing the gathering, Chuni declared: "We take pride as saviors of Jammu & Kashmir from Pakistani clutches, yet our progeny languish in unhygienic camps for eight decades without aid - the third generation suffers in history's worst neglect."

He detailed S.O.S. International's efforts securing a relief package under the Omar Abdullah government: Rs 25 lakh ex-gratia per 1947 family, professional college reservations, and 8,500 jobs for educated PoK DP youth. Shockingly, the Centre ignored the last two components. Of Rs 9,096 crore recommended, only Rs 2,000 crore was sanctioned in 2016; just Rs 1200 crore distributed, Rs 600 crore pending. Chuni called this "slow poisoning"

Mocking India's PoK claims, he said: "Officials repeatedly declare PoK integral to India yet fail to stop CPEC railways and roads on our ancestral lands. China-Pakistan built dams earlier too. If PoK is ours, ban their constructions." Retrieving Gilgit-Baltistan, he added, would secure half the nation; blocking CPEC would avenge 1947.

Chuni accused the Centre of shabby treatment: "PoK DPs are bona fide J&K citizens; Articles 370-35A never harmed us. We backed their abrogation for equal rights like Valley migrants – instead, discrimination doubled." In 'Back to Village Programs' several central schemes reached Valley migrants' doorsteps; zero for PoK DP camps. LG and secretaries visited Valley camps – none

He demanded full package implementation, satellite towns like Valley migrants, and reversal of land grabs by the tillers despite High Court orders. Chuni urged eight reserved assembly seats in J&K, a PoK DPs Development Board, and Poonch-Mirpur-Muzaffarabad-Gilgit scouts for LoC/LAC duty and youth jobs.

Jagjit Singh stressed upgrading PoK DP education to harness their intelligence for nation and society, honoring their patriotism.

Dharam Vir Gupta called for smart ID cards, cultural clubs to preserve fading heritage, and leveraging the community's valor to strengthen India.

Mandhana **Admits Emotions Led To Sunday** Heartbreak

NEW DELHI: Smriti Mandhana has taken the blame for India's batting collapse against England on Sunday night at their women's World Cup match in Indore, where they went from needing a-run-a-ball 57 with seven wickets in hand to a fourrun defeat.

Chasing 289 for a win, Mandhana was dismissed for 88 off 94 balls in the 42nd over, and from there they slipped to 262 for 6 by the 47th and just couldn't get the final impetus with left-arm spinners Sophie Ecclestone and Linsey Smith bowling six of the last nine overs."We could have done better with our shot selection," a subduedlooking Mandhana said at the press conference. "It started from me, so I will take it on myself that the shot selection should have been better. We just needed six runs per over. Maybe we should have taken the game deeper. I'll take it [upon] myself because the collapse started from me.'

Smith bowled to Mandhana from around the wicket with deep square-leg, deep midwicket, longon and long-off in place. Mandhana looked to go inside out over the covers but the ball drifted away a little, making Mandhana mistime it straight down long-off's throat.

"I thought I could take her on, I was trying to aim more over covers," Mandhana said. "I mistimed that shot. Maybe the shot wasn't needed at that time. I just needed to be more patient because throughout the innings I was trying to tell myself to be patient and not to play aerial shots.

"The emotions took over for that one, which never helps in cricket. But walking back, I was pretty confident that we'll be able to get the win. But it's cricket, you can't ever think too far ahead. If you lose, I don't think [a good innings] means anything. I had to be a little more patient than I've been in the last two-three months."

Four overs after Mandhana fell, Richa Ghosh tried to hit Nat Sciver-Brunt over the off-side infield but chipped a catch to Heather Knight at cover. In the next over, Deepti Sharma slog-swept Ecclestone straight to deep midwicket.

"Richa has been good for us, but I wouldn't say that it's only dependent on her," Mandhana said. "We just needed 6.5 runs per over; it's not like we needed nine per over that the finishing

part was a lot to ask. We have seen Aman [Amanjot Kaur] do that in WPL and Sneh [Rana] has been brilliant in the last four-five overs with the bat for us in the first three-four matches. So, I wouldn't say that, especially this one, that it was only dependent on one player. We'll take it upon ourselves that we could have actually done better in the last sixodd overs."

India had played each of the previous four matches with five bowlers, and they ended up having to defend targets on each occasion, failing twice, against South Africa and Australia. Against England, they benched Jemimah Rodrigues for an extra bowler in Renuka Singh. As it happened, India were asked to chase and the move to change the team balance came under the spotlight.

Renuka, though, was India's least expensive bowler, conceding runs at 4.62 in her eight overs. In fact, the bowling unit pulled their weight, conceding just 36 runs in the last five overs to stop England at 288 when 300 looked on the cards. But the batting later came unstuck despite half-centuries from Mandhana, Harmanpreet Kaur and Deepti.

Erling Haaland, Harry Kane and Kylian Mbappe battle to be Europe's best

MANCHESTER: Erling Haaland, Harry Kane and Kylian Mbappe are all scoring at better than a goal-a-game rates in a blistering start to the season from Europe's top three marksmen.

Ahead of their return to Champions League action this week, the trio are already battling at the top of the charts to be the competition's top scorer and making the early running in a World Cup campaign for next year's Ballon d'Or.

AFP Sports looks at the astonishing stats all three strikers are producing for both club and country.

Erling Haaland (Man City and Norway)

Haaland leads the way with 23 goals in 13 games to haul City back into contention for the Premier League and Norway to the brink of their first World Cup since 1998. Only once has Haaland failed to find the net this season and he has struck in all of his last 11 matches.

against Everton on Saturday to

take his Premier League tally for the campaign to 11.

Haaland now boasts the three quickest occasions any Premier League player has reached 10 goals in a season after doing so in six matches in 2022 and five games last season.

"If you are building from scratch what you want as the ideal centre-forward, look at Haaland," said the Premier League's all-time top goalscorer Alan Shearer.

"He has goals, pace, strength, is good in the air. Doesn't mind being roughed up, it doesn't bother him if he doesn't have many touches. He is almost perfect."

Previously he has been questioned in his homeland for not reproducing his prolific club form for Norway. Those complaints have been washed away as Haaland has struck 12 times in six qualifiers to finally take a golden generation towards his first major international tournament.

Harry Kane (Bayern Munich and England)

Kane headed in his 22nd goal The 25-year-old scored twice of the season to put Bayern on course for victory in Der Klas-

siker against Borussia Dortmund on Saturday.

The England captain has three goals in as many games for his country as the Three Lions became the first European team to qualify for the World Cup with a flawless qualifying record through six matches.

Kane has racked up incredible numbers since swapping his homeland for Bayern in 2023, even if it took until his second season to end a long wait to win a trophy. The 32-year-old has 104 goals in 107 games for the German giants, including 19 in 11 at club level this season.

Bayern already look set to defend their Bundesliga title, making a first ever Champions League crown for Kane even more

of a priority. He has scored four times in wins over Chelsea and Pafos to begin their quest for European glory and will expect more when Club Brugge visit Bavaria on Wednesday.

Kylian Mbappe (Real Madrid and France)

Mbappe's frustrating first few months following his dream move from Paris Saint-Germain last year are now long forgotten in the Spanish capital.

The Frenchman racked up 44 goals in 59 games across all competitions last season and adapted to playing as the central striker in Carlo Ancelotti's system.

Xabi Alonso has maintained Mbappe's position and the 26-year-old has been Madrid's key player during the opening weeks of the season.

Lightning quick, slick on the ball and capable of finishing lethally from outside the area, Mbappe has 15 goals in 11 matches between La Liga and the Champions League.

He is the Spanish top flight's leading goalscorer with 10, while netting five goals in just two Champions League appearances. Mbappe has also netted three times for France this season in three appearances.

In only one of 14 appearances for club and country this season has Mbappe failed to find the net, and he has netted in his last 11 consecutive matches.

Mbappe has finished as his league's top scorer in each of the last seven seasons, six with PSG and then in his first year at Real Madrid.




A Ceremony Steeped in **Spiritual Essence**
